I -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular Number 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Silver Star is awarded to the following named personnel for gallantry in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

Technical Sergeant Cecil C. Caraker, 36070881, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 19 September 1944 in the vicinity of Zon, Holland, his squad was the point during an advance when they encountered strong enemy infantry forces. Sergeant Caraker immediately attacked the enemy and personally accounted for an enemy machine gun and sniper. While continuing the advance, Sergeant Caraker observed an enemy force approaching from the Northwest and threatening the rear of the battalion. He immediately employed his heavy machine guns and mortars as a base of fire and then led two of his men through rifle and machine pistol fire to a position four hundred yards to the North from which they opened fire on the enemy flank, killing and wounding twenty and capturing twenty-five. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Illinois.

Technical Sergeant Bronislava T. Rusin, 32475481, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 23 December 1944 in the vicinity of Hastogno, Belgium, the enemy succeeded in penetrating friendly lines. Sergeant Rusin, in order to control his own squad and maintain contact with other squads, traveled three hundred yards through enemy infested swamps until he was well behind enemy lines. He then gathered the remainder of his squad at a central point and reconnoitered the area for a reserve position. Armed with an automatic weapon, Sergeant Rusin encountered enemy troops of whom he personally killed three and wounded four, while the remainder of his squad accounted for three dead and four wounded. Exposing himself to heavy small arms fire, Sergeant Rusin then established contact with a friendly unit to his rear, joined the reserve position and repelled further enemy thrusts. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

II -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular Number 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named personnel for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

CAPTAIN SAUL L. LADANSKY, 01301506 (then First Lieutenant), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 10 June 1944 in the vicinity of Carantan, France, during a vigorous engagement with the enemy, his unit faced a critical shortage of ammunition, food and water. Captain Ladansky personally drove a quarter ton truck and trailer through heavy enemy fire to the landing beach in order to secure the sorely needed supplies. Despite the increase in the intensity of the enemy fire, Captain Ladansky made several trips over this hazardous terrain and brought the urgently needed food and ammunition to front line troops. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

FIRST LIEUTENANT WILLIAM H. MALLETT, O1311411, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 13 January 1945 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, he led his platoon of eleven men in an attack against well-fortified enemy positions. Moving through deep snow and under heavy enemy fire, the platoon was finally held up by intense anti-aircraft fire. Observing a camouflaged enemy soldier move fifteen yards away, Lieutenant Mallett shot the soldier with his rifle and then led his men in an assault which destroyed the enemy machine gun and rifle positions. After twenty-nine of the enemy had been captured, twenty-three killed and several forced to withdraw in disorder, Lieutenant Mallett secured and held the area under extremely heavy enemy shell fire. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

FIRST LIEUTENANT CHESTER L. OSBORNE JR., O1285485, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 5 October 1944 in the vicinity of Osnabruck, Holland, Lieutenant Osborne exposed himself to heavy enemy small arms fire in order to control his squads and mortar fire. When attacked by a regiment of strong enemy forces, he fought vigorously and skillfully led his men to more advantageous positions from which he directed accurate and heavy fire on the enemy, inflicting heavy casualties. Although wounded by mortar fire, Lieutenant Osborne reorganized the two remaining platoons in the town and successfully withdrew them from the town. His outstanding leadership and courage exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Minnesota.

SECOND LIEUTENANT DONALD C. SCOTT, O1059054, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 13 January 1945 in the vicinity of Bouray, Belgium, his company and an adjacent company were completely surrounded by the enemy. Lieutenant Scott volunteered to lead a patrol through enemy lines in an effort to establish contact and effect a consolidation between the two companies. While advancing, Lieutenant Scott and his men were captured by the enemy. After being held by the enemy for two hours, Lieutenant Scott, realizing a chance for escape, signaled his patrol and led them through heavy enemy fire to the safety of a wooded area. He then proceeded on his original mission, established contact with the other company and succeeded in repelling the enemy. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

First Sergeant George T. Davis, 3504481, (then Technical Sergeant), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 25 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, the enemy launched a heavy attack upon Sergeant Davis' company front. Enemy tanks and infantry advanced upon their position, and Sergeant Davis courageously allowed the tank to infiltrate his position, where they were then knocked out by tank destroyers. While the tanks were advancing, Sergeant Davis moved about under heavy fire, that he might encourage his men to remain in position and better instruct them in bringing effective fire upon the enemy infantry. Through his cool encouragement, his men were enabled to cause great confusion among the enemy forces and to inflict heavy casualties. The overwhelming enemy attack was completely repelled and Sergeant Davis' company maintained their positions. This action on the part of Sergeant Davis was fully in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Indiana.

Staff Sergeant Otto L. Gumpert, 3504481, (then Sergeant) Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 25 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, while conducting his squad, an intense artillery and mortar concentration followed by an

attacking force of enemy infantry and tanks overrun a portion of his platoon. Sergeant Conwright immediately picked up the automatic rifle of a wounded comrade and assumed a position on the left flank. Although attacked by a strong enemy force, he remained in his hazardous position and succeeded in killing six and wounding five of the enemy. His heroic actions led his platoon to take advantage of the confused state of the enemy and continue toward the objective. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from West Virginia.

Staff Sergeant John P. Nolan, 14141698, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 1 February 1945 in the vicinity of Hebeorg, France, he commanded his platoon in an attack against the enemy across the Moselle River. Sergeant Nolan led his men in a direct assault against enemy positions which were holding up the progress of the attack. When enemy fire had disorganized the platoon line, he exposed himself to enemy fire in order to reorganize his men efficiently. While withdrawing, his group was cut off from the rear of the company by a twelve man enemy patrol. Sergeant Nolan immediately formed his men on a deployed front and attacked through the enemy patrol, leading his men to safety. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Alabama.

Sergeant Clayton R. Bodell, 36168838, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 5 January 1945 in the vicinity of Reville, Belgium, he was ordered to take an outpost to the front of the company defense line. A strong force of enemy infantry supported by tanks attacked the position. Sergeant Bodell and his seven man outpost courageously withstood the numerically superior enemy force and, under direct fire from the tanks and infantry, forced the enemy to withdraw, leaving several of their number dead directly in front of the position. The courage and aggressive leadership of Sergeant Bodell exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Michigan.

Sergeant Theodore E. Dzlopak, 19151976, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 18 September 1944 during an attack on Eindhoven, Holland, Sergeant Dzlopak saved the life of his platoon commander by carrying him two hundred fifty yards across an open field in the face of machine gun and rifle fire to the cover of a building where he provided first aid. Sergeant Dzlopak reorganized the platoon field to join his squad, lead them to a location where they could reorganize and continue the attack. Sergeant Dzlopak's actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New Jersey.

