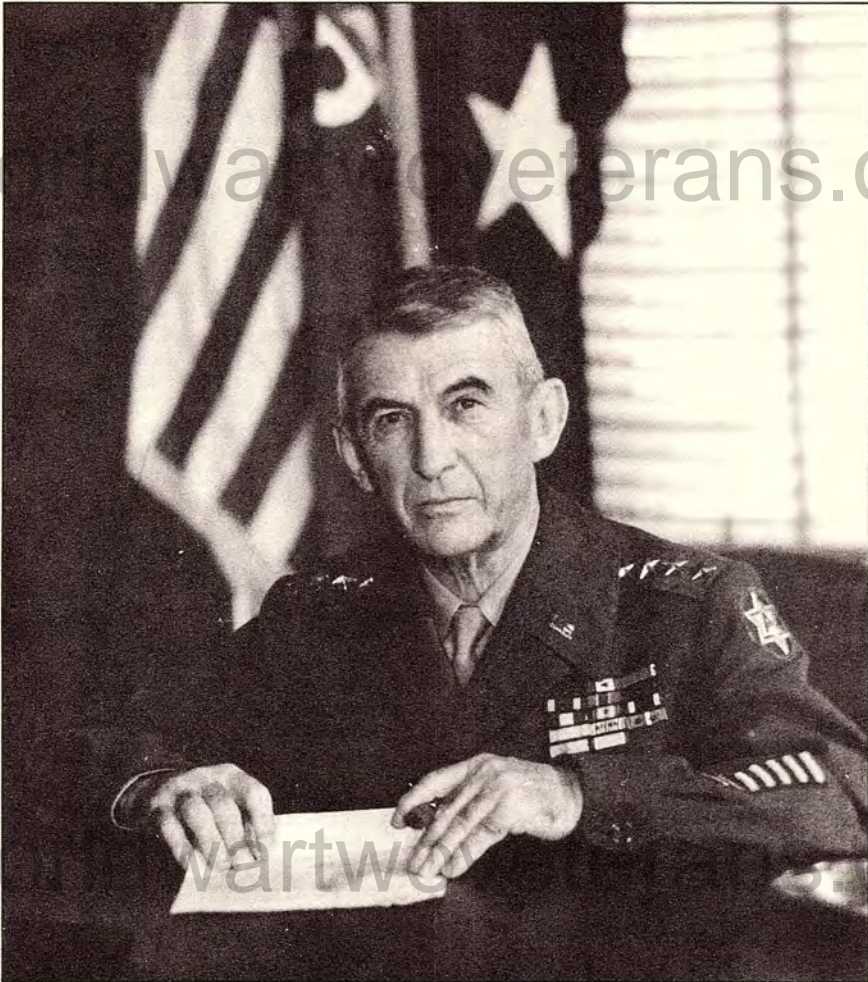

Brief Biographical Sketch  
of  
General Walter Krueger, U. S. Army



General Walter Krueger, born January 26, 1881, in Germany, came to the United States with his widowed mother when eight years old. Educated in various public schools in Middle West, including High School, Madison Indiana, and Technical School, Cincinnati, Ohio, Distinguished graduate, Infantry, and Cavalry School, 1906, and graduate General Staff College, 1907, Army War College, 1921, and Naval War College, 1926.

Married Grace Aileen Norvell of Olathe, Kansas, September 11, 1904. Children: James Norvell Krueger (U.S.M.A. 1926); Colonel Walter Krueger Jr., U.S. Army (U.S.M.A. 1931), and Dorothy Jane (wife of Colonel Aubrey D. Smith, U. S. Army, U.S.M.A. 1931).

Served as private, corporal and sergeant, U. S. Army, 1898 - 1901. Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant, U. S. Army, 1901, and promoted through the various grades to Colonel, 1932, to Brigadier General, October 1, 1936, to Major General, February 1, 1939, to Lieutenant General, May 16, 1941, and to full four star General, March 5, 1945. Retired from active service July 20, 1946.

Served in Spanish-American War in Cuba, 1898 - 1899, in Philippine Insurrection, 1899-1903, participating in numerous engagements; again in Philippines, 1908-1909; on Mexican Border, 1916 (as Lieutenant Colonel, 10th Pennsylvania Infantry); in World War I (as temporary Lieutenant Colonel and Colonel), as G-3, 84th and 26th Divisions and Chief of Staff Tank Corps, A.E.F., 1918 in France, and as G-3 VIth and IVth Army Corps, 1919 in occupied Germany. Instructor of the Line and General Staff College, 1909-1912, Army War College, 1921-1922, and Naval War College 1928 -1932. Member, War Plans Division, W. D. General Staff, 1922-1925, and 1934-1936, and Chief, War Plans Division, W. D. General Staff and member Joint Army and Navy Board, 1936-1938. Commanded 6th Infantry and Jefferson Barracks, Missouri, 1932-1934; 16th Infantry Brigade and Fort George G. Meade, Maryland, September, 1938 - March, 1939, 2nd Division and Fort Sam Houston, Texas, March, 1939 - October, 1940; VIIIth Corps, October, 1940 - May, 1941; Third Army and Southern Defense Command, May 1941 - January, 1943; Sixth Army in operations in Southwest Pacific Theater against the Japanese forces in New Guinea, New Britain, the Admiralties, Morotai in the Halmaheras, Leyte and Samar, Mindoro and Luzon Philippine Islands, February, 1943 - July, 1945

