

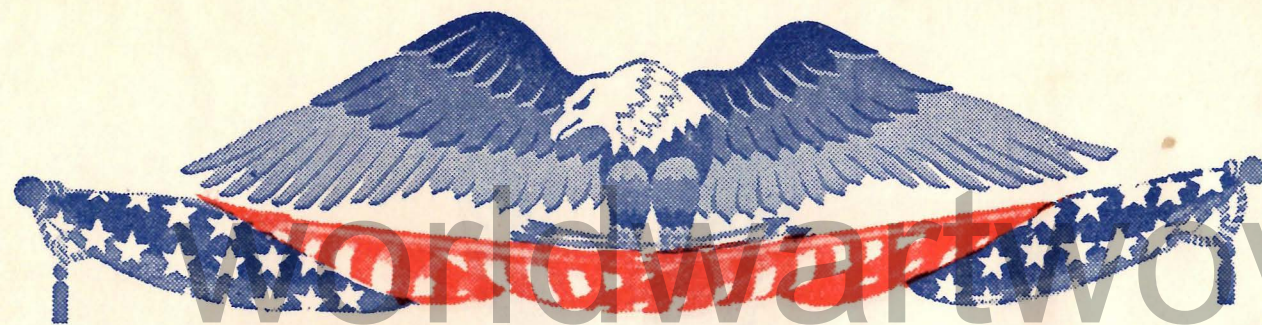

ADAMS, ARCHIE BYRL

Archie Byrl Adams, son of Mr. and Mrs. V. C. Adams, was inducted into Navy Sept. 18, 1943; left for Pacific Dec. 13, 1943; fought on Gilberts, Marshalls, Guam and Philippines; attached to USS William P. Biddle; still in service, aboard the USS Repose in China.

ADAMS, HOLLIS DURWOOD

Hollis Durwood Adams, son of Mr. and Mrs. V. C. Adams, entered Navy Oct. 18, 1942; left for Pacific June 3, 1942; participated in numerous battles in Pacific; served 24 months overseas; ranked as chief yeoman; discharged May 10, 1946; re-enlisted same day; now stationed at US Naval Repair Base, New Orleans, Louisiana.

ALLCORN, J. T.

J. T. Allcorn, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Allcorn, was inducted into Army Dec. 11, 1942; trained at Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, Mount Vernon, Illinois, Fort Custer, Michigan and Phoenix, Arizona; discharged Feb. 21, 1946; ranked as corporal.

ALLCORN, MONROE A.

Monroe A. Allcorn, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Allcorn, entered Army Air Force Feb. 13, 1942; left for ETO Nov. 24, 1942; fought in Rhineland; served 35 months overseas in Quartermaster Division; discharged Nov. 12, 1945; ranked as sergeant.

ALLEN, D. G.

D. G. Allen, son of R. D. Allen, was inducted into the Navy Aug. 30, 1944; left for Pacific Jan. 13, 1945; fought on Leyte and Okinawa; served 15 months overseas; awarded Philippine Liberation Medal and Asiatic Campaign Medal; held rank of seaman, first class.

ALLEN, RALPH M.

Ralph M. Allen, son of R. D. Allen, was inducted into the Army May 4, 1943; left for ETO Nov. 8, 1944; fought in battles of the Rhineland and Central Germany; served 20 months overseas; awarded Purple Heart and Bronze Star; holds rank of first lieutenant.

ALLISON, FRANCIS M.

Francis M. Allison, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. A. Allison, entered the Army in 1943; trained at Camp Blanding, Fla., Fort George B. Meade, Md., and Camp Shelby, Miss.; left for ETO Aug. 3, 1944; fought in France and Germany; served 19 months overseas; ranked as staff sergeant.

ALTOM, MARSHALL H.