Sergeant Thomas E. Martin, 32007311, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 8 January 1945 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, he was in an entrenched position with his squad eight hundred yards in front of friendly lines. The enemy attacked this position with strong forces, seriously threatening the defense of the position. Sergeant Martin, demonstrating his ability to think quickly, remained in position and allowed the enemy to reach within fifty yards of the position before giving the order to open fire. As a result of the courage and ability of Sergeant Martin, nine enemy were killed, one wounded and one captured. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

Sergeant Samuel E. Stevens, 30913609, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 6 January 1945 in the vicinity of Reville, Belgium, when his squad leader and assistant squad leader were wounded and evacuated due to a heavy artillery concentra-

attacking force of enemy infantry and tanks overran a portion of his platoon. Sergeant Cartwright immediately picked up the automatic rifle of a wounded comrade and assumed a position on the left flank. Although attacked by a strong enemy force, he remained in his hazardous position and succeeded in killing six and wounding five of the enemy. His heroic actions enabled his platoon to take advantage of the confused state of the enemy and continue toward the objective. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from West Virginia.

Staff Sergeant John P. Nolan, 14181682, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 2 February 1945 in the vicinity of Neubeurg, France, he commanded his platoon in an attack against the enemy across the Leder River. Sergeant Nolan led his men in a direct assault against enemy gun positions which were holding up the progress of the attack. When enemy fire had disorganized the platoon line, he exposed himself to enemy fire in order to reorganize his men efficiently. While withdrawing, his group was cut off from the rear of the company by a twelve man enemy patrol. Sergeant Nolan immediately formed his men on a deployed front and attacked through the enemy patrol, leading his men to safety. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Alabama.

Sergeant Clayton R. Bodell, 36161009, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 6 January 1945 in the vicinity of Novillo, Belgium, he was ordered to take an outpost to the front of the company defense line. A strong force of enemy infantry supported by tanks attacked the position. Sergeant Bodell and his seven man outpost courageously withstood the numerically superior enemy force and, under direct fire from the tanks and infantry, forced the enemy to withdraw, leaving several of their number dead directly in front of the position. The courage and aggressive leadership of Sergeant Bodell exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Michigan.

Sergeant Theodore E. Dalopak, 14131975, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 18 September 1944 during an attack on Eindhoven, Holland, Sergeant Dalopak saved the life of his platoon commander by carrying him two hundred fifty yards across an open field in the face of machine gun and rifle fire to the cover of a building where he provided first aid. Sergeant Dalopak recrossed the open field to join his squad, lead them to a location where they could reorganize and continue the attack. Sergeant Dalopak's actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New Jersey.

Sergeant Thomas E. Martin, 39007321, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 8 January 1945 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, he was in an entrenched position with his squad eight hundred yards in front of friendly lines. The enemy attacked this position with strong force, seriously threatening the defense of the position. Sergeant Martin, demonstrating his ability to think quickly, remained in position and allowed the enemy to reach within fifty yards of the position before giving the order to open fire. As a result of the courage and ability of Sergeant Martin, nine enemy were killed, one wounded and one captured. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

Sergeant Samuel E. Herrero, 37113009, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 6 January 1945 in the vicinity of Novillo, Belgium, when his squad leader and assistant squad leader were wounded and evacuated due to a heavy artillery concentra-

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tion, Sergeant Serrano assumed command of the squad and led his men to a covered position. Having established his squad in a defensive position, he constantly exposed himself to enemy fire in order to move from position to position to insure the safety of his men and the defense of the position. When ordered to withdraw, Sergeant Serrano was wounded. He continued to carry out his orders and remained with his squad until the enemy forced a retreat. While in a defensive position with his squad, he was again wounded but refused to be evacuated and remained with his unit for a week until it was withdrawn from the line. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Texas.

Sergeant James O. Watkins, 14007830 (then Private First Class), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 7 October 1944 in the vicinity of Zetten, Holland, during a very heavy enemy attack, Sergeant Watkins, from his post at a machine gun, delivered such effective fire on the enemy forces that they suffered heavy casualties and were forced to withdraw. During this action, Sergeant Watkins was wounded, but refused to leave his gun and continued to expose himself in order that he might continue to deliver effective fire. Wounded a second time, he still refused to be relieved and evacuated. Sergeant Watkins' persistence and courage resulted in his position being held against a numerically superior enemy force and his unit was saved many casualties and loss of territory. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Louisiana.

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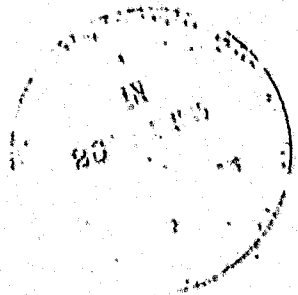

I -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular Number 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named enlisted men for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

Corporal Orlan D. Craft, 14010939, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 24 September 1944 in the vicinity of Eerde, Holland, his company was counterattacked. Although a rifleman, Corporal Craft picked up an abandoned machine gun, carried it one hundred fifty yards through intense enemy fire to an advantageous position, and delivered voluminous fire on the enemy. When enemy mortar fire began to harass his position, he moved to a safer position, but, finding this new location unsuitable, returned to his original position and continued to fire on the enemy. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Louisiana.

Corporal Thomas J. O'Donnell, 33579706 (then Private), Airborne Engineers, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 18 February 1945 in the vicinity of Neubourg, France, his platoon was given the mission of placing a foot bridge across the Moder River so that an infantry patrol could make the crossing. Corporal O'Donnell volunteered to swim the river in the face of enemy small arms fire and against an extremely strong current, burdened with all his personal equipment. He had the mission of setting up a machine gun on the opposite bank to cover the river crossing. Although numerous flares in the area displayed his position while swimming to the opposite bank of the river, which was then in enemy territory, Corporal O'Donnell again exposed himself to the enemy to assist a comrade who was drifting down stream. Corporal O'Donnell pulled the soldier to safety and then proceeded to place the machine gun in position to cover the infantry river crossing. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Corporal William Yorston, 12042913 (then Private), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 13 January 1945 in the vicinity of Foy, Belgium, his 81mm mortar platoon was engaged in supporting the attack through the woods east of Foy. During the time that his platoon was engaged in firing on the enemy a barrage of counter battery fire fell in the vicinity of his gun position. One round hit the ammunition that was stored at the gun position, setting it on fire. Corporal Yorston immediately left his foxhole and put out the fire with his hands and some snow, saving most of the ammunition. Although enemy fire was still falling in the area, Corporal Yorston persisted in his efforts until the fire was completely out and the ammunition moved to a safer place. At this time the ammunition resupply was practically non-existent and the loss of the ammunition would have jeopardized the attack of the Battalion. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

Technician Fifth Grade Winton K. Fink, 35031397, Medical Detachment, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 5 October 1944 in the vicinity of Driel, Holland, during an attack by enemy Infantry supported by artillery, Technician Fifth Grade Fink, the sole remaining member of his aid group who was not wounded, crawled forward several yards under intense enemy machine gun, rifle, mortar and artillery fire in order to administer first aid to several of his comrades who had been wounded beyond the main line of resistance. His courageous action saved the lives of his comrades. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Alabama.

