FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "F," 168th Infantry, traces its history directly to a company of Infantry organized in Villisca on June 14, 1861, named the "Highland Blues." Since that date Villisca has always maintained a military organization.

Many of the old timers of the Company recall the "all time" record established for time spent on board a transport by troops. Company "B," Fifty-first U. S. Volunteers, embarked on the transport *Pennsylvania* on November 3, 1898, and arrived at Manila on December 7. The records indicate they remained on board the transport until February 4, 1899, when they disembarked on the outbreak of the Philippine insurrection.

In June, 1916, as Company "F," Third Iowa Infantry, the unit entrained for the Mexican Border. The Company served at Brownsville, Texas, until February 15, 1917, when it returned to home station for muster out.

Company "F," Third Iowa Infantry, was again mustered into service on July 25, 1917, and was redesignated Company "F," 168th Infantry. Under that designation it served in the Rainbow Division and saw service on six different fronts.

The Company was reorganized December 20, 1920, with Capt. M. L. Overman, First Lieut. Charles L. Meyerhoff and Second Lieut. Fen Fisher as officers. Capt. W. A. Kelley, who had been assigned to command Company "B," 168th Infantry, during the World War, took an active part in the reorganization, but poor health prevented his continued service. Captain Overman was promoted to Major and Capt. James F. Joy was assigned to command the Company. Captain Joy and Lieutenant Meyerhoff resigned in 1927, and Lieutenant Fisher was promoted to Captain, with Harry Borrusch as First Lieutenant and Robert E. Moore as Second Lieutenant.. Captain Fisher and Lieutenant Borrusch later resigned and Robert R. Moore was promoted to Captain. Captain Moore is a graduate of the Infantry School at Fort Benning.

Company "F" has always obtained very fine records at annual Armory inspections and field training camps. It has participated in many civic observances and is a respected and integral part of the community.



FACTUAL HISTORY

The Company which afterward grew into Company "G," 168th Infantry, was first organized July 11, 1878, composed almost entirely of Civil War veterans. Capt. George T. Wintworth was the first company commander. From 1880 to 1891 the Company, known as Company "E," Second Iowa Volunteers, was commanded by John Trigg, Jule T. Connor, J. E. Reddig and Russell Biddle.

Capt. Henry C. Hayes was appointed commander in 1891 and was in command when the Company went to the World's Fair in Chicago in October, 1892. Captain Hayes was still with the Company when it was called out for duty in the Spanish-American War, and served with it at Jacksonville, Fla., during that war. In 1899 the Company was reorganized by Captain Hayes as Company "E," Fiftyfourth Infantry, Iowa National Guard, and from 1900 to 1917 the Company was commanded by Glenn C. Haynes, Tom Fee, Vollo Green, George Ogle and Ellis Pixley.

Under Captain Pixley the Company, known as Company "D," Third Iowa Infantry, was sent to Camp Dodge in June, 1916, for service in the Mexican Border campaign. Company "D" served nine months guard duty on the Border and returned home in February, 1917.

The Company was again called into service July 1, 1917, for World War duty. Glenn C. Hayes was appointed Captain on July 15 when the Company left for mobilization in Des Moines. It was mustered into Federal service August 5, 1917, as Company "D," 168th Infantry, Forty-second Division, and received its baptism of fire on March 5 in the Lorraine Sector, where seven men were killed and several wounded. During the war the Company took part in the engagements of Lorraine, the Champagne, Chateau-Thierry, St. Mihiel and the Argonne. Following the Armistice Company "D" became part of the Army of Occupation on the Rhine until April 8, 1919, on which date it left for home.

After the war the Company was reorganized on October 11, 1920, under command of Capt. William S. Bradley and its name changed to Company "G," 168th Infantry.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "H," 168th Infantry, was transferred from Harlan and organized in Marshalltown by Edward A. Conley in May, 1923. Federal recognition for the Company was received June 1, 1923, at which time its officers were Capt. E. A. Conley, First Lieut. H. O. Robinson and Second Lieut. Fenno Walling. In April, 1928, Captain Conley was promoted to Major and has, since that date, commanded the Second Battalion of the 168th Infantry. Lieutenant Young was promoted to the Captaincy of the Company.

