I Award of Silver Star, Posthumous.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded posthumously to the following named enlisted man:

86th Mt Inf

WACK E. TREW, 19153497, Private, Infantry/United States Army. For gallantry in action on 20 February 1945, near Mt. Gorgolesco, Italy. When cleverly concealed enemy machine guns, interspersed with intense artillery fire, succeeded in halting his company's advance, Private TREW, on his own initiative, maneuvered for one hundred yards into the concentrated fire to seek the enemy locations and direct counterfire. By skillful movement over rugged terrain he reached the crest of the ridge, and finding himself completely open to observation, gallantly opened well-aimed fire with his automatic rifle. The enemy, quick to locate him in his exposed position, returned deafening fire. Though mortally wounded by this new burst, he selected the targets of his company and indicated new locations from which they were able to destroy the hostile positions. His initiative, determination and great courage were the key factors in seizure of an important terrain feature by his company. His heroic actions furnish inspiration to all who know of them. Entered the military service from Birmingham, Michigan. Next of kin: Mr. A. S. Trew, father, hrd #2, Box #271, Hazelburg, Washington.

II Awards of Silver Star.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded to the following named officer and enlisted man:

10th Inf AT Bn

Oscar L. CHANDLER, 01185002, First Lieutenant, Infantry/United States Army. For gallantry in action on 10 February 1945, near Lizzano in Belvedere, Italy. When two of his vehicles were damaged by mines and blocked the roadway, First Lieutenant CHANDLER, disassembled his howitzers, and with his men, carried them over a mile to his new position on the outpost line of resistance. Later, during an enemy counterattack, he, asking for volunteers, formed a gun crew and moved a howitzer into an open space in front of a house that a large force of the enemy was using as a strong point. He had just started to fire when the gun was hit, wounding the gunner and breaking the gunner's sight. Undaunted by the increasing danger of his position, Lieutenant CHANDLER, taking over the gunner's place, maintained deadly fire until the enemy, many having been killed, surrendered. His bold, aggressive action and superior tactics enabled the capture of twenty-seven enemy and cleared a dangerous hostile emplacement with a minimum of casualties. His quick wittedness and utter disregard of personal welfare reduced an enemy strong point thereby saving much life and injury among defending infantrymen.

When an enemy attack forced withdrawal from newly won positions and caused the evacuation of his platoon leader, Technical Sergeant WOLF, assuming command of the platoon, quickly rallied his men and led a counterattack regaining lost positions. Under hazardous automatic rifle and grenade fire, he pushed onward, indicating lanes of fire, positions to be occupied, and himself maintaining effective fire which killed eight enemy. Receiving a head wound early in the drive, Technical Sergeant WOLF, not thinking of his own safety or seeking medical treatment, continued to lead his men and remained with them until ordered to be evacuated. The resolute courage and determination of Technical Sergeant WOLF enabled his platoon to turn back a serious counterattack, kill many enemy, and go forward to achieve new gains. Such gallantry merits high commendation. Entered the military service from Jackson Heights, New York.

EDMUND D. BENNETT, 39325709, Staff Sergeant, Inftry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 3 March 1945, near Canone Della Ticina, Italy. During a major attack, the lead company reached a strongly defended area and in the intense fire, was compelled to take cover halting the forward progress. Staff Sergeant BENNETT, a squad leader in the lead platoon, quickly analyzed the situation and finding that the position could not be flanked, made his way to within thirty yards of the enemy by crawling along the side of a stone wall under a heavy barrage of machine gun fire. Three of the enemy, seeing him close in on their position, surrendered; the others left their machine gun and ran in hasty retreat over the hill. Staff Sergeant BENNETT, seizing the abandoned weapon, went in pursuit of the fleeing enemy and reaching the crest of the hill, opened a hail of fire which caused known casualties and forced eight more of the enemy to surrender. Throughout the entire attack, even though wounded, he showed great devotion to his men and duty in exposing himself to severe fire in order to insure an adequate supply of ammunition for his automatic rifle team, and often took daring chances to better aid and care for his squad. Staff Sergeant BENNETT'S great display of courage and determination gave his men the confidence and sureness to achieve their mission. Entered the military service from Lancaster, New Hampshire.

Although wounded during his conscientious efforts to aid others, Private MUELLER continued his tireless work and inspired all the men of his company to greater endeavor. He set a high standard of conduct under most hazardous conditions and his courage and great desire to help other men are deserving of the finest praise. While a machine gun section made its way to a forward position from which it was to support attacking riflemen, it became separated and disorganized in an area being heavily bombarded by enemy artillery. Sergeant VLAID from his secure position could see the plight and the extreme danger of the section and in the midst of the heavy enemy fire, maneuvered out in the open to organize the men and direct them to safety, not leaving until all the members had cleared the area. By endangering his own life, he saved much suffering and many casualties in the almost doomed section. His heroic courage and keen devotion to the welfare of his fellowmen enabled an essential machine gun section to be employed in a later action and are justly worthy of high praise. Finding more soldiers there, he was about to throw it out of an open window when he observed that there were soldiers outside who might be injured. Knowing full well that it meant the loss of his hand, he reached out of the window, held the grenade against the wall of the building and let it explode in his grasp. Staff Sergeant MURPHY suffered the loss of his left hand, but his heroic action saved many from injury or death. His quick thinking and his courageous sacrifice are worthy of praise and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Army. Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded to the following named officer and enlisted man:

