



Membership Report-LENWLK

The fiscal year of 1979 was a 'banner year'. We crashed through the 3000 PAID membership mark for first time. Be reminded that we operate from Sept. 1st to Aug. 31st each calendar year.

GOOD NEWS: as announced in the July T-Patcher that 1980 dues were DUE, we are happy to announce that 1500 troops have responded with their \$5.00 (and some with stamp money) and this is GREAT!

LIFE Membership have been active — cause the fat's in the fire, and the 36thers have caught "T-PATCH FEVER" . . . we now have 157 Life members. This money is invested in CD's to draw maximum interest, so call it INSURANCE money, so we can stay in business — from now on.

INFLATION is a 3-letter word — "BAD", and you know all about it. At the '79 Houston Reunion, your board raised the annual dues to \$7.50. (This is not adequate, but will do for time being). This will go into effect — as of JULY 1980 . . . for '81 dues.

EXAMPLE: For your past \$5 dues, you have been getting four issues of the T-Patcher (they cost \$2.17 each) so you see, that's not a good way to run a railroad. (Many of our Infantry Division Associations have been charging \$10 for several years).

Your T-PATCHER, which has been acclaimed by many as the 'best' in the business is mailed to you THIRD CLASS. This is an economy move, of course, so naturally it takes the Postal Service a while to get it in your mail box. New dates are: DECEMBER/MARCH/JUNE/ and AUGUST. It takes about 4 weeks to write, edit and set the composition, for camera-ready art for the printer. He needs 5 working days; Postal needs up to 2 weeks, depending on where it is sent.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: This has been a sore spot for both the trooper and the Association. IF YOU FAIL TO NOTIFY (LENWLK) of your change, you may miss an issue, so please go to the PO and get a card and send it to me.

IMPORTANT — If you have paid your 1980 dues, you are expecting a Membership Card. OK, it is enclosed in this issue (Dec. 1979), so please check your envelope carefully.

ALL correspondence for Membership would be addressed to me. Make plans to be in Dallas in '80, and you have my best wishes for the holiday season.

Vincent Lockhart to Write New Book on 36th's Action From Southern France -



Edward Keeton Writes About Lack of Markers For 36th At Many Key Places 36th Fought . . .

Dear Bill:

We came back from Italy with the impression that everyone from the 36th had one hell of a good time. I know that Linda and I did. Julian Quarles, Bob Nowell, Duney & Ruby Philips, Jim & Clara Colville and Linda & I, sort of disassociated ourselves from a part of the trip so that we could see what we wanted to see.

Rather than take the various side trips offered to Capri, Florence, Pompei, etc., eight of us made trips to the "river", the German and British cemeteries, San Pietro, Paestum, etc. At a number of places, when they found out who we were, we were welcomed with open arms. Much Vino, dancing, food, etc. This made it worthwhile, especially in view of the fact that at most of the photo displays, only

Julian Quarles
Tells Of Highlights
of This Great Trip

Dear Bill:

I'm writing this from the air, over the middle of the Atlantic. It was a real thrill to stand by the Lord Mayor of Cassino in the town square with a detail of Marines, Navy Band, school children waving flags, etc and reply to his welcome address.

The square has a monument with a field gun on one side and a 1st Armored tank on the other. By the side of the monument is a pile of rubble of broken columns etc, represents the town when the fighting was over.

Bob Nowell gave a moving prayer at the Anzio-Nettuno Cemetery, Julian Philips, with his usual bull-doggedness obtained a copy of the dead; alphabetized with units of the 7,862 buried there.

Bob and I roomed together, it was late to bed and up early every morning, we slept like logs with the weather starting in the 50's and never over 70 during the day.

Back in July, I started working through the Italian Consul, Miami; Italian Military Attache in Washington DC; and Italian General Staff in Rome to get OK to visit the Persono area near Paestum (where the 2nd Bn., 143rd was run over with tanks. It is an Italian Military Post. Eight of us visited there Monday Oct. 8, and received royal treatment brass bands etc. This was the ancient Bourbon King's Hunting Lodge, but of course, is more like a castle, and we received a tour of the whole facility. The Italian Army took it over after WWII.

Personnel carriers were firing a problem over the area where 2nd Bn., 143rd was located and later we went to the Co. F's area, and found it to be exactly like it was in 1943, hedgerows have grown up, that's all.

the British appear. I believe that it was at a photo display in Cassino, there was not one picture of the Americans -- Oh yes, I stand to be corrected -- there was one photo of General Clark, taken with Field Marshall Alexander.

There are no memorial markers at any of the places that the 36th fought. I had, long ago, been given to understand that there was a suitable marker at Paestum. WRONGO. There is nothing - and none of the river or Velletri, San Pietro or Anzio. As a matter of fact, while we were attending a party at the river we were speaking with a senator and he pointed this fact out to us. (He was primarily speaking of the river area) and he told us that he was trying to get the Italian Government to erect one. That led us to a discussion and we want to try to rectify that error. More later.