On December 1, 1929, Captain Young resigned and since December 9, 1929, the Company has been commanded by Capt. D. Miller White. All officers of the Company have been World War veterans.



In March, 1929, the Company moved from its old quarters to its present spacious and adequate Armory in the new Memorial Coliseum. The outstanding event in the Company's history was its service during the Iowa cattle war from September to November, 1931. Valuable experiences were gained on this tour of duty. After a partial demobilization of troops a Provisional Battalion was formed under command of Major Conley, and Company "H" formed a nucleus for the machine gun company of that battalion.

The Fourth Army Maneuvers at Camp Ripley, Minn., in 1937 was another valuable training ground for members of Company "H." Every man in the Company entered into the war games with a determination to do his part and to benefit by the experience. This camp, with its large numbers of tanks, men, artillery, and motor vehicles will long be remembered. In April, 1938, the Company started the publication of a monthly newspaper, designed to keep members of the Company posted on latest developments along its line. Its motto, "To be a credit and a service to the 168th Infantry," is an indication of the spirit of Company "H's" enlisted personnel.





FACTUAL HISTORY

Headquarters Company, Third Battalion, 168th Infantry, was Federally recognized June 6, 1921, with about forty members. The first drill was held June 12, 1921. Neola was chosen for the Company because of its location, ma-

terial for recruits and other particulars essential to formation, maintenance and efficiency. First Lieut. Ray Schierbrock was the first commissioned officer, receiving his commission April 28, 1921.


Lieutenant Schierbrock, on June 4, 1921, reported in Des Moines to Lieut. Colonel Brewer, with a request for uniforms for the newly organized Company. Dr. Seward gave the physical examination to the original members.

When the Company was organized Major Lainson commanded the Third Battalion and Colonel Brewer was in charge of the 168th Infantry. The Company's first Federal Inspection was held March 16, 1922, by Maj. Alfred Brandt, and the first encampment was attended at Camp Dodge, Iowa, from August 10 to 24, 1921. While at Camp Dodge in 1924, the Company, with all the other Companies in camp, was honored with a review by General Pershing. The Company was called out in 1931 for duty during the cattle war at Tipton and was called out again on April 28, 1933, for duty at Denison.

The Company moved into a new Armory January 1, 1938, and now enjoys the most modern facilities. The new Armory includes a target range, large kitchen, showers, and special quarters in the basement used only by the Company.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Glenwood, Iowa, has been the home of a unit of the Iowa National Guard for the past fifty years. The present unit, Company "I," 168th Infantry, was called into Federal service in 1916 and served on the Mexican Border until February, 1917. On August 5, 1917, it was again mustered into service following the entrance of the United States into the World War. In December the unit sailed to France as a part of the Forty-second (Rainbow) Division. It served honorably in several important engagements and after the signing of the Armistice marched into Germany. In May, 1919, it returned to Iowa and was mustered out at Camp Dodge.

This Company was reorganized as Company "I," 168th Infantry, and received its Federal recognition on October



12, 1920. The following named officers were assigned at the time of its reorganization: Capt. G. V. Caughlan, First Lieut. C. H. Cook, and Second Lieut. C. R. Seitz. After the promotion of Captain Caughlan to Major on November 1, 1924, First Lieutenant Cook was promoted to Captain and assigned to command Company "L" on November 4, 1924.

When Captain Cook resigned February 1, 1928, First Lieutenant Seitz was promoted to Captain and assigned to command the Company February 17, 1928. Captain Seitz has been in command of the Company since that date, assisted by First Leiut. E. M. Skaggs, and Second Lieut. M. A. Meacham.

In September and October of 1931 the Company served at Tipton during the cattle tuberculin testing, at Burlington during the latter part of October on the same duty and at Denison in April and May to enforce farm mortgage fore-closure sales.







FACTUAL HISTORY

Company "K," 168th Infantry, was originally founded at Corning, where it had had a long record of state and Federal service, but the name of "K" Company was given Headquarters Company of Whe First Battalion, 168th Infantry, on December 1, 1937.

