

The 145th Infantry, Ohio National Guard can trace its regimental history to the formation of the Fifteenth Ohio Infantry in 1877. This regiment was made up of the following independent militia companies:

Because of the disbandment of a number of units in 1880 and 1881, Fifteenth Infantry was disbanded March 22, 1881. Companies "D," "G," "H," and "K" of the old regiment were maintained as "unattached companies." On July 7, 1881, a new regiment, the Fifth Ohio Regiment, was formed as follows:

Co. "G," 15th Infantry—Co. "B"
Co. "H," 15th Infantry—Co. "C"
Co. "K," 15th Infantry—Co. "D"

Co. "F"

The Fifth Ohio Infantry Regiment, with various internal changes, continued in existence in Ohio until the outbreak of the Spanish-American War, when it was mustered into Federal service as the Fifth Ohio Volunteer Infantry on May 11, 1898. The Regiment served at Tampa and Fernandina, Fla., and was mustered out November 5, 1898. On April 14, 1899, the

Fifth Infantry was disbanded and of its units, Companies "B," "C," "E," "G" and "H" were designated as "unattached companies" in the service of the state. On July 14, 1899, the Fifth Ohio Infantry was reorganized with the unattached companies serving as a nucleus.

The regiment attended the Victory Celebration of Admiral Dewey in New York City in 1899; participated in the Pan-American Exposition in Buffalo in 1901; the World's Fair at St. Louis in 1904 and the Jamestown Exposition in 1917. It took part in the funeral of President McKinley at Canton in 1901 and the dedication of the McKinley memorial in 1907.

The Fifth Ohio Infantry continued in service in Ohio until it was mustered in for service on the Mexican Border. It was mobilized at Camp Willis, Columbus, Ohio, on June 16, 1916, and served on the Border in the vicinity of El Paso, Texas, from September, 1916, to March, 1917. On July 15, 1917,







FACTUAL HISTORY

In 1881 when the old Fifth Regiment, Ohio National Guard, was mustered into service as a National Guard outfit, there was no provision made for a Headquarters Company. Its work was largely done by the non-commissioned officers staff, consisting of one regimental sergeant major, one regimental supply sergeant, three battalion sergeant majors, several color sergeants, one chief trumpeter and a drum major. The Band was enlisted in the letter companies and detailed to the Band. Orderlies were selected from the best appearing men at guard mount.

The First Headquarters Company was formed when the regiment was ordered to the Mexican Border in 1916 and was composed of one captain, a regimental sergeant major, three battalion sergeant majors, two color sergeants, one chief trumpeter, a Band and the mounted orderlies. Just before the Company left the Border for Detroit, Lieut. F. W.

Marcolin was put in command of the Company. It was mustered out March 15, 1917.

The National Guard forces were reorganized at Camp Sheridan, and Headquarters Company, now of the 145th Infantry, was recruited up to full strength of 356 men. It was under command of Capt. L. J. Lynn. The unit sailed out of New York harbor June 13, 1918, on board the Leviathan, and landed at Brest, France, June 22.

The Company served honorably during the many months it remained in France and Belgium, fighting on several of the more important fronts of the closing years of the war. Its work as a signal unit, as well as a communications and pioneer unit, took it into tight places and all of the men did not always come out again. On its return to the United States after the war the unit was mustered out of service at Camp Sherman.

Headquarters Company was recognized June 22, 1920, as Headquarters Company, Third Infantry, and was redesignated Headquarters Company, 145th Infantry July 1, 1921.




FACTUAL HISTORY

A few months prior to the muster in of National Guard troops for service on the Mexican Border in 1916-17, Companies were organized to supplant the Quartermaster details in the matter of regimental supply. In this manner the Supply Company, Fifth Ohio Infantry, commanded by Capt. Ben F. Duperow, came into existence. As the Supply Company, Fifth Infantry, it saw service in the vicinity of El Paso, Texas, from September, 1916, to March, 1917.

The Company was called out for World War service and redesignated Supply Company, 145th In-

fantry. Preliminary training was given the Company at Camp Sheridan, Alabama.

The Company landed in France June 22, 1917, and went into intensive training in the Baumont area (Haut-Marne). It rendered valiant service during the war and saw action in the Baccarat sector at Recourt, the Avocourt sector, Meuse-Argonne sector, Pannes sector, at Ypres (Belgium) and in the Ypres-Lys offensive. Returning from France, the Company was mustered out at Camp Sherman, Ohio, on April 22, 1919.

On March 23, 1921, the Company was reorganized as Company "I," Third Infantry, but July 1, 1921, it was given the redesignation of Service Company, 145th Infantry.

Since that time it has gone ever forward with its peace-time training and has participated nobly in state service. Notable among this service was that performed by the Company in the Lorain Relief Expedition in 1924.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The Howitzer Company, 145th Infantry, was first organized September 26, 1877, and was officially known as Company "K," Fifteenth Infantry. It was locally known as the "Berea Light Guards." On July 7, 1881, its designation was changed to Company "D," Fifth Infantry, Ohio National Guard. This unit saw service at the Cincinnati riots in 1884, the Stark county coal riots in the same year and Berea Quarry riot in 1896.

At the outbreak of the Spanish-American War the unit was mustered into Federal service as Company "D," Fifth Ohio Volunteer Infantry. It was mustered out of service November 5, 1898, and shortly after was reorganized as Company "A," Fifth Infantry, Ohio National Guard. Under this designation the unit

served during the Columbus street car strike in 1910 and the Dayton flood of 1913.

Company "A" was sent to the Mexican Border for service in June, 1916, and was stationed at El Paso, Texas. It was mustered out of Federal service on March 15, 1917.

In July, 1917, the Company was recalled into Federal service for duty overseas. Its designation was changed to Company "A," 145th United States Infantry. The unit served overseas with the Thirty-seventh Division in the Baccarat and Pannes sectors and the Meuse-Argonne and Ypres-Lys offensives. On March 4, 1920, the unit was Federally recognized as Howitzer Company, 145th Infantry.

Since its reorganization the unit has served in the Lorain tornado in 1924, the Toledo Auto-Lite riots in 1934 and the Youngstown-Warren steel strike in June, 1937.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "A," 145th Infantry, was first organized February 24, 1876, as the "Emmet Guards," located at Cleveland, Ohio. In 1877 the unit was designated as Company "A," Fifteenth Infantry Regiment. This regiment was disbanded March 22, 1881, and on July 7, 1881, a new regiment was formed, the Fifth Ohio Infantry, of which Company "A" was a part.

The Fifth Infantry Regiment was mustered into Federal service as the Ohio Volunteer Infantry on May 11, 1898, for service during the Spanish-American War. The Company was again mustered into service

for duty on the Mexican Border, where it served in the vicinity of El Paso, Texas, from September, 1916, to March, 1917. It was mustered out of Federal service March 15, 1917. Exactly four months later, July 15, 1917, the Fifth Infantry Regiment was mustered into Federal service for duty in the World War.

From the command of Capt. John R. Southam, under whom the Company had served on the Mexican Border, the Company came under the command of Capt. J. J. Baesel for the duration of the World War. Capt. Ray Landry was in command when the Company received its Federal recognition November 14, 1919. Capt. Ray T. Bolland was in command from May 27, 1921, to May 7, 1923; Capt. Herman R. Vail from May 7, 1923, to July 18, 1924; Capt. Cecil B. Whitcomb from July 19, 1924, to July 21, 1928, and the present commander, Capt. John P. Geiger, assumed command of Company "A" on July 20, 1928.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "C," 145th Infantry has as long and illustrious a history as any unit of the Ohio National Guard. The Company was first organized in 1812 as Canton Company, Third Regiment, Fourth Division Militia of Ohio, Capt. George Stidger commanding. In 1846 the Company was known as the "Stark Rangers," Third Regiment, Sixth Division Militia of Ohio, with Capt. James Allen in command.

During the Civil War, 1861-65, the Company saw service as the "Canton Zouaves," Fourth Regiment of Ohio Volunteers. Under the command of Capt. James Wallace it took part in the battles of Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, Gettysburg and the Wilderness.

From 1876 to 1898 the Company was a part of the Eighth Regiment, Ohio National Guard, which was commanded by Col. Edward S. Meyer. For six years of this period, from 1884 to 1890, the Company was designated as a unit of the Canton Independent

Battalion of Infantry with Major J. M. Campbell commanding. Company "C" was commanded by Capt. Edwin F. Frease, who was succeeded by Capt. Harry Frease.

