



36th & 100/442nd Joint Reunion — Greatest Ever!

In fact, this is probably the largeset veteran reunion even in the history of unit gatherings. Who else could draw over a 1000 at such an event. First, your board had prudently chosen a hotel that had facilities to handle a group of this magnitude.

The Amfac with their West and East Tower have the largest ballroom in Texas! And we needed it for the 3 great parties held during the four day bash. Our records show that 1132 dinners were served at the Sat'dy nite dinner dance, and that's a bunch! In fact, it took this reporter 35 minutes to walk from one end of the ballroom to the other, with a few stops on the way.

The men of 442nd arrived in great numbers, also shipped in cases of pineapples, avocatos and exotic fruits of the Islands and California, plus Clams from the group of 442nd in Seattle ... and more. Add to this, a troup of Hawaiian dancers and musicians, who performed on many occasions with Hula etc.

The 1980 Dallas Reunion was the largest assembly of troopers in our 35 years of Post World War II History. Read on.

House Majority Leader Jim Wright IS Son-of-36th






