


This Military History has been prepared with the desire to make of

STATE STAFF AND DETACHMENT



The Provincial Congress of New Jersey assumed command of the entire Militia of the State on September 5, 1775, and less than one year later, recognizing the need for some person to properly conduct the administrative details of the Militia and acting upon the recommendation of General Livingston then commanding this force, on July 12, 1776, appointed William Bott, Esq., Adjutant General, without military rank, and later on, November 28, 1776, conferred upon him the rank of Colonel and Adjutant General.


The duties of the office during that period were not clearly defined and, apparently, were not too confining as Colonel Bott found time to accompany General Washington on his retreat through New Jersey, and he was present at the Battle of Springfield, New Jersey.



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The Federal act passed in 1792 to establish a more uniform Militia throughout the United States required the appointment of an Adjutant General in each State and defined the duties of that office, to include distribution of orders, attendance at reviews, supplying of blank forms with instructions for accomplishing same, the receipt of returns covering strength, arms, accoutrements and ammunition and rendering of annual strength returns to the President.

In the early days of the nation both Congress and the State Legislature passed many amendments to the laws for the regulation of the Militia. None, however, contained proper provisions for regulating and disciplining this civilian force. Providing protection for the frontiers, participation in the Pennsylvania Insurrection of 1797 and the War with Great Britain, 1812-14, provided the incentive to keep the various County Brigades in a fair state of preparedness and officered by citizens of military experience. During this period the Adjutant General had few duties to perform beyond rendering annual returns and transmitting commissions to officers. Such clerical duties as were necessary

were performed by employees in the office of the Secretary of State.

At the outbreak of the Civil War, no State in the Union was as poorly prepared as New Jersey for the harsh exactions and necessities of war. Her Militia system, poorly regulated and sustained, was without organic unity. Arms and equipment were insufficient.

The military bureau of the State had been operated on a purely peace time basis. It was as ignorant, practically, as the people themselves of the realities and business of war. Suddenly called upon to act, they were forced to acquire by slow and painful application the facility in organizing troops, baffled at every turn by conflicting orders and requests from higher authority. Despite the many handicaps encountered, the office of the Adjutant General supervised the recruiting, equipping, mustering and dispatching of 40 regiments and replacements during the years 1861-1865. The splendid manner in which this huge task was performed reflected great credit on Brigadier General Robert F. Stockton, Jr., and his staff and is indicated in the numerous records, returns and commendations on file in the State Military Archives.



The present State Staff Detachment, New Jersey National Guard, was granted Federal recognition October 11, 1919. New Jersey's State Staff Detachment, however, had its inception in Revolutionary Days when enlisted personnel were required for duty in the Adjutant General, Quartermaster, Wagon Master and Paymaster Departments of the Militia, the headquarters of which were located in Trenton.

Supplying rations, forage and sometimes pay, but mostly depreciation notes was their task in those days, to be continued in the War of 1812; in the War Between the States, when regiments were recruited, mobilized and mustered in at Trenton and sent South; during the Spanish-American War when four regiments of volunteers were assembled at the State Camp at Sea Girt for both muster into the Federal Service and subsequent muster out. The World War brought increased duties incident to the mobilization of all New Jersey Guard Units, the organization and equipping of new units, the organization of the State Guard, State Militia Reserves and the Home Guard.

The reorganization of the National Guard in 1919 brought different regulations, but very little change in the duties to be performed, as soldiers are always hungry, broke and badly clothed and equipped. The Detachment has, however, continued to perform its manifold duties in

a quiet and efficient manner and in late years has been engaged with plans for mobilization of the National Guard, voluntary recruiting and selective service. This planning was for the future. Recent unsettled conditions in Europe have, however, caused the mobilization of the elements of the 44th Division; and, as this history is written, the Quartermaster Section is striving to transfer all Federal property to Federal control, and the Adjutant General's section is busily engaged in placing selective service into operation, both working without regard to hours, in the interest of National Defense.

The 44th Division, comprising troops of New Jersey and New York, was allocated to New Jersey in 1923, activated and Federally recognized March 26, 1924, to perpetuate the World War service of units of the 29th (Blue and Gray) Division, United States Army, which was largely composed of New Jersey National Guard units, and the pre-World War service of the First Division, National Guard of New Jersey.

Organized at Camp McClellan, Alabama, October 11, 1917, the 29th Division took troops from Maryland, Virginia, Delaware and the District of Columbia, in addition to New Jersey. The Delaware troops were subsequently withdrawn and replaced by transfers from New Jersey units having surplus personnel.

The 29th Division trained for 10 months at Camp McClellan prior to sailing for France during May and June, 1918. Units of the division embarked at Hoboken and Newport News, Virginia, and landed at Brest and Saint Nazaire, France. After several weeks of intensive training behind the lines, the division was assigned the Center Sector—Haute Alsace, relieving the 32nd Division. There it received its first taste of trench warfare with its mud, gas, night barrages, raids and other discomforts of this type of warfare, with resultant loss of life.

Relief was effected on September 23, and the division marched to join the First American Army in the great attack between the Meuse River and the Argonne. The first units of the division (the 58th Brigade, composed of Maryland and Virginia troops) launched their attack against the heights of the Haumont Woods, the Ormont Woods and the Consenvoye Woods on October 8, gaining their objective and capturing 1,572 prisoners. The 57th Infantry Brigade of New Jersey followed them on October 9, relieving the French troops on their right and penetrating to the fourth line of the enemy's prepared defenses. The attack continued for the succeeding 21 days and resulted in the taking of the Ravin de Molleville, Bois de la Reine, Bois de Ormont, Bois de la Grand Montagne, Bois de Etrayes, Richene Hill and the Bois de Brabant. Reduced more than one-third in strength, having faced parts of at least six enemy divisions, having advanced its lines in the face of most skillful and stubborn opposition over more than seven kilometers of the most difficult terrain, captured 2,500 prisoners and countless matériel of war, the Blue and Gray Division was relieved for a well-earned rest and period of recuperation.

The morning of November 11 found the division on the march to join the Second American Army in its attack on Metz with the men clad in the same clothes they had fought in, and no replacements. Upon receipt of the news of the Armistice, the march was abruptly halted and the division returned to billets; and on November 18 it was moved to the 11th Training Area, with Headquarters at Bourbonne-les-Bains, where the division remained in training until the receipt of orders on April 6, 1919, to proceed to the Le Mans area and subsequently to embark for home.

After a short stay in the Le Mans area, where necessary inspections were completed, the division embarked for home, arriving in the United States in May, 1919. Organizations were ordered to camps most convenient to



44TH DIVISION SPECIAL TROOPS



The 44th Division Special Troops traces its origin back to November 29, 1920, when the Division Signal Company was organized under the command of Captain H. W. Vandervort. Lieutenant Joseph B. Leimer, assisted by Lieutenants George H. Trundle and Dan Stahle and Lieutenant Sullivan, was the main factor in its organization.

On December 3, 1921, the Signal Company was redesignated the 44th Signal Company Special Troops. Captain Vandervort resigned November 15, 1920, and Lieutenant Leimer succeeded to command, being promoted to Captain August 9, 1922.