In the Spanish-American War the Company was part of the Eighth Ohio Infantry Regiment of Volunteers.

From 1901 to 1913 Company "C," Eighth Infantry, Ohio National Guard was commanded successively by Captains August Domer, Fred Metz, Ulrich Clay, Charles J. Houser and Harry Hazlette.

In 1916 Company "C" served on the Mexican Border, and from 1917 to 1919 it served overseas as Company "C," 146th Infantry, Thirty-seventh Division.

In the reorganization of the National Guard after the World War this Company was first designated as Company "L" Third Infantry, with Federal recognition coming June 5, 1920. It was later redesignated Company "C," 145th Infantry, Ohio National Guard.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The present Company "D," 145th Infantry was organized in Cleveland, June 8, 1915, as the Machine Gun Company, Fifth Infantry, Ohio National Guard. The unit made its first camp in August, 1915, at Yellow Springs, Ohio and was active in suppressing riots at Youngstown in June of the next year.

On June 19, 1916, the Company was mobilized in Cleveland for Mexican Border service and on June 29 arrived at Camp Willis, Columbus. On September 3 the unit arrived at Camp Baker, El Paso, Texas. It was not mustered out of Federal service until March 15, 1917, at Fort Wayne, Detroit, Michigan. The Company was called into Federal service once more on July 15, 1917, for World War service. It sailed from Hoboken for France and arrived at Brest June 22, 1918. Advanced training was given the unit at Goncourt.

CLEVELAND, OHIO

Service was seen by the Company in the Baccarat trench sector, in the Avocourt sector, at the Meuse-Argonne offensive, in the Pannes sector, and at the Flanders offensives of November 1918. From November 11, 1918 to January 11, 1919, the unit was billeted in Belgium and northern France. On March 20, 1919, it sailed for New York on the Great Northern, arriving March 27. The Company was discharged from the service at Camp Sherman April 22, 1919.

On January 16, 1920, it was reorganized and redesignated as Company "D," Second Infantry, later redesignated Company "D," Third Infantry. On July 1, 1921, it was redesignated Company "D," 145th Infantry.

Since that time the organization has participated in many calls for service, including duty at the mine strike disorders in southern Ohio in 1922; Klu-Klux-Klan riots at Niles in 1922; the Lorain tornado in 1924; the Little Steel strike in the Mahoning Valley in 1937, and other civic duties too numerous to mention.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Headquarters Company, Second Battalion, 145th Infantry, was organized at Lakeville, Ohio in 1884, by Captain Morres, and was known as Company "H," Seventeenth Ohio Infantry. This Company erected its own Armory in Lakeville, the personnel of the unit doing the actual work of construction. In 1892, the Company was transferred to Shreve as Company "H" Eighth Ohio Infantry, under the command of Capt. Ammon B. Critchfield.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "E," 145th Infantry was organized at Ashland March 5, 1900, and is now one of the oldest original letter companies in the state. On March 4, 1901 the Company traveled to Washington as part of the Eighth Ohio Volunteer Infantry and took part in McKinley's second inauguration. In 1903, the Company was ordered to Buffalo to act as guard of honor after President McKinley had been assassinated. In 1909, the Company took part in the inauguration of President Taft.

Before the foundation of Camp Perry, the Company attended encampments at New Philadelphia, Newark, Camp Know, Marietta, Athens, Strasburg and Fort Benjamin Harrison. The Company was on strike duty at Dillonville in 1906, and at Steubenville in 1908. In 1913, the unit was ordered on flood duty to Zanesville.

A S H L A N D , O H I O

Company "E" was mustered into Federal service in 1916 for the Mexican Border campaign. The men had been at home only a short time following this tour of duty when they were recalled for Federal service in the World War. On July 6, 1917, the Company was made a part of the 146th Infantry.

On June 15, 1918, Company "E" sailed for France aboard the U. S. S. Leviathan, not to return to the United States until March 30, 1919. While overseas the Company took part in the operations of the Meuse-Argonne, St. Mihiel and Ypres-Lys. In 1919, after muster out of Federal service, the unit was recognized as being of the 145th Infantry, Ohio National Guard.

Since that time the Company has been in the service of the state in the 1924 Lorain tornado disaster, 1921 Cadiz coal strike, 1934 strike at Toledo and the 1937 steel strike at Warren.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "F," 145th Infantry was organized during the Spanish-American War and mustered into service of the state of Ohio July 22, 1898 as Company "D," Ohio State Volunteers. This unit was in active training but did not leave the United States during the period of hostilities. It was mustered out of state service June 10, 1899.

On July 10, 1899, the organization was again mustered into state service and designated as Company "F," Ohio National Guard Unassigned Infantry. It was later assigned to the Fifth Ohio Infantry, retaining its Company letter "D."

W A R R E N , O H I O

On June 15, 1916, Company "D," Fifth Ohio Infantry was mustered into the Federal service for duty on the Mexican Border. It was mustered out of the Federal service March 15, 1917. In June of the same year it was again mustered into the Federal service and designated as Company "D," 145th Infantry, Thirty-seventh Division. A year later the Company went overseas, landing at Brest, France, June 18, 1918. It served in all the engagements of the Thirty-seventh Division in France and Belgium. The unit returned to the United States in March 1919, was mustered out of the service in May 1919, and returned to Warren, where it was disbanded.

The Company was again organized in 1921, and Federally recognized as Headquarters Company, First Battalion, 145th Infantry on July 23, 1921. It was redesignated as Company "F," 145th Infantry, April 1, 1929.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "G," 145th Infantry was organized in Norwalk, Ohio, August 5, 1877, as the "Western Reserve Guards," assigned as Company "G," Sixteenth Regiment. The Company was transferred to the Fifth Regiment on May 11, 1887, and retained the designation of "G" Company. Today it is the oldest company in the 145th Regiment, having maintained its same designation and station for fifty-one years.

Company "G" was mustered into service for the Spanish-American War on May 11, 1898, and was mustered out November 5, 1898. The Company was mustered once more into service on July 5, 1916, for duty along the Mexican Border. The unit was mustered into Federal service July 23, 1917, for World War duty and served with distinction in France and Belgium with the 145th Infantry, many of its officers and men being decorated for gallantry in action.

N O R W A L K , O H I O

Following the World War the unit was reorganized and Federally recognized February 23, 1921, as Company "G" under command of the late Capt. Charles V. Mack.

In addition to the three Federal campaigns in which it has been engaged, the Company has functioned on state duty in various capacities. In the Sandusky-Lorain tornado the Company established an all-time mobilization record. Within fifty-five minutes after the telephone communication from the Adjutant General, men of this Company were on duty in the stricken area.

This Company furnished the Colonel of the regiment, Col. Cortland L. Kennan, during the Spanish-American War, and Colonel A. W. Davis, who commanded the regiment during the World War. The present company commander, Bernard F. Kean, is the third generation of his family to serve the company, his grandfather, Michael Kean, and his father, William C. Kean, both preceding him in the Company.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "H," 145th Infantry was organized in 1879 as Company "C," Eighth Ohio Infantry, and in 1887 was reorganized as Company "H," Fifth Ohio Infantry, under command of Capt. James A. Freed. The unit was locally known as the "Logan Rifles." Succeeding Captains were John A. Logan II, and Harry M. Reel.

Company "H" was mobilized for service for the Spanish-American War in 1898, under the command of Captain Freed, and was mustered out November 5, 1898. The Company was reorganized the next year under the command of Capt. Harry Ulrich.

The unit was mobilized for service on the Mexican Border in July 1916, under command of Capt. John A. Logan III, and was mustered out at Fort Wayne, Indiana, in March 1917. The Company was reorganized for service in the World War and became known as Company "B," 135th Machine Gun Battalion. It served under command of Capt. Jesse Wells

from August 1917 to April 1919, during which time the Company saw active duty in the Argonne Forest and in Belgium. Following the World War the Company was reorganized as Company "H," 145th Infantry, under the command of Capt. Orson W. Abbey. Succeeding company commanders were Captains Harold C. Dickey and Joseph Parilla.

This Company was on hand at the official welcoming of Admiral Dewey on his return from an Asiatic tour in 1899. In 1913 the Company served during the Dayton flood disaster. The Company has attended the funeral services of three Ohio presidents, who are, Garfield, McKinley and Harding. It attended the World Fair in Chicago in 1893 and the World Fair at St. Louis in 1904. In 1924, the Company saw active service in Lorain following a destructive tornado.

