### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "D," 133rd Infantry, is an offshoot from Company "L," Fifty-third Infantry, organized in Waterloo on May 7, 1912, after being transferred from Independence, Iowa. The original officers of Company "L" were Capt. John H. Hildebrand, First Lieut. Carleton Sias and Second Lieut. Fred L. Fisher. Lieutenant Sias was appointed Captain on the death of Captain Hildebrand in 1913, and given command of the Company.

Company "L," Fifty-third Infantry, was redesignated Company "G," First Infantry, on July 4, 1915, and served on the Mexican Border under this designation. It was mustered out of service January 15, 1917. On April 1 of the same year Company "G" was again mustered into service, and on August 15, 1917, sixty enlisted men of the Com-

pany were transferred to Company "G," Third Infantry, to bring that unit up to wartime strength for immediate service with the 168th Infantry. Company "G" of the First Infantry was soon after recruited to war strength and became a part of the Thirty-fourth Division. The First Infantry was later redesignated the 133rd Infantry and as such served the balance of the war.

On May 10, 1919, Company "M," Fourth Infantry, was organized in Waterloo with Capt. Herbert B. Kohl in command. Howard J. Rouse was appointed Captain June 20, 1920, and given command. On April 1, 1921, the Fourth Infantry was redesignated the 134th Infantry and at the same time Company "M" was redesignated Company "D," a machine gun unit. The 134th Infantry was redesignated the 133rd Infantry July 11, 1921.

Captain Rouse was succeeded in command of the Company by Capt. Fred G. Clark May 20, 1924, who was in turn relieved by First Lieut. Loyd M. Shepherd July 11, 1930. Lieutenant Shepherd was later commissioned Captain. In addition to service on the Mexican Border and during the World War, this unit served at Tipton and Burlington during the cattle war of 1931.

FACTUAL HISTORY

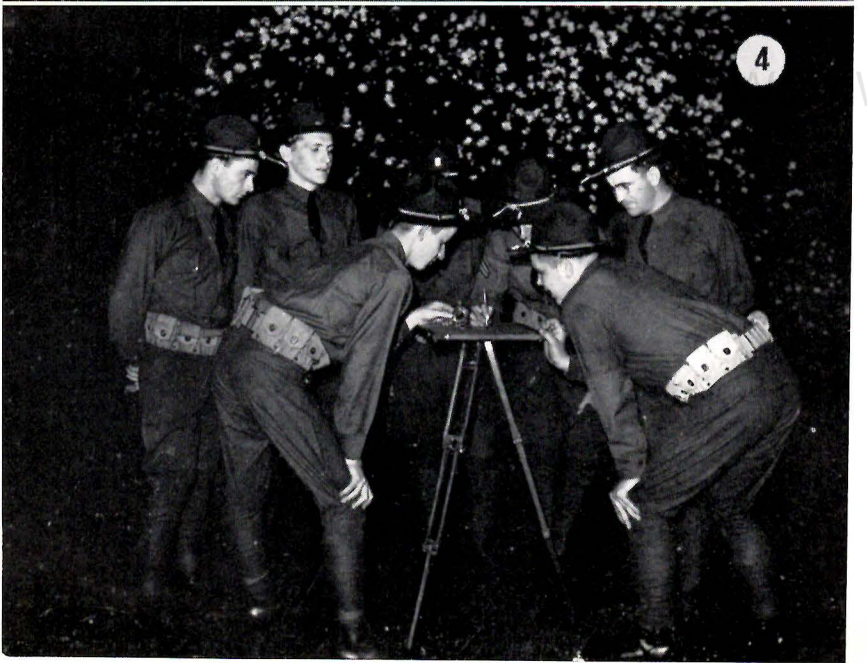
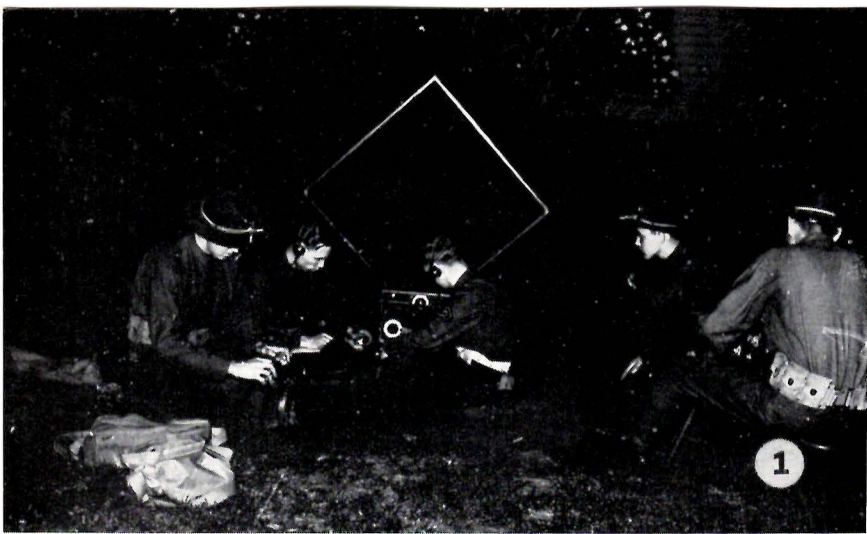

### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "E," 133rd Infantry, is the outgrowth of Company "C," Sixth Iowa Infantry, which was organized in 1884 by Capt. Frank E. Landers. In the period prior to the Spanish-American War the regimental designation was changed to Fourth Iowa Infantry.

