The Student Council of Garland High School was organized for the first time in the history of the school in January, 1946.

The purposes of the organization are to help maintain a form of school government which encourages pupil-teacher cooperation, to foster sentiments of good citizenship and to Sponsor worthwhile school activities.

The Student Council has had a very successful and useful year. The members ushered at assemblies, served as guides at the school open house, sponsored the Victory Clothing Collection Drive, and generally tried to be helpful in bettering the school. The Student Council was sponsored by Mr. Pearson and Mr. Vandenburg.

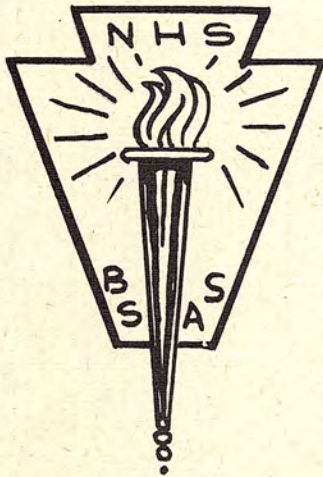
National Honor Society



The Garland High School Chapter of the National Honor Society was organized in November, 1945. Mr. Marshall Vanderburg, Principal of the High School, was the founder of this organization. It is the first time in the history of the high school that such an organization has been formed. Miss Margaret Riddle, school librarian, became the sponsor of the society. A constitution committee, composed of Miss Louise Hunt, commercial teacher, Miss Glenna Faye Currey, science teacher, Mr. Vanderburg and Miss Riddle, drew up the constitution for the society. The basis for membership in the National Honor Society has as its cardinal principles . . . Scholarship, Leadership, Character and Service to the School. A standard of 90 per cent must have been maintained before a student is eligible for membership.

The charter group was composed of fifteen members. In February, 1946, seventeen new members were initiated into the organization.

Sparked by the passing, running and punting of Aurel Bittle, who placed on the all-district eleven; the pass-catching of tall John "Sody" Hall, who was also chosen on the all-district team, and the rugged play of Jim Gatewood, who repeated as all-district, the Owls finished the season with six wins, one tie and three losses, a record not to be sneezed at.

This year, with a relatively light team, the Owls changed from the punt formation which they had used the previous year, to the fast-becoming popular "T". 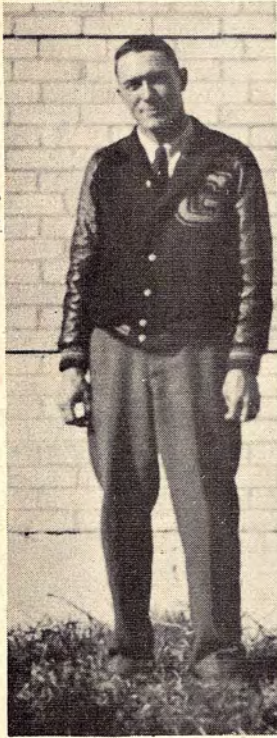
BOYS BASKETBALL

The Garland Owls 1946 boys' basketball team finished the 13-A district race in a third-place tie with Vickery-Hillcrest. Aurel Bittle and Jackie Shugart were the only returning lettermen, but John Hall, John Owens and Boyd Hill were returning squadmen. The Owls were hot and cold all season—one night they would play a fine brand of ball but the next day they would be far below par. During the season the Owls competed in two tournaments.