Subsequently, the other units of the Special Troops were organized: the 119th Motorcycle Company, Feb-

ruary 8, 1924, Flemington, New Jersey, under the command of Lieutenant George R. Parker; Headquarters Company, 44th Division, April 3, 1924, Plainfield, New Jersey, under the command of Captain Walter H. Albers; 119th Ordnance Company, February 25, 1926, Trenton, New Jersey, under the command of Captain Cyril E. Edmonds; 44th Military Police Company, March 16, 1926, Passaic, New Jersey, under the command of Captain Grover P. Heinzman.

Up to this point in its history the Special Troops had no commanding officer or headquarters, each unit commander being responsible only to the Division Commander. On February 25, 1926, an attempt had been made to organize such a headquarters at Plainfield, under the command of Major Charles. This organization was on paper only and never functioned as a headquarters. It was not until March 28, 1927, that Captain Leimer was promoted to Major and appointed Commander of the 44th Division Special Troops, Headquarters Commandant and Provost Marshal of the 44th Division.

The 44th Division Special Troops then began to function for the first time as a unit with the Division Staff.

On May 1, 1924, the 173rd Motor Transport Company, 44th Division Train, Quartermasters Corps, had been formed at Morristown, New Jersey, under the command of Lieutenant Edward C. Tuttle. It had formerly been designated Company M, Sixth Infantry, August 14, 1919, and Company M, 113th Infantry,

June 17, 1921. When Headquarters Special Troops was organized, the 173rd Motor Transport Company was placed under Major Leimer's command for administration and discipline. On March 8, 1932, it was disbanded at Morristown and reorganized March 23, 1932, at Orange, under the command of Lieutenant Dennis Maglio.

Headquarters Detachment Special Troops, 44th Division, was organized June 13, 1927. Lieutenant George H. Trundle, Signal Company, and Lieutenant Ernest F. Lawes, Jr., Signal Company, were appointed Adjutant and Supply Officer, respectively.

Since its organization as a regiment, the 44th Division Special Troops has distinguished itself on many occasions. It furnished honor guards and military police detachments in the handling of crowds at Sea Girt, New Jersey, on Smith Day and Roosevelt Day. In the Morro Castle disaster, it was again called on. Major Leimer and Lieutenant Lawes, with the assistance of a small detachment of enlisted men hastily gathered from nearby units, and the First Battalion, New Jersey Militia (colored), set up a central morgue and information bureau at the Camp Grounds, Sea Girt. Major Leimer was personally cited by the Governor for his efficient and meritorious service.

At the First Army Maneuvers at Plattsburg, 1939, the Special Troops made an enviable record, being one of the few units cited for meritorious service. The 44th Military Police Company and the 44th Signal Company were especially mentioned.







FACTUAL HISTORY

The 44th Division Military Police Company was organized in the Armory at Passaic, New Jersey, November 13, 1924, with 29 men, all World War veterans. When Congress failed to appropriate money to equip and pay units, the company was ordered to disband. But the men decided to maintain the organization and continued to drill regularly with the Federal aid, until March 16, 1926, when Federal recognition was extended to the company, under the command of Captain Grover P. Heinzman.

On May 31, 1937, the company was transferred from Passaic to Orange. To the present time more than 95 per cent of the personnel is from Passaic and its environs.

The company participated in the following maneuvers: Camp Dix, New Jersey, 1929; Pine Camp, New York, 1935, and Plattsburg, New York, 1939. It also did special duty at Sea Girt, New Jersey, on Smith Day in 1928 and Roosevelt Day in 1932.

It took the Special Troops Basketball Championship in 1935, 1936, 1937, 1938, 1939, and 1940, and the division basketball championship in 1940. In 1933 and 1934 its baseball team won the only trophies given for that sport.

In 1930, Major General Quincy A. Gillmore designated the company as the Chemical Warfare Company of the 44th Division, and it was trained in the handling of chemical warfare weapons by Major St. John, U. S. Army Chemical Warfare Service.

15, 1900, when the First Field Company, Signal Corps, was organized in Jersey City. The company took part in many parades, reviews and ceremonies, including the inaugurations of President Theodore Roosevelt, March 4, 1905, and President Woodrow Wilson, March 4, 1913. It served during the joint maneuvers of the Regular Army and National Guard in Connecticut, August 10-18, 1912. The company mobilized at Sea Girt June 21, 1916, for Mexican Border service at Douglas, Arizona. On October 18, 1916, it returned to Jersey City and was mustered out of Federal service.

The unit's designation was changed to Company A, Signal Corps, May 21, 1917. Later that year, on July 25, it mobilized at Sea Girt and transferred to 104th Field Signal Battalion, training at Camp McClellan, Alabama, with the 29th Division. It served in France with the 29th Division from June, 1918, until the return to the United States, 1919.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The 44th Divisional Signal Company was organized and Federal recognized November 29, 1920, a Radio Company, Signal Corps, at Orange, New Jersey. It was given its present designation on December 3, 1921.

It has participated with the Division in the First Army Maneuvers, Pine Camp, New York, 1935, and Plattsburg, New York, 1939. Field training in other years has usually been at Sea Girt with the Division Headquarters.

Signal Corps history in New Jersey goes back to May

FACTUAL HISTORY

Although the Tank Company, stationed at Orange Armory, is the newest addition to the 44th Division's Special Troops, it can trace its origin back to January, 1918, when it was known as Company B, Morristown, Infantry Battalion, State Militia Reserve.

That first unit was disbanded June 12, 1919; and later the same year, on August 14, at Morristown, was Federally recognized as Company M, Sixth Infantry. On June 17, 1921, it was redesignated Company M, 113th Infantry, under the command of Captain Robert E. Burke until another redesignation, May 1, 1924, made it the 173rd Motor Transport Company. First Lieutenant Edward J. Bradley, from the former company, then became commanding officer of the unit. He

was later succeeded by First Lieutenant Edward C. Tuttle.

On March 23, 1932, the company was reorganized at Orange under the command of First Lieutenant Dennis C. Magilo and federally recognized May 5, 1932. Then, on January 1, 1937, it was redesignated Company A, 119th Quartermaster Regiment, with First Lieutenant Magilo commanding until September 6, 1938, when Second Lieutenant James H. Dickinson assumed command.

Company A was converted into the 44th Tank Company September 21, 1939, with Captain George H. Trundle commanding. First Lieutenants John G. Crawford and Edward M. Minion, Jr., came into the company in 1940.


Field training for the company was received at Fort George G. Meade, Maryland, November, 1939, where it was initiated into the training of a Tank unit. Since its organization, the Tank Company has traveled more than 2,686 miles to encampments. The old organization made six encampments at Sea Girt, New Jersey, one at Pine Camp, New York, and Plattsburg, New York.

Plainfield, New Jersey, and Federally recognized April 3, 1924. Weekly drills were held in the Plainfield High School gymnasium until the unit moved into its new armory in 1932. On April 1, 1940, the company was transferred to the Special Troops Armory in Orange, New Jersey.

The company has received commendations for each of the 17 encampments attended, and on each of its annual armory inspections. It has maintained at all times an outstanding record for the percentage of drill attendance. And, although the unit has a strength of only three officers and 55 enlisted men, records indicate that approximately 600 men from Plainfield and its vicinity have received military instruction with the company.

A number of its men have served continuously since the unit was organized. Three men have won appointments to and have entered West Point. Two have graduated, and one is at this time a Cadet.

In the field, Headquarters Company has two functions. It sets up the Division Command Post with its many installations, and it furnishes messengers and orderlies for the General Staff. Because of this, the men of the unit have at all times an opportunity to observe and to gain knowledge regarding the operations of an army division.

sergeants and 12 enlisted men comprised the strength of the unit.