Private First Class Roderick J. McNeil, 36582186, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 10 January 1945 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, he led a three man patrol deep into enemy territory and, although fired upon unexpectedly at close range, deployed his men so rapidly and efficiently that he was able to capture four prisoners who later revealed information which proved of great assistance to Regimental Intelligence. On 1 February 1945 in the vicinity of Neubourg, France; he was trapped with a small group of men by a strong enemy force who had cut them off from their company. Private First Class McNeil opened fire on the enemy, killing some and scattering the remainder, thereby enabling the rest of his platoon to join the company. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Michigan.

Private First Class Felix Osalkowski, 32478422, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 22 December 1944 in the vicinity of Marvie, Belgium, while manning an outpost, Private First Class Osalkowski observed an enemy combat patrol approximately eight hundred yards distant. While his outpost leader was reporting the situation, he went forward and intercepted the patrol which was armed with two machine guns. Private First Class Osalkowski killed five of the enemy, wounded three and forced the remainder to withdraw. His courage and aggressiveness exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

Private First Class Leo A. White, 37541880, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 8 January 1945 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, Private First Class White observed an enemy tank and half-track in a concealed position. He gave the alarm and most of his comrades were enabled to take cover and avoid injury. In attempting to reach the position of the radio operator that he might warn nearby units, Private First Class White was seriously wounded. He continued on his mission, however, and reached the radio operator; He then gave sufficient details so that artillery fire was directed on the enemy, and the tank and half-track were completely disabled. His unit was then able to continue the attack. Private First Class White's actions were fully in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Minnesota.

Private William L. Hurley, 18027936, Parachute Field Artillery, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 20 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, the enemy launched a determined attack on the positions of his unit with infantry and tanks. When enemy troops approached to within three hundred yards of his position, Private Hurley, under intense mortar, tank and small arms fire, established himself in a forward and exposed position from which he delivered heavy small arms fire against the enemy. His fire was so effective that the enemy were slowed down sufficiently to allow the successful redeployment of the observation post. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Texas.

As a result of the courageous actions of Sergeant Hilderbrant, the attack was repelled, leaving twenty enemy dead and wounded. Sergeant Joseph H. Baker, 17175846, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. When the patrol was forced to withdraw after the enemy began an enveloping movement, he brought the prisoner and his own group safely back to his own lines. By the information gained the whereabouts of the missing officer was learned and he was released. Sergeant Baker's actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. 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✓ SECOND LIEUTENANT CREIL G. FISHER, 0861120, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 23 February 1945 in the vicinity of Hagnau, France, while acting as liaison officer, the enemy attacked his unit and covered the area with mortar and small arms fire. Lieutenant Fisher left the platoon command post and started out for the company command post so that he could be more centrally located and perform his duties more effectively. Since the company communication wires were severed, Lieutenant Fisher volunteered to contact all platoon command posts. Although the route over which he was forced to travel was under heavy enemy fire, and near bursts threw him to the ground on two occasions, Lieutenant Fisher contacted the platoons and visited several outposts. He then led a patrol to contact another platoon. While on patrol, he was injured but continued to the company command post and called for artillery to raise their fire which was falling short of its target. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Nebraska.

✓ SECOND LIEUTENANT CLARENCE H. TAYLOR, 01324374, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 15 October 1944 in the vicinity of Arnhem, Holland, he led a four man patrol across the Neder Rijn River with the mission of reconnoitering enemy position and observing in posts. After returning with this patrol, aware of the danger involved, Sergeant Thompson led another patrol through artillery and machine gun fire to the flanking companies. Through his heroic effort and courage, contact was maintained with the companies which were cut off from the remainder of the regiment. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Massachusetts.

✓ Staff Sergeant Leonard A. Jannotta, 3478291, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 14 January 1945, he led his platoon in a search on the town of Rey, Belgium. The enemy who were strongly entrenched, allowed the forward elements of his company to pass and then opened fire on the rear elements, placing those elements in a cross fire. Sergeant Jannotta and four grenades were wounded in this initial assault and fell in a location from which their call for aid could not be heard. Realizing the danger of bleeding to death, Sergeant Jannotta, despite his serious wounds, crept two hundred yards under fire to contact a company to take aid and bring back to his wounded comrades. He also informed his company commander of the location of the enemy tanks, thereby enabling friendly artillery fire to be delivered on the tanks and destroying them. The courage and coolness of Sergeant Jannotta under fire exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

Staff Sergeant John A. Westerman, 1-141135, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 6 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ophemmeden, Holland, he was observing for his mortar in defense of the beach against the enemy forces. When an outflanked regiment of the enemy surprised and began to attack his left flank, Sergeant Westerman rushed to the artillery observation post and coordinated the fire of one mortar with the friendly artillery, directing this fire on to the enemy. He continually exposed himself to heavy artillery, mortar and other fire while pending between the two observation posts and succeeded in bringing to bear heavy and accurate fire on the enemy forces. The enemy was forced to withdraw, leaving fifty percent of its force dead and mangled. The courage and aggressiveness of Sergeant Westerman exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

Staff Sergeant Ferdinand F. Wallack, 1106931, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 20 December 1944 in the vicinity of Wey, Belgium, his battalion was subjected to intense enemy artillery and mortar fire from a battalion of infantry and eight tanks. One platoon became short of ammunition and withdrawal was imminent unless ammunition could be secured. Sergeant Wallack loaded two boxes of machine gun ammunition in his pack and carried these ammunition under his arm and in his pockets. He then made his way to the platoon position through direct tank fire and grazing machine gun fire. Through his heroic act, the platoon was able to repel the enemy attack and destroy one tank. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Idaho Island.

Sergeant James A. Gramacho, 3840379 (then Private First Class), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 22 December 1944 near Beaufort, Belgium, Sergeant Gramacho found himself in the middle of an area swept by heavy enemy machine gun and artillery fire. He remained in his exposed position and continued to fire his machine gun, forcing an enemy to withdraw, in the course of which not a few of the enemy were killed and three others wounded. Sergeant Gramacho continued to fire until the enemy was completely disorganized, one six were of the enemy were captured. Later that evening, when his position was attacked by an armored enemy vehicle, Sergeant Gramacho disabled the vehicle and wounded its two occupants. His initiative and aggressive action were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

Sergeant Richard G. Hook, 35289798 (then Technician Fifth Grade), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 9 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ophemmeden, Holland, the enemy launched a heavy attack during which three men were wounded and one killed. Although a mail clerk, retaining the on stage of medical personnel, Sergeant Hook led aid men one hundred fifty yards under enemy fire and succeeded in evacuating the wounded. Although, during the return trip, his helmet was struck by a bullet, he continued on his mission. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Ohio.