On April 26, 1898, orders were received by Capt. J. W. Lee, commanding officer of the Company, to entrain with his command for Des Moines, where it would be recruited to war strength and equipped for action. On May 25 the Company was mustered into United States service and designated the Fifty-second Regiment, Iowa Infantry. The Company stayed in a training camp until August 28, 1898, and on October 30, 1898, was mustered out. Aside from this duty the Company was called out in 1893 for a week's strike duty at Sioux City, and in 1894 for guard duty after the cyclone at Pomeroy.

After the Spanish-American War the regimental designation was changed to the Fifty-sixth Iowa Infantry, and in 1915 the designation was changed to the Second Iowa Infantry.

On June 20, 1916, Company "C" was called out for service on the Mexican Border and was mobilized at Camp Dodge with the rest of the Regiment. On July 1, 1916, the Company was mustered into Federal service. It remained on duty in Brownsville from July, 1916, to March of 1917, when it was returned to Fort Des Moines and mustered out.

On July 1, 1917, the Company was called out for World War service and sent to Camp Cody, New Mexico, for training. At Camp Cody the Company was disbanded and merged with Company "D" to form Company "B," 125th Machine Gun Battalion, Thirty-fourth Division. In August the Company sailed for France with the Division.

In the reorganization following the war, Company "E" was organized June 1, 1921, as a part of the 134th Infantry. In July the regimental designation was changed to the 133rd Infantry. In the fall of 1931 the Company was called out twice for ten-day periods, once at Tipton and again at Burlington, in the famous "cow war."

### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "F," 133rd Infantry, was organized and Federally recognized in Mason City March 19, 1924. The Company was originally located at Storm Lake, but was transferred from there because of its inability to find commanding officers. The first officer staff of Company "F" included Capt. Lowell Forbes, First Lieut. S. N. Grummon and Second Lieut. Leslie Whipple. The First Sergeant was Charles E. Van Horn, who later became First Lieutenant of the Company and who has served in that capacity since.

On January 11, 1930, command of the Company was taken by Capt. Frederick B. Shaffer, the present commander.

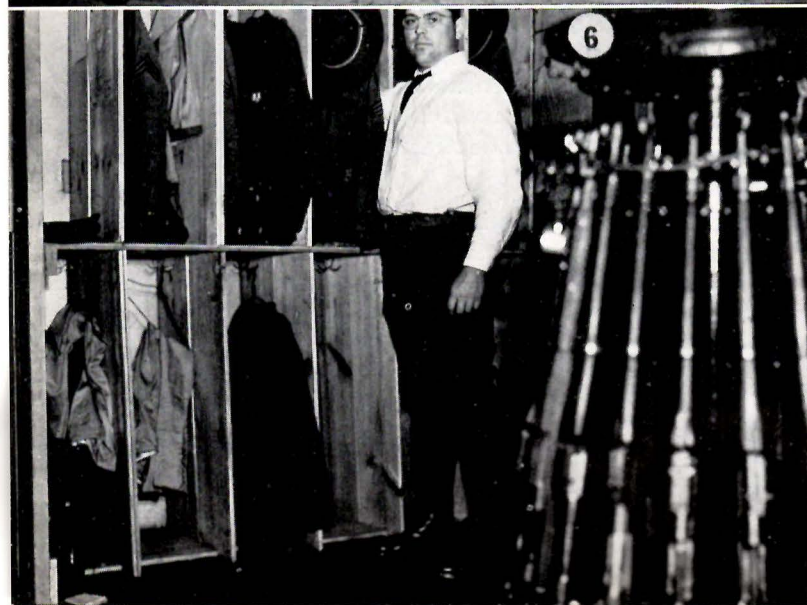
Company "F" has sent several men to Camp Perry on the State National Guard Rifle Team. Sgt. E. E. McSweeney has gone to the rifle matches three years, and Sgt. Arnold K. Olson was a member of the team in 1937. Lieutenant Van Horn is a graduate of the Infantry School at Fort Benning, Georgia, having attended the school in 1925.

Company "F" with its present officers and First Sergeant saw service in both the Iowa cattle wars—it served at Tipton for nine days and at Burlington for eleven days. Captain Shaffer, Lieutenant Van Horn and Sergeant Humiston are ex-service men, all having served in the World War. The latter two have had over fifteen years service with Company "F."

The Company has taken part in many of Mason City's civic celebrations, and takes an active part in the life of the city. The 1937 encampment of the Company was made at Camp Ripley, Minnesota. Its present officers are Capt. Frederick B. Shaffer and Lieut. Charles E. Van Horn. Richard T. Humiston serves as First Sergeant.

### FACTUAL HISTORY

One of the first National Guard Companies in Iowa was organized on February 13, 1892, at Fort Dodge with the designation of Company "G," Sixth Iowa Infantry. Officers of the new Company were Capt. Cyril W. King, First Lieut. William T. Chantland and Second Lieut. Charles W. Bond. A short time after the regimental designation was changed to Fourth Iowa Infantry. In 1893 the Company was called out to protect property after the Pomeroy cyclone, and again in 1894 to perform guard duty during a railroad strike.

