ESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

I was elected president to replace David Oglesby who indicated he was too ill to continue in office. I hope we can all "gather at the river" Potomac which runs through Washington DC again next year.



ANZIO BEACHHEAD VETERANS MEMORIAL MONUMENT

On Friday, May 26, 2006, over 250 veterans and their families gathered in New York City to participate in the unveiling and dedication of a beautiful monument, dedicated to all who served

on the Anzio Beachhead. The ceremony was timed to coincide with the arrival of the USS Anzio who participated in Fleet Week events.

The dedication was the culmination of over five




and a half years work by James Luzzi, 1st Armored Division. Jim was successful in obtaining funds from the City of New York to build this monument and is now awaiting word for its permanent placement. We were honored to have with us for this occasion, the Mayor of Anzio, Mr. Candido De Angelis. The USS ANZIO supplied the color guard and after the ceremony we were all invited to a great reception aboard the ship.

Some facts about the monument: It is made of black polished granite, standing 6 feet high, 7 feet in length and weighing 6,104 pounds. The American flag, the British flag, and the insignia of the 5th Army and 6th Corps are in colors, red, white and blue.

what historians call one of the bloodiest engagements of World War II gather here for the 27th Annual Anzio Beachhead Veterans of WWII Reunion

"Operation Shingle" began Jan. 22, 1944, and 124 days of bloodshed and carnage would ensue, leaving almost 30,000 American soldiers dead, wounded or missing in action, according to John Boller, a reunion organizer.

"It was the biggest battle we ever had," says Bud McMillian, a Fayetteville native who lives in Myrtle Beach. "We had it pretty rough there."

He was a sniper.

He remembers running down a hill on the beach along with his radio transmitter

"We were backing up the British," he says. The transmitter soldier was

killed in a rain of mortar fire.

"It blew a big hole in my left leg," McMillian says about his wound.

He spent eight hours waiting to be rescued.

"We had a hospital under ground," he says. "We had 33,000 patients treated in that hospital."

Until it was bombed by German forces.

"There were shells everywhere," he says.

McKeithen remembers May 23, 1944, in what he describes as the "greatest assembly of war tools I've ever seen" on both sides

"We had terrible casualties," he says. "We lost 101 men in my company. There were 28 left. It was just the saddest affair."

These are the stories that more than 90 WWII veterans will relive today through Saturday as they tour the Airborne & Special Operations Museum on Fort Bragg and relive Abzio.

"One of the things I'm looking forward to is meeting with the 82nd Airborne Division," says McKeithen, a Fayetteville minister who was an Army chaplain with the 34th Infantry Division.

It was the 82nd Airborne Division and the 504th Parachute Infantry Regiment that helped lead the American invasion, and it was McKeithen's 34th Infantry Division that spelled weary soldiers from 3rd Infantry Division in late March at Cisterna.

We are free ...

I'm not worthy to write about these honorable WWII veterans who reunite in our town and our nearby military base.

I've never served my country.

I've never seen mortar fire.
I've never seen one of my
best friends die in my arms.

I've never been to war.
But I remember well the shrappel scar on the right side

of my father's jaw. I have the Eisenhower jacket he wore. And his Bronze Star and Purple Hearts are secure in his old Army footlocker.

He survived WWII.

He would be 85 today.

And I've listened to McKeithen weep as he talked about Anzio and visiting in the homes with fathers and mothers and wives and children of fallen heroes who fought by his side on the Italian beachhead.

So, may we be honored these American heroes are here with us this week, and may we stand in reverence should one pass our way. They were gallant, they were brave, they were among a nation's best, and too often we forget or just don't take the time to learn or remember.

But we are free .

... because on beaches like. Anzio, they were there.