Cornel Charles E. Hunter, 15031653, Glider Field Artillery, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 16 January 1945 in the vicinity of Vaux, Belgium, every member of his forward observer party was wounded. When the infantry moved up in an attack against the enemy, Cornel Hunter, despite his wounds, accompanied the infantry in order to direct fire on a strong enemy concentration which was disrupting the attack by intense small arms fire. Cornel Hunter remained in the aid until the enemy withdrawal was repelled. The accurate artillery observation of Cornel Hunter was instrumental to the success of the attack. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Illinois.

Technician Fifth Grade Robert A. Knapp, 35791038, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by herio achievement in action. On 9 October 1944 in the vicinity of Nijmegen, Holland, two men were wounded by exploding mines and lay in an area infested with enemy mines and booby traps. Although the area was under direct enemy observation and a full scale fire, Technician Fifth Grade Knapp went into the hazardous minefield, treated the casualties and carried them to the safety of a nearby house. On his second trip to the mined area, a mine exploded ten yards from him, however, he continued on his mission. After treating the casualties, he secured the litter team and led them far up a hill of territory patrolled by the enemy. His courage and initiative exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from West Virginia.

Private First Class William E. Brackott, 34778489, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by herio achievement in action. On 26 December 1944 in the vicinity of Fy, Belgium, during an attack of enemy infantry and armor, Private First Class Brackott and four of his comrades were isolated in a house surrounded by the enemy and subjected to heavy tank fire. Armed only with an M-1 rifle, Private First Class Brackott, although wounded by enemy fire, broke through the enemy ring, reached friendly forces and returned with reinforcements. Through his aggressiveness, he succeeded in driving off the enemy tank and repelling the enemy who were surrounding the house, thereby saving his comrades from disaster. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from North Carolina.

Private First Class Murvin J. Kraus, 3070632, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by herio achievement in action. On 30 October 1944 in the vicinity of Opheusden, Holland, four men were seriously wounded and were isolated from their unit. Private First Class Kraus, realizing the importance of evacuating the men to a medical aid station, moved forward to aid in the evacuation. His route took him through a heavily mined area, subject to enemy observation, but he continued and reached the wounded men. Private First Class Kraus's heroic actions, guidance of the route forward and his cool action in the evacuation of the wounded men back to the safety of friendly lines was largely responsible for saving their lives, and were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Illinois.

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Private First Class Gerald J. Wines, 39462253, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by herio achievement in action. On 16 September 1944 in the vicinity of Bindhoven, Holland, Private First Class Wines crawled forward from his covered position and made his way under heavy machine gun, rifle and 88mm gun fire to aid and rescue a wounded comrade lying in an open field. After crawling one hundred yards to the wounded man, Private First Class Wines dragged the casualty in a prone position back to the safety of a slit trench. After administering first aid to the wounded man, he continued to perform outstanding service in maintaining contact with elements of his unit, constantly exposing himself to enemy fire in order to perform his duties more efficiently. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Idaho.

Private First Class J. E. Watrask, 16070631, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by herio achievement in action. On 9 January 1945 in the vicinity of Fy, Belgium, Private First Class Watrask was a battalion medical aid man. The battalion had attacked through heavy woods under heavy shell fire. Later during the course of the attack, Private Watrask moved forward under fire to give assistance and first aid to the wounded. At one point, on a narrow path, he was pinned in a clearing under heavy fire, he crawled forward and administered first aid. Later in the attack, when a supply truck was disabled, he

crawled forward and removed all wounded men from the interior, treating them under heavy shell fire. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Illinois.

II -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR AND OAK LEAF CLUSTER -- Under the provisions of AR 600-5, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular Number 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Bronze Star Medal having been awarded by former order, the Oak Leaf Cluster is awarded to the following named personnel for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

✓ CAPTAIN JOSEPH B. DOUGHTY JR., O1203737, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 19 December 1944 in the vicinity of Reogne, Belgium, he was assigned the mission of capturing the town and setting up a defensive position in darkness. He personally led his small and poorly equipped force in an attack against a strong enemy force and succeeded in driving the enemy beyond the defense line. He led his men into enemy-held houses, inflicting many casualties. When the enemy counterattacked with four tanks, Captain Doughty held his position without the aid of antitank weapons. When the overwhelmingly superior enemy began to inflict heavy casualties on friendly forces, Captain Doughty was ordered to withdraw. He personally led a rocket launcher team in the face of direct fire in order to drive back two tanks which had pinned down the right flank platoon. His heroic actions enabled his men to withdraw to higher ground and reorganize with a minimal loss of personnel. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Missouri.

✓ Technical Sergeant Roscoe K. Minor, 19687662, (then Staff Sergeant), Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 6 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ophousden, Holland, he participated with his platoon in an attack against the enemy. While approaching an enemy held house, his platoon leader was killed. Exposing himself to enemy fire, Sergeant Minor brought back the body of the casualty and then led the platoon passed the building, captured two prisoners and continued the attack against the town. Through the courage and aggressive leadership of Sergeant Minor, his platoon was instrumental in seizing the objective. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

✓ Staff Sergeant Merville L. Grimes, 16124845 (then Sergeant) Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 20 December 1944 in the vicinity of Reogne, Belgium, while he was in an exposed position with no entrenching tool with which to dig a foxhole, a large force of enemy infantry and five tanks attacked the platoon position. Sergeant Grimes voluntarily remained behind and covered the withdrawal of the platoon across five hundred yards of open terrain. He was the last man to leave the untenable position and withdrew under direct 88mm and small arms fire. He was then able to withstand the attacking enemy force until his platoon had withdrawn to the town. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Illinois.

✓ Staff Sergeant Frank G. Klockner, 13078491, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 25 September 1944 in the vicinity of Vochel, Holland, while leading his squad to cover the exposed flank of his company which was under fire, he lost his machine gun crew. With the use of hand grenades, Sergeant Klockner destroyed a machine gun emplacement. After expending all his grenades, he made his way to his silent machine gun and from an exposed position, fired the weapon, enabling his squad to take up advantageous positions.

From these new positions, his squad furnished him with hand grenades which he in turn throw at the enemy, killing and wounding five. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

✓ Sergeant Nicholas Denovchik, 32061630, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 20 September 1944 in the vicinity of Eerde, Holland, he was assigned the mission of destroying an enemy mortar which had been harassing friendly troops for several days. Sergeant Denovchik penetrated enemy lines and reached within twenty-five yards of the mortar. After making certain that the enemy had no alternate position, Sergeant Denovchik returned. Challenged by an enemy outpost, he ran forward through small arms fire and reached the safety of his own lines. The information which he conveyed to British Artillery was responsible for the destruction of the enemy mortar. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New Jersey.

