Here's one for Guinness Book of World Records ... revived now 35 years later. We recall this amazing story printed in 1945 — exact quote:

Jacksonville, Fla., Aug. 16 — An East Texas city claims the G.I. with the "writingest wife" in the nation.


He is Corp. Eddie Bando, a veteran of 36th (Texas) Division, who wears five campaign ribbons, and was one of first men to land on the bloody beaches of Salerno.

As of June 21, in Germany, Bando has received 2,427 from his wife during the 809 days he has been overseas — an average of three a day.

Bando wasn't left in the lurch after the first mail call following the 36th landing in Italy. He got 97 letters in that call, 57 of them from his wife.

Mrs. Bando, who resides in Bayonne, NJ, says there's no special way to be sure all your mail gets to your soldier. She's send 1,618 by first-class 3¢ stamps and the other 809 by air mail. And every one she's written has reached her husband.

36th and 442nd To Meet Jointly In East Tower, Airport Marina Hotel

Most everyone knows that the Dallas/FortWorth Airport (D/FW) is the World's Largest. And for those who are not familiar with it, the giant airport is about 16 miles from downtown Dallas and likewise Fort Worth.

It opened some six years ago and has been growing ever since. The West Tower (shown above) was built at the time the airport was, but its popularty has been so great, a new and bigger one is being built (East Tower), which will have 850 guest rooms—and that is where the 36th and the 442nd will jointly meet for our Annual Labor Day weekend Reunion.

Total for the two Airport Marina Hotels is a whopping 1,450 rooms, the largest in Texas, and the 15th largest nationally. The Grand Ballroom in the East Tower (where we meet) has 10,000 sq. ft. floor space. Shown above is the Airport control tower, so you know you're in the "middle" of this giant facility, which in size of land is as big as the island of Manhattan.

The East Tower was topped out last December, and it will be ready for the invasion of all T-Patchers, Aug. 28th through 31st, 1980...so START PACKIN. (More details in the June 1980 T-Patcher).

GO FOR BROKE . . . 442nd Regmt'l Combat Team To Meet Jointly with 36th in Dallas


The joint reunion of the 36th with 442nd Regmt'l Combat Team has been in process for several years. Now, it shall be a fact . . . Aug. 28-31st, 1980.

These Japanese-Americans gained fame for their rescue efforts with our "Lost Battalion" near Bruyeres, France. It is estimated that their attendance could reach near 500 delegates, hence the D/FW Airport Marina Hotel in which the new East Tower (see page 2) has 850 rooms. This makes housing the two groups much easier than in most other hotels.

President JACK L. SCOTT will fly to Hawaii for a meeting with Robt. M. Sasaki, executive president, and other members of their board to map out all details.

Complete information will be published in the next T-Patcher (June 1980), plus a final report of the 36th Board meeting to be held early May at the D/FW Airport Marina Hotel.

Footnote: Due to the long travel by men of 442nd, their dates start a day earlier (Wed., Aug. 27) and will depart on Mon., Labor Day, Sept. 1st. Special entertainment will be featured during their "first" visit to TEXAS!!!



State Of Texas Offers Free License Plates For All Former P.O.W.'s

The State of Texas has passed legislation to provide residents of the state who are former prisoners of war with free automobile license plates for life. Application for Former Prisoner of War License Plates, Form D12-420, may be obtained from the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, Motor Vehicle Division, 40th and Jackson Avenue, Austin, Texas 78779, or from local chapters of American Ex-Prisoners of War, Inc.

Applications must be accompanied by:
(1) A copy of an official U.S. Government document which identifies the applicant as a former prisoner of war (may be obtained from the Adjutant General, Department of the Army, if service during internment was in the U.S. Army), or certification from the Veteran's Administration that the applicant is a former POW.


(2) If the applicant is a former member of the armed forces, the application must also be supported by a copy of the applicant's discharge papers which must reflect an honorable discharge.



Brig. Gen. Fred W. Sladen Former G-3 of Hqs. 36th Dies Jan. 10 at Tacoma

Brigadier General (Retired) Fred Winchester Sladen, Jr., who as a lieutenant colonel was the G-3 of the 36th Division from 6 Feb. 1944 to 22 Nov. 1944, died in Tacoma, WA, 10 Jan. 1980 after a brief illness.

"Freddie" was one of the best liked, and most effective, staff officers of the 36th Division.

A graduate of the U.S. Military Academy in the class of 1929 (the same class as George Lynch), he first served in combat as commander of the 1st Bn., 30th Infantry, 3rd Division, in the North African landings. He was severely wounded in this action, and was awarded the Silver Star for his gallantry and two Bronze Star Medals by the 3rd Division. He recovered from his wounds and was assigned to the 36th Division by General Mark Clark, in the great shuffle that took place after the Rapido River.

General Dahlquist awarded him the Legion of Merit and another Bronze Star.

He left the Division for assignment with the War Department General Staff, where he was awarded a Commendation Ribbon.

General Sladen is survived by his wife, a daughter, Mrs. J. E. (Patricia) Crow of El Paso, and a son, Fred Sladen III of the Virgin Islands.

Last Of The Great Generals Is Gone - William H. Wilbur, 91

Accolades For Achievement Were Many For Former Assistant Div. Commander

Brigadier General William Hale Wilbur, former Assistant Division Commander of the 36th Infantry Division, died in his wheel chair in his home in Shell Point Village, near Fort Myers, Florida, on 27 December 1979. He was 91 years old.

T-Patchers will remember "Willie Wilbur" as the stern, hard-driving brigadier general who was attached to the Division for the Salerno landing, then replaced Brigadier General Otto H. Lange as the Assistant Division Commander.

Already a hero, with the Medal of Honor for his fabulous exploits in the landing in North Africa, General Wilbur won several medals while serving in the 36th.

General Wilbur was a violent opponent of the Mark Clark-ordered Rapido River crossing, but carried out those unpopular orders, as a good soldier would. He was relieved of command by General Mark Clark, and returned to the States where he served as Chief of Staff of the Western Defense Command.

He counted many of the great among his acquaintances — President Franklin Roosevelt, who draped the CMH ribbon arund his neck; General Patton, with whom he served closely, and often argumentatively; General Eisenhower, who was one of the 27 most illustrious graduates of West Point — a title he shared with General Wilbur, a graduate of the class of 1912. Among his other notable acquaintances were General Douglas MacArthur, President Kennedy, and Prime Minister Winston Churchill. General Wilbur considered Churchill the greatest man of his time.

Military honor guard from Fort Stewart, South Carolina, was provided at the church services in Shell Point Village, and burial was with full military honors at West Point. He was buried beside his son, who died of wounds in the Korean War.

He entrusted his diary to a Florida friend, Bill Hoyerman, who said of him, in his obituary:

"He did what he could, for his country."

The above eulogy was written and sent in by our Division Historian, Vincent M. Lockhart of El Paso. Many others sent in material on the passing of Gen. Wilbur, including Col. Oran Stovall, Bowie, TX, who was a great admirer of the late General. Other data on this great soldier will be published in the new Quarterly (coming soon).