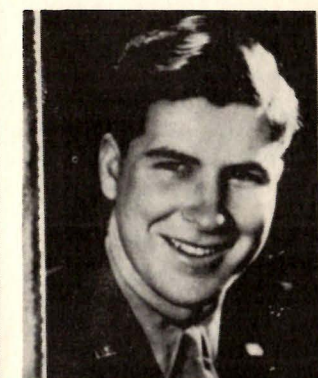
Marshall H. Altom, son of Mr. and Mrs. D. A. Altom, was inducted into the Marines May 6, 1942; trained at San Diego, Calif., and Quantico, Va.; left for overseas July 4, 1942; served 39 months in Europe and the Pacific; discharged May 7, 1946; ranked as sergeant.

ALVEY, WILLIAM A.

William A. Alvey, son of Mrs. Myrtle Alvey, was inducted into the Army in November, 1940; trained at Camp Bowie, Camp Blanding, Fla., and Camp Edwards, Mass.; left for ETO April 2, 1943; fought at Salerno; served five months overseas; awarded Purple Heart and Silver Star; is staff sergeant.

ANDERSON, DARWIN H.

Darwin H. Anderson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Almer Anderson, entered the Army Nov. 19, 1942; left for Pacific area on Feb. 16, 1944; fought on Leyte and Okinawa; served 11 months overseas; awarded Bronze Arrowhead and two Bronze Stars; held the rank of corporal.



**ANDERSON, JIM**

Jim Anderson, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Matt Anderson, was inducted into the Army July 18, 1941; trained at Camp Polk, La.; left for ETO Sept. 5, 1943; fought in Normandy, France, Rhineland and Ardennes; served 25 months overseas with Third Armored Division; awarded Bronze Star; discharged on Oct. 18, 1945.

ARMSTRONG, MELVIN L.

Melvin L. Armstrong, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. A. Doggett, entered the Army Air Force Jan. 1, 1942; left for ETO Nov. 24, 1942; fought in Rhineland, Central Europe and Northern France; served 34 months overseas while attached to Eighth Air Force; awarded Distinguished Unit Badge; discharged in October, 1945; ranked as sergeant.

ARNOLD, EDWARD

Edward Arnold, son of Mrs. Vina Jennings, entered the Army Air Corps in July, 1941; trained at Lowry Field, Colo., Luke Field, Ariz., and Wendover Field, Utah; killed Dec. 29, 1943, near Great Salt Lake, Utah, when two bombers collided in mid air; was sergeant when killed.

ARNOLD, RICHARD CUMMINS

Richard Cummins Arnold, son of Mr. and Mrs. D. E. Arnold, was inducted into the Army Jan. 28, 1943; trained at St. Petersburg, Fla., and Las Vegas, Nev.; left for Pacific in September, 1944; fought on Guam; served 18 months overseas; discharged in February, 1946; ranked as corporal.

ARRANT, BILLY GAY

Billy Gay Arrant, son of Mrs. Virgie Arrant, entered the Army Dec. 5, 1942; trained at Sheppard Field, Harlingen, Laredo, and Fort Myers, Fla.; served as gunnery instructor at Tyndall Field, Florida; discharged Feb. 13, 1946; held the rank of sergeant.

ARRANT, JAMES H.

James H. Arrant, son of Mrs. Virgie Arrant, entered the Army Air Corps Aug. 5, 1942; left for ETO in January, 1944; fought in Normandy, Brittany, France and Germany; served 11 months overseas with 574th Bomb Squadron; awarded DFC and Air Medal with 12 clusters; discharged as staff sergeant.

ASHFORD, GAYDEN E.

Gayden E. Ashford, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Ashford, entered Air Corps Sept. 15, 1943; trained at Buckley Field, Colo., Kingman, Ariz., and Avon Park, Fla.; left for ETO Jan. 20, 1945; fought at North Apennines and Rhineland; served five months overseas; awarded Air Medal; is staff sergeant.

ASHFORD, HAROLD P.

Harold P. Ashford, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Ashford, entered the Navy April 29, 1944; left for Pacific June 30, 1944; fought on Leyte, Luzon and Iwo Jima; served 23 months overseas; held rank of fireman, first class.