Its service during the past few years includes that seen as a unit at the 1935 Camp Perry rifle matches and its duty performed during the 1937 flood.

FACTUAL HISTORY

On December 4, 1875, the "Akron City Guard" was organized, with fifty-two members signing the muster roll. From this early organization came the present Company "I."

Early the next spring the Akron City Guard was ordered into the Tuscarawas Valley to serve during a coal strike, and its record of service to the state has been unbroken since that time.


The first of many reorganizations struck the young unit on January 3, 1876. The Ninth Regiment, Ohio National Guard was formed on July 10, 1876, and the Akron City Guard was designated Company "A." In August 1878, the Ninth and Eighth Regiments were merged and Company "A," Ninth Infantry was redesignated Company "B," Eighth Ohio Infan-

try. This Company bore a conspicuous part in the inauguration of President Benjamin Harrison on March 4, 1889.

When the call to arms came in 1893, Company "B" went to Cuba with the Eighth Regiment. On April 15, 1917, after seeing service on the Mexican Border, Company "B" was mobilized for action in France, under command of Capt. Sam J. Cole. The Company was mustered into Federal service on August 5, 1917, as Company "B," 146th Infantry. The organization trained at Camp Sheridan, Ala., and saw service overseas on the fronts of Meuse-Argonne, Baccarat, Avacourt, and Ypres-Lys.

After the World War Captain Cole reorganized his Company, and it was granted Federal recognition as Company "B," 145th Infantry. The unit was redesignated Company "I," 145th Infantry on April 21, 1925.

In July 1919, the unit was reorganized as Company "K," Third Ohio Infantry, and in 1921, received its present designation of Company "K," 145th Infantry.


Company "K" was transferred from Wooster to Akron on March 1, 1928, and Emerson C. Woolf, the present commander, assumed command upon the Company's reorganization in Akron. The original First Lieutenant of the Company was Fred G. Ruffner, now Captain of Company "L," 145th Infantry.

Company "K" was once commanded by Colonel F. C. Gerlach, well known Ohio National Guard figure, and Carl Weygandt, now Chief Justice of the Ohio Supreme Court, was once an officer in the Company. Present junior officers of the unit are First Lieut. Dorsey H. Davenport and Second Lieut. Claude W. Fuston, Jr.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "K," 145th Infantry was first organized at some date prior to the Spanish-American War as Company "D," Eighth Ohio Infantry. In 1917 the Company was redesignated as Company "D," 146th Infantry and saw active service in France under command of Capt. Fred Redick. Following the World War it was mustered out of service.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The forerunner of the present Company "L," 145th Infantry was organized for service in the War of 1812, as an independent battery of artillery, but the name of the organization has become lost.

The unit was mustered into service as the Sixth Ohio Battery in 1861, and was with General Sherman on his march to Atlanta.

This organization continued to function as an independent battery until it was reorganized as a unit of the Ohio National Guard on November 26, 1877, by Capt. Joseph C. Ewart, an officer who had served in the Civil War. At this time the unit was redesignated the Sixth Battery of Light Artillery.

The Sixth Battery was mustered into Federal service for the Spanish-American War, July 7, 1898, as Battery "F," First Regiment of Light Artillery, and

was immediately re-named Company "F," Tenth Ohio Volunteer Infantry. The organization was mustered out of service March 23, 1899. On July 2, 1916, this unit, now known as Company "F," Eighth Ohio National Guard, was mustered into service for duty on the Mexican Border. After a period of border service, it was mustered out on March 22, 1917.

Company "F," Eighth Ohio Infantry was mobilized July 15, 1917, for the World War, and after the reorganization of the army in September 1917, was designated as Company "F," 146th Infantry. The Company embarked for France June 6, 1918 and saw service in the sectors of Baccarat, Avocourt, Meuse, Argonne and Ypres-Lys. The unit assisted in the capture of Montfaucon, Lieut. Dierdorf being killed at the edge of the town. During the Argonne drive the company's casualties were very heavy.

Under the Federalization of the National Guard following the World War the Company underwent several changes in official designation, finally receiving the designation of Company "L," 145th Infantry.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "M," 145th Infantry was first organized in 1915, as Machine Gun Company, Eighth Infantry, the first machine gun unit in Ohio. It was organized as a detail company by Captain J. M. Straub. In 1916, the unit went to the Mexican Border under command of Capt. Randall, Captain Straub having resigned. In 1917, the Company was made a part of the 146th Infantry and served overseas as such under command of Captain E. W. Kiplinger. At the close of the war it was mustered out of service and Akron was without a machine gun unit.

Early in 1920, however, at the urgent request of the Chamber of Commerce, J. M. Straub, organized another machine gun company. It was accorded Federal recognition January 30, 1920, with the designation of Machine Gun Company, Second Infantry, Ohio National Guard.

On August 2, 1920, it was redesignated Machine Gun Company, Third Infantry. On May 1, 1921, it became Company "M," Third Infantry, and on July 1, 1921, in another rapid change, it became Company "M," 145th Infantry. J. M. Straub resigned in 1922, and R. E. Straub became the company commander, with the outfit continuing to hold its premier place among the Guard units of Ohio.

T. L. Parker took command in 1924, upon the resignation of R. E. Straub. The Company went to Niles during the Klan disturbance there in 1925, and in 1932, the Company was sent to Cadiz for a 20-day tour of duty during the mine strike in the Hocking Valley.

In 1937, Captain Parker was transferred to staff duty and Charles M. Conaway was transferred from Headquarters Company, Third Battalion, 145th Infantry and placed in command with the rank of Captain. In October of the same year Captain Conaway was transferred to command of Company "I," 145th Infantry, and the First Lieutenant of Company "M," Herbert B. Eagon, was promoted to Captain and placed in command, which position he now holds.

The unit has had three of its officers graduate from the Infantry School at Fort Benning, Georgia: Captain Parker was graduated in 1932, Captain Eagon in 1937, and the present First Lieutenant, Norman C. Finney, in 1938.

The 148th Infantry, Ohio National Guard was reorganized after the World War, being first designated as the Second Ohio Infantry, and received Federal recognition March 23, 1921. The Regiment has units in Toledo, Defiance, Clyde, Paulding, Fremont, Findley, Oak Harbor, Spencerville, Kenton, Bowling Green, Ottawa, Ada, St. Marys, Sidney, Napoleonville, Covington, Celina and Columbus.

Colonel Gilson D. Light was the first commander of the Regiment, serving from 1921 to 1924. Colonel Light then left the state of Ohio and was succeeded in command of the 148th by Colonel William L. Marlin. In 1926 Colonel Marlin was transferred to Cleveland and Colonel Light returned to command.

In 1935 Colonel Light was promoted to Brigadier General and was succeeded in command by Colonel Lee N. Murlin. On January 1, 1937, Colonel Murlin became Chief of Staff of the Thirty-seventh Division under General Light, who had since been promoted to Major General in command of the Thirty-seventh Division.

Colonel Murlin was replaced by Colonel Emil F. Marx, the present commanding officer of the regiment. Regimental Headquarters were maintained in Toledo until January 1, 1938, when they were moved to Columbus. The 148th Infantry was the first regiment in the United States to receive War Department sanction for its regimental insignia.







Headquarters Company, 148th Infantry was recruited and organized through the efforts of Captain Atkins, a World War veteran, and received Federal recognition March 3, 1921. Lieut. James C. Ewing, now commanding the Communications Platoon of Headquarters Company, 148th Infantry, was the Mess Sergeant of the new company. He is the only charter member remaining in the Company.

Captain Atkins was succeeded by Capt. Ralph H. Cannan in the fall of 1921, and under his direction the Company continued to improve in accordance with its motto "Better on to Best." A vacancy on the Regimental Staff caused the transfer of Captain Cannan to Regimental Headquarters. He has since been promoted to Major in command of the First Battalion of the regiment. Captain Cannan was suc-

ceeded by Capt. Thomas Bailey, who had served as a Lieutenant of Company "G," 148th Infantry, at Lima. During the years Captain Bailey was in command, 1928-33, special training was undertaken in radio work, and in this time a transmitter was built by the radio section, licensed and placed in operation in the amateur band.

In 1932, the Company won the regimental pennant for efficiency for the first time, and won it again the following year. In 1933 Captain Bailey resigned and was succeeded by Capt. Louis E. Fahrion, a World War veteran and a graduate of the Infantry School at Fort Benning, Ga.

In December, 1934, a disastrous fire at the Lucas County Armory destroyed all state and federal property, except the Signal equipment and part of the Company records. Temporary quarters had to be provided in a factory building.

