FOREWORD

A MERICA IS AT WAR! The men and women of this country have answered the call to arms in great numbers in order that the principles of Democracy may be upheld and the rulership of ruthless dictatorial powers again may be restored to normalcy for the best interests of humanity the world over. The conflict goes on, and our sons and daughters, brothers and sisters, fathers and even our mothers, are still joining the colors, to make the universe a better place in which to live.

Now, two years after Pearl Harbor, perhaps we are justified in pausing momentarily from our war effort to salute these men and women who have donned the uniforms of the various branches of the services — the Army and the Navy, the Marines and the Air Corps, the Merchant Marines, the Red Cross, the WACs, SPARs and the WAVEs, among top-ranking organizations—those who have forsaken civilian occupations and pursuits of personal happiness, while we carry on along the vast "home front" of these United States.

It is therefore with considerable pride and patriotic fervor that the following compilation of the likenesses and biographical sketches of more than one thousand individuals has been brought into publication for the first time between a set of covers while the World War II continues. The publisher and editors have given the most conscientious attention to the preparation of this Album, yet realize its incompleteness because many are being inducted into the Armed Forces even as this book goes to press and many will be enlisting as the conflict goes on. It has been difficult to obtain detailed data on the early background of numerous persons because of their absence now from the community. Their service records, too, are yet in the making and will not be complete until the war is won and their names are written among the nation's valiant heroes and heroines, some of whom may never again rejoin their families and loved ones here at home. Thus, the complete and final account of the patriotic contributions of this community's service men and women is left to another day. It is hoped that any inaccuracies and omissions in this book may be corrected in a later volume when America emerges victorious over her enemies in the European and Asiatic theaters of war.