At the start of the Spanish-American War the Company was mustered into service as Company "G," Fifty-second Iowa Volunteer Infantry, under command of Captain Chantland. The Company was assigned to the Third Brigade, Second Division, Third Army, but did not leave the United States. It was mustered out October 20, 1898. On April 4, 1899, the old Company was reorganized and mustered back into service. Soon after, the regimental

designation was changed to Fifty-sixth Infantry, later changed in 1915 to the Second Regiment.

On June 20, 1916, Company "G" was again called out and mustered into Federal service for the Mexican Border campaign. After serving nine months at Brownsville, Texas, the Company was mustered out.

In less than a month the Company was recalled to the service for World War duty. Company "G" transferred its quota of men to the 168th Infantry for immediate active service in France. During the war a military company was organized in Fort Dodge with Capt. Fred R. Frost as commanding officer. This unit was Federally recognized October 5, 1918, as Company "G," 134th Infantry, Iowa National Guard. The regimental designation was later changed to 133rd Infantry.

On September 20, 1931, Company "G" was called to Tipton for guard duty during the cow testing trouble, a tour of duty which lasted about ten days. The Company was again called into state service at Burlington for the same purpose in October of 1931. Since the Burlington call the unit has participated only in routine Armory training and the annual summer instruction camps.

### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "H," 133rd Infantry, is the oldest National Guard unit in Mason City, and a descendant of the "Mason City Zouaves," organized in 1873 under Capt. Simon P. Dexter, a Civil War veteran.

In 1876 the Company was redesignated Company "A," Sixth Infantry, and in 1892 redesignated Company "A," Fourth Infantry, at which time it was commanded by Capt. I. R. Kirk. Under command of Capt. Al Sorter, Jr., the Company saw service during the Spanish-American War as Company "A," Fifty-second Iowa Volunteer Infantry.

In 1903 the regimental designation was changed to Fifty-sixth Infantry and retained until 1915, when it was changed to the Second Infantry. During this period the Company was commanded successively by Capt. John A. Stewart,

Wiley Ranking and O. W. Garman. The unit served nine months on the Mexican Border.

Company "C," Fourth Infantry, was organized in Mason City on December 11, 1917, and was Federally recognized May 7, 1918. The unit was designated Company "H," 133rd Infantry, on April 1, 1921, and redesignated Company "H," 133rd Infantry, on July 11, 1921. From December, 1917, to February, 1931, the Company was commanded successively by Capt. A. L. Rule, Ralph Lloyd Jones, W. R. Hayes, George D. Crawford, Jay B. McGregor and Vern E. Mott.

In February, 1931, Capt. Stuart N. Grummon, the present commanding officer, was relieved of his assignment as Regimental Plans and Training Officer and assigned to command the unit. Edward O. Babcock has served as First Lieutenant since June 2, 1932, and Virgil A. Brown as Second Lieutenant since April 7, 1935. The Company has two enlisted men with more than ten years service and fourteen men who have been in the organization more than five years.

### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "K," 133rd Infantry, Le Mars, was organized and mustered into service as Company "K," Fifty-sixth Infantry, on December 9, 1913. The commissioned personnel at the time of the Company's muster was composed of Capt. Jacob J. Koenig, First Lieut. John C. Peterson and Second Lieut. William M. Rothaermal.

On June 19, 1916, the Company responded to the call for troops for service on the Mexican Border, and was sent to Brownsville, Texas, arriving there on July 21. During its stay in Brownsville the Company demonstrated unusual efficiency in marksmanship and was winner of the skirmish run at Loma Alta, Texas, in competition with all organizations of the Southern Department. Leaving Brownsville on March 3, 1917, the Company arrived at Fort Des Moines, where it was mustered out of service on March 23.

When the United States entered the World War in April, 1917, Company "K" organized for recruiting and

by the 8th of April had exceeded its wartime strength. This unit was the first Company in the state to report. In July the Company was called out under state orders and put into camp on the outskirts of Le Mars at what was called Camp Faber. The unit was transferred from State to Federal service on July 15, 1917, and on August 5 was formally drafted into Federal service. Two days later orders were received to transfer sixty-eight of the men to the Third Iowa Infantry. Shortly thereafter the Company was ordered to Camp Cody, New Mexico, where it was redesignated Company "B," 127th Machine Gun Battalion. It was later broken up and assigned to various units of the 133rd Infantry, leaving for overseas service in August, 1918.

At the close of the war the Company was reorganized and mustered into State service with the following as commissioned personnel: Capt. Warren C. Butler, First Lieut. Walter Huxtable and Second Lieut. Carl H. Witt.

### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "L," 133rd Infantry, was organized December 17, 1917, as Company "D," Fourth Iowa Infantry, amid the excitement and tenseness of a war conscious community. Capt. Ira L. Storm, recently returned from Mexican Border service, with Lieuts. Howard B. Rew and Hal B. Clark, handled the organization and recruiting of the new unit, which was to replace the Companies already gone to war.

During the war period the Company was busy giving military escorts for funerals of deceased soldiers, checking on draft dodgers and patrolling the city in conjunction with city police authorities. On May 2, 1918, the Company was given Federal recognition as Company "D," Fourth Iowa Infantry. In 1919 Lieutenant Clark resigned and First Sgt. Lawrence D. Swift was commissioned Second Lieu-

tenant. He served until 1921, resigning with Captain Storm, and the organization was taken over by Lieutenant Rew, later Captain.

