MAJOR GENERAL WALTER K. WILSON

Born in Nashville, Tennessee, October 7, 1880, Major General Walter K. Wilson was graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1902 and received his commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Field Artillery.

During World War I General Wilson was in charge of the Cable Section, War Department General Staff, with the temporary rank of Major and Lt. Colonel. He received the Distinguished Service Medal on January 18, 1919.

General Wilson commanded the Harbor Defenses of Manila and Subic Bays from 1938 to 1941. During the same period he was conducting the military affairs on the western sector of Luzon which included Bataan Peninsula.

Leaving the Manila area, General Wilson activated the Third Army Corps at the Presidio of Monterey and has been its leader at two different periods. As commander of the Southern California Sector from December 22, 1941 to April 2, 1942, he became admired and well liked by every man in the 125th under him. Under the same leadership in the Northern California Sector since May 1, 1942, the 125th has found that General Wilson has combined his natural talents with forty years' Army experience to become a leader whom the entire Regiment hopes to follow into battle against the Axis.

LT. GENERAL JOSEPH W. STILWELL

Leading the armies of China against Japan, Lieutenant General Joseph Warren Stilwell is fighting the battle which the 125th Infantry was visioning when it was under his command during the early days of the war. General Stilwell had his headquarters at San Bernardino before going to his present station in 1942.

Born in Palatka, Florida, in 1883, General Stilwell has borne the reputation of a fighting officer ever since his graduation from West Point, where his aggressiveness won him a prominent part in athletics. As a Major and temporary Lieutenant Colonel and Colonel in World War I he won the Distinguished Service Medal for G-2 work at Saint Mihiel.

He has advanced rapidly in rank since 1928 and was sent to China because of his extensive knowledge of the language and people, picked up in several previous trips there. For his brilliant work in slowing the Jap advance in Burma, General Stilwell was recently awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, his son Lieutenant Colonel Joseph Stilwell Jr. making the presentation.



MAJOR GENERAL IRVING A. FISH

Following up a brilliant college military career, Major General Irving A. Fish entered the Army as a Captain of Infantry on June 29, 1903, and has since distinguished himself as an outstanding officer in the Signal Corps, the Cavalry, and the Field Artillery.

He was promoted to Brigadier General of the line on July 6, 1927. He was later promoted to Major General and held this rank when he was in charge of the Thirty-Second Division, including our Regiment, during basic training and maneuvers in Louisiana.

Widely known for his superb horsemanship, General Fish's foremost hobby has always been horses and riding.

General Fish is married and has one son, who is now serving in the armed forces in the southwest Pacific.

COLONEL GEORGE L. SIMPSON

He's a man of vision. The 125th Infantry of today, smartly trained and equipped, was a plan in his mind before Pearl Harbor. With the impetus of the nation's all out effort for victory behind him, he whipped the 125th into a closely knit organization, ready for any eventuality of attack or call to foreign duty.

The War Department in Washington carries him on the roster as Colonel George L. Simpson, Commanding Officer of the 125th Infantry. We call him The Colonel. There is little of the gilt of the office to his person. He is a Commanding Officer of troops in the field. Rugged, husky of physique, he carries himself with the stride of a football player. In fact, The Colonel left behind a record of college and professional performance on the gridiron that tops that of any other officer in the 125th.

The vision of the leader of the 125th must have been developed in his college days on the gridiron or in his experience as a Big Ten pigskin referee. Basically his shrewdness in strategy and military tactics goes back

to his mastery of geology and topography. Few officers understand a map as comprehensively as The Colonel. Watch him on tactical problems as he analyzes maneuvers, then crystalizes his criticisms in a direct, clear summary.

Cigar in hand, firm chin protruding, The Colonel stands out from a crowd. He likes his men; speaking to them freely as he passes them in the field. Nothing is too trivial in importance, when it comes to the question of greater efficiency as a fighting force—the 125th. In his vision he has demanded intelligent and dynamic leadership of his officers and non-coms. The natural result has been that the 125th possesses discipline and morale. It is this teamwork under The Colonel that inspires the 125th to move on in the spirit of the Regimental Song:

HISTORY OF 125th INFANTRY

Although bearing the title "125th Infantry" only since 1917, our Regiment ranks as one of the oldest units in the country after 112 years of service.

Since 1830, when organized as the Detroit Light Guard, the present Company "A" has fought in every war the nation has waged. The black arrow on the crest stands for the hardships and sickness which the company suffered in the Black Hawk War of 1832 against the Sauk Indians. Adopting the name "Brady Guards" in 1836, the men next saw service patrolling the Canadian border in the Patriots' War of 1838-1839. Again in 1850 the unit changed names when it merged with the Grayson Guards and took that name.

