

"T-Patch To Victory", New Book To Be Ready For Troops, July 1981

Deadlines have been set for "T-Patch to Victory," the history of the 36th Infantry Division from the landing in Southern France (15 August 1944) to the end of the European part of the War.

Historian Vincent Lockhart of El Paso, who went all the way with the 36th in World War II, says that his writing is nearng the half-way mark, and the copy must be in the hands of the publisher by February 1981. Publication date is promised at July 1981.

Vince plans to interview four 36thers in California in May — Sam Webster of 143rd, Jack Harmony of 141st, General Butler of VI Corps, and Cliff Snow of 155 FA.

Then in July he plans his last "soiree" east, where he's expected to see Elliott Amick, Herb Eitt, Candy Eitt, Joe Dine, Jim Gentle, Lee O'Brien and Roswell Doughty.