**87th Mt Inf**

ROBERT C. WOKES, 021221, Lieutenant Colonel, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 3 March 1945, near Mt. della Venetta, Italy. Taking unconscionable risks to lead his battalion in a victorious assault on an enemy held mountain, Lieutenant Colonel WOKES, exhibiting brilliant dash and exemplary heroism, repeatedly distinguished himself by defying hostile artillery, mortar, and small arms fire, establishing and occupying observation points forward of the line of departure to better direct and observe action of his men. In these positions he was more than once imperiled, not only by enemy shelling but by his own artillery. As the attack developed he completely ignored danger to his life, remaining with the lead company, directing close-in artillery support to speed the advance, and spur the enemy with telling aggressiveness. Once when enemy opposition slackened the pace of a lead platoon, Lieutenant Colonel WOKES, marshaled his officers and men, who inspired by his guidance, and learning he was at their front leading the way, pushed on to the objective. Throughout the action Lieutenant Colonel WOKES was conspicuously gallant effecting assurance and winning confidence of his officers and men by personal example. By his superlative leadership and masterful use of military tactics he held casualties to a minimum, expedited the attack and eliminated strong and stubborn enemy resistance. Entered the United States Military Academy from Washington.

HUGH W. VANS 39137961, Technical Sergeant (then Staff Sergeant), Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action near Gaggio Montano, Italy, on 19 February 1945. During the assault of high ground occupied by the enemy, two machine guns held up the advance of many of our troops. Spotting the enemy positions, Technical Sergeant EVANS directed a Bah gunner to cover his advance, and by creeping and crawling under the heavy fire, worked his way to the nearest gun, which he silenced with a hand grenade. He then noticed an enemy rifleman in a nearby slit trench, so killed him with one shot. Hearing the other machine gun in operation above him, he continued his assault, attacking and knocking out the second emplacement with grenades and sub machine gun fire, killing one of the enemy and capturing three. Several tried to escape, but Technical Sergeant EVANS, with great presence of mind, quickly turned their own machine gun on them, killing three more of the enemy before they could get away. His heroic accomplishments enabled assault troops to continue their advance and occupy the commanding ground, insuring the success of their mission. By his brave, aggressive actions, Technical Sergeant EVANS has earned the highest commendation and his deeds are in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from San Rafael, California.

WILLIAM R. CONNER, 31242485, Technician Fifth Grade, Medical Department, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 3 March 1945, near Ciman Della Tiella, Italy. Assigned to support the leading platoon of an attack upon an important objective on a steep, open mountainside, Technician Fifth Grade CONNER, a platoon aid man, with concern for only the welfare of the stricken maneuvered about under the heaviest barrages to treat the wounded. Being constantly alert to the call of all, fearing no dangers for himself, he was quick to see a comrade laying helpless in an exposed trench less than fifty yards from an enemy position. Against all advice and fully aware of the intensity of the fight, he ventured out and had gone but a few feet when intense enemy fire compelled him to take cover. Fixing his Red Cross insignia on a stick, he left his sheltered position and boldly advanced to the side of the wounded man where, placing the stick in the ground, he started to aid his comrade. While performing his work in the midst of the fighting, Technician Fifth Grade CONNER was severely wounded and died almost at once. His noble courage and high regard for his fellow men are of the greatest attributes of the United States Army. Technician Fifth Grade CONNER'S heroic actions afford much inspiration for all who know of them and set a high goal for the men of his Service. Technical Sergeant JOHNSON has demonstrated great ability, initiative, and courage under the most trying conditions, and has earned the high praise of all. His actions are in keeping with the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Seattle, Washington.

JULIUS JOYNER, 34678946, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action near Cencie, Italy, on 5 March 1945. When a battalion offensive was held up for several hours by strong machine gun and small arms fire from an enemy held hill, Staff Sergeant JOYNER rallied his squad and led them through the hail of bullets at a run, traversing the most dangerous area without casualties to his men. He then led his men in the assault of positions on the hill, himself engaging an enemy machine pistol with his fire and killing the enemy. Staff Sergeant JOYNER was first to reach the summit of the mountain, and immediately engaged the enemy who were on the other side of the crest, pursuing them with grenades and fire from his automatic pistol. His aggressive leadership and great heroism spurred his men to capture an objective that had long held out against other assaults, and he thus greatly contributed to the success of his battalion in the offensive. Staff Sergeant JOYNER, by his courage and initiative, has earned much praise in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Franklinton, South Carolina.

JOSEPH S. CASSARO, 33605771, Private First Class, Field Artillery, United States Army. For gallantry in action near Abetria, Italy, on 3 March 1945. Private First Class CASSARO was a member of a wire party laying a communication line through an area that was under hostile observation and shelling to a forward assault unit, to enable them to direct supporting artillery fire. When expected mule transportation for the wire was late in arriving, the other members of the party started out leaving Private First Class CASSARO to wait for the mule and bring two heavy reels of wire. When a partisan arrived with his animal, the two loaded up and started forward into the exposed area. Close shell bursts caused the partisan to withdraw, but Private First Class CASSARO continued to lead the mule forward in the face of heavy shelling. One of the reels of wire was thrown from the mule, and as it was too heavy to recock without assistance, he proceeded on with the other reel. Soon the unbalanced load became too much for the animal, so Private First Class CASSARO removed the reel from the mule and proceeded forward with the wire on his own back, with shells dropping all around him, he carried his awkward burden a half mile before he caught up with his comrades. They then soon completed the wire laying, and established communications in time to greatly aid the efficient direction of supporting artillery fire. Under the provisions of Army regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded posthumously to the following named enlisted men:

**85th Inf**

CHARLES W. BRIDGEWATER, 38528918, Technician Fifth Grade, Medical Department, / United States Army. For gallantry in action at Mt. Belvedere, Italy, on 20 February 1945. When a company of infantry had captured the summit of a mountain, and were engaged in digging in during the night, a heavy artillery and mortar barrage, in conjunction with small arms fire from enemy positions not yet reduced, were inflicting heavy casualties on the defenders. Knowing the extreme danger of moving about in the heat of fire, Technician Fifth Grade BRIDGEWATER, a medical aid man, gave first aid treatment to all the casualties in his platoon, moved them to places of comparative safety, and went out into the moonlight to search for other wounded. Upon learning that an injured man was laying without aid about 150 yards away, he exposed himself to the fire to search out the man, remove him to a covered position, and administer medical treatment. When an adjacent platoon was pinned down by a terrific barrage of artillery and mortar shells, and their aid man was wounded, he made his way through the heavy fire to reach the other platoon, and to locate, treat, and remove to safety four wounded men. While searching for other casualties, he was instantly killed by a near explosion of a mortar shell. His heroic actions saved the lives of many men and inspired his comrades to redouble their efforts to hold their precarious position. Technician Fifth Grade BRIDGEWATER, by his gallantry in carrying out his duties under fire, has earned the unwavering gratitude of all to whom he gave assistance and comfort, and his actions are worthy of the highest commendation. Entered the military service from Fort Worth, Texas. Next of kin: Mrs. L. E. Bridgewater, mother, K.F.D., Bowie, Texas.

EVERETT R. GRIFFIN, 31340246, Private First Class, Infantry, / United States Army. For gallantry in action near Mt. Belice Terracina, Italy, on 3 March 1945. When an assault company had captured the summit of a mountain, and was consolidating its position and making preparations for defense, heavy enemy artillery fire began falling among the men, causing many casualties. A forward artillery observer with the company located the source of the fire, but was unable to call for counterbattery shelling because of lack of communications with supporting artillery, until Private First Class GRIFFIN, a radio operator, willingly went

His heroism in remaining at his post under fire at a time when the lives of his comr des depended on his getting his messages through have earned for Private First Class CHIFFI the undying gratitude of his fellows. His courage and devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Orleans, Vermont. His squad was the first to reach its position, and immediately was subjected to withering machine gun fire from the enemy below them. Staff Sergeant DIETKUS was courageously moving about the exposed area, reconnoitering positions for his men and directing their preparations for defense when he was wounded in the leg and abdomen by the first enemy burst. With great determination and grit he disregarded his painful and serious wounds, and continued commanding his squad and directing their fire on threatening enemy positions. Not until all enemy fire had been silenced and the company was able to capture and consolidate their objective did he relinquish command of his squad and call for aid for himself. The heroic actions, inspiring leadership, and extreme devotion to duty exhibited by Staff Sergeant DIETKUS have brought much credit to himself and the United States Army. Entered the military service from Chicago, Illinois.

HAMILTON G. SWALOS, 32934382, Technician Fifth Grade, Medical Department, United States Army. For gallantry in action near Mt. Della Torre, Italy, on 24 February 1945. During an extremely heavy mortar and artillery barrage, a seriously wounded soldier was left lying in an exposed position, unable to make his way to cover. Technician Fifth Grade SWALOS, after warning others in the vicinity to remain under cover, left his fox hole and braved the worst shelling to the aid of the wounded man, remove him to a safer place, and administer first aid treatment that saved the man's life. By his conspicuous heroism, his concern for the welfare of others above himself, and his devotion to the high ideals of the medical service, Technician Fifth Grade SWALOS has earned the highest commendation. Entered the military service from Buffalo, New York.

All communications with the platoon had been knocked out, and they had been unable to move for more than half an hour, when Private First Class WATZER, on duty at the battalion observation post, volunteered to carry out the plan of his battalion commander for the relief of the platoon. Leaving the shelter of his position, he ran down the exposed forward slope of a hill, passing an enemy held house on his way, and crossed the open field in a hail of bullets to the platoon, instructing them to move back about fifty yards. He then re-crossed the open area and ran to a tank which was stopped along the road, directing their point blank fire at the enemy positions. Then he made his way back to the platoon, and told them to attack when the fire from the tank ceased. After that he returned to his post at the battalion observation post. Following his directions, the infantry was soon able to continue the advance, capturing all objectives. During all of his movements through the area, the enemy laid down intense small arms, machine gun fire, mortar fire, but never once did concern for his own safety give pause to Private First Class WATZER in the accomplishment of his mission. His exhibition of initiative, selfless devotion to duty, and outstanding heroism has earned him an illustrious place in the thoughts of his associates. Entered the military service from New York, New York.

While the two men covered the withdrawal of the rest of the squad, heavy mortar fire began falling in the area, and Private First Class WITKOWSKI was wounded in the face. He remained steadfastly at his position, laying down protective fire for his comrades, until all had successfully made their way out of the dangerous area. His courageous and aggressive actions enabled the squad to successfully accomplish its mission, and Private First Class WITKOWSKI's brave and determined accomplishment sets a high standard of combat performance for the inspiration of all. By his heroic and aggressive actions, Private JUDSON enabled his squad to successfully accomplish its mission. At a later date, he, with another soldier, investigating enemy positions, by surprise completely overpowered a group of enemy by leaping enterin a house, capturing a radio and six prisoners. Later that evening displaying equal prowess he was able to capture two more enemy, one of whom was an officer. In all instances Staff Sergeant DIAMOND acted with conspicuous heroism, judicious initiative, and a selfless devotion to duty worthy of emulation. Entered the military service from Park City, Utah.