He was to spearhead the attack against Japan itself, with his Sixth Army, nearly 800,000 strong, supported by great Naval and Air Forces. After Jap capitulation, he occupied the southwest half of Japan with his Sixth Army, and conducted the disarming and demobilization of the Jap armed forces in that area. Its work completed, the Sixth Army was inactivated on January 26, 1946, the third anniversary of its birth, and the birthday of its only commander, General Krueger.

Decorations; Distinguished Service Cross, Distinguished Service Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters; Legion of Merit; Aztec Eagle with sash (Mexico); Grand Officer Order of Orange-Nassau with swords (Netherlands) Philippine Distinguished Service Star, Spanish-American War Service Medal, Army of Cuban Occupation Medal; Philippine Campaign Medal; Mexican Border Service Medal, World War I Victory Medal with Star, Army of Occupation of Germany Medal; American Defense Service Medal; American Theater Medal; Asiatic Pacific Theater Medal with four stars, Philippine Liberation ribbon with three stars, World War II Victory Medal; Army of Occupation of Japan Medal

Affiliations; Lutheran; Mason; Member Army and Navy Club, Washington, D. C., and San Antonio, Texas, Country Club.



Brief Biographical Sketch  
of  
Robert A. McClure, U. S. Army



Robert A. McClure was born in Mattoon, Illinois, on March 4, 1897. He was educated at Kentucky Military Institute. His first service was in the Philippine Constabulary between July 13, 1916, and August 9, 1917 when he was commissioned in the Regular Army as a Second Lieutenant of Infantry.

**PROMOTIONS:** He was promoted to First Lieutenant on the same date, August 1, 1917; to Captain (temporary) on June 20, 1918; to Captain (permanent) on July 1, 1920; to Major on August 1, 1935; to Lieutenant Colonel on August 9, 1940; to Colonel (temporary) on December 24, 1941; to Brigadier General (temporary) on March 15, 1942.

**SERVICE:** His first service was at Fort William McKinley, Philippine Islands, with the 31st Infantry, until November 1917, when he joined the 15th Infantry at Tientsin and Tongshaw, China. He joined the 27th Infantry at Manila, Philippine Islands. Moved with his regiment, 19th Infantry, from the border to Camp Sherman, Ohio, in October 1920. During this tour, his regiment served on a special assignment at Borderland, West Virginia, in the latter part of 1920.

He returned to Camp Sherman as Camp Exchange Officer in January 1921, and in the following October joined the 29th Infantry at Fort Benning, Georgia. He enrolled in the Infantry School at that post in October 1924 and was graduated in the following June. One year later he was graduated from the Cavalry School, Fort Riley, Kansas.



He served as an instructor at the Infantry School, Fort Benning, Georgia, from July, 1926 to September, 1930. He was graduated from the two-year course at the Command and General Staff School, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, in June, 1932, and assigned as Professor of Military Science and Tactics at Riverside Military Academy, Gainesville, Georgia.

He entered the Army War College, Washington, D. C., in August 1935 and was graduated in June, 1936, remaining at the Army War College as Executive Officer. From July 16, 1940, until August 2, 1941, he was Personnel Officer, G-1, of the Fourth Army, with headquarters at the Presidio of San Francisco, California. He then was ordered to London, England, as Assistant Military Attache'. He was assigned as Military Attache' in London on March 24, 1942. In June, 1942, assigned additional duty, as Military Attache' to the Governments in Exile, Greece, Czechoslovakia, Poland, Holland, Belgium, Norway and Yugoslavia.

In September, 1942, he was designated Intelligence Officer, G-2, Allied Force Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, in England. The following December, he moved to the North African Theater of Operations and was assigned to Allied Force Headquarters, Office of the Chief of Staff, as Chief of the Information and Censorship Section. He returned to the European Theater of Operations, in November, 1943, and was assigned to COSSAC.

In April, 1944 he was assigned as G-6, (Psychological Warfare), Supreme Headquarters, Allied Expeditionary Force. He was given additional duty as Director, Information Control Service, U. S. Group Control Council in Germany, in March, 1945. Since the disbandment of Supreme Headquarters, Allied Expeditionary Force, he has been Director of Information Control, Office of Military Government for Germany (U. S.).