A radio station under the call letters WXMD was established in 1937 for operation in the Thirty-seventh Division net. On July 30, 1938, the Company moved into the new Ohio State Armory, Wall street, Toledo, Ohio.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Although not in the direct line of descent, Company "G," Sixth Ohio Infantry is locally regarded as ancestor of the present Howitzer Company, 148th Infantry. Organized in 1908 by Capt. Albert B. DeKay, the Company participated in service at the Columbus street car strike, and had a short tour of duty in 1913, during the disastrous floods of that year.

In 1916, Company "G" was ordered to the Mexican Border and in 1917, was again inducted into service for the World War. During the war the Company was redesignated as a part of the 147th Infantry, and after service in France and Belgium, was demobilized following its return to the United States.

In 1920, Captain DeKay started the organization of a local unit, which in July of that year was recog-

nized as Company "A," Second Ohio Infantry. In 1921 the Company was redesignated as Howitzer Company, Second Ohio Infantry, and Captain DeKay resigned after fourteen years of service as a company commander. He was succeeded in command by Capt. James C. Marlatt. About this time the Company was redesignated as Howitzer Company, 148th Infantry.

In December, 1925, Captain Marlatt was succeeded in command by Capt. Homer H. Goltzene, the present company commander. Since its redesignation as a Howitzer Company, active duty of the Company has been confined to the regular summer encampments and one tour of duty in the southern Ohio coal mines, performed by a detail of twenty men and one officer.

This Company has won for itself a respected place in the life of its community and is determined to keep that respect alive.






FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "A," 148th Infantry was first organized in 1907 as Company "B," Second Ohio Infantry, with Captain A. N. Wilcox commanding, John P. Miller First Lieutenant and Dorr I. Gasser Second Lieutenant. The first official activity of the organization was participation in the Jamestown Exposition of 1917.

Capt. Charles A. Musgrave assumed command in 1910 and commanded the organization at Dayton, Ohio, during the flood of 1913.

Captain R. C. Leslie, First Lieut. D. O. Mellinger and Second Lieut. S. S. Beard, with fifty-five enlisted men, left for the Border in June 1916. They returned to the home station March 24, 1917, and on July 15, of the same year were recalled to the service for World War duty. The unit was ordered to Montgomery, Alabama, where it was demobilized for incorporation in various other units.

On December 22, 1920, the present Company "A," 148th Infantry was Federally recognized. Capt. Ed Finan commanded the Company until 1922, at which

time command of the Company was given to Capt. Frank E. Huston and Second Lieut. Andrew Hancher. First Lieut. August F. Ptak was added to the roster early in 1923 and assumed command in October of that year.

The Company was reorganized by Captain Ptak and Capt. Emil F. Marx, now Adjutant General of Ohio. Andrew Hancher was made First Lieutenant and Paul H. Underhill appointed Second Lieutenant. In 1926, Henry J. Donnell was commissioned Second Lieutenant. With the resignation of Lieutenant Underhill in 1932, Lieutenant Donnell was promoted to First Lieutenant and Marcus E. Ptak was commissioned Second Lieutenant.

Captain Ptak was promoted to Major in December 1936, and Captain Donnell was given command of the Company. Under the command of Captain Ptak Company "A" developed a "Very Satisfactory" rating, and has maintained that rating until the present. The Company is at all times ready to answer the call of duty in preserving peace and safety of the state.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "B," 148th Infantry is the direct descendant of the "Springfield Light Guard," an independent company of infantry organized at Springfield, September 29, 1873, and mustered into state service February 22, 1874. The Company received various assignments and designations during the next forty years.

On July 13, 1917, the unit was mustered into Federal service for overseas duty as Company "B," 148th Infantry. The Company was mustered out in 1919.

FREMONT, OHIO

The next year it was reorganized. On November 27, 1925, it was transferred to Fremont.

The Company's World War record is something of which it may well be proud. One of its members, Lieut. Albert Baesel, was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor and several other members were given lesser decorations and citations. On several occasions the Company has aided the civil authorities in state emergencies. In 1932 it won the Chief of Infantry Award for marksmanship.

Many former members have stepped into more responsible positions in the Ohio National Guard and Officers Reserve Corps. The following are still active: Brigadier General Ludwig S. Connelly (the former commanding officer), Capt. Henry M. Smith and Lieutenants Harry A. Comesky, Kennard Gephart and George Brown.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "C," 148th Infantry was first organized as an independent military unit by Capt. James Wilson in 1872. The Company was mustered into the National Guard December 10, 1874, and two years later was assigned to the Eleventh Ohio Regiment as Company "B." Its local designation was "Findlay Guards." In 1879, its letter designation was changed to "A," and in 1883, it was designated as Company "A," Second Ohio Infantry.

The Company was mustered into Federal service as Company "A," Second Ohio Volunteers Infantry on May 10, 1898, and served in the Spanish-American War under command of Capt. Tillman L. Laferty. The Company was reorganized August 17, 1899, being designated as Company "A" Unattached Infantry. The unit was assigned to the Second Regiment of Infantry November 13, 1899.


Its designation immediately prior to the World War was Company "A," First Battalion, Second Infantry, Ohio National Guard.

The Company was called out June 19, 1916, and mustered into service for action on the Mexican Border. During its service it was designated as Company "A," Second Regiment. It was mustered out of service on March 24, 1917.

On July 15, 1917, the Company entered the Federal service through the call of the President. It was mustered into service at Camp Sheridan August 5, and its designation changed to the 112th Depot Brigade. Its members were assigned to various units in the Thirty-seventh Division, and saw service on many fronts with that Division.

The Company was reorganized and mustered into service as Company "D," Second Infantry on December 20, 1920, redesignated as Company "C," Second Infantry April 22, 1921, and finally redesignated as Company "C," 148th Infantry on July 1, 1921.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The present Company "D," 148th Infantry was organized at Oak Harbor, Ohio, in 1911, as Company "M," Sixth Ohio Infantry. Prior to 1916, the outstanding service of the Company was duty at Dayton and Cincinnati during the disastrous floods of 1913.


Company "M" was included in the President's call for troops for service on the Mexican Border in 1916. At El Paso, Texas, the unit was engaged in training and border patrol duty. In March 1917, the unit left for Fort Riley, Kansas, where it was to be mustered out of service on the 20th, but relations with Germany were daily growing more strained and the Sixth Ohio Infantry was retained in service. Com-

pany "M" was stationed at Akron and Massillon for guard duty.

In October 1917, the regiment was recruited at Camp Sheridan, Alabama, where it was redesignated the 147th Infantry. The unit's history from this date to March 1919, is concurrent with that of the 147th Infantry and the Thirty-seventh Division.

The present organization was mustered into service on December 4, 1920, as Company "M," Second Ohio Infantry, and was later redesignated as Company "D," Second Ohio Infantry. On July 21, 1921, it received its present designation and since that time has answered the call of the governor on four occasions. Outstanding among these tours of duty was its service at President Harding's funeral in Marion, July 1923, and at Sandusky during the destructive tornado of June 1924.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "E," 148th Infantry is an indirect descendant of the "Squirrel Shooters" Company which was organized at the outbreak of the Civil War, many of whose members joined the Eighty-second Ohio Infantry when it was recruited in the district of Kenton. The original company continued to serve throughout the war and managed to retain its designation until 1878, when it was redesignated Company "K," Seventh Ohio Infantry.

In 1882, the Second Ohio Infantry was organized, with Companies "E" and "G" allotted to Kenton. Company "G" was named the "Robinson Guards" in honor of General James H. Robinson of Kenton.

In 1888, J. C. Howe of Kenton was elected Colonel of the regiment, and later made Adjutant General of Ohio. J. A. Kuert was named Colonel to succeed him and Headquarters of the Second Ohio Infantry was transferred to Kenton. Company "I" was organized in 1894, with H. L. Runkle in command.

Upon the outbreak of the Spanish-American War Kenton had more than 250 men in uniform. She fur-

nished Company "G," commanded by J. Guy Deming, Company "I," commanded by H. J. May, the Second Ohio Band, Signal Company and Hospital Corps, and the Headquarters and Staff of the Regiment. The Second Ohio Infantry was disbanded April 14, 1898.

When a new regiment was organized with headquarters in Lima, Company "I" of Kenton was reorganized with Frank S. Ansley as commander. The unit saw service on the Mexican Border in 1916 under command of Edward H. Collins. Captain Collins also commanded Company "I," then a part of the 146th Infantry, overseas during the World War.