On December 15, 1930, First Lieutenant Irving E. Fink was appointed junior officer, and later the following year through process of seniority of appointment, to the rank of Captain; he was Federally recognized and assumed command of the unit June 7, 1932. First Lieutenant Marra reverted to junior officer.

Captain Fink resigned December 19, 1939, and Captain Marra was placed in command of the organization.

First encampment for the detachment was at Sea Girt, New Jersey, where it cooperated with the Medical Detachment of the 102nd Cavalry, commanded by Major Edward Klein. It has served the Special Troops, 44th Di-

vision, for the past ten years, attending all encampments and maneuvers. The detachment was at Pine Camp, 1935; Plattsburg, New York, 1939; and Fort Dix, New Jersey, December 10-16, 1939.

The need for better control and organization of the Militia was amply evidenced by the difficulties encountered in calling out troops for the Civil War, and in 1869 the Legislature passed legislation creating the National Guard and providing rules and regulations for the conduct of same. This act provided for an Adjutant General on full time duty with competent personnel trained in the duties of the office.

The call for volunteers for the Spanish-American War found both the Adjutant General and the National Guard more fully prepared to meet the call. As the number of units volunteering greatly exceeded those required to fill New Jersey's quota, the problem of the Adjutant General was more of selecting the best fitted for the mission rather than recruiting.

The calls for duty on the Mexican Border and in the World War again found the military establishment of New Jersey prepared. Troops were mobilized, mustered into service and dispatched with little difficulty.


The passage of the National Defense Act in 1917 changed the entire status, organization, equipment and training of the National Guard; prescribed definite functions for the State Adjutant General, and further provided a State Staff and Detachment charged with specific duties—Administration, supply, transportation, mobilization and recruiting of the National Guard in both State and Federal service. This was to constitute for use in a national emergency a nucleus of National Guard officers and enlisted men trained to prepare and place in operation plans for procurement of personnel by recruiting and by selective service.

Under the provisions of the National Defense Act the Adjutant General and his various staff officers have supervised the recruiting, organization, command, discipline and administration of the units now comprising the New Jersey National Guard and in addition have prepared the necessary plans for the mobilization of the National Guard in case of emergency, a plan for Voluntary Recruiting and for operation of Selective Service. These plans will be studied and revised as conditions and regulations require.

Commissioned Brigadier General, 57th Infantry Brigade, New Jersey National Guard, December 21, 1939. Resigned appointment as Brigadier General, September 8, 1940, under provisions of regulations inducting National Guard into the Federal service.

57TH INFANTRY BRIGADE

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Headquarters, 57th Infantry Brigade, was Federally recognized December 21, 1920, as Headquarters, First Infantry Brigade. It received its present designation June 17, 1921. It is stationed at Elizabeth, N. J.

The original station was established at Newark, N. J., December 21, 1920, under command of Brigadier General Howard S. Borden. In October,

1921, it was moved to Camden, N. J., under command of Brigadier General Quincy A. Gillmore. When the latter assumed command of the 44th Division, Brigadier General Winfield S. Price was elected April 7, 1924, as Brigade Commander. Upon his elevation to Division Commander, Brigadier General Clifford R. Powell took command of the Brigade on February 15, 1937.

On August 1, 1938, Brigade Headquarters was moved to the State House at Trenton, N. J. On June 21, 1939, General Powell was elevated to command of the 44th Division. Colonel John F. Lee, Jr., commanding the 113th Infantry, was acting Brigade Commander until December 21, 1939, when Major Edward J. Maloney, Regular Army, was elected Brigade Commander.

In March, 1940, the Headquarters was moved to Elizabeth, N. J. General Maloney resigned his National Guard commission September 8, 1940, and Colonel Arthur W. Copp was appointed to command the 57th Infantry Brigade inducted into Federal service at Fort Dix, N. J., September 16, 1940.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Headquarters Company, 57th Brigade, was organized February, 1926, in Newark, New Jersey, and received its Federal recognition on March 9, 1926, when it was transferred to Camden, New Jersey.

At the time of its organization in Camden, the unit consisted mainly of veterans of the World War, under the command of Captain Fred C. Dawson, with Robert C. Bellville as Second Lieutenant. Second Lieutenant Bellville later became company commander with John E. Rouh as Communications Officer. In 1929, Captain Bellville resigned, and Captain Rouh took command, with Frank S. Honer filling the vacancy made. In 1934, Second Lieutenant Honer resigned and was replaced by James M. Davidson, who, later, on May 4, 1937, was appointed to the 57th Brigade Staff. Rudolph C. Koerner was elected

to fill the vacancy made by the change. Captain Rouh retired May 31, 1939, and Lieutenant Davidson returned to the company as commanding officer.


It has attended annual encampments at Sea Girt, New Jersey, each summer, with the following exceptions: 4th Division Encampment, Camp Dix, New Jersey, 1929; First Army Maneuvers, Pine Camp, New York, 1935; and First Army Maneuvers, Plattsburg, New York, 1939.

The basketball team representing Headquarters Company won the South Jersey Championship in 1930; the communication team, the South Jersey Championship in 1936, the State Championship in 1937, and third place in state competition in 1938.

During the First Army Maneuvers in 1939, the organization was awarded a "certificate of commendation" for "Exceptional and Meritorious Service" in maintaining signal communications.

113TH INFANTRY

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The Militia of Essex and Bergen Counties was authorized by the Provincial Congress of New Jersey on June 3, 1775. To this recognized need for trained Bands and Companies of citizen soldiers, the present 113th Infantry traces its early history.

Under the above act was organized the First Brigade, Essex County Militia, and the First Regiment, Bergen County Militia (Hudson County was created in 1840; Passaic County, in 1837, from Bergen and Essex Counties). These units responded to all calls of the State and Federal Governments, serving with distinction during the Revolutionary War, 1775-1779; the Pennsylvania Insurrection, 1794; the War with Great Britain, 1812-1815; the War with Mexico, 1847, and the Civil War, 1861-1865.

The Civil War forcibly demonstrated the need for State and National control of the Militia, and in 1868, the legislature passed an act creating the National Guard. Under this act, the First Brigade, Essex County Militia, was designated First and Fifth Regiments, New Jersey Infantry; the Hudson County Militia, Fourth Regiment, Infantry; and the Passaic County Militia, Second Separate Battalion, Infantry. The First and Fifth Regiments were later consolidated. A new Second Regiment was formed at Paterson in 1872 from the First, Second and Third Separate Battalions and Company B, Fourth Regiment. The First and Second Regiments served during the Spanish-American War, 1898, participating in no active engagements.

The three Regiments served on the Mexican Border in 1916 as the First New Jersey Brigade. This service did much to prepare both officers and men for the more arduous service of the World War. On March 15, 1917, prior to the declaration of war against Germany, the Brigade


was called for duty guarding munitions plants, bridges and railroads. In July, 1917, orders were received to entrain for Camp McClellan, Alabama, where training in earnest for the World War commenced. The 29th Division was formed in October, 1917, from National Guard units of Maryland, Virginia, New Jersey and the District of Columbia. At this time, the First and Fourth Regiments were consolidated with the Second New Jersey Infantry, to form the 113th Infantry, and the Fifth Regiment formed the nucleus for the organization of the 114th Infantry, the two regiments constituting the 57th Infantry Brigade, 29th Division.