U. S. DECORATIONS: He was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal in 1943, with the following citation:

"For exceptionally meritorious and distinguished services in a position of great responsibility. During the Tunisian Campaign, General McClure was charged with the formulation and direction of public relations policy of the Allied Forces....conduct of propaganda and operation of censorship....he created a closely integrated American-British organization....developed and maintained harmonious relationships with press of the United Nations....largely responsible for effectiveness of the United Nations propaganda activities in territory of North African operations...in occupied territories and the combat zone..."

OTHER U. S. DECORATIONS: Awarded an Oak Leaf Cluster for his Distinguished Service Medal for the formulation and direction of Psychological Warfare policy of Supreme Headquarters, Allied Expeditionary Force Legion of Merit, Bronze Star.

FOREIGN DECORATIONS: Commander of the British Empire, Commander Le Legion of Honor (France, Croix de Guerre with Palm (France), Nishan Iftikar (Tunis), El Alonena (Morocco), Polonia Restituta, IV class (Poland), Crown of Italy.

## JEFFERSON PROVING GROUND

A major Military Installation, established in Jefferson County just prior to World War II, Jefferson Proving Ground was a factor of vital importance in the successful prosecution of the war.

For many years before the United States entered World War I, and since that time until about January, 1940, practically all experimental and proof work in connection with the development and acceptance of ammunition and components for the Army was performed at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Aberdeen, Maryland.

Just prior to World War II, it became evident that the facilities and space existing at the Aberdeen Proving Ground would be altogether inadequate and that a vastly greater land area would be necessary to carry out simultaneously and without interruption the many activities in connection with proof work under the Great Ordnance manufacturing program. This was decided at a meeting in the office of the Chief of Ordnance on October 8, 1940, conducted by Lieutenant Colonel L. H. Campbell Chief of Ordnance.

A matter of prime importance in the selection of a proving ground site was the question of its accessibility to the principal manufacturing and industrial centers of the country. Other questions of equal or almost equal importance were those of obtaining a site where the weather conditions were favorable throughout the year, and an area large enough and sufficiently remote to permit work to go on uninterruptedly, and without undue danger or disturbance to the adjacent communities.

The present site of the Jefferson Proving Ground seemed to fulfill most of these conditions better than any of the other localities that were considered available at the time. Situated about ten (10) miles from Madison, Indiana, the selected site, some eighteen miles long and a fourth as wide, lies principally in Jefferson County with portions extending into Jennings and Ripley Counties. It is about seventy (70) miles southwest of the City of Cincinnati, Ohio, and about fifty (50) miles northeast of the City of Louisville, Kentucky. Transportation facilities are good inasmuch as the Baltimore and Ohio, and Pennsylvania Railroads pass the western boundary of the reservation. It is also bounded on the east by Indiana Route 29, on the west by Indiana Route 7, on the south by Route 107, on the north by U. S. Route 50.

The site, which consists of more than 56,000 acres, became the property of the United States in December of 1940. Construction began December 19, 1940, and in a short time the land was converted into a modern Proving Ground -- the first proof shot being fired on the 10th day of May, 1941.

The primary function of the Post is to test all types of Ordnance ammunition, projectiles, propellants, cartridge cases, primers, fuzes, boosters, bombs and grenades which are used as weapons of warfare, ranging from 20 mm aircraft cannon to 155 mm Field Guns, 8" Howitzer and 240 mm Howitzer, as well as airborne missiles. Acceptance tests are performed on given material to obtain results required by certain provisions of specifications.



Plans were made by the War Plans Division of Aberdeen Proving Ground. Jefferson Proving Ground was constructed by the Quartermaster Corps under the direction of the Ordnance Department of the United States Army. The Architect-Engineers were Russ and Harrison Company of Indianapolis, Indiana. The Contractors were J. C. O'Conner and Sons Company, and the J. L. Simmons Company. The Construction Quartermaster, Captain Frank Maguire, arrived December 20, 1940, and the Assistant Construction Quartermaster, First Lieutenant Samuel P. Davalos, arrived December 22, 1940.

On December 30, 1940, Lieutenant Colonel D. C. Cabell assumed command in compliance with War Department Special Orders dated December 17, 1940.

The first Chief Proof Officer, Lieutenant Colonel (then Captain) John D. Armitage, later assigned to the Pacific Theater of War, was returned as Commanding Officer of the Proving Ground when it became a sub-post of the Indiana Arsenal. Lieutenant Colonel Armitage, well and widely known in the Jefferson County Community, played an important part in the technical development and progress of the activities of the Proving Ground.

Colonel I. A. Luke succeeded Colonel D. C. Cabell as Commanding Officer on April 3, 1942 and Colonel W. B. Hardigg assumed command on the 11th of March, 1943, to serve until after the War.

Currently, in peace time, the Proving Ground is on a "stand-by" basis; its guns silenced.

One of the largest, best equipped airports in the country was constructed to permit testing of airborne projectiles. An idea of its size and completeness may be appreciated when it is pointed out that it was one of few capable of launching and landing the largest of bombers.