The conspicuous courage and valor displayed by Private First Class ERBS is of the highest, and his unselfish devotion to duty and illustrious behavior in the heat of combat is truly eulogized in the lofty traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Cicer, Illinois.

I Awards of Silver Star.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star Medal is awarded to the following named officers and enlisted men:

87th Mt Inf

CHARLES N. NELSON, 056340, Captain (then First Lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 5 March 1945, near Castel d' Aiano, Italy. Upon crossing the line of departure, his company ordered to capture an enemy held hill, immediately came under intense artillery and machine gun fire. Seeing that his chosen route of approach was too heavily defended to be used without many casualties, he moved ahead through the barrage, and reconnoitered an alternate route. He then led his men in a move which flanked the enemy defenses, thus enabling the battalion to easily mop up the immediate resistance. Continuing onward, the company advanced through a draw, which offered partial defilede until they reached its head, where they were again set by a hail of artillery and machine gun fire. Because of the terrain, radio communication was impossible, so Captain NELSON exposed himself to the fire to move back and contact his wiremen, lead them in laying a communication line to a vantage point which was open to hostile observation and fire, but from which he was able to direct effective counterbattery shelling from supporting artillery. When several enemy guns had been knocked out, and artillery was well registered on the targets he had pointed out, he again moved ahead to reconnoiter the terrain, and spotted several enemy strong points. Returning to his men, he organized groups to attack these positions, and led them forward to point out their various tasks. He then advanced with the rest of his company to assault and capture their objective. During the entire action, Captain NELSON displayed extreme courage and aggressiveness in exposing himself to the worst of the fire in order to execute his company's advance, and his gallant actions and tactical skill spiritedly moved forward to accomplish their mission with a minimum of casualties. Immediately upon the company's successful winning of their first objectives, Second Lieutenant LYNN, despite the seriousness of his wounds, led his platoon on in the front of further assaults, his men spearheading the company's advance throughout the day until they were put into battalion reserve. Even then he remained with his platoon, planning and supervising its defensive preparations until morning, when he finally allowed himself to be evacuated. By his gallant leadership, aggressive actions, and tactical skill, Second Lieutenant LYNN greatly assisted his company's successful accomplishment of all missions. His heroism and great ability are commendably in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Klamath Falls, Oregon.

EDWARD C. GULCZYNSKI, 3-304330, Technical Sergeant / Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 24 February 1945, near Mt. Delta Terraccia, Italy. When the summit had been successfully assaulted and captured, and the platoon was preparing defenses against expected counterattacks, enemy snipers opened harassing fire on the position. Directing his men to cover, he crept forward, surprised the two snipers, and took them prisoners. By his heroic leadership and sound judgment, Technical Sergeant GULCZYNSKI enabled his men to overcome stubborn enemy resistance and accomplish their mission with light casualties. His gallant deeds are an inspiration to all who know of them, and are in keeping with the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Hyde Park, Massachusetts.

GERALD E. LUST, 32066249, Staff Sergeant, Infantry / United States Army. For gallantry in action on 3 March 1945, near Monteforte, Italy. FRANK L. GORHAM, JR., 0515645, Captain (then First Lieutenant), Field Artillery, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 21 February 1945, near Pizzo Campiana, Italy. When strong enemy forces counterattacked hoping to dislodge troops from newly won mountain positions, First Lieutenant GORHAM, artillery observer for supporting battery fire, gallantly exposed himself to hostile artillery, mortar, grenade and small arms fire, to make accurate counterbattery fire adjustment. With complete disregard for his own safety, he time and again imperiled his life by crawling to within close proximity of hostile artillery emplacements, to take azimuths on the firing weapons, and make other detailed reports of enemy activity. For fifteen hours he heroically weathered a virtual hail of enemy fire to gather data which could be later used advantageously in bringing damaging fire on the enemy. His valorous disregard for personal safety was noticeably conspicuous, and because of it, infantry units were able to hold their freshly won ground. During the initial encounter, he fearlessly moved among his men, keeping tight control over them at all times, dispatching units where their thrusts would result in more advantageous advance, and personally leading other groups. After the enemy had been driven from the peak, they set up a terrific artillery barrage, making any movement of troops on the mountain peak hazardous. Unmindful of the risks involved, First Lieutenant ST. LOUIS visited each platoon leader, and made the rounds to each soldier's fox hole to insure adequate defense against the imminent counterattack. When the enemy struck, he, rounding up all men in the command post, led them to carry the fight to the enemy at close enough range to use hand grenades. This bold and aggressive stroke of military tactics kept his front lines intact and repelled the enemy. Beside exhibiting exemplary leadership, he showed unerring initiative by carrying a heavy radio after operators and messengers had been evacuated with wounds. Throughout the night, he, unheeding the shells that were still falling, advanced to exposed positions to repair damaged wires to his platoons. wholly in keeping with the loftiest traditions of the United States Army, First Lieutenant ST. LOUIS conspicuously demonstrated superlative leadership, military prowess of an exceptional character and personal valor of the highest. Entered the military service from Albany, New York.

JUDGE F. HURD, 01327009, Second Lieutenant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 3 March 1945, near Monteforte, Italy. In the height of a major attack against a fiercely resisting enemy, Second Lieutenant HURD, seeing several wounded men lying in an exposed area unable to move from the intense shelling, left his covered position to aid the casualties. Manoeuvring into the deadly barrage, he reached the wounded men, and while administering the much needed treatment, he was hit and severely wounded. A litter squad finally

Second Lieutenant HURD displayed courage and a determined sense of responsibility which reflect much credit on himself and the United States Army. Entered the military service from Massasset, Long Island, New York.

