HILLSBORO COLLEGE

Hillsboro College as part of the Hillsboro public school system is proud of the record which has been made by its boys in the military service. The Hillsboro public school system is also very proud of the record which has been made by those young men who have gone directly from high school organization and even the lower grades into the armed services of the nation.

Former students of the college have made glorious records for themselves in the Air Corps particularly. Mention is made of the service in the Air Corps because a majority of the men went into that branch of the service. Some men have wrought just as heroically in the other branches of the service such as the infantry, the slogging foot soldiers, who in the final analysis have had to bring the job to a successful culmination.

While this school organization is proud of the advancement many of its former students have made in securing commissions, we have a deep sense of gratitude to those loyal ones who have served in the ranks. This statement is true of faculty members as well as of former students.

Places are still being reserved in the faculties of the Hillsboro school organization for the men and women who have gone into the military services in this time of emergency. Notable among these are Frank E. James, former physical education director of the college, football coach for the high school and basketball coach for the college, who went into the Navy as a chief petty officer and now is serving as a Lt. (jg). Lt. M. L. Brockette went out of his classes in the high school as a private at Camp Barkeley and is now back from the European theater following a tour of heroic service as a first lieutenant. Lt. L. Smyth and Lt. J. H. Starling have put their teaching abilities to great service in the cadet center at San Antonio.

Clarence Ekstrom, one of the most popular teachers that the Hillsboro school organization has ever had, and former assistant coach of the high school, has from the earliest days of the conflict served in the ranks throughout the European theaters of action. C. B. Lawrence, who taught mathematics in the high school, has done a long tour of duty in the southwest Pacific.

Hillsboro high school felt keenly the loss of its principal when Oliver W. Scott accepted a commission as first lieutenant and took up service at Camp Hood as a personnel officer After achieving the rank of captain, principal Scott received an assignment to the west coast where he is serving effectively and most efficiently in the drastic campaign against the Japanese empire.

Anv sort of reference to the war effort of the Hillsboro school organization would be incomplete without reference to those less spectacular but in many respects more heroic things that have been done by faculty members. Many teachers have worked on meager salaries, less than \$85 per month, and have in spite of the low wage, sacrificed to the point of purchasing a bond each month. In many respects these teachers are the unsung heroes of this great conflict.

HILLSBORO

In the late months of 1943, many men in uniform drifted into Hillsboro from the nearby camps and spent the week ends, seeking released from army routine and the congested areas. The number increased until it was apparent that the town and county could make a patriotic and hospitable gesture by opening a local Service Men's Center.

The project was presented to the City Federation and through the nine organizations which make up the Federation, the Center was created. The dining room space of the Newman Hotel was donated to the organization by the B. E. Montfords and it was redecorated and furnished within a few weeks. Furniture was loaned and given by individuals and business organizations from over the county and a Service Men's Center which excelled in quality and atmosphere held open house for Hillsboro and Hill County citizens on March 12. 1943 and was ready to serve and entertain the service men on Saturday, March 13.


The Center has been open regularly on week ends and has served in two and one half years some 6000 men. Convoys which have spent the night in and near Hillsboro, have found an abundance of hot coffee and doughnuts and cookies at the Center a treat that even the most optimistic had not hoped for. On these occasions, Junior and Senior hostesses found their work a great pleasure because they realized that they were making many tired and unhappy soldiers forget the army routine and remember to sit down to a desk and write his family a letter that might not have been written, and then enjoy the relaxation of comfortable chairs and the conversation and games offered by the personnel of the Center.


Special holidays have been observed and Christmas, Thanksgiving, Hallowe'en, and New Years have been celebrated with proper decorations and entertainment. Christmas of 1943 was observed at Andrew's Grill followed with a Christmas tree with a present for every service man present. The following Christmas, dinner and the Christmas tree were held at the Country Club. Some 130 men being served at the two parties. Lawn Parties have been held at the homes of several residents and refreshments of home made ice-cream and of watermellon were served. These proved very popular.

Pool has always been the most popular game at the Center with Ping Pong second. The snack bar which serves coffee and cookies and sweet rolls free, gives a feeling of hospitality that no other feature has been able to offer. Many have found it easy to talk of home and loved ones over a cup of coffee where otherwise it might not have been so easy. Here the real release has been found.

Many have gone over and returned. Some have been wounded, some killed, and some still remain in service, but none who came to visit the Service Men's Center in Hillsboro have regretted their visit. Several boys from other States have found the surroundings and inhabitants so attractive that they have chosen Hill County girls for their wives and plan to establish their homes here at the end of the war.
