





MINUTES OF THE BUSINESS MEETING, 63RD DIVISION ASSOCIATION MARRIOTT PAVILION HOTEL, ST. LOUIS, MO., AUGUST 6, 1988

The 40th Annual Meeting of the 63rd Inf. Div. Association was opened at 9:45 A.M. by the National President Gene Rombach in the Pavilion Ballroom of the St. Louis Marriott Pavilion Hotel. There were approximately 225 members present at the opening and a number of additional members arrived during the Meeting.

President Rombach lead the members in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. This was followed by the Invocation given by the Past Secretary/Treasurer Ed Witt.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read by Ed Witt and a Motion was made by Bill Martin and Seconded by Ed Hooven to accept the Minutes. Motion carried.

Ed Witt then gave the Financial Report as prepared by Tom Liszka, our current Secretary/Treasurer, who was hospitalized Thursday in St. Louis. The Financial Report depicted a balance on hand as of August 1, 1988 of \$21,499.65 and included a detailed summary of the status of 730 letters sent to members who haven't paid dues - some as long as 1960 and others as recent as 1986. A Motion was made by Shorty Myers and Seconded by Ed Fowle to accept the Financial Report. Motion carried.

President Rombach then introduced our Medal of Honor recipient John Crews and Jerry Rosenberg who has attended every Reunion. Both men received a standing ovation. President rombach then had all first-timers stand and be recognized. There were about 30 men standing and a group photo should be in the next issue of the Blood and Fire.

Our Historian, Mike Baymor, reported on the status of the Hatcher Book which is now sold out. There are about 50 requests for another printing but from an economical standpoint we would require a reprint of 500 copies so it was decided not to reorder at this time.

Mike has received a request for certain issues of old Blood and Fires for the Miss. Archives — the listing of requested issues will be shown in the next issue of our B. & F. Any person wishing to give old 63rd artifacts to a legitimate Museum please contact Mike for the Camp Shelby address.

A Mr. Kozial of Schwabishhall, Germany is writing a history on Waldenburg and the battle we had there. He would appreciate any information you fellows could furnish.

Mike is planning on himself, Mag Froberg and Bill Scott writing a more complete 63rd Division History - more on this subject in upcoming issues of the B. & F.

Nate Spiegel then gave his Editor's Report and advised that the closing date for material going into the November Issue would be October 5, 1988.

Nate also asked for more profile items. Asked that they be kept reasonably short - not as job resumes - including old photo and a current picture. Nate always needs news items, so don't be bashful. Let us know some news etc.

Shorty Myers, 253 HQ., a very faithful and hard-working member of the Association, explained to the membership the efforts being made to making a movie - via VCR - of scenes from Van Dorn, combat, etc. which will be offered for sale to the membership - hopefully next year.

Roger Johnson, who was responsible for the very successful 63rd tour last Fall was then presented a Placque in appreciation for his efforts.

Ed Witt then presented to the Membership a Plan for Site Selection as outlined by the Board of Directors at their meeting yesterday.

The assignment of Chapters as back-up for site selections will be:

1990 - Florida Chapter

1991 - I.O.K. Chapter

1992 - Philadelphia Chapter

Other locations will be accepted from the floor at the Annual Meetings if they have a legitimate presentation and adequate personnel to man a Reunion.

After a detailed discussion, Charley Stewart motioned and Bill Martin Seconded that the site plan be put into effect - Motion carried.

Members O.K.'d that the Secretary/Treasurer should send a final letter to the 207 names who still have not responded to the first letters sent. If no reply received after 30 days from date of mailing these individuals will be dropped from the roster and mailings.

John Santangelo made a presentation for the 1989 Reunion - a bit different from that made last year. It will be held at a Marriot Hotel 18 miles from San Francisco with a room rate of \$55. + 8% tax per room. Parking will be complimentary and free transportation to and from San Francisco will be provided. Reunion to be held August 23 - 27. All rates have been confirmed via teletype. They have 6 couples and 18 people available to run the Reunion.

Nate Spiegel then proposed Orlando, Florida for the 1990 Reunion with rates in the \$55. to \$60. range and to be held between the 1st week of September and the 1st week of October. Motion made by Pete Romano and seconded by Hank Greenberg to accept the Florida presentation — Motion carried.

REMINISCING



Herbert J. Hinkel 63rd Division Artillery 718th Field Artillery Batt. Headquarters Battery

I was Cadre from the 98th Division.... Camp Breckenridge, KY....