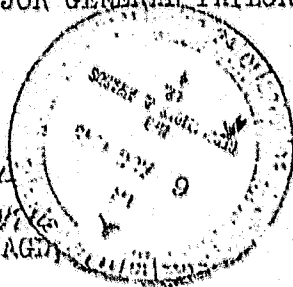
✓ Sergeant Pat J. Lindsay, 19176812, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 1 February 1945 in the vicinity of Neubeurg, France, during an attack across the Moder River, ammunition for his mortars became critically short. Having ordered his squad to join in the fight, Sergeant Lindsay accompanied them as a rifleman. Although wounded, he refused evacuation and remained at his post. When his company was threatened by an antitank gun, Sergeant Lindsay fired three rounds from a rocket launcher, successfully neutralizing the position and killing or scattering the crew. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

✓ Private First Class Harvey H. Jewett, 19127223, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 7 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ophousden, Holland, he led his mortar squad in an attack with his battalion. After reaching the objective, the position was subjected to a strong enemy attack. Private First Class Jewett set his mortar in a concealed position and by running to the top of the embankment, placed heavy fire on the enemy, killing several of the enemy and repelling the attack. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Wisconsin.

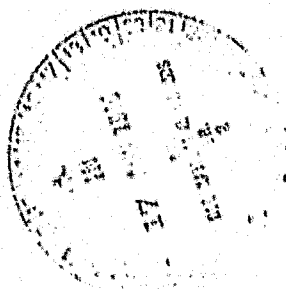

I -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named personnel for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy in countries indicated:

FIRST LIEUTENANT WYLAND D. POB, O1O48144, Airborne Antiaircraft Artillery, Army of the United States, from 6 June 1944 to 15 January 1945, in the United Kingdom, France and Belgium. Entered military service from Oklahoma.

WARRANT OFFICER JUNIOR GRADE CLAUDE O. BELL, W2106043, Army of the United States, from 6 June 1944 to 8 May 1945, in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from Georgia.

Master Sergeant Max Fisher, 35110774, Airborne Antiaircraft Artillery, Army of the United States, from 6 June 1944 to 1 April 1945, in the United Kingdom France and Germany. Entered military service from Indiana.

Sergeant Arthur B. Evans, 36800346, Parachute Infantry, Army of the United States, from 17 September 1944 to 8 May 1945, in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from Wisconsin.

Sergeant John P. Stanglewicz, 16099153, Parachute Infantry, Army of the United States, from 6 June 1944 to 8 May 1945, in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from Illinois.

CAPTAIN JOSEPH R. DOBSON, O806915, Air Corps, Army of the United States, from 1 October 1944 to 8 May 1945, in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from Minnesota.

FIRST LIEUTENANT THOMAS A. WALDMAN, O698494, Air Corps, Army of the United States, from 1 October 1944 to 8 May 1945, in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from California.

FIRST LIEUTENANT GLENN H. ELLERMAN, O764264, Air Corps, Army of the United States, from 1 October 1944 to 8 May 1945, in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from Wisconsin.

I -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Silver Star is awarded to the following named personnel for gallantry in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

CAPTAIN ROBERT H. PHILLIPS, 0454084, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 5 October 1944 in the vicinity of Orisel, Holland, while commanding his company which was moving to front line positions, he learned that strong enemy forces occupied positions between him and the line. Captain Phillips courageously and skillfully led the assault elements around the enemy and relieved the British unit on the line. During the night the enemy, delivering heavy small arms and mortar fire, surrounded his troops and employed tanks against the company. Captain Phillips directed the defense of his position so skillfully that before his company was relieved, one hundred fifty of the enemy had been captured and the position had been successfully defended. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

FIRST LIEUTENANT GEORGE G. BURN, 0130234, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 24 September 1944 in the vicinity of Eerde, Holland, Lieutenant Burn was in charge of a section of machine guns. During one of the most intense attacks in the history of the regiment, against two hundred well-emplaced enemy occupying high ground on sand dunes, Lieutenant Burn was struck through the helmet by a bullet that wounded him and caused him to bleed profusely. Though urged to remain in the rear, he rejoined his forces, engaged so heavily at the time that it was difficult to tell who was on the offensive. He remained with his guns continually during the advance, moving from one weapon to another, exposing himself continually and urging his men on by his own example, until the high ground had been gained and the enemy driven out. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New Jersey.

FIRST LIEUTENANT EDWARD G. THOMAS, 01300731, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 1 November 1944 in the vicinity of Arnhem, Holland, he was in command of a combat patrol of twenty-two men. The patrol became pinned down by hand grenades and machine gun fire from eight enemy soldiers located on top of a railroad trestle. Lieutenant Thomas surged forward through the intense enemy fire to a position within ten yards of the enemy, killing three and wounding two. In the ensuing hand-to-hand fighting against overwhelmingly superior enemy forces in well-entrenched positions, Lieutenant Thomas led an attack so aggressive and determined that his men were inspired and followed his courageous example. In order to capture several prisoners, Lieutenant Thomas jumped into an entrenchment, killed one of the enemy and disarmed another. After accomplishing their mission, Lieutenant Thomas and his men made their way back through heavy mortar and machine gun fire. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Connecticut.

Technical Sergeant John H. Taylor, 18116587, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 1 November 1944 in the vicinity of Arnhem, Holland, he was assistant

patrol leader of a twenty-two man combat patrol. During the advance of the patrol to its objective, Sergeant Taylor made three trips back through nine ice-cold streams in order to help his exhausted comrades through these streams. When the patrol became pinned down by enemy hand grenades and machine gun fire, Sergeant Taylor quickly reformed the patrol and assaulted well-entrenched enemy forces on the other side of the embankment. His assault was so aggressive and determined that his men became inspired and followed his courageous example. Observing four enemy soldiers in an entrenched position sending up Very flares, Sergeant Taylor threw two hand grenades which killed three of the soldiers. He then jumped into the entrenchment and disarmed the other. After the mission had been completed, Sergeant Taylor and the patrol made their way back through heavy mortar and machine gun fire. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Texas.

Private Schuyler L. Savage Jr., 15331715, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 17 September 1944 in the vicinity of Zen, Holland, Private Savage was participating in a flanking attack with the mission of destroying an enemy 88mm gun which was harassing friendly forces. In the face of heavy small arms fire, he charged across a field and wooded area to reach a position ten yards from the objective. Seeing his advance, the enemy directed their fire on his position. Private Savage coolly aimed and fired his rocket launcher, rendering the enemy gun ineffective and driving the seven man crew into the open. He immediately fired upon the crew, killing three and forcing the remainder to surrender. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Indiana.