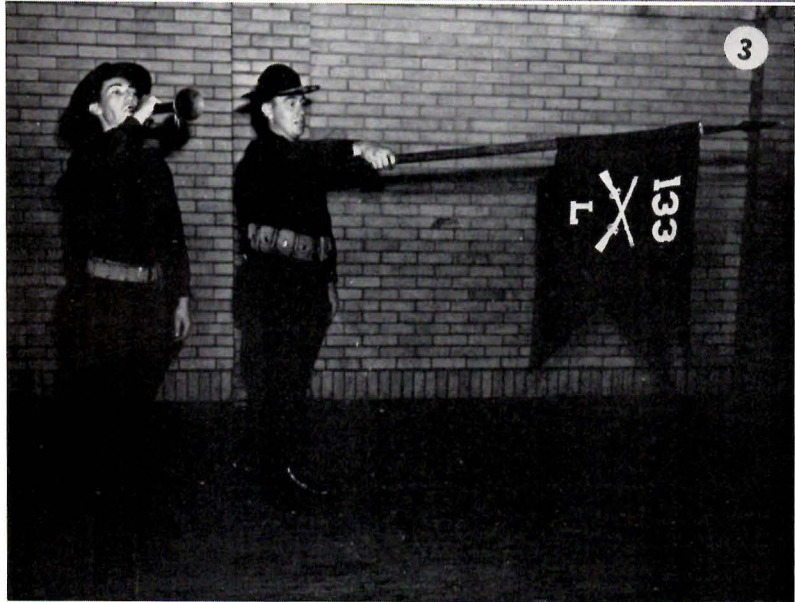
In August, 1921, Company "D" was one of the units attending the first post-war summer encampment at Camp McHenry, Storm Lake, Iowa. On March 29, 1921, the designation of the Company was changed to Company "L," 134th Infantry, and again on July 11 of the same year to Company "L," 133rd Infantry.

Lieutenant Reister assumed command of the Company on September 25, 1925, and promoted to Captain to take the place of Captain Rew, who had been promoted to Major. In 1927 all Sioux City National Guard units moved into a new Armory.

In October, 1931, Company "L" served at Burlington during the Iowa cattle war, finally returning home at Thanksgiving. In the spring of 1933 the unit was sent to Le Mars to serve during civil disturbance, and was again called out on July 4, 1936, when a disastrous fire had nearly destroyed the town of Remsen. Present officers of the Company are Capt. H. W. Reister, First Lieut. Byron F. Lampson and Second Lieut. William M. Leaverton.

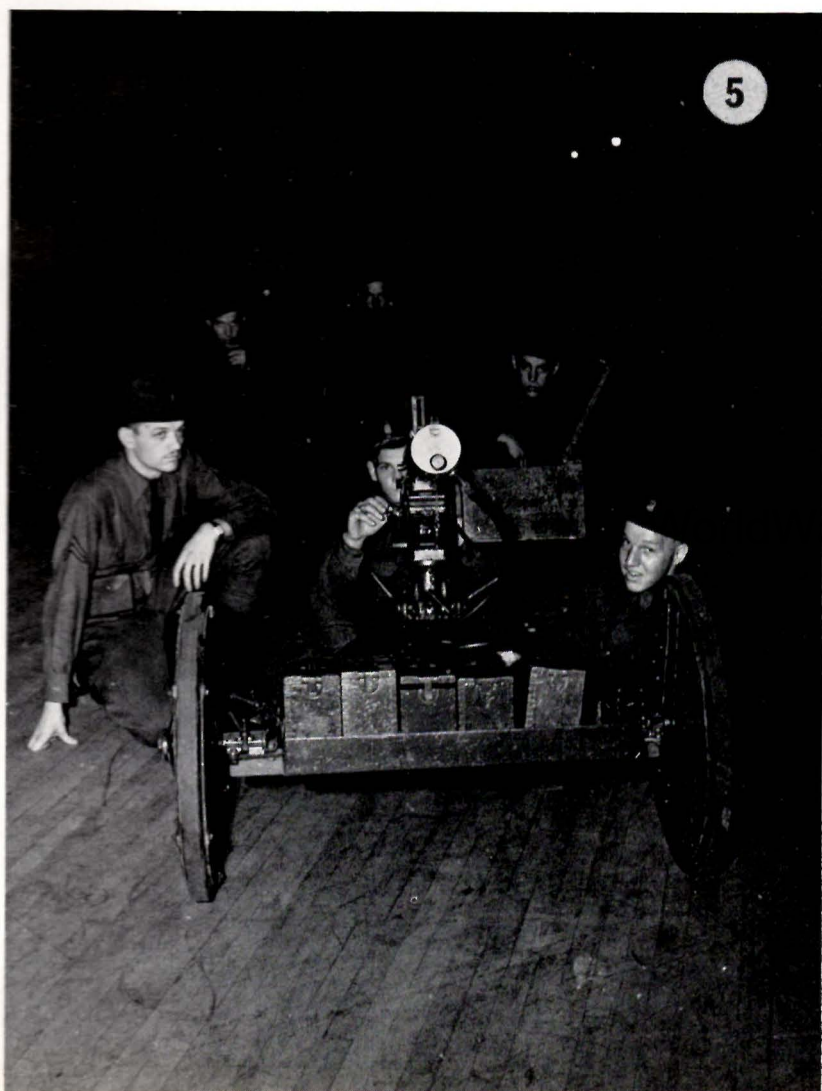
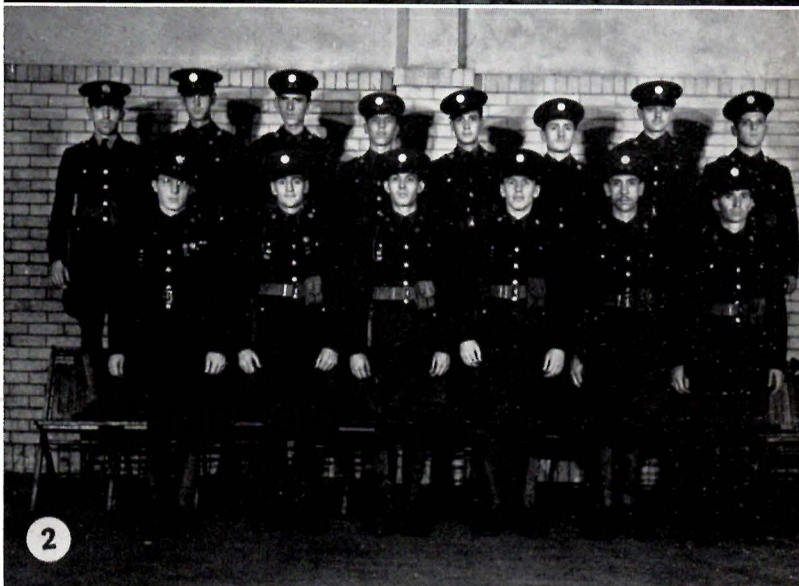

