ACORD, KELLY FRANK

Kelly Frank Acord of Dallas, son of Mrs. J. D. Acord, was inducted into service Oct. 27, 1943; received training at Dallas, New York, Illinois, Georgia, and Corpus Christi; served in Navy and Coast Guard; held rank of seaman, first class, when discharged Feb. 6, 1946.



ACORD, TROY

Troy Acord, Dallas, son of Mrs. J. D. Acord, was inducted into Army Air Force and received training at Sheppard Field, Ellington Field and Kansas; awarded American Theater and Victory Ribbons; held the rank of first lieutenant.

ALLEN, HOLLIS G.

Hollis G. Allen, son of Mr. and Mrs. Glen W. Allen, entered the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for Pacific Nov. 21, 1941; was member of "Lost Battalion"; was captured on Java by Japs March 8, 1942; liberated Sept. 5, 1945; was with 131st Field Artillery; awarded Purple Heart. Held rank of captain.



ALLEN, LOY FOWLER

Loy Fowler Allen, son of Mr. and Mrs. Glen W. Allen, entered the Army Air Forces May 29, 1942; was sent to ETO Jan. 26, 1944; fought at Rome-Arno, Balkans; shot down over Germany Feb. 25, 1944; held prisoner by Germans until May, 1945; discharged as first lieutenant Jan. 4, 1946.

AMBURN, SAMUEL ELWIN, JR.

Samuel Elwin Amburn, Jr., son of Mrs. Addie Sealy, was inducted into the Army May 12, 1943; sailed overseas June 7, 1944; fought in Southern Philippines and Okinawa; served with 536th Amphibious Tractor Battalion; spent 19 months overseas; discharged as corporal Jan. 27, 1946.



ANDERSON, LUTHER LEE

Luther Lee Anderson, son of D. H. Anderson, entered the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sent to the Pacific Nov. 21, 1941; member of the "Lost Battalion"; captured by the Japs on Java March 8, 1942; liberated Sept. 5, 1945; awarded the Purple Heart; discharged.



ANDREWS, RAYMOND

Raymond Andrews of Graham entered the Army March 15, 1942; sailed for ETO in March, 1944; fought in Normandy, Northern France and the Rhineland with the 90th Infantry Division; was awarded the Purple Heart; spent 18 months overseas; discharged as sergeant Sept. 27, 1945.

ARGABRIGHT, JAMES J.

James J. Argabright, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Argabright of Antelope, was inducted into the Army in 1943; trained at Camp White, Ore.; sent to the ETO in August, 1943, for 18 months' service; holds rank of corporal.

ARGABRIGHT, JOHN L.

John L. Argabright, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Argabright, entered the Army March 10, 1942; sent to the ETO Jan. 1, 1944; fought in the Rhineland and Central Europe; awarded the Bronze Star; served with the 90th Infantry Division; holds the rank of sergeant.



ARGABRIGHT, JOSEPH HAROLD

Joseph Harold Argabright, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Argabright, entered the Army on Nov. 25, 1940; sent to the Pacific on Nov. 21, 1941; member of the "Lost Battalion"; captured by the Japs on Java March 8, 1942; liberated Sept. 5, 1945; awarded the Purple Heart.



ARGABRIGHT, RICHARD W.

Richard W. Argabright, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Argabright of Antelope, entered the Army Air Forces; trained at Boise, Idaho; sent to Panama Canal Zone for service; holds rank of corporal.

ARGABRIGHT, TROY C.

Troy C. Argabright, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Argabright of Antelope, entered the Army in January, 1943; trained at Camp Hood, Texas; sent to the ETO December, 1943, for 11 months duty; served with the Tank Destroyers; holds the rank of sergeant.



ARMES, JOHN THURMAN

John Thurman Armes, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Armes, entered Navy Seabees Dec. 30, 1942; received initial training at Camp Bradford, Va.; sailed for Pacific April 8, 1943; served 28 months overseas; held rank of shipfitter, first class.

ARMSTRONG, MATT

Matt Armstrong, son of Mrs. J. M. Armstrong, was inducted into the Army in February, 1943; received training at Camp Callan, Calif.; sailed for Pacific July 12, 1943; saw action at Hollandia, New Guinea; served with 104th AAA Battalion; awarded Unit Citation; discharged.