AVANTS, AARON E.

Aaron E. Avants, son of Mrs. T. E. Avants, was inducted into Army Nov. 1, 1942; left for ETO March 21, 1943; fought in Normandy, Northern France, Ardennes, Rhineland and Central Europe; served 20 months overseas with 90th Infantry; discharged Nov. 18, 1945; ranked as technician, fifth grade.

BAGLEY, MATHEW, JR.

Mathew Bagley, Jr., son of M. V. Bagley, was inducted into the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for ETO in 1942; fought in North Africa and Salerno while attached to the 36th Division; spent 15 months overseas; awarded Presidential Citation; discharged in October, 1944.

BAIRD, ROBERT VERNON

Robert Vernon Baird, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Baird, was inducted into the Navy July 17, 1945; received training at the Naval Training Station in San Diego, California; was sent overseas in January, 1946; spent three months in the Pacific Theater of Operations.

BAKER, N. C.

N. C. Baker, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Baker, was inducted into the Army Jan. 22, 1941; sailed for ETO in April, 1943; fought in Naples-Foggia, Rome-Arno, Southern France, Rhineland and Salerno with 142nd Infantry; awarded Silver Star; discharged as sergeant July 1, 1945.

BAKER, PAT JIM

Pat Jim Baker, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. E. Baker, entered the Navy Sept. 20, 1943; sailed for Pacific in January, 1944; fought in Marianas, Carolines, Iwo Jima, Philippines, Okinawa with Third and Fifth fleets; discharged as fire controlman, second class.

BALLARD, COURTNEY JACKSON

Courtney Jackson Ballard, son of Mrs. C. N. Ballard, was inducted into the Navy in February, 1943; sailed for Pacific April 10, 1943; fought at Iwo Jima, Tinian, Okinawa, Tarawa; lost his life while serving aboard USS Indianapolis, July 30, 1945.

BALLARD, JAMES FRAZER

James Frazer Ballard, son of Mrs. C. N. Ballard, was inducted into the Army Dec. 20, 1942; trained at Fort Sill, Okla., Camp Hood, Camp Bowie, Camp Forest, Tenn., Camp Polk, La., and Fort Meade, Md.; spent 11 months in Europe; discharged as corporal April 11, 1946.

BARKER, C. W.

C. W. Barker, son of Mr. and Mrs. O. C. Barker, was inducted into the Navy July 29, 1943; sailed overseas May 20, 1945; spent eight months in the Asiatic-Pacific sector; served aboard USS New York and USS Defense; discharged as gunner's mate, third class, on Jan. 11, 1946.

BARKER, JOHN MELVIN

John Melvin Barker, son of Mr. and Mrs. O. C. Barker, entered the Army Air Force Oct. 16, 1942; left for CBI Nov. 29, 1944; participated in liberation of India, Burma and China; served with Air Transport Command, Engineers; discharged as sergeant, Feb. 8, 1946.

BARMORE, DURWARD A.

Durward A. Barmore, son of Mr. and Mrs. Nolan Barmore, entered Army Signal Corps Jan. 27, 1944; left for Pacific Nov. 9, 1944; stayed overseas seven months; awarded one battle star; served with 986th Signal Service Company; discharged Sept. 28, 1945; ranked as technician, fifth grade.

BARMORE, LEMAN E.

Leman E. Barmore, son of Mr. and Mrs. Nolan Barmore, entered the Army Air Corps Sept. 27, 1942; received training in Texas and Illinois; sent to ETO Feb. 20, 1946; holds rank of corporal; attached to 416th Night Fighter Squadron; now stationed in Germany.

BARMORE, NOLAN, JR.

Nolan Barmore, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Nolan Barmore, entered Army Air Force Jan. 27, 1943; left for ETO Feb. 15, 1944; fought in Northern France, Normandy, Rhineland and European air offensive; overseas 10 months with 344th Bomb Group; awarded Air Medal with 11 clusters; discharged as staff sergeant.