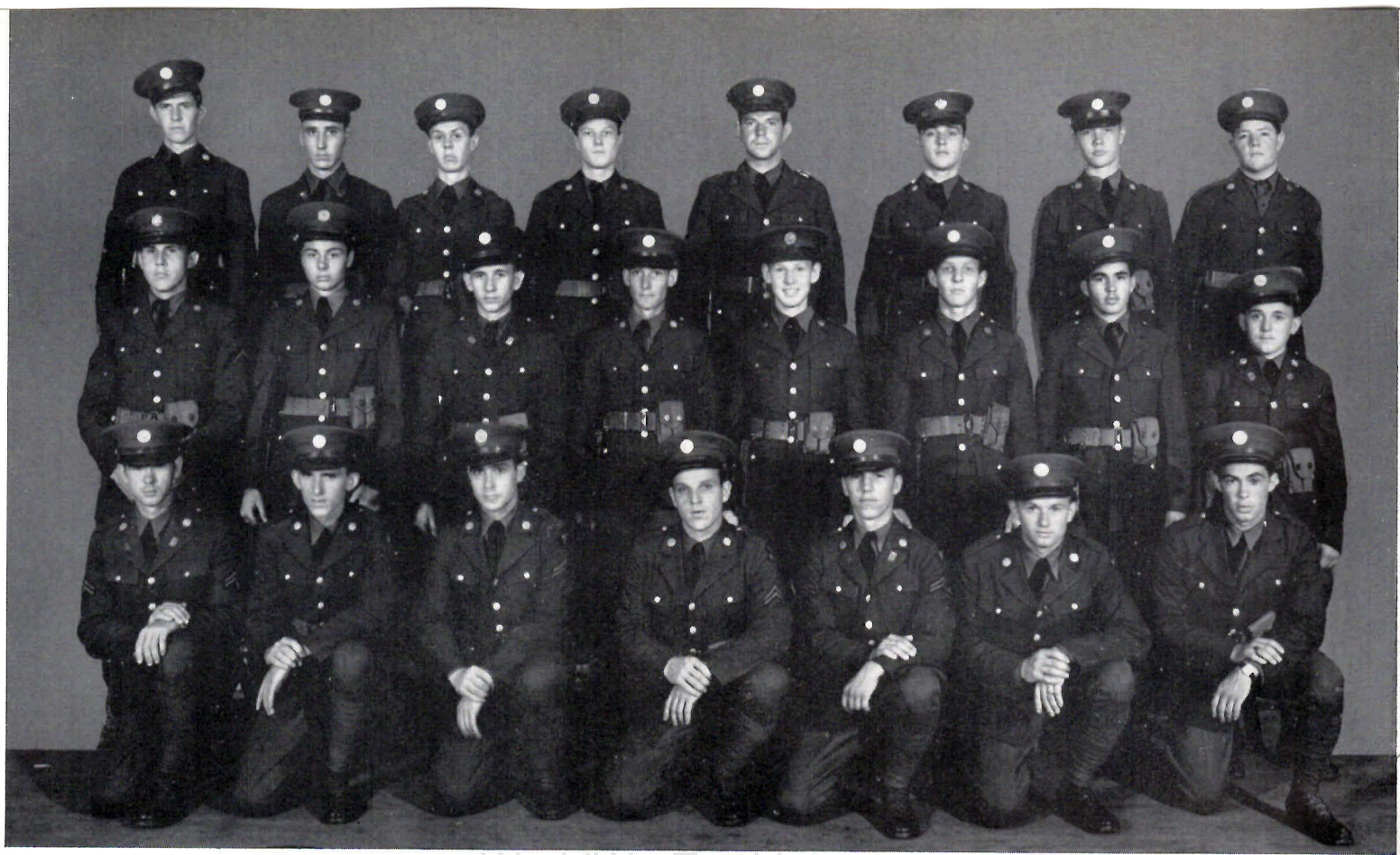

### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "M," the machine gun company of the Third Battalion, 133rd Infantry, was organized in Sioux City and received Federal recognition as such on October 28, 1921. The officers who were appointed to organize and recruit the Company included Capt. Joseph D. Hale, First Lieut. Alphe B. Young and Second Lieut. William H. Fair, all of whom had received machine gun training in the World War.