Officer personnel who trained at Jefferson Proving Ground airfield later distinguished themselves in war theaters and among the crew of the bomber carrying the first atomic bomb over enemy territory there was at least one who served here.

The site of the Proving Ground, southern Indiana, in the heart of a great industrial area where Ordnance material was manufactured, embraced an assemblage of utilities and services of giant proportions. Its more than 56,000 acres are knitted with 37 miles of electrical lines, 17 miles of water mains, nearly sixty miles of roads. There are 13 miles of railroads, and 43 miles of communication lines; the whole being enclosed with 48 miles of fence.

During the peak of wartime operations there were some 1,200 employees, 22% being women, most of whom came from the surrounding farms and villages. The resourceful community met the urgency of housing and transportation.

Of geological interest the terrain ranges from flat plains to wooded rolling ground; the soil, top layers of white clay, classified as Claremont Silt, with underlying strata of yellow clay some 10 to 25 feet in depth and bearing on limestone rock. It lies 850 feet above sea level.

Aside from the network of complete utilities, appointments at the Proving Ground include permanent officer quarters, enlisted men's barracks and canteen, post exchange and hospital facilities. In short it is a self-contained community.

Maintenance facilities include fully equipped shops, repair stations and storage buildings of permanent construction.

Stand-by personnel consist of fire and patrol crews and staffs of yard and building maintenance men who function to hold the installation in such a condition as to permit quick activation.

## THE STORY OF O. P. A. IN JEFFERSON COUNTY

War creates shortages. Essential imports are reduced or cut off. Factories that made peacetime goods are converted to production of war materials. Food and fibre, once in plentiful supply, must be shared with our fighting men and with our allies. Supplies of civilian goods diminished, as war production goes up. To fight the war, it was necessary to stop making cars, radios, refrigerators and washing machines for civilians, in order to make more guns, tanks and planes. We had to make more shoes, tires, trucks; produce more meat, dairy products, canned foods; produce more oil, refine more gasoline to supply our military as well as civilian needs. While military needs were cutting deeply into supplies available for civilians, employment was increasing and people had more and more money to spend. With demand much higher, and supplies much lower than pre-war days, it was apparent that many wouldn't get their fair share. This could only lead to buying runs, hoarding, aggravated shortages and people with the most money and shopping time would get the best and the most. It soon became apparent that war time shortages would cause severe hardships and slow up our whole war effort, unless some system was inaugurated to distribute scarce supplies fairly to those who need them most. For that reason, Congress acted; to protect every citizen alike, to provide a mechanism for fair sharing of essential goods, to meet war essential needs first when supplies would not meet the wants of all, to promote all our production by provisions of the Second War Powers Act.

The authority to ration was delegated by Congress to the President, and delegated by the President to the War Supply Agencies. These Agencies consisted of the War Food Administration on all foods, and the War Production Board on all other commodities. W. P. B. transferred to the Petroleum Administration for war control over Petroleum Products. These three supply Agencies were responsible for production for military needs and for civilian production and allocation. They determined when available supplies of essential goods were inadequate to meet uncontrolled demand. When they found that consumer rationing was necessary to insure fair distribution of scarce essential goods, the Office of Price Administration was directed to ration. The purpose of O. P. A. was to assure each section of the country its fair share of scarce goods; to divide that supply fairly--one family to another; to prevent hoarding; to distribute essential products to those who needed them most; to help maintain ceilings by preventing ruinous bidding up of prices of scarce goods.

Hence consumer rationing was set up in January, 1942, when it became apparent that the supply of tires and tubes were inadequate to meet the demand. Consumer rationing in America was done by "Committees of Neighbors". These committees were called War Price and Rationing Boards. Every community in America was served. Volunteers made up our War Price and Rationing Boards. These volunteers were aided by paid employees located in the Boards. District offices served the Boards, coordinated their operations and served on price control and rent control problems. Regional offices supervised O.P.A. programs, communicated national policy to the District office; and at Washington, we had the national



office.

Hence, January, 1942, found two War Price and Rationing Boards in Jefferson County. One located at the J.P.G. and one in Madison. The one at the J.P.G. handled employees only, while the one in Madison handled the rest of Jefferson County.

Each local Board consisted of three Volunteers. The Jefferson County Board was located in the City Hall in a little room rented and occupied by the N.Y.A. People had to go upstairs and through the Court room, which caused quite a disturbance often times when court was in session. Mr. Merrit Cottrell, an employee of the W.P.A. acted as clerk, Dr. Fred C. Denny was the first Board Chairman, Harry M. Chapman, and Fred McKay served with him on the Board.

The regulations were very incomplete at this early stage. The going was very rough for the Board members and for the clerk, but most people had good tires and only those who had to drive their car long distances applies as a rule, yet the job of determining who should get tires first in order to keep within the County allotment was not an easy one.