When the war ended in May of 1945, I was assigned and transferred to Hqs. 63rd Div. Artillery, Allied Military Gov. for Adelsheim, Gaden and Lauda, Wurttemburg. Prior to all this, my outfit fought all the way across the Danube at Ulm, - Landshut, Bavaria.

I recall that we fired on a castle near the town of Stein, it could have been Waldenburg Castle, but I am not sure any more. I also recall, the Castle of Von Zeperlin near Ashaushen, Wurttemburg, Langenberg, Castle, Adelsheim, Castle, and a few others the names, escape me, after all these years.

We were in it, at Alsace Lorrain, 1000 yds. from the German lines. At times, we were in front of the 63rd Infantry. Recall seeing the lads in the fox holes - we were pinned down in front of the Seigfried lines, until Gen. Patton's 3rd Army encircled the Germans, and we broke through the Seigfried Lines. A few times we almost ran out of ammunition supplies. It was bitter cold in France/Colmar, and we also used cats to pull the field pieces. I was HCO and VCO + interpeter, since I speak German, after a fashion - read and write it too.

I had relations and friends in the German Army, my family (6 or 7) were in the Army of the U.S.A. Many of our relations died in the uprising against the Nazis in July of 1944, and in 1934 one member, an attorney was shot by the Nazis. When the territories which we took in the Eastern part of Germany and Central Europe was sold out by politicians, many of my relations died from the communists. If the Nazis did not get them the commies did. The 69th withdrew from Saxony, and Gen. Patton from Eastern & Central Europe. What we won in the field, the politicians lost at the conference table. That is why I will not go to France to see the unveiling of the Jebsheim Cross. Too many memories of the political sellout to the Russians. The inscription on the stone would be better to read:

"They are together in Death"
"We have should united in Peace"

shelling as well as from the Schu-mines. As daylight improved German machine gunners and snipers aimed deadly fire on the attackers as they probed their way through the mine field. Pinned down by this curtain of fire the further advance of the attack was tortuously slow and casualties increased at an alarming rate. Thru sheer courage the First Battalion moved forward. Nearing the top of Hill 216 German machine gun, machine pistol and rifle fire became devastating in its accuracy. Even in the face of this superior fire power the Battalion was able to bring heavy small arms, machine gun and mortar fire on the German positions forcing the enemy to vacate and withdraw over the crest of the north slope. jubilant men crossing over the peak found the enemy dug in on the south slope. From here the Germans poured even more intense fire upon the attackers than they had received on the north slope. Adding to the misery of the attack, the Battalion faced another thickly sown Schu-mine field. As they probed their way through this second mine field heavy machine gun and mortar fire from the base of the south slope of Hill 216 added to the torrent of fire from the dug-in Germans. Casualties mounted as the determined Germans fought bitterly to halt the attack. Nevertheless, the Battalion continued to advance to the base of the southern slope.

The victorious, but seriously depleted First Battalion had accomplished their mission of taking Hill 216, but it was obvious they could not reach the Weiss River to establish the main defensive position prior to nightfall. The Third Battalion was alerted and moved out to continue the attack. The two Battalions attacking together were able to secure a line of defense by 2100 hours along the north bank of the Weiss River.

Throughout the night pockets of German resistance harassed the attackers with small arms and directed mortar fire. The following day these pockets were eliminated one by one along with "mopping up" the west bank of the Fecht River down to its junction with the Weiss River. By 1400 hours on the second day the mission was completed, Hill 216 secured and a strong defense along the west bank of the Fecht River and the north bank of the Weiss River was established. Based on the unbelievable success of the 254th Infantry Regiment taking Hill 216, the French 1st Army renamed Hill 216 "Bloody Mountain" and after the war selected Hill 216 as their Memorial Cemetery for French and Goumier soldiers killed in the vicious Battle of



foot. Men who could hardly walk had to be evacuated and the First Battalion fell to less than company strength. The daylight hours of 26 January 1945 were spent evacuating the dead and wounded, thawing out frozen weapons, improving the defensive positions, and preparing to renew the attack on Jebsheim that evening. Prior to the evening attack, eight battalions of artillery laid a concentration of fire into Jebsheim for 15 minutes. As we watched it seemed as if Jebsheim, lying peacefully asleep one minute, became nothing but a massive sheet of flames the next. The crucial "Battle of Jebsheim" had begun, but that's another story for a future letter.
