#### 2006 Annual Meeting

After brunch COL Michael Ewens introduced our guest speaker LTC Timothy Harris, USAF is the Operations Officer of the 729<sup>th</sup> Airlift Squadron, Air Force Reserve Command, which is located at March Air Reserve Base, California. He is a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy. He is a Command Pilot with over 5,500 flight hours. He

Has participated in Operations Desert Shield, Allied Force, "Free Willy" Deep Freeze Enduring Freedom and the current Iraqi Freedom. LTC Harris discussed the mission of the 729<sup>th</sup> AS which is to provide strategic and tactical airlift worldwide. He also covered in detail through a Power Point presentation the conversion from the C-141C Starlifter to the C-17A Globemaster III. The C-141 and the KC-135 aircraft are retired.

The C-17 is the backbone of the airlift capability of the USAF. They are a strategic heavy lift aircraft capable of carrying a payload of 157,000 lbs. They can carry a single M-1A Abrams tank and delivery it into the war zone. They can take off and land on a short field under 4000 feet. This means that they are capable of loading and landing in almost any theater of operation. The operations in Iraq and Afghanistan use this capability a great deal. The C-17 is also capable of in-flight refueling and airdrop techniques. He has flown missions in Afghanistan and Iraq. Some of these missions have been round trip from bases in Europe, which demonstrates the great capability of the C-17. He showed videos and slides on the C-17s great flexibility. It is a Global Direct Delivery Aircraft, a Rapid Outsized Strategic Airlift Aircraft (larger than the C-5), a Strategic Brigade Airdrop Aircraft and an excellent Night Operations Aircraft. He showed a dramatic video of a Night Operation drop at 30,000 feet over Afghanistan with the crew on oxygen and wearing night vision goggles. It was a dynamic view of cargo going out the back of the C-17 into the cold, black night at 30,000 feet to avoid any enemy air defense missiles.

The Eagle Award went this year to COL (CH) Donald Forden; COL Forden has been a dedicated member of our organization for many years. A life Membership Certificate was presented to LTC Wesley Blasjo.

MAJ Edward Bundick a member of the old WW II 63<sup>rd</sup> Division Association, Inc. gave a presentation on what their organization does and the yearly meeting. New business, SGM Eighmy presented a list of nominees for 2006-2007. COL Alfred Diaz was elected President and CSM Arnold Greenberg was elected as Vice President.

COL Michael Ewens and LTC Donald Wirth held the raffle. The meeting was adjourned at 1400 hours. All had a wonderful time.