New automobiles were added to the rationing list in February, 1942. Help was badly needed as applications for tires and tubes and cars increased in number, and although the clerks employed at the N.Y.A. office and the clerk at the County Nurse's office gave assistance whenever they were not otherwise occupied, it was proving insufficient. Mr. Cottrell's health was gradually failing, so in March, 1942, it was deemed necessary to have more help. Congress had come through with a small amount of money to help staff the ever growing Boards all over the country.

Mrs. Lillace Harper former clerk at the County Nurse's office, went on duty as the first paid clerk on March 3, 1942. She and Mr. Cottrell handled all business for awhile, then Mr. Cottrell was forced to quit on account of ill health, and Mrs. Harper, with the help of the Board members, had to carry on. In March, typewriters were added to the scarce list also.

On April 28th, the sugar supply in this country was frozen, and all retailers, wholesalers, institutions and industrial users were required to register and on May 3rd, all consumers had to register for War Ration Book 1. The schools came to the rescue and helped with registrations. This was only the beginning of the many times the Board found it necessary to call on the schools and teachers in the county for aid. On April 28th, 1942, Mrs. Leona Drake entered the payrolls of the Jefferson County Rationing Board, and a short time later, the Board moved to the old Grade School Building on the northwest corner of Central and Second.

Canning sugar for consumers was started towards the last of May. Sugar was the first part of rationing which touched all the people. Gasoline was rationed in May, also. All car owners received an "A" book, and where need was shown, B or C books were also issued in addition to the "A" books, according to the mileage required. Three new Board members were added to the Board at that time -- namely, Charles Gautier, Guy Raney and Bill Eckert.

Because of the Hatch Act, it became necessary on May 31st for Mrs. Drake to quit work, as she was running for the office of City Clerk, a race in which she was successful. In June, the Board took on three ad-



ditional paid employees; Dorothy Tague took Mrs. Drake's place the 1st of the month. George Knoebel took a clerical position the 20th and Harry Chapman resigned his position as a member of the tire Board and became Executive Secretary of the Board office on June 19th. His place on the Board was taken by Richard Heck.

The first of July, 1942, the Board again moved its quarters across the street to the Holwager Memorial Building. Even yet we still had little furniture. All we had was borrowed. Supplies were hard to get and no funds were available. In the summer of 1942 the city of Madison and Jefferson County allowed the Board a sum of money to pay a janitor, and for office supplies.

In July, 1942, bicycles were added to the list of rationed items. October, 1942, rubber footwear and fuel oil were added; in December, 1942, stoves were added; in November, coffee was added; in February, 1943, shoes; March, 1943, processed foods and meats and fats were added. By this time another Book called Book II was issued making four kinds of rationing programs. Point rationing, which meant an equal share to all; uniform coupon rationing for a single commodity; differential coupon rationing where different people require different amounts; and certificate rationing where single items in scarce supply have to be allotted to individual buyers on the basis of need.

In January, 1944, the Board Office was moved to the Armory Building on North Jefferson Street. As supply began to equal demand, items were released from control. Coffee was removed July, 1943. Typewriters, April 1944. Tubes, July, 1944; bicycles, September 23, 1944. Stoves, October, 1944. Automobiles, July, 1945. On V-J Day, September 2, 1945, shoes, gasoline, processed foods, meats and fats and fuel oil, were all removed from rationing, and in November, 1945, boots and tires were removed. At this time, sugar rationing was removed from the Board level and taken over by the District Office at Indianapolis, and the War Price and Rationing Boards became known as Price Control Boards.

Sugar controls ended for consumers May, 1947, and all controls except control on price of sugar and rent ended July, 1947.

Mrs. Lillie Harper, E.O.D. March 3, 1942 - Separated January 13, 1943. Clerk. Handled tires, timekeeper, sugar, and automobiles.

Harry M. Chapman, E.O.D. June 19, 1942 - Quit under Hatch Act, March, 1946. Chief Clerk

Dorothy A. Tague, E.O.D. June, 1942 - Married H. T. Whisman, March, 1946 - Separated from the Board December 12, 1946. All Board employees laid off at this time. Clerk later Price Clerk. Handled sugar, time report, apparel, durable goods, food, oil and information.

Mary H. Rodgers, E.O.D., October 12, 1942 - Separated October 1, 1945. Clerk -- Handled tires, automobiles, typewriters, stoves.

Virginia Baglan, E.O.D., December 18, 1942 - Separated September, 1946. Price Clerk -- Handled price. Helped on rationing programs.

Mrs. Mary A. Brown, E.O.D., February 26, 1943 -- Separated December 12, 1946. All employees separated at that time. Clerk, later Chief Clerk. Handled gas, tires, price.

## JEFFERSON COUNTY BOND DRIVES

Six million volunteers promoted the sale of one billion separate securities to eighty-five million Americans during the four years and eight months of Defense and War Financing. Their service was performed as a patriotic contribution to the Nation's war effort and without compensation in any form from the Government of the United States.