JACK H. MAYNARD, 39076324, Sergeant / Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 20 February 1945, near Gaggio Montano, Italy. Although suffering from shrapnel wounds received during the early phases of an attack on an enemy-held mountain, Sergeant MAYNARD rejoined his company after treatment, flatly refusing to be evacuated and highly desirous to participate in the major attack. Storming the objective with his men, he gallantly carried and operated a light machine gun during the rapid movement of his squad forward, and the additional fire power supplied by him added significantly to successful occupation of the highly desired objective. The enemy after recovering from the first stunning impact, counterattacked, and again Sergeant MAYNARD illustriously displayed enviable intrepidity by once more firing his machine gun to help repulse the attack. Not until he was assured that the objective was safely secure did he allow himself to be evacuated. At all times his gallant fortitude, valor, and military prowess were an effective source of inspiration to his men, and are deservedly worthy of emulation. During the whole period, Private First Class ROCCOFORTE, on these and many other occasions, risked his life to care, on the numerous duties of his branch of service. His gallant actions and heroism saved many lives and prevented much pain and suffering. Private First Class ROCCOFORTE has earned the highest praise and commendation, and his deeds are always an inspiration to those who know of them. Entered the military service from Chicago, Illinois.

✓ RICHARD S. SHELDON, 0289711, Lieutenant Colonel / Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 20 February 1945, at Mt. Belvedere, Italy. During the storming of a strongly defended mountain peak, Lieutenant Colonel SHELDON commanded a battalion of a unit of infantry who led the assault. When overwhelming artillery mortar and machine gun fire momentarily pinned down the leading elements before a mine field, he rushed forward, completely disregarding his own safety, to take personal command of the assault groups, and lead them through gaps in the dangerous mined area. In the face of withering machine gun and automatic weapons fire, he inspired his men by his own fearless conduct, and led the final assault against the strong enemy positions on the summit of the mountain. When all of the objective had been occupied, Lieutenant Colonel SHIELD made his way along the entire battalion front, directing reorganization and securing of defenses. He encountered several enemy bunkers and personally reduced them with hand grenades. During a particularly heavy mortar barrage, he called for and directed supporting counterbattery fire on the enemy. After he had made sure that his position was entirely secure, he assisted the battalion on his right to gain their objective, and secured their flank positions by tying them in with his battalion. Such a display of heroic leadership, and skillful tactics merits the highest praise. By his splendid accomplishment, Lieutenant Colonel SHIELD has brought new glory to the United States Army. Captain FABN

BRUCE H. DEVINS, 01175684, Captain/ Field Artillery, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 24 February 1945, near Mt. Belvedere, Italy. The constant failure of communications with the forward elements in a division's major attack incited Captain DEVINS, to maneuver into treacherous artillery and mortar fire to start a new wire forward. Knowing the area to be heavily mined and despite intense sniper fire and heavy artillery barrages, he kept working onward with no thoughts of personal safety and mindful only of the importance of his mission, showing such courage as to inspire his men with new determination to finish the job. Captain DEVINS reached the outpost and established contact but realizing the necessity for constant communications, started back, laying a second wire over the hazardous route. These two lines were essential throughout the planning and assault on the division's objective, and Captain DEVINS' heroic courage and keen sense of duty enabled communications at all times with the foremost elements of the attack. His performance of this dangerous mission has won the admiration and respect of all who know of his deed. Entered the military service from Washington Court House, Ohio.

ANGELO V. SICGATO, 32002878, Technical Sergeant/ infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 5 March and 6 March 1945, near Mt. Delia Spc, Italy. Throughout the assault on a strongly defended mountain peak, Technical Sergeant SICGATO moved his men forward in protection of the exposed lines of the attacking group, and when the summit had been reached, he placed one squad in position on the forward slope of the mountain. When the squad leader of this group was painfully wounded by machine gun fire, and fell in an exposed position unable to make his way to cover, Technical Sergeant SICGATO dashed down to aid the wounded man. He bandaged his wounds, and made him as comfortable as possible, while an enemy sniper leveled three shots at him. Then, Technical Sergeant SICGATO made his way back to the crest of the mountain, though a hostile machine gun fired at him all the way. Improvising a stretcher, he called for volunteer litter bearers, and then guided a medical aid man back to the wounded man, still under machine gun fire. As the medical aid man stayed with the injured soldier, checking the bandages and administering what comfort he could, Technical Sergeant SICGATO went back to guide the litter team forward. Finding that two of these men had become casualties, he took the litter himself, carried it back down to the wounded man, secured him to the makeshift conveyance, and he and the medical aid man dragged the litter back to cover. After the wounded soldier had been evacuated, Technical Sergeant SICGATO continued throughout the night to assist the injured, and prepare defenses of the newly won positions. Before dawn, he was wounded in the hand by

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded posthumously to the following named officer:

WALTER A. LUTHER, 0395660, Captain / Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 20 February 1945, near Mt. Soliveder, Italy. During the assault on a strongly defended mountain peak, Captain LUTHER went forward of his company with a small detachment of men to scout out enemy positions on the summit in preparation for moving his main line position. He wiped out the last hostile resistance. He set up an apt, st about midway between the front line and the enemy positions, and was spotting the hostile emplacements when a terrific barrage of mortar, machine gun and small arms fire swept the area, and the enemy launched a counterattack against the small detachment. Like one of his men attempted to contact their battalion headquarters by radio to ask for support, Captain LUTHER held the enemy at bay with fire from his submachine gun and with hand grenades. As the little group aggressively maintained their position against overwhelming odds, one sniper fire hit Capt. in LUTHER and instantly killed him. I Awards of Silver Star, posthumous.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded posthumously to the following named officer and enlisted man:

85th Mt Inf

WILLIAM H. BAKER, 61327484, Second Lieutenant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 5 March 1945, near Mt. Delia S.p.e., Italy. After he had led his platoon in the storming and capture of a mountain peak, Second Lieutenant BAKER organized his men in defense positions on the left flank of the summit, leaving a security squad on the forward slope, and digging in with the remainder of his platoon on the reverse slope. During the night, when the defenses were still under construction, the enemy launched a strong counterattack. Initially, about twenty of the enemy advanced up the slope, signifying by their actions that they wished to surrender. When they were within a few yards of the most forward position, they suddenly dropped to the ground, and commenced throwing grenades and firing machine pistols at point blank range. At the same time, enemy artillery and mortars laid down a terrific barrage on the mountain, and long range machine gun fire was directed at the crest of the summit. From his position on the reverse slope, Second Lieutenant BAKER heard the initial burst of fire, and rushed across the crest to his men, rallying them and directing their efforts to repel the attack, even though he was in the most exposed position, with bullets and shells hitting all around him. When his men had managed to stem the advance, he sent a messenger to bring a machine gun into the fight, which soon went into action, delivering grazing fire across the positions and into the enemy. Throughout the fire fight, he continued his movements through the area, aiding the wounded and bolstering the courage of his men, until the strong resistance forced the enemy to withdraw. Several days later, while he was in a forward position, observing the fire of enemy guns and directing counter battery fire on them, an exploding artillery shell mortally wounded him, and he died soon after. His courageous leadership and gallant conduct in the face of the worst enemy fire will always be an inspiration to his men. Second Lieutenant BAKER has earned the unying praise and commendation of all for his glorious achievements. Entered the military service from Denver Colorado. Next of kin: Mrs. Joyce A. Baker, wife, 2309 Birch Street, Denver Colorado.

JATHUR E. SYSTROM, 37448104, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 5 March 1945, near Cenelle, Italy. When the platoon of which he was a member split into three squads in his company, Sergeant SYSTROM took charge of a group assigned to cover the right flank of his platoon, and offer security for the other two squads advancing on his flanks. In this hundred yards of their objective the whole platoon which encountered only

small arms opposition thus far, were suddenly met by withering automatic weapons fire and heavy pounding by enemy mortars and artillery. Sergeant BYSHAW, his squad continued to move forward, but the enemy, spotting the aggressive unit approaching their position, waved a white flag. With conspicuous dash Staff Sergeant BYSHAW leapt to his feet and ran headlong toward the enemy bunker. When within thirty feet the white flag disappeared and a rifle was inserted in the summer slit. Instantly he stooped to lunge, but ran on to single handedly overpower the enemy, capturing two enemy positions, and five prisoners. It was later learned that he had been wounded about the face in his heroic effort. The remainder of the platoon then moved in to occupy the objective. Staff Sergeant BYSHAW was killed fifteen minutes later by a direct hit of an enemy mortar shell. His illustrious feat of bravery is truly inscribed in the most valiant traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Omaha, Nebraska. Next of kin: Mrs. Alice Mae Byshaw, wife, 2504 Elliott Street, Omaha, Nebraska.

## II Awards of Silver Star.

85th Mt Inf.

JOHN S. CHAGHE, 01325827, First Lieutenant/Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 21 February 1945, near Mt. Belvedere, Italy. During the assault of a heavily fortified enemy peak by a mountain infantry company, First Lieutenant CHAGHE, in his initial advance on the enemy, who had stopped progress of his company's advance, found it necessary to withdraw from further investigation of an enemy emplacement because of darkness. Two of his men were wounded, and he evacuated them under a hail of fire to zones of safety to give them medical aid. Then, selecting one man to cover his advance, he set out at dawn, inching his way to an enemy emplacement about seventy-five yards away. He threw a grenade at the enemy and demanded that they surrender. When no response came, he, with great courage, stood up and fired directly into the enemy emplacement, killing three and forcing the others to flee. Spotting another machine gun about thirty yards away, he, repeating his previous tactics, forced two enemy to surrender. After turning his prisoners over to his men, he detected more enemy about seventy-five yards to his front, and once more forced ten of them to surrender. He had no sooner cleared this position than he sighted more hostile activity about one hundred yards up the slope. Taking several men with him to support and cover his approach, he, unhesitatingly, set out to deal yet another blow to hostile resistance. Once more his aggressiveness yielded the prisoner and drove the ring of enemy resistance. Throughout the action he was incessantly harassed by enemy mortar, artillery and machine gun fire. His conspicuous valor repeated with each assault, culminated by his capture of the objective, is enshrined in the illustrious traditions of the United States Army. The First Lieutenant CHAGHE, by his military prowess, has won the high esteem and respect of all. Entered the military service from Laramie, Colorado.