**BARNETT, GLEN M.**

Glen M. Barnett, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Barnett, Sr., was inducted into the Navy June 18, 1945; received training at San Diego, California; was also stationed at Manchester and Bremerton, Washington; was fireman when discharged in August, 1946.

BARNETT, JOHN D., JR.

John D. Barnett, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Barnett, Sr., was inducted into the Navy Sept. 7, 1943; trained at San Diego, Calif.; sailed for Pacific Feb. 15, 1944; fought at Guam, Saipan, Leyte, Luzon, Iwo Jima; spent 26 months overseas; discharged as coxswain in April, 1946.

BARNETT, RANDOLPH LITTLE

Randolph Little Barnett, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lonzo M. Barnett, entered Army Sept. 26, 1942; sailed for Pacific July 2, 1943; fought at Bismarck, New Guinea, Leyte and Luzon; was attached to First Cavalry, Fifth Regiment; spent 27 months overseas; discharged as sergeant.

BARTLETT, JAMES LEON

James Leon Bartlett, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Ed Bartlett, entered Air Corps May 17, 1941; left for Pacific Nov. 1, 1941; killed during Jap invasion of the Philippine Islands Dec. 10, 1941; awarded the Purple Heart posthumously; body now rests in US Military Cemetery in Manila.

BARTON, CHARLES F.

Charles F. Barton, son of C. F. Barton, was inducted into the Army Air Force Aug. 15, 1944; received training at Douglas Field, Calif., and Sheppard Field; sailed for Europe in January, 1946; is now stationed in Germany with Army of occupation; is corporal.

BARTON, DON B.

Don B. Barton, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Barton, was inducted into the Army Air Force Sept. 15, 1942; trained at Ellington Field, Houston, Amarillo, Chanute Field, Illinois, and Boca Raton, Florida; held the rank of private, first class, when discharged Feb. 21, 1946.

BARTON, JAMES T.

James T. Barton, son of C. F. Barton, entered the Army Feb. 16, 1942; trained at Little Rock, Ark.; sailed overseas May 21, 1942; fought on Guadalcanal and Solomons with Sixth Army; spent 34 months in the Pacific sector; holds rank of private, first class.

BARTON, JESSE K.

Jesse K. Barton, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Barton, entered the Army March 4, 1941; sailed for Pacific Jan. 23, 1944; fought on Solomons, New Guinea and Southern Philippines; was attached to 93rd Division; awarded Bronze Star Medal; discharged as major Dec. 27, 1945.

BASSETT, WILLIAM H.

William H. Bassett, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Harris of Santa Anna; was inducted into the Navy May 22, 1946; received training at Camp Wallace, Texas; was sent overseas in September, 1944; spent eight months in Europe; discharged June 15, 1946, as seaman, first class.

BATES, FLOYD R.

Floyd R. Bates, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Bates, was inducted into the Army Dec. 18, 1943; trained at Camp Roberts, California; sailed overseas in September, 1944; fought on Mindanao; spent 11 months in Pacific; wounded in action; discharged Nov. 24, 1945.

BAXTER, WOODROW J.

Woodrow J. Baxter, son of P. S. Baxter, entered the Army Nov. 25, 1940; served with 36th Division at Naples-Foggia, Rome-Arno, Central Europe, and others; awarded Silver Star, Bronze Star, Purple Heart; commissioned on German battlefield; discharged as second lieutenant.

BEAL, EDDIE B.

Eddie B. Beal, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. H. Beal, was inducted into the Army Aug. 10, 1942; trained at Camp Wolters, Fort Robinson, Nebraska and Fort Warren, Wyoming; was attached to an infantry division; held the rank of corporal when honorably discharged Dec. 1, 1944.

BEAL, FELTON R.

Felton R. Beal, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ezra Beal, entered the Army June 5, 1942; received training at Camp Wolters, Mineral Wells, and in New York; went overseas in September, 1942; spent three years in Newfoundland with 471st Infantry; discharged Nov. 5, 1945.

