

Glenn Lewis Adair, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Adair, entered the Navy May 10, 1945; was given boot training at San Diego, Calif.; sailed for overseas Aug. 25, 1945; spent ten months in the Pacific; at the present time is located in China.

ADAMS, CECIL L.

Cecil L. Adams, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. R. Adams, entered the Army Feb. 16, 1943; sailed for overseas May 11, 1944; spent 19 months in the Pacific; fought in New Guinea, Mindanao and Philippines; received his discharge Dec. 25, 1945; held rank of sergeant.

ADAMS, CHARLES AUBREY

Charles Aubrey Adams, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Adams, entered the Army Air Corps on Oct. 9, 1942; received training at Biloxi, Miss., and Ypsilanti, Mich.; sailed for Cuba in January, 1945; served with second Air Force; discharged on Feb. 4, 1946.

ADAMS, VIRGIL H.

Virgil H. Adams, son of J. H. Adams, entered the Army on Feb. 21, 1942; received training at Little Rock, Ark.; sailed for Pacific on July 20, 1942; fought in Bismarck, New Guinea, for 35 months; awarded Unit Citation; was discharged on Sept. 15, 1945; held rank of staff sergeant.

ADAMS, WARREN

Warren Adams, son of Mr. and Mrs. Seth Adams, entered the Army Air Forces on Feb. 2, 1943; sailed for ETO in July, 1944; reported missing in action over Italy; presumed dead after a year; held rank of second lieutenant; posthumously awarded Purple Heart.

ADKINS, LONNIE ROE

Lonnie Roe Adkins, son of Mrs. Maude Adkins, entered the Army on Feb. 19, 1941; sailed for ETO on April 15, 1943; fought in North Africa and Italy; served 31 months overseas with the Second Armored Division; was given an honorable discharge on Nov. 17, 1945, as sergeant.

ALLEN, HENERY

Henery Allen, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. Allen, enlisted in the Navy on Nov. 8, 1943; received training at San Diego, Calif.; sailed for Pacific in April, 1944; served 16 months overseas with Armed Guard; discharged on July 8, 1946, as gunners mate third class.

ALLRED, WILLIAM K.

William K. Allred, son of W. S. Allred of Anson, entered the Army Air Corps on Sept. 24, 1942; left for China-India-Burma theater on May 9, 1943; awarded Presidential Citation and Silver Star; fought in five battles during 25 months overseas.

ALTUM, ALFRED CLINTON

Alfred Clinton Altum, son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Altum, entered the Navy June 2, 1945; sailed for everseas Sept. 10, 1945; served in both Atlantic and Pacific; holds rank of storekeeper third class; now in Florida.

ANDERS, BOBBY FAY

Bobby Fay Anders, son of Mr. and Mrs. Larue Anders. enlisted in Naval Air Corps Sept. 3, 1942; sailed overseas in March, 1942; served in both European and Pacific sectors; fought in battles of the Bay of Biscay and D-Day Invasion; spent 20 months across; was discharged Jan. 10, 1946.























ANDERS, JONES LYCURGUS

Jones Lycurgus Anders, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fay Anders, was inducted into service June 16, 1943; trained at San Diego, Calif.; sailed for overseas Sept. 12, 1943; after serving 25 months in Pacific with Navy, was discharged March 8, 1946; held rank of signalman second class.

ANDERSON, ELDON B.

Eldon B. Anderson, son of Mrs. Essie Anderson, entered Air Corps May 8, 1941; went overseas on April 22, 1944; spent 15 months in the ETO; was shot down over France and captured by Germans; was prisoner a year; awarded Purple Heart; was discharged Oct. 18, 1945.

ANDRESS, DULAN

Dulan Andress, son of Mr. and Mrs. D. E. Andress, entered Army May 9, 1943; trained at Camp Hood, Fort Knox and Camp Pickett; spent six months in ETO, fighting in Africa, Sicily and Italy; served as sergeant in tank division; killed in action on June 1, 1944.

ANDRESS, LLOYD

Lloyd Andress, son of Albert Andress, entered the Army May 23, 1941; trained at Camp Callan, Calif., Fort Lewis, Wash., Camp Robinson, Ark., and Camp Bowie; sailed for overseas May 1, 1942; spent 25 months in the Pacific; was discharged on Oct. 19, 1945.

ASTIN, MAXWELL R.

Maxwell R. Astin, son of Mrs. Charles Astin, entered Navy May 2, 1944; trained at San Diego, Calif., and Dearborn, Mich.; sailed for Pacific Dec. 28, 1944; served aboard the USS Ajax during his 12 months in the Pacific area; received an honorable discharge Dec. 29, 1945.

Clay C. Bailey, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence C. Bailey, entered the Coast Guard Sept. 6, 1942; trained in California exclusively; sailed for Pacific and spent 29 months there; fought in battles of Leyte and Palau; held rank of radioman second class.

Mark M. Bailey, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence C. Bailey, entered the Army May 6, 1940; sailed for overseas May 14, 1941; spent 39 months in the Pacific; fought in battles of Carolinas, invasion of Saipan; discharged in August, 1945, as corporal.

BAILEY, RAY A.

Ray A. Bailey, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence C. Bailey of Hamlin, entered the Navy in July, 1945; received his training at San Diego, Calif., Sampson, N. Y., and Bethesda, Md.; is now serving in Bethesda; will serve for two more years.

BAIZE, REED E.

Reed E. Baize, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Baize, enlisted in the Navy in 1942; trained at San Diego, Calif.; sailed for overseas Feb. 20, 1943; served in ETO and Pacific; fought in Africa, Sicily, Italy, France, Iwo Jima and Philippines; awarded Unit Citation.

Neal C. Brigham, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. F. Brigham, was inducted into the Army Air Forces Oct. 24, 1942; received training at Lubbock, Sheppard Field, Santa Ana, Calif., and Chanute Field, Ill.; was given discharge in February, 1946, with rank of private, first class.