The present unit was mustered into service December 19, 1920, as Company "E," Second Ohio Infantry, under command of Capt. John Polly. Other officers of the unit were First Lieutenant U. J. Coates and Second Lieut. Loucks B. Brown, now assistant adjutant general and executive officer of the 148th Infantry. The unit was redesignated as Company "E," 148th Infantry on August 26, 1921. The present commander, Capt. Cecil J. Davis, assumed command June 1, 1924.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The first National Guard unit organized in Wood county was known as the "Bloomdale Rifles," and is remembered chiefly because of the internationally known rifleman, "Cap" Richards, who at one time was commander of the company.

Sometime later a company known as Company "H," Second Ohio Infantry was formed, and an Armory was built for its use at Bowling Green. This unit served the Federal government in the Mexican Border campaign and fought during the World War. Through both these periods of service the unit was commanded by Capt. Ray Avery. Capt. Avery is

still a close friend and ardent supporter of the present Company "F" of Bowling Green.

Following the World War a Battery of artillery was organized, commanded successively by Captains Alvah Bachman, Ray Ladd, C. M. Galliher and Lee R. Crawford.

On April 29, 1937, the Second Battalion Combat Train, 135th Field Artillery was transferred to Toledo, and Company "F" was organized in its place. This Company has continued to grow and win the respect and esteem of the citizens of Wood county, and is today regarded as a civic institution in the community of Bowling Green.

The Armory has been considerably improved since organization of Company "F," and the Company can now boast of the most modern quarters.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "G," 148th Infantry was first organized in June 1901, as Company "M," Second Ohio Infantry under the command of Captain J. W. Smith, who, until 1914, was followed successively by Captains J. W. Row, Dolby Crawfis, L. E. Eastman and Guy Cartwright. During this time the organization was called into active state duty to serve during the Springfield riots, the Columbus street car strike and the 1913 Dayton flood.

The organization was called into Federal service for duty on the Mexican Border in September 1916, and was stationed at Fort Bliss, El Paso, Texas. In March 1917, the organization was mustered out at Fort Sheridan, Illinois.



The Company was called back into Federal service July 15, 1917, for World War duty, and was ordered to Camp Sheridan, Alabama. Upon disbandment of

the Second Ohio Infantry, the personnel of the Company was transferred to Company "M," 146th Infantry, Thirty-seventh Division. The unit served overseas from May 1918 to April 1919, and was engaged in operations of the Baccarat sector, Flanders and the Meuse-Argonne offensive.

When the Ohio National Guard was Federalized following the World War, this unit was reorganized and designated the 123rd Wagon Company, Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Trains, and was placed under the command of Capt. Victor H. Goedde, who was succeeded by Capt. Guy E. Kersh in 1936. On May 15, 1936, the organization was redesignated Company "G," 148th Infantry. Upon the death of Captain Kersh, Lieutenant W. L. Goedde assumed command. He was followed on June 15, 1937, by the present commander, Capt. Vernon F. Hydaker.

Within the past few years the unit has responded to call in several state emergencies, principally the Cincinnati flood in 1936.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "H," 148th Infantry was first organized by Dr. L. B. Tyson at Kenton on November 9, 1877, as Company "G," Eleventh Infantry. It was known locally as the "Robinson Guard," but its designation of Company "G" was retained when it became part of the Second Infantry in 1883.

The Company was mustered into state service November 10, 1899, as Company "G," unattached, and assigned to the new Second Regiment on November 13, 1899.

During the Spanish-American War in 1898, the Company was organized for volunteer service on April 25, and was mustered in at Columbus as Company "G," Second Ohio Volunteer Infantry on May 10, 1898. It was mustered out of service at Macon, Georgia, February 10, 1899.

Capt. Walter Elliott succeeded Capt. Cliff Deming in command of the Company, and was in charge when the unit served during the Street Car Strike in Columbus in 1910. Capt. Harlo Povernire took command shortly after, and commanded the Company in its service at the 1913 Dayton flood, on the Mexican Border and through the World War.

In 1916, a portion of Company "G" was designated as detail Machine Gun Company, commanded by Second Lieut. Floyd Elliott, who took the unit to the Border. On the Border Capt. Jenkins took command of the unit, but was shortly after succeeded by Captain Elliott. Capt. James West organized the "Home Guard," and after the World War the Company he commanded was mustered into the National Guard.

Captain Cloyd Jameson succeeded Captain West as commander of Company "G." The Company was redesignated Company "H," Machine Gun Company. Captain Murlin took the place of Captain Jameson, and when he was commissioned Major of the Second Battalion, Capt. Juston McElroy took command. Under him the Company has seen active service at Nelsonville in 1932, Toledo strike in 1934, and the Cincinnati flood in 1936.







FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "L," Third Infantry, of which the present Company "I," 148th Infantry is an outgrowth, was organized in 1877, and reorganized when volunteers were called for in 1898, in the war with Spain. On May 10, 1898, Company "L" was mustered into service, under command of Captain W. T. Amos. During the war the Company was stationed at Tampa and Fernandina, Florida, finally being mustered out at Columbus on October 26, 1898.

The Company remained a live one from the Spanish-American War up to 1916, as evidenced by the readiness with which the men responded to the second call for their services following Villa's raid on Columbus, New Mexico. Until March 23, 1917, the Company remained near El Paso; on that date it was ordered with its regiment to Fort Riley, Kansas for muster out, but en route received orders to proceed to Fort Benjamin Harrison at Indianapolis, Ind. Three days after arriving at Fort Benjamin Harrison

the regiment was given orders to guard public utilities at certain points in Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana and West Virginia.

Company "L" remained on this duty until August 13, when it was ordered to Chillicothe, Ohio, for guard duty in connection with the construction of the cantonment later known as Camp Sherman. On October 21, 1917, the regiment was given orders to entrain for Camp Sheridan, Montgomery, Ala., at which point the regiment became known as the 148th Infantry.

Company "L" landed at Brest, France on July 4, 1917, and went into camp at Pontenezen Barracks. During the war the Company was located in the Baccarat sector from August 4 to September 16. From September 25 to October 1, it was engaged in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive; from October 7 to October 16, it was in the Pannes sector; from October 31 to November 4, it was in Flanders along the Lys

CAMP SHELBY



Major General Blanding, Brigadier General O'Keefe and Some

Located approximately twelve miles south of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, Camp Shelby was named during the World War in honor of the first Governor of Kentucky, Col. Isaac Shelby. Born in Maryland, Colonel Shelby, as a member of the Virginia Militia, distinguished himself at King's Mountain, 1780, and in the South Carolina campaign, 1781. As the first governor of Kentucky, he received the thanks of Congress for the Battle of the Thames, 1813.

Named in his honor, this camp was the training quarters during the World War for the Thirty-eighth Division. More than 36,000 men trained here. It was the healthiest large or divisional camp in the United States, having the lowest death rate of any.

The reservation comprises approximately 5,100 acres of

FACTUAL HISTORY

The first military company organized in Napoleon, Ohio, after the Civil War was designated as Company "F," Napoleon Light Guard and was mustered in as such in 1872 with J. B. Couch as Captain. Captain Couch was succeeded by Captain J. D. Norton and Company "F" was assigned to the Sixteenth Regiment, Ohio National Guard in 1877.

The Company was organized for volunteer service in the Spanish-American War under Captain J. A. Musser, and was mustered in as Company "F," Sixth Ohio Volunteer Infantry May 12, 1898. The Company arrived at Cienfuegos, Cuba January 4, 1899, and left Cuba for Savannah, Georgia April 26, 1899.

The unit was reorganized under Captain J. M. Reiger November 6, 1899, and in addition to its annual

encampments rendered service to the state on numerous occasions. Company "F," Sixth Ohio Volunteer Infantry, Capt. Harry R. Lowry commanding, was called into service on the Mexican Border June 1916. It stayed on the Border until March 1917, when it entered the service of the United States for World War duty. The Company was ordered to Cleveland for guard duty and remained until September 1917. At Camp Sheridan Company "F," Sixth Ohio and Company "F," First Ohio Infantry were combined to form Company "F," 147th Infantry.

The Company sailed from Newport News June 23, 1918, and arrived at Brest, France, July 5, 1918. The Company served in the Baccarat sector, the battle of the Meuse-Argonne, at the St. Mihiel salient, and was engaged in operations in Flanders until the Armistice.

