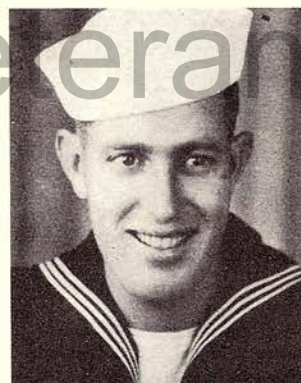


**ADAMS, JAMES WILLIAM**

**ADRIAN, LLOYD E.**

Lloyd E. Adrian, son of M. L. Adrian, entered the Army on May 11, 1942; trained at Camp Barkley; sailed for ETO on June 24, 1943; served with the Medical Corps; was overseas 30 months; discharged on Dec. 22, 1945, as technician fourth grade.

**ALEXANDER, C. C.**

C. C. Alexander, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Alexander, went into the Navy on Jan. 28, 1944; received training at San Diego, Calif.; sailed for the Pacific Theater of Operations on Nov. 2, 1945; spent 3½ months overseas; held the rank of electricians mate third class.

**ALEXANDER, R. C.**

R. C. Alexander, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Alexander, entered the Army March 7, 1942; sailed for ETO April 1, 1943; served with famed 36th Division at Naples-Foggia, Rome-Arno, Southern France, and the Rhineland; spent 30 months overseas; discharged in September, 1945.

**BASSINGER, ROBERT LESLIE**

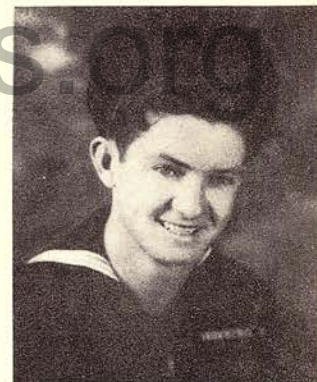

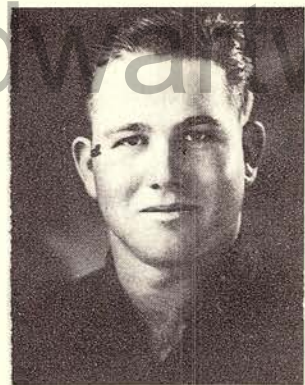


**BOWLIN, WILLIAM B.**

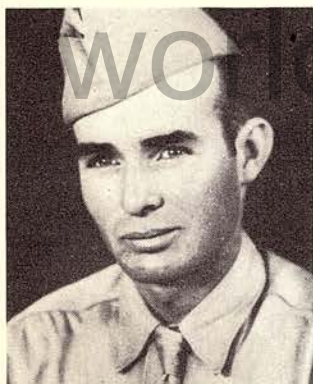


**BRUCE, MARSHALL, JR.**
