SKANEATELES IN TWO WORLD WARS

Here is the record -- names, dates, places and the faces we have all known in our town.

It is not unlike a thousand other records which towns throughout the nation like Skaneateles have compiled to honor those whose lot it was to take up arms in defense of a way of life we find indispensable to free and happy human existence.

And if it were merely a record it would serve only the purpose of the statistician,

It is above all a reminder and a symbol of the duties and responsibilities which come unpleasantly into the lives of each of us as individuals, as small communities, as large areas, and as a nation.

When a debt must be paid and what we cherish protected, only man can be the agent, for he alone possesses the power which God gave him to uphold what he believes right, and defend it from what he believes evil.

So this record of our township's contribution of its native sons to two worlds wars, which threatened to destroy free people everywhere, is a memorial to their courage and their valor, and in nineteen instances, to the supreme sacrifice they had to make.

Two hundred thirty-two of us were in the armed forces in World War I; three were killed. In the last war, six hundred thirty left home, sixteen never returned.

Out of the millions who served in both wars, this number is almost infinitesimal. But these are people, not numbers. They are the faces we know so well, the personalities which make each different; they are the people we played with as children, with whom we shared the dislike of school, and the curious aches of growing up and learning that the world was not a story-book utopia after all.

It is a record stamped with friendship, with affection and love
--and grief.

These are not rifles in an infantry regiment, planes off the assembly line or parts of a ship to be ordered by the thousands.

They are the human offering which our small and beautiful town of Skaneateles made when our nation and the ideals on which it is built needed help.

It is a record of which we are proud, and honored to have been a part.