On April 11, 1921, Frank E. Brownell organized the First Separate Company, Second Infantry in Napoleon. This unit was redesignated Headquarters

FACTUAL HISTORY

The present Company "M," 148th Infantry was first organized at Covington as an independent company on October 31, 1872, with the local designation of "Covington Guards." It was mustered into service July 8, 1873, and assigned as Company "A," Fifth Ohio Battalion of Infantry. On July 21, 1875, it was assigned to the Third Regiment and served as such until it was mustered into service April 26, 1898, for service in the Spanish-American War. It was mustered out of service October 26, 1878, at Columbus.

Capt. Joseph C. Ullery was first Captain of the organization. When the unit was assigned to the Third Regiment he was made Colonel and James E. Shellenberger was made Captain of the Company. On November 6, 1899, the unit was reorganized as Company "A," Third Regiment and remained under that designation until Mexican Border service in 1916 and 1917.

At the entrance of the United States into the World War the Company was sent to Columbus for guard

duty. Following this tour of duty the Company was sent overseas, landing at Brest, France. Its first front line experience was gained in the Baccarat sector and its major engagements include the Meuse-Argonne drive, service on the St. Mihiel front and the Belgian drive. It was ordered home after the war and mustered out at Camp Sherman, April 17, 1919, after two years and ten months of service.

The Company was reorganized January 28, 1921, and designated as Company "M," 148th Infantry (Machine Gun Company). It is now commanded by Capt. Rolla R. Dunkle, who has been in command since July 14, 1927.

The Company saw service as Company "A," at the Bradford railroad riot of 1876; the Columbus and Newark railroad riot of 1877; the Cincinnati riots of 1883 and 1884; the street car riot in Columbus in 1910, and flood duty at Piqua and Dayton in 1913. As Company "M," 148th Infantry the unit served in the Auto-Lite riot in Toledo in 1934 and saw flood service in Cincinnati in January 1937.

Appointed First Lieutenant of Company E, Fourth Infantry, Ohio National Guard, March 20, 1908, and Captain, August 7, 1906. Promoted to Major, Fourth Infantry, May 30, 1909. Mustered into Federal service July 11, 1916, for service on the Mexican Border, serving until March 3, 1917. Mustered into Federal service again on July 15, 1917. Served in the World War as a Battalion Commander, 166th Infantry, Forty-second (Rainbow) Division, and as a Staff Officer to the Commanding General, Fifth Army Corps. He was overseas from November 1, 1917, to April 11, 1919. Appointed Lieutenant Colonel, General Staff Corps, March 3, 1919. Discharged April 12, 1919. Awarded the Silver Star and Purple Heart decorations. Appointed Lieutenant Colonel in the Ohio National Guard on May 21, 1920, and assigned to the 166th Infantry. Appointed Brigadier General and assigned to the command of the 74th Brigade, December 10, 1920. Served as Adjutant General of Ohio under Governor Donahey from January 8, 1923, to January 14, 1929, and under Governor White from January 12, 1931, to January 12, 1935.



BRIGADE HISTORY

The Seventy-fourth Infantry Brigade, Thirty-seventh Division, United States Army was organized in October 1917, by consolidating the First and Sixth Ohio Infantry into the 147th Infantry, filling the Third Ohio Infantry from elements of the Second and Seventh Ohio Regiments to form the 138th Infantry, and redesignating the Third Battalion of the Tenth Infantry the 136th Machine Gun Battalion. General William V. McMaken was made commander of the newly-formed Brigade.

Brigadier General Joseph A. Gaston succeeded to the command of the Brigade on April 2, 1918, and remained in command until transferred to command of a depot brigade at Camp Meade on June 19. His place was taken by Colonel Frederick W. Galbraith, when the Brigade was moved to Newport News. On June 22, it embarked for France. It went into training in the Beaumont area, where Colonel Galbraith was replaced by Brigadier General William P. Jackson.

From August 4 to September 18, the Brigade took over the Baccarat sector in Lorraine. It was later

assigned to the First Army as the center division of the three assault divisions which bore the brunt of the Meuse-Argonne offensive. As a part of the Thirty-seventh Division, Fifth Army Corps the Brigade participated in the capture of the German stronghold Montfaucon. Following a brief rest period in the first week of October, the Brigade was ordered to take over the Pannes-Remy sub-sector in the Thiécourt area and after holding this sector for a week, it was ordered to the Belgian front to participate in the two offensives of Ypres-Lys.

On March 22, 1919, the Brigade embarked at Brest for the United States, arriving at Hoboken on March

30, and was immediately sent to Camp Mills. The Brigade was mustered out of service at Camp Sherman May 1, 1919.

Following the World War the Second Infantry Brigade was Federally reorganized December 10, 1920, and on July 1, 1921, was redesignated as the Seventy-fourth Infantry Brigade, composed of the 147th Infantry and the 166th Infantry, with Headquarters and Headquarters Company stationed in Columbus. Brigadier General Frank D. Henderson was appointed Brigade commander.


Since 1920, the Seventy-fourth Brigade has performed its annual field training period at Camp Perry, with the exception of 1927, when Brigade Headquarters participated in a CPX at Fort Knox and 1936, when the Seventy-fourth Brigade engaged in the Second Army maneuvers at Fort Knox.


In 1937 the Brigade was called upon for active state duty in the maintenance of law and order in the "Little Steel" Strike. It served from June 22 to July 15, 1937, in Youngstown, Struthers, Campbell, Hubbard, Niles, Warren and Cleveland, with detachments at Canton and Massillon.

The 147th Infantry, Ohio National Guard was first organized in 1877, as the Sixteenth Ohio Infantry. It was composed of the following companies:

The Sixteenth Infantry, with minor changes, continued in state service under that designation until May 5, 1898 when it was redesignated the Sixth Ohio Volunteer Infantry for service in the Spanish-American War. The Regiment saw service in Cuba from January 3, 1898 to April 21, 1899.

The Regiment was recalled into service June 19, 1916, for the Mexican Border campaign, and following this tour of duty was combined with the First

Ohio Infantry to form the 147th Infantry. After a brief training period overseas in the Baccarat sector, the Regiment moved to the Ypres area where it was assigned to the French Army Corps. During the war it served in the operations of Lorraine, Meuse-Argonne and Ypres-Lys. Following the war it was disbanded at Camp Sherman and later redesignated the 147th Infantry, being Federally recognized March 11, 1921.

Since its reorganization the Regiment has rendered exceptional services to the state in various emergencies. It was on duty during the Hocking Valley coal strike in June and July 1932, the Ohio river flood from January 24 to February 6, 1937, and the Youngstown steel strike, from June 21 to July 14, 1937, where its capable handling of the dangerous situation averted what might have been one of the bloodiest chapters in the state's history.

The efficient leadership of the Battalion and Company officers, under the direction of the Regimental Commander and his Staff, has made the 147th Infantry one of the outstanding units in the National Guard of the United States.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "K," 148th Infantry was Federally recognized in September 1907, as Company "K," Second Ohio Infantry, under the command of Capt. Charles Mooney. The Company was called into Federal service for action on the Mexican Border July 5, 1916, and was mustered out of service March 28, 1917.

On June 15, 1917, the Company was recalled to the service for duty overseas. Its designation at that time was Company "B," 147th Infantry, and as such

it saw service at St. Mihiel, Ypres-Lys, Meuse-Argonne and the Alsace-Lorraine offensive. The Company was released from the service in May 1919.

During the next few years the Company underwent numerous changes in its designation. It became Company "K," Second Infantry June 23, 1919; Company "K," Third Infantry August 2, 1920; Headquarters Company, Third Battalion, 148th Infantry July 1, 1921, and Company "K," 148th Infantry April 1, 1922.

Company "K" was the first company of the Ohio National Guard to be organized after the World War. Emil F. Marx, the present Adjutant General of Ohio, organized the Company and became its first commanding officer.








FACTUAL HISTORY

The Service Company, 147th Infantry was first organized as the Supply Company, First Infantry, Ohio National Guard, in May, 1917. At that time it was commanded by Capt. Willard O. Lathrop, with Second Lieut. Arnold Shircliff second in command.

This Company was combined with the Supply Company, Sixth Infantry at Camp Sheridan in October 1917, to form the Supply Company, 147th Infantry. This new unit embarked for France June 23, 1918. In France and Belgium, as part of the Thirty-seventh Division, the Supply Company, 147th Infantry rendered valiant service in the Bourmont area, Baccarat sector, Avocourt sector, Meuse-Argonne, Pannes sector, Ypres-Lys and Lys-Escaut offensives.