In 1841 the present Antitank Company was formed as the Scott Guard and with the Brady Guard added lustre to the fighting name of the 125th at the battles of Cherubusco, Cerro Gordo, National Bridge, Contreras, Chapultepec, Paso Ovegos, and the City of Mexico. The bursting sun of the Aztec on the regimental crest symbolizes the role played in these battles.

Before the Civil War, two more companies were formed, the present "E" and "F" companies. The four units took part in twenty-six actions and eleven major engagements including Manassas, Cold Harbor, Appomattox, and the Wilderness. At the first battle of Bull Run, Company "A" led the Union advance into Virginia and staved off the advance of the Confederate troops with a brilliant rear guard action. On the crest the eleven blue stars stand for the major battles in that war.

Six new companies came to life before 1896, and all ten went to Cuba in the Spanish-American War in 1898. They played important parts in the battles of Aguadores and Santiago, with the palm tree symbolizing the engagements on the crest.

With the exception of Company "K" and the Headquarters Companies, which had not been founded at the time, the Regiment was sent to patrol the Mexican border against the raids of Pancho Villa in 1916.

A year later in August, the same units were organized into the 125th Infantry as a part of the Thirty-Second Division. Landing in France in January 1918, the Division did not see front line action until May. However, in the battle of Chateau-Thierry and the offensives of the Aisne-Marne, Soissons, Oise-Aisne, and Meuse-Argonne, it vanquished twenty-three German divisions including the Kaiser's Own and smashed through the German lines thirty-eight kilometers without a set-back. The battle of the Meuse-Argonne was ranked as one of the greatest, if not the greatest, of the

War; and the Thirty-Second won the undying gratitude of France with its capture of the Dame Marie Heights and the village of Romagne. The men did not waver in their advance, although the cost was terrific.

The Division was twice decorated by the French government for—in the words of Marshal Petain—"three days' fighting without stopping; without rest, and almost without food." In addition, 95 men in the 125 of 294 men in the Thirty-Second won Distinguished Service Crosses for their individual parts in making the Thirty-Second the first division to cross into German soil. The Lion of Hesse-Nassau on the crest stands for the work of occupation there, while the blue lines stand for the offensives in which the Regiment took part.


Over the crest the Griffin stands for Michigan, as the "Griffin," constructed by LaSalle in the 1680's, was the first ship built and sailed on the Great Lakes.

Until October 15, 1940, when recalled to Federal Service, the companies maintained their status as Michigan National Guard units. They were called into state service in January 1937, to patrol striking plants in Flint. To put the men into condition for the coming fray, the authorities sent them to camps in Louisiana for basic training. Next they took part in the Louisiana maneuvers and won the honor of being selected for a war strength battalion in the Carolina maneuvers the same year. Returning to Camp Livingston on December 5, the men had only two days of light work when the news of Pearl Harbor roused them for battle. With forty-six states represented, the 125th Infantry once again is eagerly waiting for action and the chance to win even more honors than in previous wars.



"From the swamps of Louisiana via Arizona and Nevada wastelands to the mountains and coasts of California."

To most persons these words mean little, but to a member of the 125th Infantry, they describe a year's traveling from December 7, 1941, to December 7, 1942.

On December 7, 1941, members of the Regiment were polishing equipment and preparing for a permanent camp at Camp Livingston, Louisiana, after the strenuous Carolina maneuvers which had been completed only two days before. Then their work was interrupted as news of Pearl Harbor crackled over the air waves.

The next day packing was in full swing for an unknown destination. Would it be California, Hawaii, or some point even farther west? No one knew, and everyone had a different idea.

Although packed, the 125th did not board its four trains until December 11. The men spent almost two hours at Alexandria, Louisiana, scene of so many of their free moments during basic training, and then set out for the Beaumont, Texas, oil fields. From Texas, the train crawled through New Mexico, stopping for a short period at Gallup, where the soldiers got glimpses of Indian curios. Moving across the plains of Arizona, the tired men thought the West a long desert until they sighted the mountains in the region of San Bernardino, California. Finally the entire Regiment was detrained and encamped at the Los Angeles County Fair Grounds at Pomona by December 15. It was then designated as the Reserve for Southern California under the command of General Joseph Warren Stilwell.

Pomona was regarded as home only two days when the men loaded their equipment into trucks and moved to the Santa Anita Race Track. Although there were no races before wildly cheering and wildly betting crowds, Whirlaway, champion money winner of all time, put on early morning shows for the Infantry with fast workouts around the famous track.

On leaving Santa Anita two days later, the Regiment broke up for the first time in California. Regimental Headquarters and the Second Battalion set up a CP at the Los Angeles Municipal Airport, the First Battalion moved to the oil rich and wide awake Long Beach area, and the Third Battalion shifted to Burbank. The first major guard on aircraft plants was set up at this time. A week later the Twenty-Seventh Division relieved the Regiment.