DALE J. SIEBELER, 353451, Private First Class, United States Army. For gallantry in action during the period 10 March 1945 to 11 March 1945, near St. Donato, Italy. When a company of infantry had captured a commanding mountain peak and were preparing defenses in their newly won position, the enemy laid down terrific artillery, mortar and machine gun fire. After all radio operators of the company had become casualties, Private First Class SIEBELER, a messenger from another company, volunteered to take charge of communications on the mountain. Through the night, under a terrific pounding from enemy shelling, he labored in the most exposed areas, laying and maintaining wires to all forward positions, to the supporting machine gun platoon, and to the forward observation post of an artillery observer. When a strong enemy counterattack developed, and the company executive officer became a casualty, Private First Class SIEBELER immediately took charge of the command post, receiving messages, answering inquiries, passing orders, and performing with such skill and efficiency all of the duties usually relegated to officers that the company commander, leaving the position in his charge, was able to devote his full time to the tactical situation. He continued to render a superior performance in this capacity for three days, until he was wounded by shell fire. By his heroic actions, splendid leadership, and military skill, Private First Class SIEBELER earned the praise and admiration of all. His courage and intelligence in a difficult and dangerous situation are commendably in keeping with the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Defiance, Ohio.

I Award of Oak Leaf Cluster to Silver Star.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, the Second Oak Leaf Cluster to the Silver Star medal is awarded to the following named officer:

86th Inf

CLARENCE M. TOMLINSON, 014808, Colonel, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 4 March 1945, near Mt. Sassovalare, Italy. When his regiment was commencing an attack on strong enemy positions atop a mountain peak, Colonel TOMLINSON went forward to the observation post of one of his battalions, to find the position under heavy shelling, the battalion commander wounded, and the executive officer in the rear command post with which there was no communication, as all lines had been disrupted by shelling. Immediately detailing his vehicle to carry the wounded commander to the rear, Colonel TOMLINSON assumed personal leadership of the battalion, directing their attack throughout the day, with utter disregard for an almost continuous hail of artillery and small arms fire, until the organization had successfully accomplished its mission and taken all objectives. His courageous and skillful leadership of the battalion, and calm efficiency under fire were an inspiration to all during this crucial time, and insured the success of the assault. Though he could have delegated this dangerous task to another, he chose to personally lead the attacking battalion and provide it with the most excellent and daring caliber of leadership. Colonel TOMLINSON, through his brilliant and gallant courage and professional skill, has well merited the highest commendation and praise, and his actions are truly worthy of the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from New York, New York.

II Award of Silver Star.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded to the following named officer:

DAVID L. RUFFNER, 06997, Brigadier General, United States Army. For gallantry in action during the period 21 April 1945, to 28 April 1945, in the Po Valley, Italy. Accompanying a motorized battalion of mountain infantry, reinforced by tanks that spearheaded the way through the Po Valley, Brigadier General RUFFNER, on the first day, entered a house and, alone, captured twelve enemy soldiers. When the general officer in command of the force became a casualty, he assumed command, and against determined enemy rear guard action, aggressively pushed his tanks and men on to the Po River, making his force the first to reach this important barrier. The following day he led his men in forcing a bridgehead, himself commanding the leading elements in the crossing by assault boat, though his force was subjected all the while to a pitiless pounding of artillery. Immediately upon reaching the north bank, Brigadier General RUFFNER made a personal reconnaissance through a sniper infested area in order to expedite the

forward movement. Pressing on through the disorganized enemy, his force drove from the Po River to the foothills of the Alps, under his able direction. On the east shore of Lake Garda, when his men were held up by concentrated rifle and machine gun fire from dominating heights along the shore, he went forward to personally direct the fire of his leading tanks in knocking out the enemy resistance, repeatedly exposing himself to enemy observation and fire to accomplish his gallant task. Throughout the action, his many heroic deeds and splendid leadership were an inspiration to his men, who, by his example, were spirited to magnificent and daring accomplishments in breaking the back of enemy resistance in this area. Brigadier General RUFFNER, through his skillful tactics and outstanding courage, has well merited the admiration and respect of all who know of his deeds. Entered the military service from Virginia.

I Awards of Silver Star, Posthumous.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star Medal is awarded posthumously to the following named enlisted men:

*85th Inf*

ARTHUR L. NYGARD, 37174660, Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action during the period 20 February 1945, to 24 February 1945, near St. Della Terracina, Italy. During an advance across mountainous terrain, Sergeant NYGARD, a mortar sergeant, in checking for possible routes of approach of counterattacking enemy, found an unsecured draw through which hostile troops were attempting to infiltrate. Securing what can he could, he emplaced them at the top of the draw, and directed their efforts, through a terrific barrage of enemy artillery, to drive off the hostile intruders. The following morning, when two riflemen were pinned down in an advanced listening post, Sergeant NYGARD again distinguished himself by bringing the tube of his mortar forward, setting it up in an exposed position on the forward slope, and in spite of heavy snelling and small arms fire, knocked out the machine gun which had held the men down, thus enabling them to return to their comrades. Later he made personal reconnaissance for gun positions and a mortar observation post, emplaced his men, and himself crawled to a position on an open hill to direct their fire. Their first round drew a terrific hail of artillery, machine gun and sniper fire from the enemy, but undaunted, he remained in his exposed and dangerous position to direct his men in supporting the forward advance of riflemen, enabling them to reach their objective without a casualty. Throughout the action, his many gallant deeds were truly an inspiration to all who observed them, and greatly expedited the accomplishment of all missions. Sergeant NYGARD has well earned the highest commendation and praise for his heroic actions, which reflect credit on the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Fort Ripley, Minnesota. Next of kin: Mrs. Alice Nygard, mother, Ripley, Minnesota.

