The 188th Field Artillery was inducted into Federal Service on April 1, 1941. To commemorate the completion of its first year of active service this book is published.

During the year the regiment has served at Fort Francis E. Warren, Cheyenne, Wyoming, and at Fort Lewis, Washington. It is a part of the 76th Field Artillery Brigade, under the command of Brigadier General Lloyd E. Jones, the brigade being a part of the IX Army Corps, formerly commanded by Major General Kenyon A. Joyce but now under the command of Major General Charles H. White.

The year has been replete with training and maneuvers over sun-baked Wyoming prairies and through rain-drenched Washington forests. Men of the 188th have stood long, lonesome vigils in the bitter cold of winter and 'neath the blazing Wyoming sun. They have been "in position" a few feet above sea level with the roar of the mighty Pacific Ocean always in their ears and they have been encamped at an altitude of 8500 feet. They have worked with the finest instruments and they have poured thunderous tons of lethal metal through smoking howitzers.

Through it all the 188th Field Artillery has emerged as a well-trained, well-disciplined stalwart fighting unit, ready and eager for combat in any land or any clime.

MEMBERS OF THE 188TH FIELD ARTILLERY:

The 188th Field Artillery, North Dakota National Guard, was inducted into the federal military service one year ago today. On that day, and for the duration of the present emergency, we dropped the last four words of our official name and substituted for them, the words "Army of the United States."

So far as federal service is concerned, this is our first birthday anniversary, and we are entitled to but one candle on our birthday cake. We have, however, made an enviable record of military achievement, and are entitled to many stars on our service flag.

First, in the matter of morale and esprit de corps. We have had very few delinquencies. On the opposite side of the ledger we have numerous letters of commendation from individuals and organizations praising the men of our regiment for their gentlemanly conduct.

Our regiment has furnished a large number of officers and men for key positions in other organizations. These men have gone to the General Staff in Washington, to the Chemical Warfare Service, the Signal Corps and as instructors in various Field Artillery schools.

Seriously handicapped by the lack of equipment, especially during the early months of our federal service, we have a training record of which all of us may well be proud. We made a remarkably successful forced march from Fort Francis E. Warren, Wyoming, to Fort Lewis, starting only four days after the dastardly attack by the Japanese on Pearl Harbor.

Most important of all, however, is the sincere desire on the part of you men to serve your nation. There have been very few applications on the part of either officers or men to transfer to non-combatant organizations. We are not afraid to fight when fighting is necessary.

I wish to emphasize again the principle that you all have heard me mention many times before, and that is that we all have a definite job to do, and, for us all as individuals, our particular job is the most important thing in the world. Do not forget that you can be just as good a soldier as a private, a corporal, a sergeant, a lieutenant or a captain as you can as a lieutenant general, and that your service is just as important to the nation as that of the most widely-heralded military hero.

Personally, I ask no greater honor of the Government of the United States than to continue to serve with you during the present war to preserve and protect our nation and our civilization.