Continuing its practice of splitting up, the Regiment observed Christmas, 1941, in three states after a move on December 23. Regimental Headquarters was set up at Needles, California, in the heart of the desert. The First Battalion took over Flagstaff, Arizona; Seligman, Arizona; and Coolidge Dam. Most of the Second Battalion was keeping watch at Camp Siebert, Boulder City, Nevada; although Company "F" was at Daggett, California. At the same time the Third Battalion set up a CP in Barstow, California, with Company "I" at Mojave and Company "L" at Muroc Lake. The desert units found little of the famed heat during their stay, needing fires every night while in the open. Part of the Antitank Company had its own separate position at Catherine Mine, Arizona, on both sides of the world's most dangerous river, the Colorado.

Moving again became the order of the day on January 6, when the Regiment assembled in Los Angeles at the National Guard Airport. Three days later, however, the location was changed to the Municipal Playground in Los Angeles' beautiful Griffith Park.

Vic's Place, Hollywood, Paris Inn, and Chinatown gave the men their gayest night life since entering the Service, although opportunities for such enjoyment were limited by six hour passes to only a small per cent of the total strength. At the same time the alerts during the early days of the War gave them more excitement than any of the maneuvers, especially the night when the anti-aircraft batteries fired at planes over Mines Field. The people of Los Angeles added to the morale of the men with their hospitable spirit toward all service men.

Although the Regimental Headquarters remained at the Municipal Playground, the battalions were sent to other areas in the near vicinity. The Second Battalion moved to Mines Field on January 29, and the Third Battalion returned to Burbank January 28. Then except for the First and Third Battalions exchanging locations on March 10, the men remained in the same camps until April. While on duty at the Playground, the First Battalion made several movies of tactics of small infantry units.

On March 11 many non-commissioned officers from all battalions left for the Santa Barbara area to train recruits for the Regiment. The rugged, wooded hills a few miles south of Santa Barbara at Carpinteria furnished ideal training grounds, and the city had innumerable recreational facilities.

While the training center was in full swing, Griffith Park resounded to the movement of troops. Citizens of Los Angeles were startled to see no signs of any camp when they drove by Griffith Park after 1:35 on April 20, as the 125th had completed its breaking down of camp to catch trains bound for Gilroy and points in that sector.

Regimental Headquarters was established the same day, and the three battalions began a new series of travels. The First Battalion took over installations at historic San Luis Obispo, at Avila, and near Cayucos. Later units were temporarily sent to Cambria Pines. The Second Battalion remained in Gilroy four days, then renewed their training schedule at Palo Alto. Units of the Third Battalion were established at Santa Clara, Watsonville, Monterey, and Half Moon Bay.

Since April the Regimental Headquarters has remained in Gilroy, with the battalions taking the travel tours. Their journeys have covered most of the larger cities in the Sub-Sector and would have required a year's civilian salary to make in 1940.

Of all the spots they have visited, the battalions agree that San Jose and Santa Clara rate top ranking. Swimming pools, bowling alleys, tennis courts, and night clubs which were outclassed only by those in Los Angeles, all contributed in making the Regiment enjoy the stay near Santa Clara College.

Trailing San Jose by a narrow margin in popularity, Monterey has also been occupied by all three battalions. While there, the men leisurely saw many of the

historic landmarks of the state, as Monterey was the first capital. At the same time, most of the 125th soldiers got to see Carmel with its quaint shops. In addition, the Seventeen Mile Drive between Carmel and Monterey and along the Pacific, which is nationally famous for its scenic beauty, was toured daily by patrols.

Nationally famous as the home of Stanford University, Palo Alto has been one of the favorite campsites of all three battalions.

Also serving as headquarters for all three battalions, Watsonville is also well liked by the men, who have never found entertainment lacking in the apple center city.

Other places visited by the line companies included Santa Cruz, Capitola, and the Half Moon Bay area. Of the three sites, the Santa Cruz installation, has proved, by far, the most popular.

Salinas, Sunnyvale, Fort Funston, Camp McQuaide, and Shell Beach have had soldiers of the Regiment stationed there at different times, although the Sunnyvale camp has had 125th soldiers there for a longer period.

As the only company to stay in Oakland, Company "G" occupied positions there, as well as in Stockton, Paso Robles, and Mills Field in June.

The same month platoons of Company "L" made excursions to Bakersfield, Fresno, and Visalia; and they returned to their regular positions four days later. Companies "E" and "F" had previously been stationed in Fresno.

In November a non-commissioned officers' school was put into operation at the Gilroy CCC Camp, where groups of non-coms have been learning the tactics of warfare through practical maneuvers over the wooded hills surrounding the camp.

In addition to the men at the CCC School, another group is learning intelligence work at Belmont, California.

To bring the Regiment to strength again, a new training center began drill sessions at the Salinas Rodeo Grounds the first week in December, with recruits from Tennessee and the Southern States furnishing the majority of the total number. Hampered by rain and mud the men still completed all training by the last of February and have now reported to their companies within the Regiment.