After 10 months of intensive training at Camp McClellan, the Brigade embarked for France on June 5, 1918, and was shortly thereafter in the front lines in Alsace, subsequently moving northwest of Verdun to participate in the great Meuse-Argonne Offensive. The Armistice was signed as preparations were being made for the American offensive against the fortress of Metz. Upon cessation of hostilities, the Division moved to a training area, later embarking for return to the United States and demobilization at Camp Dix, May 27, 1919.

The wartime units are now reconstituted in the 113th Infantry (Rifle), N. J. N. G. Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Band, Service Company and Medical Detachment are stationed at Newark; the Second Battalion at Paterson (without Company H); Company H, Passaic, and the Third Battalion, at Jersey City.

The 113th Infantry (Rifle), participated in the First Army maneuvers, Pine Camp Area, New York, 1935; Plattsburg Area, New York, 1939, and Pine Camp Area, New York, 1940.

tion for participation in the Spanish-American War. It did not enter, however, and was ordered home September 3, 1898, to be disbanded on May 2, 1899.

The company was reorganized at Orange on March 6, 1902, and designated Company I, Fifth Regiment. Mustered into Federal service for Mexican Border duty, it trained at Douglas, Arizona, June 20 to November 14, 1916, returning to Orange without having seen active service, but having gained invaluable training.

Mustered into Federal service once again on March 25, 1917, for the World War, the company was redesignated Headquarters Company, 114th Infantry, 29th Division, United States Army, and served meritoriously in the Belfort area, the Meuse-Argonne Forest and the interrupted Metz Offensive.

Demobilized at Camp Dix, May 29, 1919, the unit was reorganized and Federally recognized as Company A, Sixth New Jersey Infantry, June 17, 1921. It was redesignated Company A, 113th Infantry, at the same time, to perpetuate the history of the 114th Infantry, 29th Division.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company A, 113th Infantry, was organized at Orange, October 6, 1885, as Company B, Third Battalion, after a bitter struggle with opposing politicians of the day. Captain John J. Full, First Lieutenant J. Murphy, and Second Lieutenant Francis J. Murphy were the unit's first officers.

While early drills and formations were conducted at Park Rink, contributions from Orange civilians made possible the erection of the present armory on January 29, 1888, less than a year after a large number of the company qualified for and attended camp at Sea Girt.

On May 31, 1892, Company B, redesignated Company I, was transferred to the Second Regiment. In 1898, the unit went into training at Jacksonville, Florida, in prepara-

The unit entered Federal service in 1916 for Mexican Border duty. Three weeks after being mustered out of the Border service it was called for duty in the World War, taking part in the Argonne Forest and St. Mihiel drives.

The organization received Federal recognition as Company B, 113th Infantry, on June 30, 1919, under the command of Captain Richard F. Mattia. On January 1, 1927, Captain Edward A. Battle took over command, serving until August 3, 1939. He was succeeded on August 4, 1939, by First Lieutenant Arthur J. Hensel, who, in turn, was replaced January 17, 1940, by Captain Albert E. Coryell, the present Commander. Captain Coryell served in the Canadian Expeditionary Force and has been in the New Jersey National Guard since June, 1919.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Previous to 1858 Company B, 113th Infantry, was known as the Eighth Volunteer Regiment and was inducted into the service during the Civil War as such. After the war, the organization mustered out and became the First Regiment, New Jersey State Militia. During the years between 1865 and 1898, the company was occupied in drilling and training tactics of the army. In 1898, it was again mustered into service, this time for active duty in the Spanish-American War.

railroad strike of 1877; mobilized for the Spanish-American War at Sea Girt, New Jersey, May 2, 1898, and demobilized November 4, 1898; paraded in honor of Admiral Dewey at New York City, September 30, 1899; did not duty at the Paterson, New Jersey, strikes in 1902; participated in maneuvers in Connecticut August 10-18, 1912; mobilized at Sea Girt June 21, 1916, for Mexican Border service at Douglas, Arizona, and mustered out of Federal service October 10, 1917 at Newark.

It trained at Camp McClellan, Alabama, October 11, 1917, to June 5, 1918. From July 15 to September 22, 1918, it served in the Boron-Center and Haute-Alsace sectors in France. It participated in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, October 8-30, 1918, and saw action at Molleville, Bois Ormont, Molleville Farm and Estrayes Ridge. The company returned to the United States May 20, 1919, and was demobilized at Camp Dix, New Jersey.

Field training was received at Sea Girt and Fort Dix, and at First Army Maneuvers at Plattsburg, New York, August, 1935; First Army Maneuvers, Plattsburg, 1939, and at Canton, New York, 1940.

FACTUAL HISTORY

The original organization from which Company G, 113th Infantry, descends—The Hackensack Continental Guard—was founded in 1855 and had as its meeting place the Mansion House in Hackensack.

At the outbreak of the Civil War this unit was disbanded and many of the personnel enlisted in Company A, 22nd New Jersey Volunteers. On October 8, 1872, Company C, Second Battalion, National Guard of New Jersey, was organized with its headquarters in the same Mansion House. On May 31, 1883, Company C became Company G during the organization of the First, Second and Third Battalions as a regiment. This unit participated in the

Spanish-American War. At the conclusion of the Spanish-American War, the Second Regiment was disbanded, and Company G was transferred to the Fourth Regiment. When the Fifth Regiment was organized in 1902, this unit was transferred to it with its old Company letter "G". The Company was called for service on the Mexican Border in 1916 and again in 1917 when it served with the 29th Division at McClellan, Ala. Company G and Company L of Ridgewood were merged to form Company C, 114th Infantry. This unit, on its arrival in France, participated in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, Belleau Bois, Bois de Ormont and Bois de Moirey.

When the Guard was reorganized after the war, Company G, stationed at the historic Hackensack Armory, was redesignated in the following chronological order: Company G, Sixth Infantry, 1919-20; Company G, 113th Infantry, 1921; Company C, 114th Infantry, November, 1921, and finally, Company G, 113th Infantry, June 8, 1924.

In May, 1937, Company G was transferred from Hackensack Armory to the Second Battalion Armory in Paterson.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Passaic's militia history goes back to Captain John H. Post, soldier of the Revolution, who lies buried with his wife in Armory Park, Passaic, close by the spot where, on November 22, 1776, Post hacked down the old Acquackanonk Landing Bridge between what are now Passaic and Wallington and so delayed for a day the British who were pursuing Washington's troops.

Two old brownstone headstones which once marked the spot where Captain and Mrs. Post were buried are now preserved as slabs in a granite marker erected in back of the Seventeenth Century Church which originally was used for worship by the congregation of the Dutch Reformed Church of Acquackanonk (now Passaic's First Reformed Church).

Half a century ago Passaic's National Guard unit was Company B of the Fourth New Jersey Infantry. Captain Charles Stelling was its commander.

Andrew Derrom, Hamilton M. Ross and James Barker were Company B's Captains in the Nineties.

It was Captain Ross who led the Company away into service during the Spanish-American War. John H. Doremus, mantel dealer and prominent citizen of Passaic for two decades after he was stricken with blindness, lost his sight as a result of his 1898 war-time experiences, having fallen ill while the Company was in Florida, awaiting orders to embark for Cuba.

