

# Foreword



The Student Council of Garland High School was organized for the first time in the history of the school in January, 1946.

The purposes of the organization are to help maintain a form of school government which encourages pupil-teacher cooperation, to foster sentiments of good citizenship and to Sponsor worthwhile school activities.

The Student Council has had a very successful and useful year. The members ushered at assemblies, served as guides at the school open house, sponsored the Victory Clothing Collection Drive, and generally tried to be helpful in bettering the school. The Student Council was sponsored by Mr. Pearson and Mr. Vandenburg.

## National Honor Society



The Garland High School Chapter of the National Honor Society was organized in November, 1945. Mr. Marshall Vanderburg, Principal of the High School, was the founder of this organization. It is the first time in the history of the high school that such an organization has been formed. Miss Margaret Riddle, school librarian, became the sponsor of the society. A constitution committee, composed of Miss Louise Hunt, commercial teacher, Miss Glenna Faye Currey, science teacher, Mr. Vanderburg and Miss Riddle, drew up the constitution for the society. The basis for membership in the National Honor Society has as it's cardinal principles . . . Scholarship, Leadership, Character and Service to the School. A standard of 90 per cent must have been maintained before a student is eligible for membership.

WOT The Charter group was composed of lifteen members. In February, 1946, seventeen new members were initiated into the organization.