When Captain Hale resigned in March, 1923, Lieutenant Young was appointed Captain and placed in command of the Company. Lieut. William Fair was promoted to First Lieutenant and John A. Fair, an officer in the Air Service during the war, was appointed Second Lieutenant. In the following year, upon the resignation of Lieut. W. H. Fair, Lieut. John Fair was promoted to First Lieutenant and First Sgt. John A. Swanson of World War service was com-

missioned Second Lieutenant. He was later promoted to First Lieutenant when Lieut. John Fair resigned in 1926. Clinton S. Woodward was promoted to Second Lieutenant on the same date.

Lieutenant Woodward left the Company in 1927 and was succeeded by Lieut. Robert H. Holcomb. Two years later upon the resignation of Lieutenant Holcomb, Lieutenant Woodward returned to the Company. In May, 1925, Sgt. Gerald C. Line was commissioned First Lieutenant, Thirty-fourth Division Postal Officer, and later, upon the death of Lieutenant Swanson in 1930, became First Lieutenant of the Company.

Company "M" has the distinction of having had three of its members chosen for West Point Military Academy. The men who passed the competitive exam for entrance in successive years are James D. Lang, Austin B. Fisher, and Fred W. Ressegieu. The Company has been called out twice by the governor of the state. Its first call was made in 1931, when the Company was sent to Burlington, and its second in 1933 during the farm strike at Le Mars.

The 168th Infantry, Iowa National Guard, was originally organized in 1876 as the Third Infantry, National Guard of Iowa; the Headquarters being organized February 18, 1876. Company "A" of this Regiment has been in existence since 1869.

On April 30, 1892, in reorganization of the Iowa National Guard, this Regiment was reorganized by reassignment of eight companies of the Fifth Infantry and four companies of the Third Infantry.

May 30, 1898, at Camp McKinley, Des Moines, Iowa, the Regiment was mustered into United States service for the Spanish-American War, as the Fifty-first Infantry, Iowa Volunteers. It participated in actions about Manila and in the Malolos Campaign in the Philippine Insurrection and returned to the United States, being mustered out at San Francisco, California, November 2, 1899.

After the insurrection, the Regiment resumed its status in the State's service as the Fifty-first Infantry, Iowa National Guard—reorganization being completed March

26, 1900. Its designation was changed to the Fifty-fifth Infantry, Iowa National Guard, November 26, 1902, and again to the Third Infantry, Iowa National Guard, July 4, 1915.

June 26, 1916, the Regiment was mustered into United States service at Camp Dodge, Iowa, for duty on the Mexican Border and was mustered out at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, February 20, 1917.

July 15, 1917, the Third Infantry, Iowa National Guard, was called into United States service, being drafted for United States service August 5, 1917, at Des Moines, Iowa, for service during the World War, and was redesignated the 168th Infantry, August 16, 1917. It served overseas in the Forty-second (Rainbow) Division and participated in combat as follows:

Luneville Sector (Lorraine), February 27 to March 22, 1918.

Baccart Sector (Lorraine), March 28 to June 19, 1918.

Esperance-Souaine Sector (Champagne), July 5 to July 14, 1918.

The Regiment was demobilized after the World War at Camp Dodge, Iowa, May 16, 1919, and reorganized as the 168th Infantry, Iowa National Guard, in 1920; its reorganization having been completed July 13, 1921.

June 6, 1929, the Third Infantry, Iowa National Guard, which was drafted into United States service August 5, 1917, and redesignated as the 168th Infantry for service during the World War, was, for the purpose of perpetuating the history of the Regiment, reconstituted and consolidated with the 168th Infantry, Iowa National Guard, Federally recognized July 13, 1921.

Since the World War the Regiment has been called into service by the Governor of the State of Iowa in connection with civil disturbances on two occasions.

#### FACTUAL HISTORY

When Headquarters Company, 168th Infantry, stationed at Council Bluffs, was reorganized into the Thirty-fourth Division, Headquarters Company, the vacancy was filled by allocating the Company to Jefferson. Authority for placing the Company in Jefferson was obtained from the Adjutant General's office in May, 1927. The Company was Federally recognized July 6, 1927, with Capt. O. W. Harris and Second Lieut. Espy A. Barker serving as its first officers.

#### JEFFERSON, IOWA

The Armory of Headquarters Company was completed and dedicated in November, 1927. On August 4, 1931, Captain Harris was transferred to the Regimental Staff and Second Lieutenant Barker was promoted to Captain in command of the Company. On December 2, 1935, Capt. Foss Davis assumed command of the Company, with Second Lieut. Harold I. Morain as Junior Officer. Second Lieutenant Morain resigned January 21, 1937, Corp. Raymond B. Morgan being promoted to the rank of Second Lieutenant. Captain Davis and Second Lieutenant Morgan are still commanding the Company, but only three of the unit's original members are still in service.