In Jefferson County, an early start in forming a county-wide organization, coupled with the hard work of a large number of people and the generous support of the community, kept the county among the leaders in Indiana during the entire war period. The organization which was known as the War Finance Committee during the later years of the war, was originally called the "Defense Savings Staff". It was organized in August, 1941, composed of business and professional men and women from every township. Headquarters were established in the business section of Madison, at 308 West Main Street. The principal objective of the new organization was to "educate" the public to know and buy Defense Savings Bonds and Stamps. Following the sneak attack on Pearl Harbor, the organization's name was changed from "Defense" to "War", and the staff's status was changed from an educational group to an aggressive band of volunteers who were asked to raise this community's share of the funds needed to finance the tremendous war effort.

The first war rally in the nation was held in Indianapolis on January 15, 1942. Movie actress Carole Lombard flew from California to the capitol of her native state to assist in the program. Her death, in an airplane accident on her return trip home, shocked the country, and her supreme sacrifice while serving the war financing movement furnished an inspiration to the many volunteer war bond workers.

The second war rally to be held in Indiana was at Madison on Lincoln's Birthday, February 12, 1942, at the Brown Gymnasium. A community determined to back up the fighting forces, filled the large auditorium to overflowing. Preceded by a torchlight parade and sparked by an eyewitness account of the Pearl Harbor attack, the tremendous undertaking which faced our country was stressed in a stirring address by Governor Schricker of Indiana, who called for united support. Political leaders in this county publicly promised that "politics" would not be allowed to interfere with the war effort.

The following day, a committee of volunteer women started making a canvass of the entire city and county, securing pledges to "buy bonds to the limit" until victory was ours. They also explained the advantages of the bonds from the investor's viewpoint to everyone they contacted.

Thus Jefferson County residents were well prepared for the national War Loan Drives which started a few months later. Every war loan quota was oversubscribed by substantial margins. Over two hundred active war bond workers were on the Jefferson County War Finance Committee Staff, and every one personally solicited their neighbors and friends during each one of the War Bond Drives. Cooperation was freely asked for, and the responses were generous. Stores, factories, theatres, schools, churches, newspapers, and all organizations lent support in manning war bond booths, installing payroll savings plans and sponsoring special



events to publicize the Drives. Bonds were sold at all post offices and banks in Jefferson County, through payroll savings plans at stores, factories and the Jefferson Proving Ground, through direct solicitation and at booths in stores and theatres.

Although state wide contests were held in Indiana every month beginning May, 1942 to the end of that year, covering the sale of Series E F and G Bonds, there were no national war Loan Drives until December of 1942. From then until the Victory Loan, which was held in October and December of 1945, there was a War Loan Drive every few months. Jefferson County met all goals set for us, and more. Our people were determined to furnish our share of the funds needed to buy the guns, tanks, ships and planes needed by the Armed Forces and, on the Victory Loan, the funds needed to bring the "boys" back.

Following is a summary of the Drives:

RECORD OF SERVICE RENDERED BY THE JEFFERSON COUNTY CHAPTER  
AMERICAN RED CROSS DURING WORLD WAR II

Jefferson County can certainly feel proud of the fine record of service rendered by the Red Cross Chapter during World War II. Every effort was made to render wholehearted, efficient service day or night, in all phases of the Red Cross program, and the successful War Fund Drives, Roll Calls, etc. held during that time attest that the community as a whole appreciated and approved of the work done by the Chapter Officers, volunteers, and committee members.

Fortunately the Jefferson County Chapter was already well organized when the war started. Following the 1937 Flood an election of officers was held at that time, and all phases of the Red Cross program were already well established and ready to swing into action when the war emergency began. Those officers, who carried on with but one exception, through the war period, were;

Miss Biltz, after efficiently serving as Secretary for a period of two years, resigned, and her place was most capably filled by Miss Anna Koehler, the remainder of the officers remaining the same.

It would be very difficult to stress any one committee as rendering more service during the war period than another, because all did outstanding work. Classes were organized immediately for special training in first-aid, to meet any war emergency; also in Canteen Service; Nurses Aides; Home Nursing; Nutrition; Surgical Dressing Leadership; etc. It might give a better picture to list each committee and the field of work covered, in this report, as follows:

**PRODUCTION CORPS:** Mrs. Frank Bokert gave most efficient service as County Chairman of this Corps during the war period. The Madison High School turned over to the Red Cross Chapter free of charge, a corner room in the basement for the sewing project, also storage space in two other rooms. This courtesy was greatly appreciated, especially as it extended over a period of several years. Here garments were cut out and sewed, and materials and yarn distributed. Church groups, various organizations, and individuals volunteered for different days during the week. Hundreds of garments, such as bath-robes, dresses, childrens garments, etc. were made. Mrs. Isadore Weinberg was County Chairman of the Knitting program, which she handled in a very fine way. Yarn was distributed to all parts of the County for the making of sweaters, scarfs, afghans, socks, etc. Mrs. Thomas Finnegan was in charge of sewing; Mrs. Wm. Schofield in charge of cutting, in the workroom.