During the Spanish-American and World Wars Atlantic did not have a National Guard Company,

the local men joining the Red Oak Company for service. Company "K" is the first Company stationed in Atlantic since about 1907 when Company "H" of the old Fifty-fifth Iowa Regiment was stationed there.

Present officers of "K" Company are Capt. Paul P. Edwards, with First Lieut. Dwight E. Crabtree and Second Lieut. Raymond G. Wallace assigned for duty. It has an enlisted personnel of sixty-one men. The Armory of the Company is the American Legion Memorial Building, where adequate offices, supply and locker rooms and a drill floor are available for all purposes.



FACTUAL HISTORY

The history of Company "L," 168th Infantry, began in 1856 with the organization of the "Council Bluff Guards" by the late Gen. Grenville M. Dodge. At the beginning of the Civil War, Company "L" entered the service of the state of Iowa as part of the Fourth Iowa Infantry. Following the war, a temporary organization was maintained by the Council Bluff Guards until 1887 when a National Guard was organized in Iowa. The Company was reorganized and renamed the "Dodge Light Guards" and became a part of the Fifth Regiment, Iowa National Guard.

The Company saw service in the Spanish-American War as Company "L," Fifty-first Iowa Volunteer Infantry. Its First Sergeant at this time was Mathew A. Tinley, now commanding general of the Thirty-fourth Division. In 1900 Company "L" was reorganized as a part of the Fifty-first Infantry, later the Fifty-fifth Infantry, and in 1916 was called into United States service on the Mexican Border as Company "L," Third Infantry. In 1917 Company "L" was again called into Federal service and became Company "L," 168th Infantry.

In 1921 the unit was reorganized as Company "L," 168th Infantry, and has retained its status as such. It has been called into state service twice and at present ranks high among the rifle units of the Iowa National Guard.

The 113th Cavalry Regiment was organized in 1915 as the First Squadron, First Iowa Cavalry, with four troops. Troop "A" was stationed at Marengo, with Captain Goldthwaite in command; Troop "B" was stationed at Riverside, with one platoon at Lone Tree, under the command of Glen L. Laffer; Troop "C" was stationed at Oxford, with one platoon at Williamsburg, under the command of Capt. Ray Yenter; and Troop "D" had station in Grinnell, commanded by Captain Guile.

On June 21, 1916, the several troop commanders were given orders to call out their respective commands for service on the Mexican Border. The Squadron served at Dona and Llano-Grande, Texas, during the Mexican Border campaign, and on its return to Iowa was mustered out of service on February 28, 1917. On August 5 of the same year the Squadron was again mustered into Federal service, and in the reorganization of the American forces in the early days of the United States' participation in the war, received the following redesignations: Troop "A" was changed to Headquarters Company, Thirty-fourth Division; Troop "B" to the 126th Machine Gun Battalion and Troops "C" and "D" were combined and redesignated the



127th Machine Gun Battalion. All of these organizations saw service in France, and were mustered out in 1919.

The First Iowa Cavalry was reorganized in 1921, with two squadron detachments, a band, medical detachment, and a service and headquarters troop. The majority of these organizations were Federally recognized in 1921, under command of Col. Ralph P. Howell who was in command of the First Squadron of Iowa Cavalry in 1915. The first troop

to be Federally recognized was the Oskaloosa unit, commanded by Capt. Maxwell A. O'Brien, now the regimental commander.

The designation of the First Iowa Cavalry was changed to the 113th Cavalry August 10, 1921. On October 15, 1923, the death of Colonel Howell caused Lieut. Col. Park A. Findley to be promoted to Colonel and placed in command of the Regiment. On March 15, 1929, the organization of the Regiment was again changed, to consist of Headquarters Troop, Band, Machine Gun Troop, Medical Detachment and three Squadrons of two Troops each.