BEAL, ZEDDIE D.

Zeddie D. Beal, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. H. Beal, was inducted into the Army in July, 1942; trained at Camp Wolters, Camp Carson, Colo., Fort Robinson, Neb., Camp Anza, Camp 'Ross and Camp Haan, Calif.; served with an infantry division; held the rank of corporal when discharged on Jan. 13, 1946.

BEARD, BILLY GENE

Billy Gene Beard, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Beard, entered the Army May 23, 1945; received training at Camp Hood, Texas, Fort Leavenworth, Kan., Fort Francis E. Warren, Wyo.; holds rank of corporal still in service; now stationed at Fort Warren, Wyoming.

BEARD, DERWOOD OLICE

Derwood Olice Beard, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Beard, entered the Army March 18, 1941; sent to Pacific March 5, 1943 for 23 months' service; fought in Naples-Foggia, Rome-Arno; was staff sergeant, attached to 757th Tank Battalion discharged June 16, 1946.

Robert Beard, Jr., son of Mrs. Georgia Beard, entered the Navy April 23, 1942; sailed to Pacific Nov. 20, 1942; fought on Iwo Jima, Okinawa, Guadalcanal, and Bougainville; 37 months overseas; served aboard USS Cecil; present at peace signing with Japan in Tokyo Bay; discharged.

BEAVER, CHARLES H.

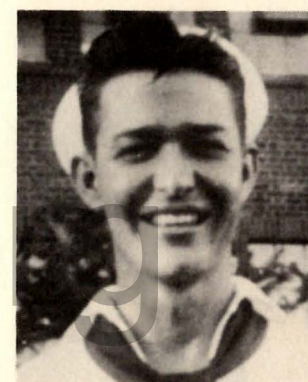
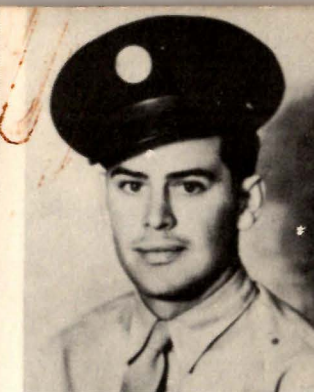
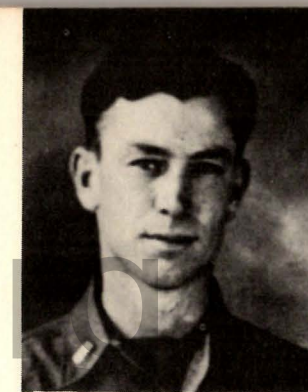

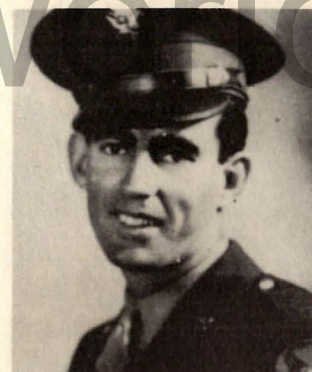


**BEAVER, THURMAN SCOTT**

J. R. Bingham, son of Mr. and Mrs. Tom Bingham, was inducted into the Army Dec. 3, 1941; sailed overseas April 22, 1942; fought at Attu, Kiska; was attached to the Fourth Infantry; awarded Purple Heart and Silver Star; now stationed at Fort Benning, Ga.; is technical sergeant.

Charles M. Blanton, Sr., son of Mrs. Elizabeth Blanton, was inducted into Army Nov. 2, 1940; received initial and advanced training at Camp Bowie; served with 36th Division as mess sergeant; discharged June 2, 1943.

Stanford Edmon Blanton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Blanton, was inducted into the Army March 14, 1945; trained at Camp Hood; sailed overseas Oct. 7, 1945; served with 81st Wildcat Division; is now stationed in Japan; holds the rank of technician, fourth grade.