The Production Program was carried on not only at the Madison High School, but at Hanover where Mrs. Clarence Dryden was the very efficient and capable Chairman for the program; at Kent; North Madison, Brooksbury; Wirt, Dupont; Deputy and small community groups organized for this



purpose. A program of sewing was also carried on at the Jefferson Proving Ground by the wives of officers stationed there. Also at the Madison State Hospital, where knitting was done and sewing; so that all Chapter quotas were promptly met and those who saw the efficient manner in which the work was carried on, and the general interest in the women of the community who had a part in this project, were most favorably impressed; as were those from Area Office of the Red Cross who visited the workrooms from time to time.

**SURGICAL DRESSING PROGRAM:** Anxious to contribute their part in the Chapter's program of war service, Mr. and Mrs. Walter Greiner most generously offered their home to be used as headquarters for the surgical dressing program. This work was done in the recreation room of their home. The Chapter felt most fortunate to have such an ideal setup for this program. Miss Mary Hill most efficiently and capably served as Chairman of the work, with loyal and excellent assistance from many volunteers from Madison and different parts of the County. Hundreds of hours given, and thousands of surgical dressings made attest to the success of this program. All quotas were promptly met and the quality of the work was outstanding.

**NURSES AIDES:** Donation of a room in the Holwager Building was given by Mr. Holwager where Mrs. Courtland Yount as instructor, gave the training required to seven women from the County. Mrs. Harvey P. Meyers efficiently served as Chairman of the work done by these women at the Kings Daughters Hospital, where they gave hundreds of hours of excellent service; and also served when the Blood Plasma visits were made to the community; and at other times of emergency.

**CANTEEN CORPS:** Classes in Nutrition and Canteen Corps service were conducted by Mrs. Graham Ross to a large group of women who were vitally interested in this particular program. Mr. John Lucht served as Chairman of the Canteen Corps proper, with Mrs. Stewart Douglass and Mrs. Nancy Robinson as his Co-Chairmen. This Corps did excellent service when the Blood Plasma groups came to the community, and at other times when called upon. They also responded during the flood period, which occurred during World War II, and gave service day and night at that time.

**BLOOD DONOR SERVICE:** Several visits of the Indianapolis Mobile Blood Plasma Unit to Jefferson County, and to the Jefferson Proving Grounds, during the period of World War II were made. Almost 3,000 pints of blood were donated by people in the community, including military personnel at the Jefferson Proving Ground, Hanover College Students, people from the adjoining county of Switzerland County; etc. The Elks Club most generously let the Chapter use their entire building for this program, which covered several days on each trip. The Tri Kappa - Beta Omega Chapter - of Madison, carried on the work in Madison most efficiently, under the chairmanship of Mrs. John McGuire. At the Jefferson Proving Ground the Officers Wives Club took charge assisted by the Canteen Corps and Nurses Aides, etc. from the Chapter.

**FIRST AID:** Classes in first-aid were carried on under the chairmanship of Mr. Charles Stanton. Through Col. Hardigg, Commanding Officer of the Jefferson Proving Ground, classes were held on the Post in first aid for all civilian employees, for beginning, advanced and instructors classes. The first-aid classes were held in different parts of the county, also, so that the entire community was covered by volunteers especially trained in this work to meet any emergency that arose. A large group of in-



instructors were trained and utilized for this program.

**HOME NURSING;** Different classes in Home Nursing, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Glenford Clements, were held. Much interest was shown and their training was especially shown when the flood disaster occurred. Mrs. Clements was assisted by the County Nurse in this work. Much credit can be given to Mrs. Clements also, for the fine emergency setup she had ready at all times, kept at the Madison High School and cots kept at the Scout Camp, the stored items at the High School including linens, bedding, robes, clothing, etc. and other medical equipment, which could be used immediately, or taken out and to, any place of disaster in the community during the war period. Also stored at the Kings Daughters Hospital, in charge of Mrs. Rinda Rains, Superintendent, were two completely equipped first aid boxes with materials sterilized, which could be picked up there by the medical group in the community and taken to any point of disaster and used. This equipment represented an investment by the Chapter of several hundred dollars and was much appreciated by those who knew it was available at all times for use.