When Pancho Villa crossed the Mexican-American Border March 9, 1916, and raided the town of Columbus, New Mexico, and when the National Guard was called out for Mexican Border duty, Frederick H. Rohrbach was Captain William H. Kruitbosch, First Lieutenant, and Chester C. Seiden, Second Lieutenant, of what is that they had come to be known as Company A, Fifth New Jersey Infantry, a rifle company.

Captain Kruitbosch later organized M Company, of Rutherford, and still later was assigned to the transport service, in which he served during the World War. First Sergeant Grover P. Heinzmann became First Lieutenant in Company B.

Captain Rohrbach commanded Company A on the Mexican Border, in Camp McClelland, at Anniston, Ala., and in France. The Passaic unit first went into the lines in a quiet sector in Alsace and got its baptism of fire October 12, 1918, at Bois d' Ormont, in the Argonne.

Brigaded with the French, the old Fifth, by that time Federally-designated as the 114th Infantry, attacked on the morning of the 12th and, by nightfall, was the only company which had obtained its objective, the hillside known as Ormont Woods. Company B, at Company A's left, trapped in a ravine by deadly machine gun fire, suffered heavy losses.

Company A was mustered out of Federal service in 1919. On June 29, 1919, Passaic's military company was reorganized and Federally recognized as Company H, Sixth






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

FACTUAL HISTORY

Although Company K, 113th Infantry (Rifle), through various predecessors, can trace its ancestry back to the closing years of the 17th century, Company K, as such, was formed at Camp McClellan, Anniston, Alabama, October 12, 1917, from a consolidation of Companies C and G and eight men from each of Companies D and F, Fourth New Jersey Infantry. Sailing for France June 14, 1918, it participated in action in the Haganback Sector, at Cote-de-Roche, at Molleville Farm. Returning to Hoboken, New Jersey, May 17, 1919, it was disbanded at Camp Merrit, New Jersey, May 27, 1919.

Reorganized in Union City, New Jersey, as Company K, Sixth Infantry, New Jersey National Guard, July 24, 1919, it was next moved to Jersey City and redesignated Company K, 113th Infantry, June, 1921.

Teams of this company won the Regimental Baseball Trophy in 1928 and repeated in 1929. It captured the Divisional Combat Team Trophy in 1930. Sergeant Baroletti won the National Individual Rifle Match at Camp Perry, Ohio, in 1930.

Besides furnishing a guard for the King and Queen of England in May, 1939, this unit participated in the First Army Maneuvers at Pine Camp, New York, 1935; at Plattsburg, New York, 1939, and Pine Camp, New York, 1940.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company L, 113th Infantry, was organized October 11, 1917, at Camp McClellan, Alabama, from an amalgamation of Companies A and K and parts of D and F, Fourth New Jersey Infantry. Its predecessors were originally organized as units of the Fourth New Jersey Rifle Corps in 1867, redesignated Fourth Regiment, 1869.

Individuals from the company volunteered for service in the Spanish-American War, serving under the designation Fourth New Jersey Volunteer Infantry from July 18, 1898, to April 16, 1899. The unit was mobilized October 13, 1916, for Mexican Border service at Douglas, Arizona.

The company was mobilized April 13, 1917, for guard service within New Jersey and entered Camp McClellan, Alabama, October 11, 1917. It landed at

Brest, France, June 27, 1918, and trained with the 151st French Division in the Suarce Area. It served in the Boron-Center and Haute-Alsace sectors, July 25 to September 22, 1918; in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, October 8-30, 1918. The company returned to the United States in May, 1919, and was mustered out of Federal service at Camp Dix, New Jersey.

Company L has been in the following maneuvers: Manassas, Virginia, September 5-12, 1904; Connecticut, August 10-18, 1912; Great Bend, New York, August 17-31, 1935, and Plattsburg, New York, August 13-27, 1939.

It was reorganized and Federally recognized as Company L, Sixth Infantry, June 30, 1919; redesignated Company L, 113th Infantry, June 17, 1921, to perpetuate the World War service of Company L, 113th Infantry, 29th Division, and the pre-war service of Companies A, D, F and K, Fourth New Jersey Infantry.

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114TH INFANTRY

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The original 114th Infantry was organized at Camp McClellan, Alabama, October 11, 1917, from the Third New Jersey Infantry, Fifth New Jersey Infantry and the First Delaware Infantry. The First Delaware Infantry, from which the Third Battalion, 114th Infantry was organized, was withdrawn from the Regiment in 1918 and a new Third Battalion was organized with transfers from the other units of the 57th Brigade, making the Regiment entirely a New Jersey organization.

The ancestor of the 114th Infantry, the Third Infantry, was originally organized as Third Battalion, New Jersey Rifle Corps, in December, 1865. In July, 1866, it became Third Regiment, and was attached to an Independent Brigade, New Jersey Rifle Corps.

On April 14, 1869, after creation of the National Guard, the Regiment was reorganized from Companies A, C and D, First Battalion, and Companies E, G, I and K, Third Regiment, New Jersey Rifle Corps. The Regiment, to consist of Companies A to G, was provisionally designated Fifth Regiment, National Guard, assigned to Second Brigade. On May 1, 1869, the designation was changed to Sixth Regiment.

On reorganization of the National Guard, May 2, 1899, the Regiment, with the exception of Companies A and B, was disbanded. Companies A through G and K, Sixth Regiment, and Companies F and H, Seventh Regiment, were reorganized into a new regiment of 12 companies, designated Third Regiment. The Regiment was attached to the Second Brigade.

Prior to its disbandment, the Third Infantry had seen the following active service: railroad strike and riot duty,

July 20-August 10, 1877; two years of volunteer service in the Spanish-American War, from April 27, 1898 (the Regiment consisted of Companies A through H at this time); joint maneuvers with the United States Army Coast Artillery, Fort Hancock, New Jersey, July 5-16, 1907; joint Army and Militia maneuvers, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, July 9-19, 1910; joint Army and Militia maneuvers, Mt. Gretna, Pennsylvania, July, 1912.

The motto of the Third Infantry was "In Omnia Paratus."

With the reorganization of the Regiment as the 114th Infantry, in 1917, it was trained at Camp McClellan, went overseas in July, 1918, and, after a brief training period, was placed in the Defensive Sector of Haute-Alsace in August and September, 1918. Its baptism of fire in the World War occurred in this Sector. It participated in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive in October, 1918, its heaviest fighting being October 12-17, 1918, east of the Meuse River. The Regiment returned to the United States in May, 1919, and was discharged at Camp Dix in May and June.

Upon reorganization of the New Jersey National Guard in 1920, the Third New Jersey Regiment was organized, the regimental organization being completed and Federally recognized in December, 1920. The greater percentage of the commissioned personnel, as well as a large number of the enlisted personnel, had served with the 114th Infantry in the World War.

In July, 1921, the designation of the Regiment was changed to the 114th Infantry, to continue the history of the original 114th Infantry.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company A, 114th Infantry, was first organized April 14, 1869, as Company B, Third Infantry. On November 22, 1881, Company B disbanded until December 8, 1881, when the personnel was transferred to Company E in the same regiment. The unit was redesignated as Company I May 1, 1899, and transferred to the Second Regiment. On October 1, 1901, it became Company G, 113th Infantry, 29th Division, for service in World War I. It was reorganized May 27, 1924, as Company L, 114th Infantry, to perpetuate the World War service of Company G, 113th Infantry, and the pre-war service of Company I, Second Infantry; and a month later it was redesignated Company A, its present status, under the command of Captain Winfield Scott Emmons.

