Association Has Come A Long Way Since Nov. 1945

The 36th Division Association has been in business since a few months after VJ day 1945. In Nov. 1945 the current WWII Association was organized, and had the first reunion in Brownwood Texas in Jan. 1946 to make plans for the big one set for Oct. 1946 in Fort Worth.

Since that time, the elected officers and directors have planned and executed some great reunions. The 1946 bash, for example — brought in almost 1,000 registered T-Patchers. Of course at that time the fatwas-in-the fire, and the enthusiam was current in the minds of all who were the Ruptured Duck

As the years followed, attendance declined as troopers got married, raising a family and all the problems of adjustment to civilian life again. By the late 1960's it looked bad. Turnout was small, but the feeling was there, and after 1970 the Association began to grow.

The answer was found in membership solicitation. We were fortunate to have Amil Kohutek, a devoted T-Patcher who sent out tons of mail to every name available. With some help from the troops, the membership grew. And, in 1977 and early 1978 we are on our way. But, we still need help. This organization can be no better than the personal participation of ALL 36thers.

Un-recondered figures sl. w that some 45,000 men wore the T-Patch from early 1930s Nat'l Guard days until V-E Day. So, we know they are out there — somewhere. Finding them, sometimes is loke looking for an eagle's nest. But, you can help!