ARMSTRONG, ROY G.

Roy G. Armstrong, son of Mrs. J. M. Armstrong, entered the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for Pacific Nov. 21, 1941; was member of "Lost Battalion;" was taken prisoner by Japs on Java March 8, 1942; released Sept. 5, 1945; was member 131st Field Artillery; awarded Purple Heart; discharged.

ATKINSON, JOSEPH HAMPDEN

Joseph Hampden Atkinson, son of Mrs. Lee Atkinson, entered the Army Air Force in 1922; served in ETO with Eighth and 15th Air Forces; awarded Distinguished Service Medal, Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal with five clusters; is now in Alaska; holds rank of general.



AUSTIN, WALTER JOHN, JR.

Walter John Austin, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Austin, was inducted into the Navy Sept. 23, 1943; received training at Corpus Christi, and Rodd Field; sailed overseas October, 1945; spent eight months in the Pacific Theater of Operations; holds rank of seaman, first class.

AWALT, JAMES R.

James R. Awalt, son of Mrs. Carl Awalt of Jermyn, was inducted into the Army on Feb. 26, 1945; received training at Camp Hood, Texas; sailed for the Pacific on Aug. 21, 1945; spent 10 months overseas; holds the rank of sergeant.



BAILEY, CLYDE M.

Clyde M. Bailey, son of Mrs. Lula Bailey, was inducted into the Army May 19, 1943; trained at Camp Polk, La., and Fort Ord, Calif.; sailed for Pacific June 8, 1944; fought on Philippines and Ryukyus; spent 19 months overseas; held rank of technician, fifth grade.

BAKER, RAYBURN D.

Rayburn D. Baker, son of W. B. Baker, of Mineral Wells, was inducted into the Army Sept. 27, 1945; received training at Camp Roberts, California, before sailing overseas March 27, 1946; spent five months in the Pacific Theater of Operations; is private, first class.

BAKER, WILBERN, JR.

Wilbern Baker, Jr., son of W. B. Baker, was inducted into Army Feb. 12, 1943; received training at Fort Jackson, S. C.; left for ETO Oct. 17, 1944; fought at Ardennes, Rhineland and Central Europe; served nine months overseas with Infantry; held rank of sergeant.



BARNETT, JOHN W., JR.

John W. Barnett, Jr., son of J. W. Barnett, Sr. of Jacksboro; was inducted into the Army in January, 1943; trained at Fort Warren, Wyo.; sailed overseas July 3, 1943; served in Africa and the ETO; spent 26 months overseas; holds the rating of sergeant.



BERRYMAN, LOUIE E.

Louie E. Berryman, son of Mr. and Mrs. B. W. Berryman; entered the Army on June 26, 1945; trained at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, and Camp Robinson, Ark.; sailed for the ETO Feb. 28, 1946; served with the 39th Infantry Division; is at the present stationed in Germany.

BICE, JACK L.

Jack L. Bice, son of Rev. Ed M. Bice of Jacksboro, was inducted into the Navy Jan. 11, 1945; trained at San Diego, Calif.; sailed to the Pacific Theater of Operations June 22, 1945 for 14 months service; holds the rank of seaman, first class.

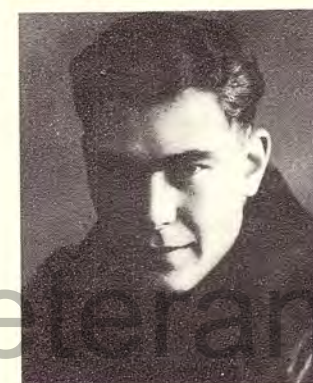


BLACK, CLOYD I.

Cloyd I. Black, son of Mrs. I. H. Black; entered the Army Air Corps July 9, 1943; trained at Miami Beach, Fla., Nashville, Tenn., Syracuse, N. Y., and Midland, Texas; was bombardier instructor at Big Spring Air Field; was discharged Oct. 10, 1945 with rank of second lieutenant.

BLACK, VERNON B.

Vernon B. Black, son of Mrs. I. H. Black; entered the Army Air Corps March 17, 1943; left for the Pacific in August, 1945; spent eight months overseas; served with the 501st Bomb Group; was discharged on May 21, 1946; held the rank of first lieutenant at time of discharge.



