The Rushmore Servicemen's Mothers' Club was organized May 3, 1943, and disbanded May 3, 1946. On this date the Auxiliary to Rushmore Eagle Post No. 543, was organized with members of Mothers' Club becoming members of the Auxiliary.

Our club was organized with a group of 21 members and at the close we had 67 members.

We held monthly meetings at homes of our members. At roll call each mother answered with news of their sons in service. We also had a few mothers who took the name of some boy in service whose mother had passed away, and we called them our "adopted sons for duration" and we sent things and wrote to them same as our own sons.

We held suppers, sold quilts, had auction sales etc.. to raise money for the blood plasma fund at the St. Paul and Minneapolis blood centers. We sent some over \$1000 to this fund.

We also made afghans, bedroom slippers, wash cloths, laundry and bedside bags and cookies and sent to hospitals. We sent Christmas cards to all the boys each Christmas from the club.

We purchased a desk American flag and stand, and presented to each soldier returning home in our community. There were 115 service stars on our roll when we discontinued our club (113 men, 2 women). We have 3 gold stars on our service flag.

The above record of 3 years of great humane work was accomplished only by the splendid co-operation of all the people of the Rushmore community.

# SERVICEMENS' WIVES CLUB

# Worthington, Minnesota

The Servicemens' Wives Club was organized through the help of the adult committee of the Y. M. C. A. in December, 1944. The purpose of the group was to furnish entertainment and a chance to talk and get together for all local servicemens' wives while the boys were away. The Club met once a month at the Y. M. C. A. and had varied programs, including picnics and suppers, and some form of outside entertainment also.

Mother's Service Club was organized in October, 1944, for the sole purpose of a group of servicemen's mothers uniting to better help in the war effort. The membership that year numbered 66. The officers were: President, Mrs. R. Kellam; Vice-President, Mrs. E. Hobicht; Treasurer, Mrs. T. Hauge; Secretary, Mrs. O. Griffith.

The Club's main objective was raising money for the blood plasma fund. \$540.00 was given to this fund, \$50.00 to the Red Cross, and the members donated 20 pints of blood.

The ladies furnished cakes, cookies and doughnuts to the canteen regularly.

This group is still active as some of the mothers still have boys in service. The present membership is 24; namely, Mrs. E. Akkerman, Mrs. G. Garrett, Mrs. O. Griffith, Mrs. W. Hay, Mrs. R. The present aim of the group is to help in anyway possible the boys who have given so much, and are now in the Veteran's Hospital at St. Cloud. Magazine subscriptions have been sent and at Christmas time treats of nuts and homemade candy are sent. The group sews regularly for these boys. The mother's sons still in the service receive a Christmas package from the group.

As a local project each veteran, as well as a British war bride, at the Sanitarium receives a decorated cake as a birthday remembrance.

# NOBLES COUNTY RED CROSS CHAPTER

February, 1941 - April, 1946

County headquarters were set up in the Armory at Worthington, Minnesota. Branches working with Worthington were: Adrian, Bigelow, Brewster, Dundee, Ellsworth, Kinbrae, Lismore, Reading, Round Lake, Rushmore, and Wilmont; also several township groups, church organizations, and other societies.

When war broke out the following volunteer services were established: Staff Assistance; Canteen; Production, including Surgical Dressings; Motor Corps, and Gray Ladies. Dr. G. C. Turner was Chapter Chairman, and Mr. A. L. Wells, Brewster, Chapter Vice Chairman.

Red Cross did refugee sewing, as well as knitting of garments, sewing for hospitals, and surgical dressings. Large quotas of sewing, knitting and surgical dressings were assigned to this chapter, and thanks to the fine cooperation and untiring efforts of the women of the county, were always filled and promptly shipped. One local project was, giving to each boy who left the county a furnished kit.

Canteen served lunches to draftees upon departure, and in September, 1944, Canteen was opened at the Depot and gave twenty-four hour service to all service people until six months after the war ended. During this period approximately 54,880 service men and women were served, and the high peak for one month was 6500, but never after the first month were less than 1000 served. Home baked cakes, cookies, pies, and doughnuts were donated by the people of Nobles County.

The Gray Lady service is still active at the Southwestern Minnesota Sanitorium.

Group of women on Staff Assistance did all our typing, filing, stencil cutting, etc.

Many people from the county were sent to the Blood Bank in Minneapolis by the Red Cross.

Home Service was very active throughout the entire war.

First Aid and Home Nursing Services conducted classes for training personnel.

Junior Red Cross worked through the schools for the county, filling their quotas.

Red Cross Swim School and Life Saving still active each summer.

Red Cross Fund Drives netted \$71,038.61 during the war - 1942 through 1945.