The Company returned to the United States immediately following the war and was mustered out of service at Camp Sherman April 19, 1919.

The Company's post-war history begins with its Federal recognition as Service Company, 147th Infantry on March 11, 1921, under command of Captain A. M. Cooper. Commanders since that time have been Captains Stephen C. Marvin, Willard J. Havlin, Edwin F. Heilman, Fred Rohdenburg, Edwin F. Heilman and Henry A. Rattermann.

Capt. Fred Rohdenburg died while in command and was buried with full military honors, with Service Company serving as guard of honor, and the Cincinnati company commanders as pallbearers, led by the regimental band and the commanding officer and his staff.

Service Company, under difficulties of procurement and transportation, very successfully served a provisional regiment of 2000 officers and men in the Cincinnati flood area from January 24 to February 6, 1937, with a saving to the state of about \$4,000 on the estimated cost. In the steel strike at Youngstown and Cleveland in June and July of 1937, the Company again demonstrated its worth.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Howitzer Company, 147th Infantry was organized in the fall of 1904 as Company "L," Seventh Ohio Infantry, under the command of Capt. Clarence L. Bond. The personnel of the unit was transferred in the fall of 1912, to Company "M," First Ohio Infantry, Captain S. T. Gray in command. A later transfer was made to Company "A," Fourth Ohio Infantry, under the same command.


Company "A," Fourth Ohio Infantry was mustered out in July 1916, and Company "G," Fourth Ohio Infantry was formed under command of Capt. Don L. Caldwell. This Company was called into Federal service for the World War in May 1917. At Camp

Perry this unit was redesignated Company "G," 166th Infantry and saw service overseas with the famous Rainbow Division.

Company "G," 166th Infantry was mustered out of Federal service at Camp Sherman, Ohio in 1919. On June 30, 1919, was mustered into service under command of Captain Caldwell, as Supply Company, Fourth Ohio Infantry; was redesignated Company "G," Fourth Ohio Infantry, and finally redesignated Company "G," 166th Infantry.

Company "G" was redesignated Headquarters Company, Third Battalion, 166th Infantry, under the command of First Lieut. Harley Shaffer. This Company was transferred to the 147th Infantry and converted to a Howitzer Company July 1, 1926, under command of Capt. Nelson E. Heaton.







FACTUAL HISTORY

The present Company "A," 147th Infantry was first organized August 8, 1868, by a group of Civil War veterans, who assembled in the George street fire engine house to form the organization known as the "Cincinnati Zouaves."

Company "A" was mustered into service at Cincinnati July 25, 1871, and was locally known as the "Wayne Guards." The unit served as Company "A," Third (or German) Battalion. On May 29, 1876, the organization was assigned to the First Battalion, First Regiment. The Company disbanded on July 11, 1878, but was reorganized as the "Longworth Rifles" on August 13, 1878. On April 14, 1899, the Company was assigned to the First Separate Battalion Infantry as Company "A."

The Company saw active service for two weeks at Columbus and Newark during the railway strikes of 1877; served during the Cincinnati flood of 1883-84; the Cincinnati riot of 1884; saw two weeks of active service in the Cincinnati labor trouble of 1886, and saw riot duty at the Washington Court House in 1894.

Upon the outbreak of the Spanish-American War the Company was organized for the Volunteer service at Cincinnati on April 26, 1898 and was mustered



in at Columbus as Company "A," First Ohio Volunteer Infantry, May 7, 1898. It was mustered out of service October 25, 1899.

The Company resumed its duties in the First Ohio Infantry in 1899, and continued as such until 1917, when it was shipped to Camp Sheridan, Alabama and redesignated Company "A," 147th Infantry. The Company served honorably with its regiment in France and Belgium. The First Sergeant of Company "A" during the World War was Winifield I. Gunne, now living in Norwood, Ohio. From the close of the war until 1921 the Company served as a unit of the First Ohio Infantry. On December 21, 1921, Company "A" received Federal recognition and was designated as Company "A," 147th Infantry. Its active duty includes relief duty for coal miners at St. Clairsville in 1928; strike duty at Nelsonville in 1932; flood duty at Cincinnati in 1937, and service during the Little Steel Strike at Youngstown and Cleveland in 1937.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "C," 147th Infantry was first organized in 1868, as a company of the old Cincinnati Zouave Battalion. This Battalion was intended for a drill unit rather than a fighting unit, and its unit companies became several of the outstanding drill companies of the country.

During the Spanish-American War the Battalion became part of the First Regiment, Ohio National Guard and as such was mobilized when the United States entered the World War. The Battalion was sent to Camp Sheridan, Alabama, for training, where all its

units received new designations. Company "C," 147th Infantry came into being through a combining of Company "C," Seventh Ohio and Company "H," First Ohio. In this way the Company was made a part of the Thirty-seventh Division.

The Division went overseas and served honorably in France and Belgium. Company "C," 147th Infantry gained the distinction of capturing the first German prisoners that were captured by the Thirty-seventh Division in the World War.

Company "C" returned to the United States with the division after the war and was demobilized, April 19, 1919, at Camp Sherman, Ohio.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The World War history of Company "D," 147th Infantry is coincidental with that of the 147th Infantry Regiment. Following the reorganization of the National Guard after the World War, the present Company "D" was mustered into service in 1920, as Company "H," 147th Infantry, at Springfield, Ohio. It was not until March 5, 1926, that this unit was transferred to Cincinnati.

When Cincinnati's Company "H" was first mustered it was under command of Capt. Irvin H. Rowe, an officer who had seen extensive front line service overseas. Junior officers of the Company were First Lieut. Charles Gravenkemper and Second Lieut. Walter Robeson.


In the summer of 1930, the Company's designation was changed to "D." Captain Rowe resigned December 31 of that same year, and was succeeded by the present commander, Capt. Frank T. Balke, January 1, 1931. Present junior officers of the unit

are Lieutenants Roberts A. Ibold and Robert C. Siler.

Since the muster of the present company in Cincinnati in 1926, it has attended twelve field training periods at Camp Perry and one at Fort Knox. In 1932, the unit saw service in the southeastern Ohio coal field strikes. In 1937, it was on duty two weeks during the Ohio river flood and later in the same year, saw five weeks of service in the Mahoning Valley steel riots. Through all these tours of state duty the Company has been outstanding in its discipline and in the soldierly bearing and appearance of its personnel.

Two enlisted members of the unit have particularly long and honorable service records. First Sgt. Gregory A. Myers enlisted in Company "H" in October 1927, and has served continuously in the organization since that date. Supply Sgt. Harry Pyle served with the Fourth Kentucky Volunteer Infantry during the Spanish-American War and has been with the Kentucky National Guard and the Ohio National Guard continuously since that time. He has served with Company "D," 147th Infantry for the past thirteen years.





FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "E," 147th Infantry was first organized in June 1883, as the "Ellison Light Guards" and designated as Company "C," Thirteenth Ohio Infantry, with Captain D. R. Shriver in command. The Company saw state service during the Cincinnati Courthouse Riots and the Ohio River flood of 1884.

The Company was redesignated as Company "C," Sixth Ohio Infantry in 1886, and with that regiment attended a centennial celebration in New York city in 1888. The following year the unit was disbanded with the rest of the Sixth Regiment. It was reorganized in November, 1900 as Company "G," Seventh Ohio Infantry, under Captain W. V. Cooley. As Company "G" it saw service at President McKinley's funeral in 1901, the Hanging Rock riots of 1906, the Ohio river flood of 1907, the Night Rider Tobacco

War of 1908, and the inauguration of President Taft in 1909.

In October 1910, it was redesignated Company "L," First Ohio Infantry and in 1913, saw state service in the Ohio river flood. In 1917, the unit was called out for service in the World War, mustered into Federal service July 15, 1917, and ordered to Camp Sheridan, Alabama, where it was combined with Company "L," Third Ohio Infantry to make Company "L," 148th Infantry. The Company saw service in France along the fronts of the Baccarat sector, the Meuse-Argonne and Ypres-Lys. It was mustered out of service April 22, 1919.

The unit was reorganized by Capt. Harry Yates and was Federally recognized as Company "E," 147th Infantry on February 4, 1921. It was later redesignated as Company "I," 147th Infantry. On October 1, 1931, it was redesignated as Company "E," 147th Infantry. Since receiving this last designation the unit has seen service in the eastern Ohio coal strikes of 1932, Ohio river floods of 1933, 1936 and 1937, and the steel strike of 1937.