The Headquarters Company is a community project and the Armory is a community center. The Armory was constructed, with title in a board of trustees, with an arrangement that when the bonds were paid, the title of the building should revert to the city of Jefferson, and the building used primarily by the Guard Company.

fantry, on April 1, 1921. The first annual encampment was held at Storm Lake, Iowa.

In 1922 Capt. Edwin A. Spetman took command of the Company and served for a year. In 1922 the Company made its annual encampment at Camp Dodge, Iowa, using the old wartime wooden barracks as quarters. Captain Spetman was replaced in command by Capt. George A. Henderson, who served until 1927, when he was relieved by Capt. Otto E. Shebel. Captain Shebel served until January 1, 1929. Capt. Everett M. Swanson was the next commanding officer and served as such until February 1, 1934. During this period the Company was active in athletics and had a good baseball and basketball team. Rifle marksmanship improved generally also.

The Service Company served near Tipton in September and October, 1931, during the Iowa cattle war. Since February 1, 1934, its commanding officer has been Capt. Ivan T. Bradford. In 1935 and 1936 the Staff Section of the Service Company was removed to Des Moines.

Since 1935, when the personnel of the Service Company was quarantined during the entire camp period because of

The Howitzer Company, 168th Infantry, was organized and Federally recognized May 17, 1921, and attended its first field training at Camp Dodge the same year.

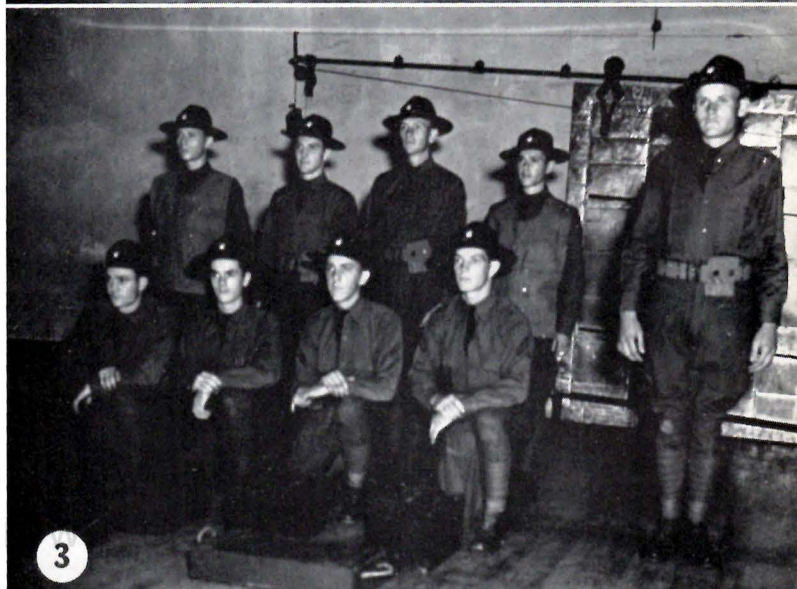
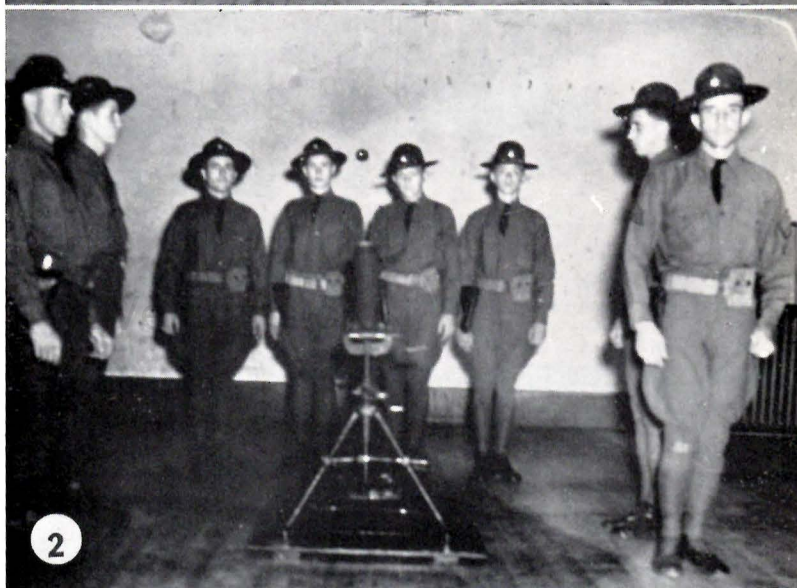
From 1921 to 1930 the Company occupied quarters in the basement of the Armory building, but, since the last year, the space over Weil & Schoenberg's store was remodeled and has been used as an Armory.

Each year the Howitzer Company has participated in field training at Camp Dodge, except 1937, when as a part of the 168th Infantry, it took part in the Fourth Army maneuvers at Camp Ripley, Minnesota. The Company has always taken an active part in community affairs by doing police and guard duty at football games and municipal functions. In 1925 the Howitzer Company was called out to Clarinda following a disastrous wind storm. Again, in 1935, it rendered a valuable service by guarding the collapsed building then occupied by the Hawley Drug Company.