BLOODWORTH, J. D.

J. D. Bloodworth, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Bloodworth, entered the Army July 25, 1944; sent to the Pacific Theater of Operations April 6, 1945 for 16 months service; fought on Luzon; was attached to the Field Artillery; discharged.

BOAZ, FRED

Fred Boaz, son of P. A. Boaz; was inducted into the Navy and trained at San Diego, Calif., before sailing overseas; participated in campaigns for Tarawa, Leyte, Solomons, Philippines; served aboard the USS Rose; spent 24 months in the Pacific Theater of Operations.



BOND, JAMES B.

James B. Bond, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Bond; went into the Army in October, 1938; trained at Fort Bliss, Texas, Fort McDowell, Angel Island; sailed for Pacific in January, 1939 and served in Pearl Harbor; spent 48 months overseas; served in Anti-Aircraft Artillery; is staff sergeant.

BOND, JOE D.

Joe D. Bond, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Bond; entered Army November, 1940; sailed for the ETO in October, 1944; fought in Rhineland, Ardennes, Central Europe and Northern France; spent 10 months overseas; served with 84th Infantry Division; holds rank of corporal.



BOND, RICHARD O.

Richard O. Bond, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Bond; was inducted into the Army in February, 1943; trained at Camp Wolters, Texas, and Camp Roberts, Calif.; sailed for Pacific June, 1943; fought on Northern Solomons and Leyte; spent 29 months overseas; is technician, fifth grade.

BOND, THOMAS L.

Thomas L. Bond, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Bond; entered the Army in November, 1942; received training at Camp Wolters, Texas; sailed for Pacific November, 1942; spent 36 months overseas; holds rank of private, first class.



BOONE, FRANK PORTER

Frank Porter Boone, son of Mrs. Loretta M. Boone; entered the Merchant Marine Aug. 12, 1942; received training at New London, Conn.; was sent overseas in February, 1944; served in the Atlantic, Mediterranean and Adriatic seas; spent 11 months overseas; was lieutenant commander.

BOOZ, CHARLES E.

Charles E. Booz, son of Mr. and Mrs. T. R. Booz; entered the Army Air Force Nov. 10, 1942; received training at Greeley, Colo., Kearns, Utah, and Morrison Field, Fla.; held the rank of technical sergeant when honorably discharged in February, 1946.



BOWDEN, AVIN J.

Avin J. Bowden, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. N. Bowden of Vernon; entered the Marine Corps May 8, 1942; trained at San Diego and Camp Elliott, Calif.; was sent overseas Nov. 3, 1942; fought on Saipan, Tarawa and Tinian; was awarded the Purple Heart; holds rank of master sergeant.

BOWEN, GLEN M.

Glen M. Bowen, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Bowen; was inducted into the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for Pacific Nov. 21, 1941; served with 131st Field Artillery; was member of "Lost Battalion;" captured by Japs on Java March 8, 1942; died in POW camp in Thailand Dec. 11, 1943; awarded Purple Heart posthumously.



BOX, CLINTON A.

Clinton A. Box, son of Mrs. Dora Box; entered the Army Feb. 12, 1943; sailed for ETO March 1, 1945; fought in Rhineland and Central Europe with 63rd Infantry Division; spent 12 months overseas; now stationed at Camp Carson, Colo.; holds the rank of sergeant.

BOYD, HUGH F., JR.

Hugh F. Boyd, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Hugh F. Boyd, Sr.; entered the Army Air Force July 10, 1942; sailed overseas Oct. 28, 1942; served in China-Burma-India theater for 24 months; is now stationed at Washington, D. C.; holds the rank of captain.



BOYD, LEWIS C.

Lewis C. Boyd, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Boyd; entered the Army Air Corps June 30, 1942; trained at Randolph Field, Texas, Jonesville, Wis., Fort Morgan, Colo., Twenty-Nine Palms, Calif., Kirtland Field, N. M.; was disabled in training; discharged June 10, 1943 as staff sergeant.

BOYD, ROY R.

Roy R. Boyd, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy L. Boyd; entered the Army in November, 1941; received training at Fort Sill, Okla.; sailed for ETO Nov. 15, 1945; spent nine months overseas to date with the 88th Infantry Division; holds rank of lieutenant; now stationed in Italy.

BOYD, WILLIAM F.