**DISASTER PREPAREDNESS;** Mr. Herman Potter, as Chairman of this Committee most efficiently organized same to be on call immediately in time of any disaster in the community. He was assisted by Mr. Bayard Hughes. The City Hall was designated as the Headquarters in time of emergency, which was demonstrated most effectively at the time of the flood during the war period. Mr. Anthony Datillo was chairman for transportation for this committee, and did an excellent job. Others who served in different capacities on the committee were; Mr. Marshall Tennis, Mr. Ralph Knoebel, Mr. Stanley Meenach, Mr. John Lucht, Dr. Cook Mr. Richard Heck, Mr. Frank Pritchard, Mr. Charles Heberhart, Mr. O. L. Head as chairmen of various committees under Mr. Potter. Others gave of their time and efforts and a most efficient working organization was set up. During the flood period the Jefferson Proving Ground gave outstanding and most valuable aid and service to this committee, under Col. Hardigg, which demonstrated in every way that whatever war disaster might occur, Jefferson County was ready and organized to meet the emergency at any time.

**HOME SERVICE;** This committee functioned on a 24 hour basis and too much cannot be said for the outstanding, efficient and wholehearted service given by Mr. Donald Bear, as Chairman of Home Service. The Chapter tried to meet all requests made by service men, or their families, to them for service. The Chapter Chairman, Mrs. Walker, and Secretary, Miss Koehler assisted Mr. Bear in this work. As a result of the need and the great volume of work handled by Mr. Bear, a full-time Executive Secretary for the Chapter was realized at the time when service men were returned from overseas back to the community from hospitals, etc. and when families in the community especially needed the service of a paid Secretary to help meet all problems of communication, location, financial need, etc. that came up.

**WATER SAFETY;** This committee functioned under the chairmanship of Mr. C. Rogers Walker. Classes were organized and instruction given at the Crystal Beach Pool, in Madison, and Hoosier Hills Scout Camp. Results of Mr. Walker's chairmanship were shown from reports of rescue work done at several camps by service men who had had their training under his leadership while civilians in the community. Instructors classes were held and many younger groups given the training in beginners and advanced swimming.



**CAMP AND HOSPITAL SERVICE:** This committee was organized in the community and through the Chapter, furniture for dayrooms, for Camp Atterbury and Freeman Field, and many items were secured and given to the service men stationed at the Jefferson Proving Grounds, such as drapes for their dayroom, smoking stands, books, magazines, papers, treats, etc. Mr. C. Rogers Walker was chairman of this program, with Mrs. M. E. Garber, Co-Chairman. At holiday time fruit and candy was sent to Wakeman Hospital, at Camp Atterbury, and other treats. The Chapter cooperated in every way with the Jefferson Proving Ground in securing and meeting their requests for service. Furniture for dayrooms was also contributed to the Jefferson Proving Grounds for the Hospital, Dayroom at Hangar, Airfield, and Recreation Room. Much favorable expressions of appreciation were received from the Commanding Officers and those in charge for the services rendered by the Chapter Chairman, Mrs. Walker, and others who cooperated in doing all they could for the Post in the County, and those nearby.

**CHAPTER OFFICERS:** The Chapter officers were loyal and tireless to meet all demands made upon them during the war period. Mrs. Walker, as Chapter Chairman, worked with all the committees carrying on the work, giving almost 24 hour service in several phases of the work, being on call at all times. As stated earlier in the report the Chapter officers had served for several years before the war began, so were aware of where to go to secure quick and efficient response to all demands for service, which helped a great deal. All drives went over "the top" and all obligations for service were met.

Mr. Clarence Dryden, as 1st Vice-Chairman, gave unstintedly of his time to help the Chapter in every way meet its obligations for service. He helped with the financial drives, especially in his own community; with the Blood Plasma work, securing cooperation of Hanover College; and in all phases of the Chapter's program. His services were outstanding in every way.

Rev. J. M. Tidball headed several of the drives for funds for the Chapter assisted by Mr. Charles Middleton, of the Chamber of Commerce, as Treasurer of the drives. All quotas were met and his inspiration and help as a Chapter officer were always available at any time.

Mr. Robert Yunker was enthusiastic in his interest in the Chapter's meeting its responsibility and offered many excellent suggestions which were utilized to make the Chapter in every way an organization for service.

Miss Biltz and Miss Koehler were unexcelled as Secretaries. Both also gave of their time as first-aid instructors, and Miss Koehler also took the nursing course as Nurses Aide and gave not only time at Kings Daughters Hospital, but also for two periods of time at Wakeman Hospital. Their help was invaluable in every way.

Mr. Richard Johnson, with his excellent knowledge of business procedure and finances, gave the Chapter a Treasurer they could count upon at all times for his interest, support, and assistance. His keen and competent way of analyzing any situation, and deciding which action the Chapter should take, meant a great deal to the efficient carrying on of the program.

It is impossible, in this report, to give by name credit to all the organizations, groups and individuals who were responsible after all, for the success of the Jefferson County Chapter's program during the War

years. Organized for service, the Chapter met its obligations because of the loyal support of these groups and individuals. It can stand on its record and look back with much pride and satisfaction in having met all obligations because of the support received in all its endeavors, and know that because they did meet and keep the obligations for which they were organized, the Chapter in peacetime will continue to be a strong force for service in the community.

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