In spite of inadequate Armory quarters, the Howitzer Company has always obtained a commendable rating at annual Armory inspections. One of the particular duties of the Company at the summer camp is manning the saluting gun.

### FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "A," 168th Infantry, was originally organized in Winterset, and was Federally recognized in August, 1917, as a part of the Rainbow Division. The Company consisted of approximately 150 men from Company "A," Third Iowa Infantry, and fifty men from each of the corresponding Companies of the First and Second Iowa Regiments. During most of the World War period the Company was commanded by Capt. Charles W. Aikens of Winterset.

### DES MOINES, IOWA

The official records of the organization show that fifty-nine officers and enlisted men were killed in action or died from wounds received, and that 298 officers and men were wounded. Upon the return of the Regiment from duty overseas, the Company was mustered out of service in May, 1919.

When the National Guard was reorganized in 1921, Company "A" was located in Des Moines and granted Federal recognition March 21, 1921. Since that date the organization has taken an active part in all activities of the National Guard, whether military or otherwise, and is proud of the many trophies it has won in competition with other units of the Iowa National Guard.

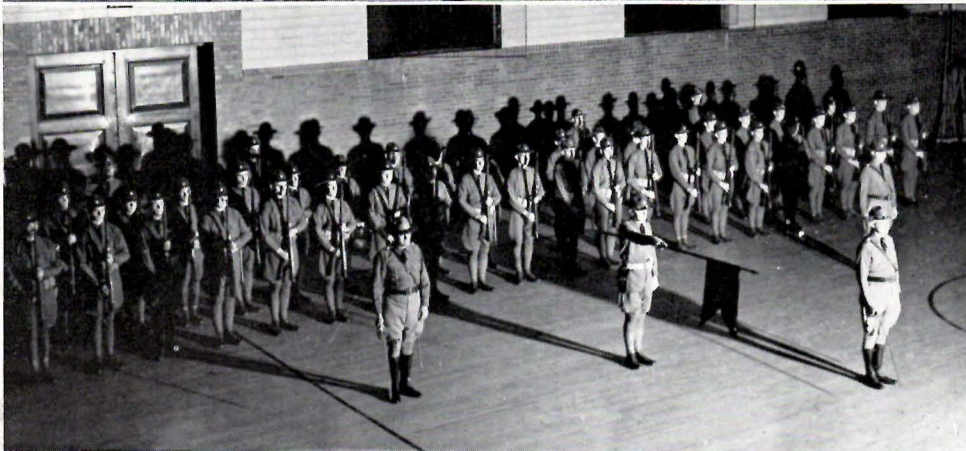

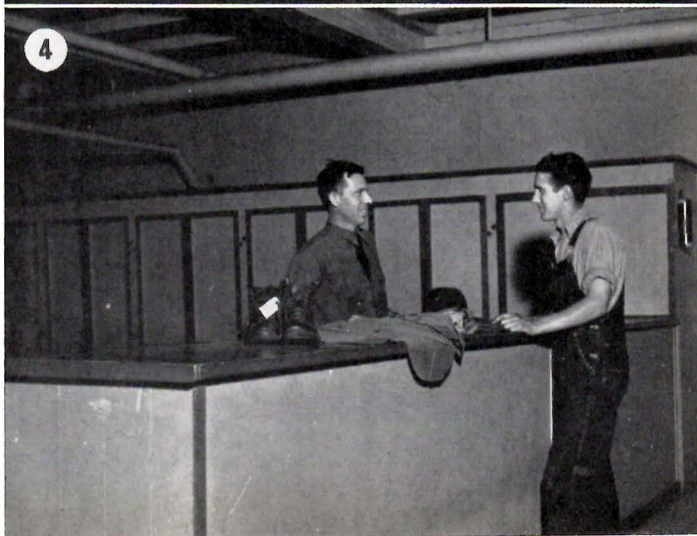
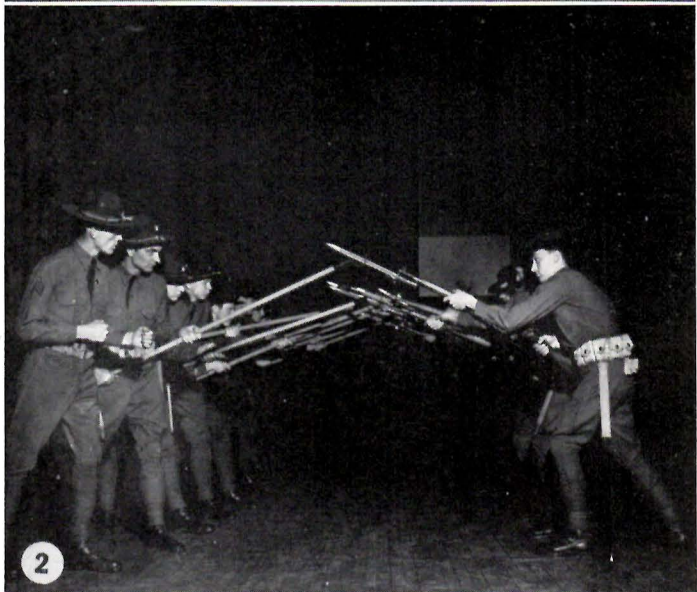