By his amazing devotion to duty and courage in carrying on with his work in spite of his serious condition, Technician Fifth Grade SAVIERS has truly earned the highest commendation, and his achievement is worthy of the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from Twin Falls, Idaho.

DANIEL COLEY, 34447235, Private First Class, Medical Department, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 20 February 1945 and 21 February 1945, near Polla, Italy. During the night advance up a draw flanked by enemy machine gun positions, a leading member of the assault unit tripped a mine, which wounded eight men, and brought heavy mortar shelling and cross bands of machine gun fire on the soldiers. Heroically, Private First Class COLEY went forward under the deadly fire to seek out the wounded men and care for them, remaining through the night, as the enemy action continued, to make the injured men as comfortable as possible. He attended each of the wounded, giving his outer clothing to them to keep warm during the long vigil. I Announcement of Colonel William G. Darby as Assistant Division Commander.

Colonel William G. Darby, O14133, Field Artillery, Headquarters, 10th Mountain Division, is announced as Assistant Division Commander, hereby confirming the verbal order, Commanding General, of 2d April 1945.

II Award of Silver Star, Posthumous.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded posthumously to the following named officer:

JAMES A. SHEPARD, O394051, Captain, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 21 February 1945, near Cappelle di Ronchidice, Italy. When, during an offensive, an attacking battalion had dug in for the night, with the plan of continuing the assault the following morning, Captain SHEPARD, battalion S-1, went forward at dawn to reconnoiter a location for a command post. As he moved into the front line area of a platoon, the enemy launched a strong counterattack on these positions, supported by intense artillery, mortar and machine gun fire. Observing that the platoon, stunned by the sharp action, was able to make little concerted effort to beat off the attack, he boldly made his way, through the fire, at great risk to his own life, to go from foxhole to fox-hole, rouse the men, and literally push them into action. When the platoon leader was killed, Captain SHEPARD took over complete leadership of the group, aggressively fighting until the counterattack was broken up, by our own small arms and grenade fire. This unhesitating action at a critical moment, together with his gallant exhibition of personal bravery, distinguished Captain SHEPARD as being truly worthy of the finest traditions of the United States Army. His courage and quick thinking were inspirational and deserving of the highest commendation and praise. Captain SHEPARD was killed in a later action. Entered the military service from St. Paul, Minnesota. Next of kin: Mrs. Jean A. Shepard, wife, 308 Washington Boulevard, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

III Awards of Silver Star.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45, as amended, a Silver Star medal is awarded to the following named officers and enlisted men:

JOHN F. JAMES, O1320460, First Lieutenant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 21 April 1945, near II Ferne, Italy. Accompanying his battalion commander forward to determine what was holding up the battalion's offensive, First Lieutenant JAMES arrived to find that the enemy had set up a

road block, and were defending it with heavy fire from several buildings. When tanks moved up, to assist the attacking company, and commenced direct fire on the enemy, First Lieutenant JAMES, alone, went forward along a ditch towards the hostile positions. When the fire lifted, he dashed into one of the buildings, from which bullets were still pouring, and engaged the enemy at close range, killing one and capturing another. This gallant deed, voluntarily undertaken and courageously executed aided in the liquidation of the road block and has earned for First Lieutenant JAMES the highest commendation and praise, truly in keeping with the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from San Francisco, California.

L. JAY TEVENNUM, 01327311, Second Lieutenant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 19 March 1945, near Calvensa, Italy. Leading a sixteen-man patrol far behind enemy lines to capture prisoners for interrogation, Second Lieutenant TEVENNUM split his group into small units, and deployed them in such a manner that each supported the other. With their leader encouraging them, the men moved forward, seeking enemy positions and braving mine fields. When the enemy released a flare, he halted the patrol and advanced alone until the hostile soldiers opened fire on him. Immediately his men opened supporting fire, half of them advancing towards the position. Aware of the precarious situation, the enemy attempted to flee, but he and his men gave chase. Second Lieutenant TEVENNUM overtook one and knocked him unconscious with the butt of his carbine while his men captured another, and, with their mission accomplished, the patrol reformed and returned with their prisoners. By his aggressive and skillful actions, at great risk to his own life, Second Lieutenant TEVENNUM insured the success of his mission and earned the undying respect and admiration of his men. Such heroism and splendid leadership are truly worthy of the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered the military service from St. Louis, Missouri.

RICHARD H. BOESE, 37344626, Sergeant (then Private First Class), Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 14 April 1945 and 15 April 1945, near Castel d'Almo, Italy. Accompanying his company commander at the commencement of an offensive, Sergeant BOESE, a bugler, volunteered to lead one of the platoons, which was under intense artillery fire, to a safer route of approach, risking his life to accomplish this task. Later when a leading platoon had bypassed an enemy-held area, and were bursting onward, another group moved up to mop up the resistance in the rear of the assault platoon. Again, through mine fields and artillery fire, he guided this group safely forward to where they were able to carry out their mission. The following day, as the advance continued, direct artillery shelling gave control of the company exceedingly difficult, and Sergeant BOESE courageously exposed himself to the heavy fire to move about among the men, encouraging them forward, and passing on directions to the company commander. When a change in objectives necessitated a night withdrawal, and a cry of assistance was heard from in front of our positions, when he distinguished himself by going forward in the darkness to seek out the injured man and administer aid and comfort until a litter team was able to come forward and evacuate the wounded soldier. During the entire period, his great courage and gallant actions were an inspiration to all who observed him, and truly worthy of the finest traditions of the United States Army. Sergeant BOESE has well merited the highest commendation and praise for his brave deeds. Entered the military service from Palisade, Colorado.