William F. Boyd, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy L. Boyd of Jacksboro, was inducted into the Merchant Marine in 1944; received training at St. Petersburg, Florida; was honorably discharged from service in May, 1945.



BRANDENBURG, JAMES O.

James O. Brandenburg, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Brandenburg, was inducted into the Army on Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for the Pacific on July 8, 1945; served six months overseas with Field Artillery; holds rank of first lieutenant.

BRANNON, JOHN K.

John K. Brannon, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. L. Brannon, entered the Navy in 1933; trained at San Diego, Calif.; sailed overseas in August, 1942 for 33 months service in the ETO and Pacific; fought in North Africa and Okinawa; now aboard the USS Osage; holds rank of chief machinist.



BRANT, D. C.

D. C. Brant, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. D. Brant, was inducted into the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for the Pacific Sept. 15, 1942; participated in the battles of New Guinea, Solomons, Luzon, Guadalcanal, Philippines; spent 35 months overseas; was awarded Distinguished Unit Badge; holds the rank of master sergeant.

BRANT, HARLEY H.

Harley H. Brant, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. D. Brant, was inducted into the Army Air Corps in February, 1943; received training at Chicago, Illinois, Pennsylvania State College and Harlingen, Texas; held the rank of corporal when honorably discharged in February, 1946.



BRAY, CARL T.

Carl T. Bray, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam D. Bray, entered the Army Air Force Jan. 4, 1944; was sent overseas in September, 1944; served in the China-Burma-India Theater with 493rd Bomb Squadron, 7th Bomb Group; awarded Air Medal with cluster; discharged as sergeant Dec. 10, 1945.

BRAY, HAROLD D.

Harold D. Bray, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam D. Bray, entered the Army Dec. 20, 1940; sailed for overseas April 1, 1943; fought at Salerno, Naples-Foggia and Rome-Arno with the 36th Infantry Division; awarded Silver Star; was killed in action in Italy March 31, 1944; awarded Purple Heart posthumously.



BRAZEAL, J. M.

J. M. Brazeal, son of Mrs. Effie Brazeal, was inducted into the Army Air Corps Sept. 1, 1942; trained at Denver, Colo. and Boise, Idaho; was sent to the Pacific Nov. 9, 1945; was shot down over the Pacific while on a bombing mission and died of internal wounds March 9, 1944; awarded Purple Heart posthumously.

BRAZEAL, ROBY H.

Roby H. Brazeal, son of Mrs. G. W. Brazeal, was inducted into the Army in 1942; received training at Luke Field, Arizona, Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and Atlantic City, New Jersey; served in American Theater of Operations; holds the rank of sergeant.



BRIMHALL, ARTHUR A.

Arthur A. Brimhall, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Brimhall, entered the Army June, 1944; sailed for overseas Dec. 12, 1944 for 18 months service in the ETO; participated in the battles at Ardennes, Rhineland and Central Europe; discharged in June, 1946, as technical sergeant.



BRIMHALL, CLIFFORD OATHER

Clifford Oather Brimhall, entered the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for Pacific Nov. 21, 1941; served with 131st Field Artillery; was member of "Lost Battalion;" captured by Japs at Java March 8, 1942; liberated Sept. 5, 1945; awarded Purple Heart; holds the rank of corporal.

BRIMHALL, JAMES B.

James B. Brimhall, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. O. Brimhall, entered the Army May 12, 1943; trained at several camps in the States before sailing for Europe July 24, 1944; spent 20 months overseas with 124th General Hospital Unit; was honorably discharged March 4, 1946.



BRIMHALL, ONIS LEON

Onis Leon Brimhall, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Brimhall, entered the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for Pacific Nov. 21, 1941; served with 131st Field Artillery; was member of "Lost Battalion;" captured by Japs on Java March 8, 1942; liberated Sept. 5, 1945; awarded Purple Heart; discharged April 15, 1946.

BROCK, DONALD LEE

Donald Lee Brock, son of Mr. and Mrs. Faires Brock, was inducted into the Navy Sept. 27, 1945; received training at the Naval Training Station, San Diego, Calif.; sailed overseas March 8, 1946; served in the Pacific Theater of Operations; holds the rank of seaman, second class.



BROCK, GEORGE H.