II -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR (Posthumous) -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Silver Star is awarded posthumously to the following named enlisted men for gallantry in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

Private First Class Edward T. Gulick, 12309665, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 24 September 1944 in the vicinity of Eerde, Holland, his company participated in an intense action against an enemy line situated in commanding ground of sand dunes beyond the edge of town. Private First Class Gulick, carrying an automatic rifle, became separated from his company. Observing rifle fire brought to bear on their flank from a patch of woods on the left, he crawled along a ditch until he was twenty-five yards from the position. Jumping to his feet he rushed the enemy from that point, taking them so much by surprise that he was able to kill five of the thirteen enemy before the others surrendered. This single action contributed materially to the success of the entire assault on the sand dunes. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New Jersey.

Private First Class Donald F. Minikus, 37447600, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 5 October 1944 in the vicinity of Orind, Holland, he was forward on the front lines when a returning patrol brought word that three members had failed to return after a burst of enemy shell fire. Voluntarily, Private First Class Minikus started back along the route of the patrol to find the wounded men. He reached them a third of a mile within enemy territory. Two of the men were dead. The third he carried back alone to his own lines, several times disregarding enemy fire that fired at him along the way. His action saved the wounded man's life. Approximately an hour later, when the company was attacking, he again set out through intense fire to rescue a wounded man forty yards in advance of friendly lines. On his return trip, he was shot through the leg but continued with his burden, crawling until a machine gun burst killed both he and the other wounded man. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Iowa.

III -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR ORNAMENT -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Silver Star having been awarded by former orders, an Oak Leaf Cluster is awarded to the following named officer for gallantry in action against the enemy in Holland:

FIRST LIEUTENANT JOHN L. ADAMS, 0527766, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 16 September 1944 in the vicinity of Vechel, Holland, although under attack by strong enemy forces, his platoon received an order to attack. Lieutenant Adams led his twenty-five man platoon in an assault against the enemy with the mission of driving approximately seventy-five enemy soldiers from a vital bridge. Although the platoon suffered heavy casualties in the initial phase of the attack, and he himself received serious wounds, Lieutenant Adams advanced one hundred yards in front of his platoon, inspiring his men to continue in the attack. Encouraged by the superior leadership and courage of Lieutenant Adams, his men seized their objective, capturing fifteen of the enemy and inflicting forty-two casualties. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Oklahoma.

IV -- AWARD OF MERIT STAR -- Under the provisions of AM 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 15 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named personnel for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

CAPTAIN JAMES B. FONDER, 0359256, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 6 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ophusdon, Holland, his position became subjected to strong and repeated attacks by enemy infantry, tanks and artillery. After the unit had suffered heavy casualties including a platoon leader and a section leader, Captain Fonder went forward and assumed command of the section which was composed mainly of inexperienced personnel. He exposed himself continually to heavy enemy artillery, mortar and small arms fire in order to move about and direct his men in defense of the vital position. Through the courage and aggressive leadership of Captain Fonder, the enemy attacks were repulsed and the position successfully defended. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from South Carolina.

SECOND LIEUTENANT (Command) Y. BUTLER, 02014982 (then Technical Sergeant), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 23 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, his platoon was attacked by superior forces of enemy infantry and tanks. Lieutenant Butler left the cover of his foxhole to direct his men in repelling the attack. He frequently exposed himself to direct enemy fire in order to direct the defense of the platoon position. Throughout the eleven hours during which the attack lasted, Lieutenant Butler, through his expert leadership and courageous determination, held his ground and repelled the attacking enemy force. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Kentucky.

First Sergeant Everett Oliver, 1505020, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 13 June 1944 in the vicinity of Carenton, France, after his company commander had been killed during an attack on the town and the remainder of the company was pinned down by enemy machine gun fire, Sergeant Oliver assumed command of the company and directed the outflanking and destruction of the enemy machine gun. He commanded the remainder of the attack until nightfall when he organized a defensive position and maintained leadership of the men until relieved by an officer. His actions prevented the collapse of the battalion flank and were instrumental in the success of the entire attack. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Kentucky.

Technical Sergeant Arnold J. McGlone, 015712, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 23 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, he was commanding a 60mm mortar section and occupied a forward observation post. Realizing the importance of mortar fire when the enemy launched an attack, Sergeant McGlone remained at his headquarters post and continued to direct mortar fire until the enemy overran his position. He then returned through heavy small arms fire on to where his men were located and instructed his crew to continue to fire on the enemy until their ammunition was expended. After the enemy had surrounded the post and captured his men, he skillfully led them through the enemy lines and rejoined the remainder of the company. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from West Virginia.

Staff Sergeant S. L. Graham, 3423004 (then Sergeant), Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 16 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ophemusden, Holland, his squad was attacked by enemy infantry forces supported by artillery, mortar and tank fire. Observing one heavy caliber 50 machine gun set up in a poor position, Sergeant Graham immediately moved forward under heavy machine gun and small arms fire to move the gun to a more effective position. While setting up the gun in the new position, he was knocked over his machine gun by the concussion of a grenade which exploded nearby. Although wounded, Sergeant Graham went back to the machine gun, loaded and fired with such accuracy that he forced the enemy to withdraw. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Louisiana.

Staff Sergeant Clyde R. Holdren, 15112704, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 23 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, he was in command of a light machine gun section which was defending a vital road block. Although the position was subjected to heavy artillery and mortar fire, Sergeant Holdren continually moved about exposed to the enemy fire in order to encourage his men and improve their fighting efficiency. During the night he personally destroyed an enemy half-track, killing three of its occupants and an enemy quarter ton truck, killing two of the enemy. Through his courage and aggressive leadership, Sergeant Holdren was instrumental in repelling six major attacks. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from West Virginia.

V -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (Posthumous) -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded posthumously to the following named personnel for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

FIRST LIEUTENANT JOHN M. MASON, 0112842, Airborne Engineers, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 6 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ophemusden, Holland, he led his platoon in an attack on well-prepared enemy positions. Although seriously injured during the assault, Lieutenant Mason remained with his men and provided an inspiration to the members of his command. During an enemy counterattack, he continually exposed himself to mortar and small arms fire in order to place his men in a position to hold the recently secured ground. As a result of his heroism and aggressive leadership, the enemy were repulsed and heavy casualties were inflicted on enemy forces. In a later action, during a heavy artillery concentration, Lieutenant Mason was mortally wounded. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from District of Columbia.