The company entered service for the Spanish-American War May 2, 1898, and was mustered out February 11, 1899, at Athens, Georgia, where it was a part of the First Brigade, Third Division, Second Army Corps.

It sailed for World War service June 15, 1918, trained at Suarce, France, with assignment to the Bemont and Haute-Aisne sectors July 21 to September 22, 1918. It participated in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, October 8-30, 1918, and in engagements at Molleville, Boris Orment, Molleville Farm and Estrayes Ridge. Its last units returned to New York May 20, 1919.

Among the honors Company A has won are the Regimental Athletic Championship, 1932 and 1936, and the Second Place Award, National Defense Trophy, 1939.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company C, 114th Infantry, was originally organized April 14, 1869, at Elizabeth, New Jersey, as Company C, Third Regiment, changed to Company C, Second Regiment, May 2, 1899. It was drafted into Federal service August 5, 1917.

Company C, 114th Infantry, 29th Division, was organized at Camp McClellan, Alabama, October 11, 1917, by the transfer of the entire enlisted strength of Company L, Fifth Infantry, and 65 enlisted men from Company C, Third Infantry. It landed in France June 27, 1918, and was stationed first at Vaux-sous-Aubigny, then in the vicinity of Grandvillars near Belfort. During August and September, 1918, Company C served

at Montreux-Chateau, Retzwiller, Manspach, Hagenbach, Chavennes L'Etang and Revigny. In October, 1918, it was in Bois de La Cote, Bois de Sartelles, Germonville, Cote d'Eau, Cote des Roches, Bois d'Armont and Bussey. At the signing of the Armistice, the company was at Bussey. It moved to Leroncourt, November 20, 1918, and, seven days later, to Chatillon-sur-Saone.

It left France April 24, 1919, and was mustered out at Camp Dix, New Jersey, May 14, 1919.

On March 15, 1920, reorganization was begun and on June 17, 1920, it became Company C, Third Infantry. It was designated Company G, 113th Infantry, November 9, 1921; and on June 8, 1922, it was redesignated Company C, 114th Infantry. It participated in the First Army Maneuvers, Watertown, New York, August 17-31, 1935, and the First Army Maneuvers, Plattsburg, New York, August 13-27, 1939.

gun company. By April 1, 1921, the reorganization was completed. On June 24, 1921, the machine guns were received and the company began training in its new role. The designation of the regiment was changed to the 114th Infantry on July 1, 1921, and has remained the same to the present time.

Several changes have taken place in the officer personnel, but the vacancies have always been filled by promotion from the ranks.

The present Company D was redesignated a "Heavy Weapons Company" in July, 1940. Captain Hugh M. MacLean, present commander, has had 17 years of service in the company, 11 years as an officer. First Lieutenant Robert E. Thompson has had 11 years of service, eight as an officer, and Second Lieutenant William R. Jost has had six years of service, three as an officer.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company D, 114th Infantry, was formed July 23, 1920, as Company D, Third Infantry, with 51 men on the roll. Captain Roy Kitchell, descendant of a long line of military forebears dating back to the American Revolution, was in command at the age of 22, assisted by First Lieutenant Felix Best and Second Lieutenant Walter Schroeder, the latter being the present First Battalion commander.

In March, 1921, a nation-wide reorganization of the Infantry set-up designated Company D as a machine

FACTUAL HISTORY

Asbury Park, New Jersey, under the command of First Lieutenant Michael M. Mattice, with Second Lieutenant Turner R. Cottrell as Communications Officer. Its present designation was made May 1, 1940.

Lieutenant Mattice was promoted to Captain, November 21, 1936, and transferred to the 44th Division Staff as Aide. On January 31, 1939, he was transferred to Headquarters, 114th Infantry, and assigned as Regimental Ad-





FACTUAL HISTORY

Company H, 114th Infantry (Rifle), was organized November 30, 1860, as Company A, City Battalion of National Guards. Its members have been veterans of the Civil War, the Spanish-American War and the World War.

It entered Federal service in the World War, May 8, 1917, at first guarding the Naval magazines at Iona Island, New York. Recalled from that point August 16, 1917, for mobilization of the Second Regiment, it entrained October 3, 1917, for Anniston, Alabama, where during the process of Federalization it became part of the 113th Infantry. Company H (then Com-

pany A) entered the lines July 25, 1918, in the Haute-Marne Sector. The period of active service that followed included the St. Mihiel, Verdun and Argonne Sectors.

Upon its return to the United States and demobilization at Camp Dix, May 27, 1919, the company was reorganized as Company H, 114th Infantry. It received Federal recognition July 25, 1920. Trained as a machine gun company, the unit only recently has been reorganized into a Heavy Weapons Company.

Company H was formerly commanded by Captain Charles F. Burr, now retired, and Captain Peter Smith, now Major, QMC. Present officers are Captain Albert J. Meteny, First Lieutenant John I. Banks and Second Lieutenant Frederick R. Hoffman.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Salem County, New Jersey, present station of Company I, 114th Infantry, has had some form of militia company ever since the first European settlement, in 1640. In 1643, the Swedes built Fort Elfsburg to hold the Delaware River for Sweden. The Dutch captured it in 1655, and, until 1664, there were armed companies of Dutch soldiers in the county. When the English finally took over, in 1674, soldiers were sent into the county for defense purposes, and a decided lapse of militia action followed.

In 1784, a Spanish privateer, the LaFortune, raided New Castle and attempted to land at Elsinboro on the Salem County side of the Delaware River. The Spanish were repelled by a band of farmers armed with ancient blunderbusses and pitchforks. This led to the formation of a regular Militia Company for the county by the English Government, some few soldiers of which were mustered into service for the French and Indian War.

The Salem County militia companies came into their own in 1775, and an almost perfect continuity of service has lasted since that time. As part of its glorious record in the Revolution, the volunteer colonial militia held the British on the banks of the Alloways Creek and kept the British raid from spreading into the adjoining county of Cumberland. Following the Revolutionary War, several militia companies were organized. In the War of

1812, these militiamen were sent to Bridgeport, Gloucester County, where a general encampment for South Jersey was held. By 1830, the militia companies, unfortunately, were allowed to decay.

The Mexican War drew a half-dozen volunteers from this company and, in 1861, when the Civil War broke out, the militia was reorganized. The Johnson Guards, a Salem Militia Company, were marched away as early as April 25, 1861. To take their place, a company of home guards was formed.

When the war was over, the militia was allowed to die down. In 1890, one Militia Company was formed and reformed, although many Salem men enlisted.

Company I entered the World War, July 25, 1917, as part of the Third Infantry. Reorganized as Company M, 114th Infantry, December 20, 1920, it finally became, after several redesignations, Company I, 114th Infantry.

Among the honors won by the company are: National Defense Trophy Third Honors, 1933, 1934, 1938; National Trophy for Highest Figure of Merit in Rifle Practice, 1937; New Jersey Sons of the Revolution Trophy, 1938; Gillmore Trophy, N.J.N.G. Company Team Match, 1939; Regimental Athletic Championship, 1937, and Regimental Combat Championship, 1933.



National Guard, to perpetuate the history of Company B, Fourth Regiment, First New Jersey Brigade.