The Company was again reorganized and mustered in on April 28, 1920, as Company "I," Fourth Ohio Infantry, under Capt. Iven J. Laymon. Since that time the Company has been designated as Company "I," First Ohio Infantry; Headquarters Company, Second Battalion, 147th Infantry and Company "F," 147th Infantry, its present designation.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "G," 147th Infantry was first organized in 1880, as the "Scott Dragoons," a company which was later redesignated Company "F," Thirteenth Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry. It was mustered into Federal service May 10, 1898, and served through the Spanish-American War as Company "F," Third Regiment, under command of Capt. Thomas I. Brooks. The Company did not leave the United States during the War, remaining in training camps at Tampa, Fla., Fernandino, Fla., and Huntsville, Ala. It was mustered out of Federal service October 26, 1898, at Columbus, Ohio.

The Company was reorganized in 1899, and officially designated as Company "D," First Infantry Regiment, Ohio National Guard. It retained this designation until October 26, 1917. During this period it was commanded by Captains Lyne Smith, Oliver H. Hughes, A. W. Underwood, Milt Wedding and Earle V. Miller.

The Company was called for service in the World War during May 1917, and was mustered into Federal service July 15, 1917. On October 26, 1917, it was transferred intact to Company "D," 147th Infantry and on December 24, 1917 it was again transferred intact to Machine Gun Company, 147th Infantry, commanded by Capt. Earle V. Miller. The unit saw service in France on the Alsace Lorraine front, Meuse-Argonne offensive, St. Mihiel salient and the first and second engagements of Ypres-Lys. It was mustered out of Federal service April 19, 1919.

The Company was again reorganized, and received Federal recognition March 18, 1921, as Company "G," 147th Infantry. Since reorganization it has been commanded by Captains Ancile R. Thomas, John A. Blount, DeForest R. Roush and the present commander, Mathew L. Crabtree. Junior officers of the unit are First Lieut. Walter N. Davies and Second Lieut. James B. Gall.


The Company was made a component part of the Third Ohio Infantry and assigned as Company "F." Commanders of this unit were Captains George H.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "I," 147th Infantry was mustered into service and given Federal recognition as Company "B," 147th Infantry, on December 1, 1924. The original officers of the Company were Capt. Henderson Estes, First Lieut. George Davies and Second Lieut. Edward Tress. Two of the original enlisted men, Privates Leo P. Strickler and Edward H. Hobbs, now First Sergeant and Sergeant respectively, are still members of the organization.

The Company was redesignated as Company "I," 147th Infantry on September 24, 1930.

On three occasions since 1932 the Company has been called out on state service. In June 1932, Lieut.

Douglas Brown and sixteen enlisted men were sent to Athens county for duty in the mine strike in the Nelsonville area. The tour of duty lasted twenty-eight days. In January 1937, Capt. Robert I. Stuart, First Lieut. William H. Adams and Second Lieut. Frank S. Robbins, Jr., and fifty-one enlisted men were sent to Cincinnati for duty during the flood emergency. This detail served for fourteen days with the police of the First District.

In June 1937, the Company was ordered to Youngstown and Cleveland for duty in the "Little Steel Strike." Captain Stuart, First Lieut. Frank Robbins and Second Lieut. Robert M. Martindale, with forty-nine enlisted men, remained fourteen days in Youngstown and ten days in Cleveland.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The present Company "K," 147th Infantry was first organized as the "Hamilton Light Guard" October 14, 1875. The first officers were Capt. George H. Phillips, First Lieutenant R. N. Shotts and Second Lieut. John A. Keller. Three years later, 1878, it was given the designation of Company "G," Fourth Infantry.

Successive commanding officers and the years in which they took command are as follows: Capt. Robert N. Shotts, 1881; Capt. John A. Keller, 1883; Capt. Charles L. Hunter, 1885; Capt. W. C. Hunter, 1889; Capt. Frederick A. Rife, 1891; Capt. Frank D. Bristley, 1894, and Captain A. W. Margedent 1897.

In 1898 the Company was mustered into the service of the United States for action in the Spanish-American War as Company "E," First Ohio Volunteer Infantry. It was mustered out of Federal service April 14, 1899. The Company was not organized again until 1910, at which time command of the Company was given to Capt. Charles Hunter.

In 1916, Capt. Hunter was retired for age and Lieut. Wesley Wulzen was assigned to reorganize the

Company. It was then ordered to the Border and Lieut. Wulzen was made Captain.

With the declaration of war on Germany the designation of the Company was changed to Company "E," 147th Infantry, and under that designation made an excellent record for service in France. After the war it was reorganized as Company "E," First Infantry, later changed to Company "C" in the same regiment. On July 1, 1921, the letter designation remained the same, but the Company was assigned to the 147th Infantry and since that time has been known as Company "F," Company "C" and now as Company "K" of the same regiment. Captains during that time were J. Wesley Morris, Jr., Frank Williams and Tester Doyle. At present the Company is commanded by Capt. Arthur D. Fille.

Aside from its war time service the Company has served the state during a mine strike, the flood emergency in the spring of 1937, and the Mahoning Valley strike during the summer of 1937.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "L," 147th Infantry was first organized as Company "E," Fourth Infantry, Ohio National Guard on July 26, 1876, and was locally known as the "Fay Light Guards." Capt. John O'Brien was in command. This unit was disbanded January 12, 1884, and reorganized July 9, 1884, as Company "E," Thirteenth Infantry, with Capt. William G. Marshall commanding. On May 11, 1887, it was assigned to the Thirteenth Infantry as Company "G." After again being disbanded June 14, 1890, it was reorganized May 6, 1902, as Company "I," Fourth Infantry, with Capt. Charles L. Bull in command.

The Company was mobilized on June 19, 1916, and sent to the Mexican Border, where it remained until March 21, 1917. Before this unit could be mustered

out of service, it was needed for World War duty. It was redesignated Company "I," 148th Infantry and ordered to assemble with its regiment at Cincinnati. On October 10, it was sent to Camp Sheridan, Alabama, where it was stationed until it was ordered to France, June 18, 1918. The unit had preliminary training at Bourmont until the latter part of July, when it was sent into the Baccarat sector. On August 4, it occupied the front line trenches for the first time. The unit served in the Baccarat sector, in the Meuse-Argonne offensive, in the Pannes sector, at St. Mihiel, and in the Ypres-Lys offensive.

After the war the unit was reorganized as Company "E," 147th Infantry, and in December 1923, was redesignated as Company "L," 147th Infantry, under command of Capt. LeRoy Johns. Captain Johns was succeeded by Captain O. H. Cornwell. Present officers of the unit are Capt. Harold L. Hays, First Lieut. Francis R. Woodruff and Lieut. John G. Baldner.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "M," 147th Infantry was organized in the spring of 1921, by Capt. Harry Johnson, assisted by First Lieut. Fred W. Smith and Second Lieut. Paul W. Schweikert. Federal recognition was granted on May 21, 1921.

In 1922, Captain Johnson resigned and First Lieut. Smith was promoted to Captain. At the same time Second Lieutenant Schweikert was promoted to First Lieutenant and Croumert J. Walker was appointed Second Lieutenant. Second Lieutenant Walker resigned in 1923, and Herbert A. Littleton succeeded him. Lieutenants Schweikert and Littleton were transferred to Company "H," 147th Infantry, in 1924, and Lieutenants R. C. Hanes and R. E. West were appointed to succeed them respectively. In 1925 Captain Smith resigned and Ova M. Carr was appointed First Lieutenant. He later took Captain Smith's place

as Captain. In the same year Lieutenant West resigned from the Company.

Captain Carr resigned in 1926, and was succeeded by Lieutenant Hanes. C. W. Stine was appointed Second Lieutenant and later in the year advanced to First Lieutenant. Lieutenant Stine resigned in 1928, and C. C. Vonderheide was appointed First Lieutenant. J. G. Baker was appointed Second Lieutenant. Lieutenant Vonderheide was transferred to Company "D," 147th Infantry and in 1930, Lieutenant Baker was transferred to the same unit.

Lieutenants Prestin and Stanl were transferred to the National Guard Reserve in 1936, and First Lieut. Jack D. Sheets was transferred from Company "H," 147th Infantry to this organization. Cecil Flint was appointed Second Lieutenant. In 1937, Captain Hanes was promoted to Major commanding the Third Battalion, 147th Infantry, and First Lieutenant Sheets was promoted to Captain.