The Fifty-seventh Cavalry Brigade was organized with

the 113th Cavalry of Iowa and the 114th Cavalry of Kansas. Colonel Findley was promoted to Brigadier General and ordered to command the Fifty-seventh Cavalry Brigade on April 15, 1930. Major Yenter, who was in command of the First Squadron, was promoted to Colonel and placed in command of the Regiment. On September 21, 1931, the Regiment was called out for service in the Iowa cattle war.

On March 23, 1936, Colonel Yenter was promoted to Brigadier General to take the place of the late Brigadier General Findley and on April 2, 1936, Lieutenant Colonel O'Brien was promoted to Colonel and given command of the Regiment.

Freeman. The Troop was the first Cavalry unit in Iowa to receive Federal recognition after the World War, and was the only cavalry troop sufficiently equipped to attend the annual encampment at Storm Lake, Iowa, in 1920.

The designation of the Troop was changed from Troop "F," First Cavalry, Iowa National Guard, to Troop "F," 113th Cavalry, Iowa National Guard, on November 1, 1920, and from Troop "F," 113th Cavalry, to Machine Gun Troop, 113th Cavalry, on April 1, 1929. The Troop was also the first cavalry organization in the state to have an inside drill hall where mounted instruction could be given all through the year. The Machine Gun Troop won the Findley Trophy in 1927 and 1928 as Troop "F" and in 1935 as Machine Gun Troop, its present designation.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Troop "A," 113th Cavalry, Iowa National Guard, was originally organized May 16, 1929, as Troop "E." Officers of the new Troop were Capt. Walter Livingston, First Lieut. Kenneth S. Enochson and Second Lieut. Edwin R. Wallace.

Being the first mounted National Guard unit ever organized in the city, the Troop was exceedingly popular. On July 9, 1930, Troop "E" was redesignated Troop "A,", 113th Cavalry. In September, 1931, the services of the Troop were enlisted to assist in a serious situation


FACTUAL HISTORY

Troop "B," 113th Cavalry, was organized as Troop "B," First Iowa Cavalry, in November, 1920, and Federal recognition was extended April 27, 1921, after several months of drilling without uniforms, horses or other equipment. First commander of the unit was Capt. W. E. Gill.

After two years of service Captain Gill left the Troop and First Lieut. A. E. Sterzing assumed command for the next few months. Soon after Capt. John Johnson took temporary command of the Troop, being replaced

November 1, 1923, by Capt. R. L. Powers. Captain Powers was succeeded by Capt. F. E. Bigelow, one of the original Lieutenants at the time of organization. Captain Bigelow commanded the unit until 1931, at which time Captain Williams took over his present position as unit commander. Captain Williams has been with the organization continuously since its founding, and Sgt. George Dysinger has been with the Company continuously with the exception of one year. The Troop was given its present designation of Troop "B," 113th Cavalry, August 10, 1921, in the general reorganization of the National Guard. Principal service of the unit has been its participation in the cattle war of September and October, 1931.



FACTUAL HISTORY

Troop "E," 113th Cavalry, was organized in 1920 at Sigourney, with Capt. J. P. Kramer serving as first commanding officer. Captain Kramer resigned about March 1, 1934, and was succeeded by Capt. C. J. Lambert. Some time in July, 1924, Captain Lambert was relieved of command by Capt. George S. Talley. Capt. Harry Reynolds succeeded Captain Talley in December, 1924, and held the position until 1928 when Capt. Ward Strong became commanding officer.

OTTUMWA, IOWA

In the meantime Ottumwa organized a Service Troop in 1920 with Capt. Henry Merrick in command. The following year Captain Merrick was made a Major and Capt. Henry Wormhoudt succeeded him for the years 1921 and 1922. Capt. Charles Brockman took over the Troop in 1923 and was commanding officer until 1929 when the Service Troop became Troop "A."

On July 9, 1930, the Troop was designated as Troop "E," under Capt. Harold Haller, who succeeded Captain Brockman in 1929. Captain Haller was succeeded by Capt. C. G. Baker July 16, 1931. Captain Baker was commanding officer until August 26, 1935, when he was relieved by Capt. M. B. Hardsocg, the present troop commander. On January 8, 1935, Troop "E" was officially stationed in its new Armory.