In the reorganization after the Spanish-American War, the company became Company E, Third New Jersey Infantry, on May 2, 1899. During the Mexican Border trouble in 1916, the company was not called, but the commanding officer and three enlisted men served as a recruiting party.

The unit was mustered into Federal service July 25, 1917, and in the organization of the 20th Division became merged with Company H, 114th Infantry, on October 11, 1917, serving overseas with the division. It was demobilized May 14, 1919, at Camp Dix.

On July 7, 1920, it was reorganized as Company E, Third Infantry; changed to Company L, 114th Infantry, November 9, 1921, and given its present designation June 6, 1927.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Company M, 114th Infantry, is the successor of the Minute Men of the Militia in 1775, a company of riflemen first organized during the Revolutionary War and reorganized for the War of 1812.

Another reorganization came during the Mexican War. After the war it was made Company C, Burlington County Militia, in 1852. In 1861, it became Company B, Fourth Regiment, First New Jersey Brigade. After the Civil War, the company was reorganized as Company F, Seventh Regiment, New Jersey

HEADQUARTERS, 69TH FIELD ARTILLERY

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The 69th Field Artillery Brigade came into being in February, 1929, under authority of the War Department, and was Federally recognized the same month with Brigadier General Samuel Garrison Barnard as its first commander.

Its ancestry, although mixed, like that of many other military units, is at least traceable to authority given by the Provincial Congress of New Jersey on February 13, 1776, to the establishment of two companies of artillery in the Province—one in East Jersey and one in West Jersey. Both companies were organized and served creditably in the Revolutionary War, taking part in the battles of Trenton, Princeton and Monmouth, among others.

The East Jersey Company later participated in the famous "Whiskey Rebellion" of 1794, and in the War of 1812. In 1861, it was designated Battery A, First Brigade, New Jersey Volunteers, and covered itself with glory throughout the Civil War, engaging in many of the major battles of that war.

What had once been the West Jersey Company apparently became the Camden Light Artillery of the New Jersey Militia, in 1855. This unit entered the Civil War on April 27, 1861, as Company E, Fourth Regiment, First Brigade, New Jersey Volunteers. It was disbanded for a short period after the Civil War, as was Battery A.

In 1869, upon formation of the New Jersey National Guard, both units were reorganized. The unit in Northern New Jersey, once the East Jersey Company, was redesignated Battery A and attached to the First Brigade with headquarters in Elizabeth; that in Southern New Jersey, once the West Jersey Company, was redesignated Battery B and attached to the Second Brigade with headquarters in Camden. Later their designations were changed to Gatling Gun Company A and Gatling Gun Company B, respectively.

In 1900 the designations of the units were again changed, this time to Battery A and Battery B, New Jersey Artillery. Subsequently another battery was organized by fission from Battery A, was designated as Battery C and its headquarters established at East Orange. The three batteries entered Federal service June 21, 1916, and were sent to duty on the Mexican Border. They were mustered out of Federal service October 25, 1916.

Shortly after declaration of war by the United States against the Central Powers of Europe, the War Department authorized the organization of additional units to complete an artillery regiment, and on July 25, 1917, the old batteries were again mustered into Federal service. Upon the organization of Battery D in Atlantic City, Battery E in Montclair, and Battery F in Morristown, the

regiment went into training at Camp McClellan, Alabama, as the First New Jersey Field Artillery. Upon the organization of the 29th Division, the regiment (less Battery F) was designated 112th Field Artillery. A new Battery F was obtained by the conversion of Troop E and D, First Squadron, New Jersey Cavalry.

The regiment sailed for France early in July, 1918, and trained near Poitiers and Meucou. Lack of equipment precluded its participation in combat. It returned to the United States in the spring of 1919 and was demobilized at Camp Dix, New Jersey.

On July 1, 1920, portions of the regiment were reorganized into battalions of Field Artillery, National Guard. In 1923, the whole regiment was reorganized, under its war-time name of 112th Field Artillery. As a horse-drawn, 75-millimeter-gun regiment (the only one remaining in the National Guard), it still exists under that name.

In 1929, the Brigade was organized, comprising the 112th


Field Artillery and the 156th Field Artillery of the New York National Guard. In 1936, a new regiment was formed, the 157th Field Artillery, with a portion of the 112th Field Artillery as nucleus. This regiment, equipped with the 105-millimeter howitzer, became part of the Brigade.

In 1939, the 112th Field Artillery again gave up a part of itself to form the nucleus of a new regiment—the 165th. And in 1940, when the 165th Field Artillery became fully organized, the 112th left the Brigade and was replaced by the 165th Field Artillery.

In July, 1938, General Barnard retired from the service after a long and honorable career with artillery units in New Jersey, which had begun with Gatling Gun Company B. He was succeeded in command by the Brigade's present commander, Brigadier General Edward Clark Rose, who had commanded the 112th Field Artillery from the time of General (then Colonel) Barnard's relinquishment of the regiment to organize the Brigade.





FACTUAL HISTORY

Headquarters Battery, 69th Field Artillery Brigade, was organized and Federally recognized July 19, 1929, and has since been under the com-

157TH FIELD ARTILLERY

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The history of the 157th Field Artillery is alleged to have its origin about the time of the War with Mexico, in 1848. Descendants of soldiers who participated in that war are now assisting in establishing the regiment's claim to a part in this history. In the interim the factual history commences on November 24, 1855, when the Camden Light Artillery was organized. Captain Isaac W. Mickle, who served as Captain in the New Jersey Battalion, was the commanding officer. At the outbreak of the Civil War, thirty-one of the thirty-six members entered the Union Service under Captain Mickle.

On December 20, 1869, Gatling Gun Company B was formed from personnel from the Camden Light Artillery Company. It disbanded June 22, 1876; but two years later, on May 16, it was reorganized. On April 19, 1900, it was changed to Battery B, Field Artillery.

The battery mobilized for service on the Mexican Border June 21, 1916, and served at Douglas, Arizona, until October 25, 1916.

Throughout the first quarter of the 20th century the units grew, and the organization began to take on its present appearance. Headquarters, First Battalion, First New Jersey Field Artillery, was organized April 3, 1917. Three months later, Headquarters, First Regiment, came into being. It managed to the 12th Heavy Field Artillery, U. S. Army, October 10, 1917. It served in the World War. (It was demobilized March 31, 1919, at Camp Dix, New Jersey.) On July 1, 1920, Battery B, First Battalion, Field Artillery, was Federally recognized, and redesignated Battery D, 112th Field Artillery, three years later.

Combat Train, First Battalion, Field Artillery, was Federally recognized June 27, 1921. It was changed to the 112th Field Artillery April 20, 1922; redesignated Battery E, 112th Field Artillery, and Federally recognized April 17, 1923, and redesignated Battery A, 157th Field Artillery, May 11, 1936.

On June 27, 1931, the First Battalion Field Artillery was Federally recognized, and, a year later, it was changed to the 112th Field Artillery.

Battery F, 112th Field Artillery, received Federal recognition August 17, 1923, and was redesignated Battery D, 157th Field Artillery, May 21, 1936.

Headquarters Battery and Combat Train, Second Battalion, 112th Field Artillery, was Federally recognized August 23, 1923, and redesignated Headquarters Battery and Combat Train, First Battalion, 157th Regiment Field Artillery June 2, 1936.

