**ANGELES, SOTERIOS LOUIS**

Address—Garden City, Kansas; Pvt.; Army; served as truck driver with the Transportation Corps in the Interior; inducted Sept. 10, 1942 and served 7 months; decorations, Purple Heart; Killed April 4, 1944.

**BEACH, REX**

Address—Garden City, Kansas; Navy; Ensign; served as Navigator in the Pacific Theater; enlisted 10-20-41 and served 22 months; Killed when plane crashed 8-8-43.



**BREIT, HUBERT**

Address—Garden City, Kansas; St. Sgt.; Army; served as gunner with the 2nd Division in the European Theater; inducted 6-15-43 and served 18 months; decorations, Purple Heart; Killed 1-20-45 in Belgium.

**COUNTRYMAN, ERNEST H.**

Address—Garden City, Kansas; Cpl.; Army; served as an engineer in the Engineer Corps in Iran; inducted 7-3-42 and served 21 months; died January 23, 1944; Plot 1, Row D, Grave 4. Their resting place is a plot of ground on a wooded knoll at Amirabad Post, PGC Headquarters, where the foot hills of the towering Elburz Mountains slope down toward the plain and city of Teheran.