Sergeant James F. O'Laughlin, 7026043, Airborne Engineers, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 20 September 1944 in the vicinity of Son, Holland, his platoon was assigned the mission of defending a vital bridge. When an enemy force succeeded in moving close to the only open lane of traffic for the approaching British armor, Sergeant O'Laughlin led his squad across the bridge under enemy fire and established a defensive position in a reasonably concealed location. Later, when his squad was acting on the left flank of a skirmish line, Sergeant O'Laughlin continually exposed himself to enemy fire in order to ascertain the positions of vulnerability of his men in a position situation. He skillfully directed fire against four enemy tanks, thereby forcing the enemy to withdraw into the woods, enabling friendly troops to consolidate their positions. Sergeant O'Laughlin led his squad in an assault and succeeded in routing or destroying the tanks. During this action, he was mortally wounded by enemy fire. His courage and aggressive leadership were an inspiration to all who worked with him. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

VI -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (Posthumous) -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded posthumously to the following named personnel for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

FIRST LIEUTENANT WILLIAM J. HARRIS, 1824, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 23 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, strong forces of enemy infantry and tanks, supported by heavy artillery, attacked the left flank of his company and penetrated through to the center. Lieutenant Harris went forward under heavy artillery fire and alerted all personnel of the situation. He skillfully planned the withdrawal so as to provide a small but effective covering force. He directed the fire of this covering force so skillfully that the entire group was able to withdraw safely. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

Staff Sergeant Clyde D. Carter, 30117 (then Sergeant), Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 21 February 1945 in the vicinity of Haguenau, France, his squad was deployed along four outposts with exposed terrain between each. When the enemy delivered heavy fire on the area and severed all communication between the outposts, Sergeant Carter exposed himself continually to heavy enemy fire in order to personally check each position. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Oregon.

Technician Fifth Grade Carl F. Kelley, 35643086, Medical Detachment, Airborne Engineers, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 20 December 1944 in the vicinity of Marvie, Belgium, he responded to the call for medical aid and ran to the assistance of a wounded comrade. After treating the wounds of the casualty, Technician Fifth Grade Kelley called for aid in evacuating the man, but because of the heavy fire which covered the area, he received no response. Technician Fifth Grade Kelley courageously carried his wounded comrade on his shoulders one hundred twenty-five yards across an open field to a covered position, completely disregarding heavy artillery and small arms fire. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Ohio.

VII — AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL SECOND OAK LEAF CLUSTER — Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 2 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal and Oak Leaf Cluster to the Bronze Star Medal having been awarded by former order, the Second Oak Leaf Cluster is awarded to the following named personnel for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

CAPTAIN FELIX W. STANLEY, 01289335, (then First Lieutenant), Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 23 September 1944 in the vicinity of Schijndel, Holland, Captain Stanley voluntarily took a four man patrol deep into enemy territory in an attempt to save an officer believed to have become lost while wounded during an attack. Engaging superior enemy forces, he forced them back and returned to his own lines with one prisoner. From intelligence later gained from the enemy prisoner, a later attack by the company brought the wounded officer back to his own group. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Texas.

Sergeant James E. McNicoe, 18131236, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 7 June 1944 in the vicinity of Carantan, France, Sergeant McNicoe and two of his comrades made their way through heavy enemy fire to a vital bridge with the hazardous mission of wiring the bridge for demolition. In the face of heavy mortar and machine gun fire, Sergeant McNicoe accomplished this mission, thereby enabling infantry troops to move up and reinforce the elements already there. The bridge was blown according to plan and friendly units were enabled to continue in the attack against Carantan. Sergeant McNicoe further distinguished himself by again exposing himself to heavy fire in order to blow a trench in a road so that supplies, ammunition and communication could be maintained with other units without exposing friendly troops to enemy fire. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Oklahoma.

Since the only route to the rear was covered by heavy 20mm, 88mm, rifle machine pistol and machine gun fire, two attempts to secure the urgently needed ammunition failed. Realizing the seriousness of the situation, Private First Class Butler volunteered to drive a quarter ton truck in an effort to secure ammunition. Together with an officer and one enlisted man, Private First Class Butler set out on this hazardous mission but enemy fire set fire to the vehicle. Undaunted, the small group, by crawling and running, reached the battalion. They set out in another vehicle and again the truck was destroyed by enemy fire. By taking a circuitous route, they reached the rear area, loaded a vehicle with ammunition and, travelling over the same fire-swept road, reached the battalion successfully with the sorely needed ammunition. His courage and tenacity exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Indiana.

Private First Class Francis Ford, 3944216, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 18 September 1944 in the vicinity of Best, Holland, his battalion, almost completely encircled by a strong enemy force, suffered an acute shortage of ammunition. Since the only route to the rear was covered by heavy enemy 20mm, 88mm, rifle, machine pistol and machine gun fire, two attempts to secure the urgently needed ammunition failed. Realizing the seriousness of the situation, Private First Class Ford volunteered to accompany an officer and another enlisted man in a quarter ton truck in an endeavor to obtain ammunition. The group set out on this hazardous mission but enemy fire set fire to the vehicle. Undaunted, Private First Class Ford and the other men, by crawling and running, reached the battalion. They set out in another vehicle and again the truck was destroyed by enemy fire. By taking a circuitous route, they reached the rear area, loaded a vehicle with ammunition and travelling over the same fire-swept road, reached the battalion successfully with the sorely needed ammunition. His courage and tenacity exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

Private Alvin Ledford, 14187827, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 14 October 1944 in the vicinity of Ghenuden, Holland, he accompanied a combat patrol as an automatic rifleman with the mission of destroying an artillery observation post and an enemy strongpoint. When the patrol was on the verge of being ambushed, Private Ledford charged an enemy machine gun position exposing himself to direct fire of the machine gun, and killed the crew with his automatic rifle. His courage and aggressiveness exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from West Virginia.

II -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR (Posthumous) -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Silver Star is awarded posthumously to the following named enlisted man for gallantry in action in Belgium:

Corporal Theodore J. Hanford, 36213920, Airborne Engineers, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 25 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bestegne, Belgium, although a company clerk, he volunteered to lead a squad beyond the main line of resistance to act as an outpost. Advancing under small arms and automatic weapons fire, two of his men were killed by machine gun fire. Corporal Hanford, alone, eliminated the enemy gun and killed three of the enemy with grenades and bayonet after crossing fifty yards of open terrain under heavy mortar fire. While administering first aid to a wounded member of his squad, Corporal Hanford was mortally wounded by enemy sniper fire. MAJOR HENRY G. PLITT, 0404722 (then Captain), Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 18 September 1944 in the vicinity of Best, Holland, his battalion, almost completely surrounded by a strong enemy force, suffered an acute shortage of ammunition. Since the only route to the rear was covered by heavy enemy 20mm, 88mm, rifle, machine pistol and machine gun fire, two attempts to secure the urgently needed ammunition failed. Realizing the seriousness of the situation, Major Plitt and two enlisted men set out in a vehicle to obtain ammunition. Enemy fire set fire to the vehicle, wounding Major Plitt. Undaunted, he and his men, by crawling and running, reached the battalion. They set out in another vehicle and again the truck was destroyed by enemy fire. By taking a circuitous route, they reached the rear area, loaded a vehicle with ammunition and, travelling over the same fire-swept road, reached the battalion successfully with the sorely needed ammunition. His courage and tenacity exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

IV -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named personnel for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

First Lieutenant ROBERT W. COLLIER, 01307992, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 27 October 1944 in the vicinity of Opheusden, Holland, he led a detachment with the mission of destroying a twenty-man enemy outpost which had been holding mines and heavy traps throughout the area. Landing his men through a mined area under a concentration of small arms fire, he directed a heavy assault, killing three of the enemy and forcing the other seventeen to surrender. While withdrawing to their own lines, the patrol became disorganized by a heavy concentration of mortar fire which killed the route operator, thereby covering all communications with friendly forces. Lieutenant COLLIER courageously exposed himself to enemy fire and withdrew his patrol in small groups. His cool and efficient manner proved instrumental in the success of the mission and later in the safe withdrawal of the patrol under a heavy concentration of enemy mortar and artillery fire. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Minnesota.