Second Battalion, 112th Field Artillery, was Federally recognized August 23, 1923, and redesignated First Battalion, 157th Field Artillery, June 15, 1936.

112th Regiment, Field Artillery, was Federally recognized January 8, 1924.

Sanitary Company No. 155, 119th Medical Regiment, was Federally recognized April 10, 1922; redesignated 155th Collecting Company April 1, 1924; converted to 157th Ambulance Company, 119th Medical Regiment, April 1, 1927; reconverted to 155th Collecting Company, 119th Medical Regiment, July 1, 1935, and converted to Battery C, Second Battalion, 157th Regiment Field Artillery May 20, 1936.

Headquarters Battery and Combat Train, Second Battalion, 157th Field Artillery, was Federally recognized May 5, 1936.

Headquarters Second Battalion, 157th Field Artillery, was Federally recognized June 8, 1936.

April 19, 1900, it was redesignated Battery B Field Artillery.


The unit was mustered into Federal service June 21, 1916, for Mexican Border duty, mustering out October 25, 1916, to resume its state status. It entered Federal service for the World War July 25, 1917, subsequently becoming Battery B, 112th Field Artillery, which served overseas during the war but did not participate in combat. The organization was disbanded March 31, 1919, at Camp Dix, New Jersey.

Reorganization July 1, 1920, made it Battery B, First Battalion, Field Artillery, National Guard, changed later (October 2, 1923) to Battery D, 112th Field Artillery. Its present designation was made June 15, 1936.

FACTUAL HISTORY

Battery B, 157th Field Artillery, was first organized in 1855 as the Camden Light Artillery, New Jersey Militia. It mustered into the Civil War April 27, 1861, as Company B, Fourth Regiment, First Brigade, New Jersey Volunteers, and disbanded three months later at Trenton. On December 20, 1869, it got its first claim to being Battery B when it was attached as such to the Second Brigade. Disbandment came June 22, 1876, and it was not until two years later, on May 16, that the unit was reorganized as Gatling Gun Company B. On

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165TH FIELD ARTILLERY

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Organization of the 165th Field Artillery took place simultaneously at East Orange, Hackensack, Dumont and Englewood, from units of the 112th Field Artillery, 44th Division.

Its true parent organization, the First Battalion, 112th Field Artillery, is one of New Jersey's oldest and most honored of the state's famous military organizations. Its history extends back to Revolutionary times, when the raising of two companies of Artillery was authorized by the Provincial Congress.

The predecessor of the First Battalion was Battery A, which was organized originally as the Eastern Company of Artillery, New Jersey Militia, 1776. On May 10, 1856, it was redesignated Battery A, First Brigade, New Jersey Militia. In 1869, it was redesignated Battery A (Hexamer's Battery), First New Jersey Field Artillery, which was reorganized in 1866 as Battery A (still Hexamer's Battery), Hudson County Militia, attached to the First Brigade, stationed at Weehawken. With a station change to Elizabeth, it was redesignated Gatling Gun Company A, on April 9, 1884. July 12, 1893, saw its disbandment for almost two years. Reorganization was effected at Orange on April 27, 1895. On May 2, 1899, it was changed to Field Artillery. With another station change to East Orange on April 19, 1900, the unit was redesignated Battery A, Field Artillery. After change of designation to 112th Field Artillery, 29th Division, on October 10, 1917, it was demobilized at Camp Dix (March 17, 1919).

Reorganized and Federally recognized as Battery A, First Battalion, Field Artillery, on November 20, 1920, its station was once again established at East Orange. Finally, under the Organization Tables of April 20, 1922, it was redesignated 112th Field Artillery.

The original Battery A saw service in the Revolutionary War with Colonel Thomas Proctor's Regiment of Artillery, Continental Army, assigned to General Knox's Brigade of Artillery. It was detailed to accompany the First New Jersey Brigade during the Pennsylvania Insurrection of 1794, known as the Whiskey Rebellion. During the war with Great Britain, it served several tours of duty at Navesink and Paulus Hook. It volunteered for service in the Civil War, being used at West Point (May 7, 1862), Mechanicsville (May 31, 1862), Gaines Mills (June 27, 1862), Chantilly (August 30, 1862), Crampton's Pass, Antietem, Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, Salem Church, Gettysburg, Mine Run and Cold Harbor. It was in service on the Mexican Border from June 21, 1916, through October 21, 1916. It was mobilized for World War service on July 25, 1917, going overseas from July 5, 1918,

to March 7, 1919. Back in the United States once again, it was demobilized on March 17, 1919.

Battery C, the second parent unit of the regiment, was organized from Battery A on May 8, 1916, with East Orange as its station. Redesignated 112th Field Artillery on October 10, 1917, it was demobilized at Camp Dix on March 17, 1919. Reorganized, it was Federally recognized as Battery C, First Battalion, Field Artillery, April 19, 1921. A year later, under the Tables of Organization (April 20, 1922), it was redesignated 112th Field Artillery.

After Mexican Border service from June 21, 1916, to March 20, 1917, Battery C was mobilized for World War service on July 25, 1917. It served in France from July 5, 1918, to March 7, 1919. Ten days later it was demobilized at Camp Dix.

Colonel Edward J. Towers was chosen as the first Regimental Commander and Major Lewis M. Smith, Jr., as the Regimental Executive. Both of these officers had served in the First Battalion in all grades from private to Battalion Commander for over 30 years.

While the regiment's designation is new and horses have been replaced by motors, the personnel is comprised of capable and experienced artillerymen who may be expected to carry on with vigor the traditions passed on to them by one of New Jersey's oldest groups of cannoneers.

area, Colonel Harry completed the Battalion in the summer of 1921, when he led it to its first field training trip at Peekskill, New York. By the middle of 1922, the full Regiment was formed, with headquarters at Englewood and units at Hoboken, Jersey City, Newark and Englewood. Later, Hoboken was abandoned and Dumont added to the station list. It was not until April, 1938, that the entire Regiment was assembled under one roof, in a huge new armory at Teaneck.

Among its officers today are 12 who saw active duty in the World War. Five of these, including three of the Regimental Staff, were with the 104th Engineers, AEF.

During the 1939 field maneuvers at Plattsburg, New York, the Regiment was awarded a citation by the Commanding General, 44th Division, for especially meritorious conduct, while several officers and enlisted men were given citations by the Commanding General of a New York Infantry Brigade, for their outstanding service in assisting his troops to effect a night river crossing. During the First Army Maneuvers of 1940 the Regiment again received a citation for especially meritorious conduct, at Canton, New York.

The Regimental insignia consists of a shield outlined in blue and grey (29th Division colors), the shield composed of red and white diagonal bars, representing months of combat and post-Armistice service. Superimposed on the center of the shield is a fructed tree (a green oak bearing golden acorns) to represent the Argonne Forest, the scene of the Regiment's most active service. The motto is *Faciendum Est* (It Must Be Done).

FACTUAL HISTORY

Upon the transfer of Lieutenant Caile in 1925 to the State Staff, Lieutenant Parker was promoted to First Lieutenant and to Company Commander. First Sergeant Belmont V. D. Worman was appointed Second Lieutenant, serving until his retirement in 1938. Second Lieutenant John M. Duffield was elected in December, 1938, to fill the vacancy of Company Commander caused by the retirement of Lieutenant Parker. Second Lieutenant Stanley H. Partridge was elected to fill the vacancy caused by the promotion of Lieutenant Duffield.