George H. Brock, son of F. G. Brock of Fort Worth, was inducted into the Army Dec. 31, 1943; received training at Camp Hood, Texas, and Camp Shelby, Miss.; sailed overseas Sept. 10, 1945; spent six months in the Pacific Theater of Operations; holds the rank of sergeant.

BROWN, DONALD N.

Donald N. Brown, son of Mrs. Louise M. Brown, entered the Army Nov. 25, 1940; sailed for Pacific Nov. 21, 1941; served with 131st Field Artillery; was member of "Lost Battalion;" captured by Japs at Java March 8, 1942; was liberated on Sept. 5, 1945; awarded Purple Heart; is staff sergeant.



BROWN, HORACE L.

Horace L. Brown of Bryson, Texas, was inducted into the Navy on June 6, 1944; trained at San Diego, Calif.; sailed for the Pacific in January, 1945; served on Okinawa; was aboard the USS Oneida; discharged Nov. 24, 1945; held the rank of seaman, first class.

BROWNLEE, ALBERT R.

Albert R. Brownlee, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. L. Brownlee, was inducted into the Army November, 25, 1940; received training at Camp Bowie, Texas; served as a member of the 131st Field Artillery, 36th Division; awarded American Defense Ribbon; holds the rank of corporal.



BROWNLEE, AVIN W.

Avin W. Brownlee of Channing, entered the Army Sept. 17, 1940; sailed overseas April, 1943; served 26 months in the European Theater of Operations; engaged in numerous battles; attached to the 131st Field Artillery; honorably discharged June 28, 1945; held the rank of sergeant.

BROWNLEE, FRITZ A.

Fritz A. Brownlee of Jacksboro, Texas, was inducted into the Army Air Corps Feb. 12, 1943; trained at Kearns, Utah and Gowen Field, Idaho; awarded the American Theater and Victory Ribbons; honorably discharged in 1945; was ranked as corporal.

BROWNLEE, LEON W.

Leon W. Brownlee of Jacksboro entered the Army Air Corps Jan. 1, 1942; sent overseas in October, 1942; served with the 358th Bombardment Squadron; wounded and imprisoned 29 months by the Germans; awarded the Purple Heart; discharged in January, 1945, with rank of captain.



BRUTON, BILL W.

Bill W. Bruton, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Bruton, was inducted into the Army July 17, 1942; sailed for the ETO July 1, 1944; saw action in Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes, and Central Europe; spent 18 months overseas with an Infantry unit; held the rank of sergeant.



BRUTON, CARMAL

Carmal Bruton, son of Mrs. Allis Bruton, was inducted into the Navy on Sept. 8, 1942; trained in Rhode Island; sailed for the Pacific on Feb. 12, 1943; spent 30 months overseas; holds the rank of machinist's mate first class.



BRUTON, CLYDE EARL

Clyde Earl Bruton, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Bruton, entered the Navy in March, 1944; received training at San Diego and Oceanside, Calif.; sailed for Pacific Oct. 27, 1944; fought on Iwo Jima and Okinawa; spent 18 months overseas; held the rank of seaman first class.



BRUTON, JAMES W.

James W. Bruton, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Bruton, was inducted into the Army May 18, 1942; received training at Camp Bowie, Camp Hood, Jackson, S. C., and Shreveport, La.; sailed for ETO in January, 1944; participated in four major battles while overseas 24 months; held rank of corporal.



BRUTON, VERNON C.

Vernon C. Bruton, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Bruton, was inducted into the Army in April, 1944; trained at Camp Robinson, Ark.; sailed overseas in September, 1944; fought in Rhineland, Ardennes and Central Europe; spent ten months overseas with Infantry unit; holds rank of staff sergeant.

BUMGARNER, CLIFFORD FRANKLIN

Clifford Franklin Bumgarner was inducted into the Navy March 26, 1946; received boot training at the Naval Training Station, San Diego, Calif.; is now training at Memphis, Tenn.; is attached to the Medical Corps; holds the rank of hospital apprentice second class.

BUNNELL, ELVIS L.

Elvis L. Bunnell, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Bunnell, entered the Army Air Corps on March 25, 1944; sent overseas on March 23, 1945; served 16 months in the China-Burma-India Theater of Operations; took part in China offensive; holds the rank of corporal.



BUNNELL, RAYMOND M.