# THE QUILTERS

Around the quilt the workers sit,
And as they work they chat a bit;
The middle-aged, the young and old,
Through summer heat and winter cold.

They talk of things both old and new -About the things they used to do,
And now and then a sigh or tear,
This all goes on throughout the year.

They come each time to quilt some more And turn them out, yes, by the score. The good they do spreads far and wide Through village, town and countryside.

Keep up the work and quilt and talk, And with thy Master ever walk, Till He shall call you one by one, And kindly say, "Your work is done." A group of women made baby quilts from scraps of outing flannel left after layettes were cut by Red Cross. This work was done in the homes.

While working in Red Cross work room one afternoon, we noticed how many scraps were left after cutting garments for refugees. We began making large pieced quilts, putting in a three pound ball of cotton and an outing flannel back. We tied these with bright colored scraps of yarn.

After all the pieces suitable for quilts had been used, the remainder was cut in strips and served for rugs. We had these woven and with the quilts were enclosed in boxes for refugees.

On or about January 1, 1942, we were invited to work in Red Cross work room. By this time we had so many scraps to work over, we were very happy for more workers. There were many of the older ladies who did not feel they could help with the sewing, but as it was with many of us quilting and quilts was our "Hobby," so they joined our little group.

On April 1, 1942, we were set up as a special committee under Red Cross known as "Quilters." We had a total of sixty-five members ranging in age to 82.

We began to take in quilts to be quilted and doing all kinds of hand work, such as crocheting, making rugs, dolls, aprons, and fancy quilts. These articles were sold and put in a special fund which began to grow by leaps and bounds.

The money was used for: (See Financial Report).

We became such a money making group it was no longer able to remain under the Red Cross. Then we were Quilters without any further connection with Red Cross. Under this setup we were able to branch out still farther.

Our articles were shipped to 25 states and Canada.

During our years of work together we would like to pay tribute to the three members we lost by death - Mrs. John Apel, Mrs. Flora Anderson, and Mrs. George James.

The officers were: Mrs. F. D. Soutag, Chairman; Mrs. Flora Anderson, Vice-President until her death, then Mrs. Retta Ford replaced her as Vice-President; Mrs. Andrew Johnson, Designer; Mrs. O. A. Kunzman, Secretary-Treasurer.

One quilt was autographed by citizens of Wglu, Adrian, Dundee, Kinbrae, Brewster, R. Lake, Wilmont, Hulda, and Rushmore amounted to \$237.10, was donated to the Minnesota Historical Society by the Quilters as a souvenior of their work.

The ladies made approximately from 300 to 400 quilts, 150 to 200 baby quilts, and about 900 to 1000 dolls, besides all their other activities.

The Quilting Project closed January 15, 1946.

# OUR FARMERS FOUGHT A WAR TOO

Modern war imposes a terrific burden on the productive resources of the nation involved. Not the least of the strains that appear is that on food.

Rationing, controls on supply, movement to distress areas, all the things that can be done with the available supply are futile without an abundant production.

Nobles County made an enormous contribution in agricultural commodities of the very kind war demands; fats, meat, milk, and cereals. To realize the relative importance of these materials it is only necessary to remember that nearly all of the food going into export or for the armed forces abroad was actually produced on less than one-fifth of America's farms. Nobles County, nearly all crop land, was in that one-fifth.

In 1944, among the approximately 1000 counties that produce a significant surplus of food, Nobles ranked as follows: chickens raised, 71st; turkeys raised, 46th; corn, 44th; oats, 21st; flax, 26th. 1944 was not a good year for Nobles County but the only one of the war years having these comparisons.

Over 66,000 hogs, 34,000 sheep, 60,000 cattle, 485,000 chickens and 85,000 turkeys, were on hand or raised during that year.

6,300,000 bushels of corn and 3,200,000 bushels of oats were raised to sell or feed to those animals. Flax was greatly damaged by bad weather, but nearly 200,000 bushels were sold, plus 75,000 bushels of soybeans.

In spite of reduced man power, but with help by many new machines, a big upsurge of production followed and continues. In 1946 corn rose to nearly 7.5 million bushels and oats to 4.8 million bushels. Flax went up to 260,000 bushels and soybeans reached a total of 394,000 bushels.

Driven in part by self interest, no doubt, but with a real patriotic and humanitarian urge to supply a needy world, Nobles County greatly increased production per man, total acreage under plow and total volume of exportable surplus. A remarkable achievement, not without cost.

The labor of many farm boys and girls and homemakers helped to make it possible. Inexperience took its toll in the form of accidents and injuries. Long hours in bad weather were the common lot of the operators.

But the job was done. There was no serious loss of crops. Production was never allowed to lag. It is a proud record for the county.