Staff Sergeant Arthur L. Campbell, 36413562, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 29 September 1944 in the vicinity of Vechel, Holland, his outpost position was attacked by overwhelmingly superior enemy forces. Although the members of the outpost were ordered to withdraw, it was apparent that withdrawal would be impossible without sufficient covering fire. Sergeant Campbell, realizing the situation

then volunteered to remain to cover the withdrawal of the remainder of the group. Although seriously wounded in this action, Sergeant Goyt continued to deliver effective fire until his comrades had reached a safer position. He then skillfully made his way through the attacking enemy to the safety of his own lines. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Michigan.

Private First Class Francis P. Ford, 39544246, Parachute Infantry while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 25 December 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, the enemy penetrated the defensive lines and threatened the safety of the regimental command post and aid station. Since the evacuation of casualties was only possible over one road which was under fire from enemy tanks and artillery and subjected to intermittent small arms fire, Private First Class Ford exposed himself to the dangers in order to evacuate the wounded to the aid station. He made several trips over this hazardous route and succeeded in bringing in several wounded comrades for essential medical treatment. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

V -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL Oak Leaf CLUSTER -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal having been awarded by former order, the Oak Leaf Cluster is awarded to the following named enlisted man for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in Holland:

Sergeant Kenneth M. Swindall, 34253639, Glider Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 17 September 1944 in the vicinity of Zon, Holland, after learning that the glider carrying ammunition and rations for the regiment had crashed in enemy territory, he volunteered to go through the lines in order to save the ammunition. Although subjected to enemy small arms fire, Sergeant Swindall reached and remained with the glider until the last load of ammunition had been loaded onto a quarter ton truck and trailer. He then destroyed the remains of the glider and skillfully directed the driver of the vehicle back through the lines to his own unit. His courage and devotion to duty exemplify the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from North Carolina.

I -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Silver Star is awarded to the following named enlisted men for gallantry in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

Technician Fourth Grade Raymond F. Barton, 19116411, Medical Detachment, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 17 September 1944 during an engagement against strong enemy forces in the vicinity of Voelkel, Holland, Technician Fourth Grade Barton volunteered to cross a bridge across the Alkana Vaart canal to aid the wounded on the eastern side of the canal behind a railroad embankment. This was a distance of approximately sixty yards, every inch of which was covered by heavy machine gun and rifle fire. In daylight and under a concentration of very intense fire, Technician Fourth Grade Barton dashed from the cover of the west bank across the bridge and down behind the railroad embankment. While doing this he was burdened with medical aid equipment and supplies. His aid to the wounded was directly responsible for saving at least five lives. When a counterattack was launched, Technician Fourth Grade Barton voluntarily accompanied the assault echelon. While vigorous fighting was in progress all around him and enemy fire continually harassed him, he administered aid to his wounded comrades on the battlefield and directed their evacuation from the area. Through his courage and devotion to duty he was instrumental in saving many lives. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from California.

Technician Fourth Grade Robert Passanisi, 35269389, Parachute Field Artillery, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by gallantry in action. On 27 December 1944 in the vicinity of Longchamps, Belgium, after his forward observation post had been demolished and the officer in charge wounded and evacuated, Technician Fourth Grade Passanisi assumed command and continued vital operations. Although under constant enemy observation and continuous enemy shell fire, he called for, observed and directed artillery fire from 75mm, 105mm and 155mm guns. Through his courage and skillful direction, a determined attack by enemy infantry and tanks was repelled with the loss of six of the enemy tanks and at least two hundred fifty of the enemy infantry. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Ohio.

II -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, 22 September 1943, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 35, Headquarters XVI Corps, dated 25 June 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named enlisted men for heroic achievement in action against the enemy in countries indicated:

Priv 1st Class Chester H. Tolson, 36661130, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 21 December 1944 in the vicinity of Breston, Belgium, he volunteered to accompany a patrol whose mission was to contact a battalion which had completely surrounded by the enemy. When the patrol became pinned down by small arms, machine gun and mortar fire, Private First Class Tolson, with a radio slung over his back, crawled across open terrain under heavy enemy fire to the location of the beleaguered forces. He then established communication and delivered important information to the commanding officer which contributed to the defeat of the enemy in that sector. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Illinois.

Private First Class Kenneth C. Gernik, 3620827, Medical Detachment, Glider Bn. 1st Artillery, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 26 May 1944 in the vicinity of Bastogne, Belgium, his combat post area was straddled by enemy aircraft which set fire to the radio installation and inflicted wounds on several of the men in the adjacent kitchen. Private First Class Gernik ran to the aid of the wounded despite exploding ammunition which had been set on fire. While rendering aid to the wounded, the enemy again strafed the area, but Private First Class Gernik sheltered the wounded, continued his treatment and personally evacuated the casualties to the aid station. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Wisconsin.

Private Richard H. Slanker, 35625429, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 24 September 1944 in the vicinity of Schijndel, Holland, he volunteered to accompany a patrol whose mission was to convey a vital message to the Regimental Commander who was located in an isolated position. Through his excellent scouting ability and courage, Private Slanker led the patrol through enemy territory and an almost impassable barrier to its destination where it accomplished its mission. On the return trip, the patrol was pinned down by machine gun fire. Private Slanker again skillfully led the patrol around the enemy to the safety of friendly lines. Discovering that one man was missing, Private Slanker returned to the area where the patrol had encountered the enemy machine gun fire and found his comrade seriously wounded. Private Slanker carried the casualty back to safety and returned to his own lines. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from Ohio.

CAPTAIN EARLE HIXON, 01286540, Parachute Infantry, while serving with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself by heroic achievement in action. On 12 June 1944 in the vicinity of Carvaten, France, prior to an attack by friendly forces, communication was severed by enemy action. Realizing the importance of conveying messages to his unit in order to coordinate successfully the movements of all forces participating in the attack, Captain Hixon infiltrated through enemy lines to deliver messages and receive orders. He made repeated trips across open terrain under direct enemy observation and fire in order to establish contact with adjacent attacking units. He personally directed mortar and machine gun fire which accounted for several enemy dead and the capture of many prisoners. His actions were in accordance with the highest standards of the military service. Entered military service from New Jersey.
