Rushing to the machine gun bunker, Sergeant BUSA found the gunner seriously wounded and the weapon disabled by enemy fire. He valiantly treated the gunner and assisted him to safety. Returning to the machine gun, Sergeant BUSA rapidly repaired the weapon, moved to a position exposed to the enemy concentrations and directed accurate and effective fire upon the advancing troops. Sergeant BUSA continued to operate the machine gun until the attack had been repelled. His courageous actions and sound judgment were instrumental in the successful defense of the Company F positions. AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR. --By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 9 July 1918 (WD Bul 43, 1918), and pursuant to authority in AR 600-45, the Silver Star for gallantry in action is awarded to the following-named officer and enlisted man:

First Lieutenant EVERETT J. YACKER, O59153, Infantry, Company "F", 65th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the morning and afternoon of 30 January 1951, in the vicinity of Tolwol-Li, Korea, Lieutenant YACKER was a platoon leader with the mission of occupying commanding ground near enemy-held Hill "262". As Lieutenant YACKER led his men toward the objective, the platoon was subjected to sporadic small arms and automatic weapons fire which steadily increased in intensity. Courageously climbing the steep slope, the force then began receiving heavy enemy mortar fire concentrations and sustained many casualties. Disregarding the intense bombardment, Lieutenant YACKER immediately supervised the treatment of casualties and then, with a force of 10 men, continued the attack. As he moved up the hill, he called in accurate artillery fire on the enemy positions and skillfully led the remaining platoon members to the objective. Lieutenant YACKER'S aggressive leadership and sound judgment in securing this vital position enabled his company to successfully flank, assault and overrun the strategically-valuable Hill "262". Lieutenant YACKER'S outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from the District of Columbia.

Sergeant First Class JACK BAUGHN, JR., US52218139, Infantry, Company "E", 65th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the evening and night of 14 June 1953, in the vicinity of Sagimak, Korea, Company "E" commenced a raid on enemy-held Hill "412". As Sergeant BAUGHN'S squad neared the objective, it was subjected to heavy enemy fire which wounded the squad leader. Sergeant BAUGHN immediately assumed command of the squad, reorganized it and aggressively led the group up the slope. He courageously guided his men through the intense defensive barrages, forced the enemy to retreat and, upon reaching the crest, deployed his men in an effective defense perimeter. Upon receiving the order to withdraw, Sergeant BAUGHN skillfully led the squad to the assembly area and then volunteered to guide a screening patrol back to the shell-torn objective in an attempt to retrieve wounded personnel. Disregarding the heavy enemy artillery and mortar bombardment, he again moved into the area under fire and succeeded in evacuating several United Nations casualties to safety. Sergeant BAUGHN then led the screening patrol back to the main line of resistance. Sergeant BAUGHN'S outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Kentucky.

Upon reaching the men, he assisted a wounded man to his feet and bravely guided the patrol members back through the lane he had cleared to the safety of the trenches. Despite the extreme danger, Private BIRON moved to within five feet of the soldier and, ignoring the man's threats, began to reason with him. A half hour later he persuaded the man to leave the tent and accompanied him to a deserted area. Here, he again spoke with the soldier and finally induced him to put down one grenade. Private BIRON'S outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Vermont.

Despite the heavy incoming fire, he courageously administered first aid and moved across the shell-torn terrain to obtain transportation for the wounded men. He then bravely supervised their evacuation to an aid station. Lieutenant LE DOUX'S disregard for his personal safety and sound judgment were instrumental in saving the lives of the casualties. Lieutenant LE DOUX'S outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Rhode Island.

Sergeant First Class (then Sergeant) **PAUL D. TULLIS**, US54059661, Infantry, Company "G", 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the early morning of 25 May 1953, in the vicinity of Chat-Kol, Korea, a patrol on a mission forward of the main line of resistance was subjected to an enemy artillery and mortar bombardment. The heavy fire dispersed the men, wounded Sergeant TULLIS and seriously wounded another patrol member. Sergeant TULLIS immediately regrouped the men and administered first aid to the other casualty. Disregarding his own wounds, Sergeant TULLIS courageously served as rear guard in the ensuing return to friendly lines. Upon reaching the safety lane, he positioned himself there and remained until all patrol members had reached the main line of resistance. His sound judgment and bravery were greatly responsible for the patrol's safe return with a minimum of casualties. Sergeant TULLIS' outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Texas.

Sergeant First Class (then Corporal) VINCENT D. SALCETO, JR., ER13114671, Infantry, Company "G", 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the night of 24 May and early morning of 25 May 1953, in the vicinity of Chat-Nol, Korea, a patrol on a mission forward of the main line of resistance was subjected to an enemy artillery and mortar bombardment. The heavy fire dispersed the men and inflicted two casualties. Disregarding the incoming rounds, Sergeant SALCETO bravely reorganized the patrol and administered aid to the wounded personnel. Obtaining a litter, he assisted in carrying the most seriously wounded man back toward the main line of resistance. He carefully guided the men through heavily mined areas and was greatly responsible for the patrol's safe return to friendly lines with a minimum of casualties. Sergeant SALCETO'S outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Pennsylvania.

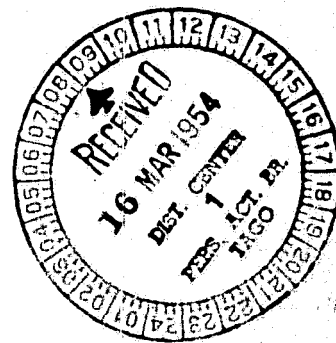

AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR. — By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 9 July 1918 (WD Bul 43, 1918), and pursuant to authority in AR 600-45, the Silver Star for gallantry in action is awarded to the following-named officers:

Major (then Captain) **RAYMOND F. RUYFFELAERE**, 025814, Infantry, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2d Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the night of 13 June and early morning hours of 14 June 1953, in the vicinity of Chat-Kol, Korea, the right flank of Company "F" was attacked by a numerically superior enemy force. Despite the heavy defensive fire, the attacking force penetrated the main line of resistance and the Battalion reserve company was ordered into action. Aware that the company commander's knowledge of the area to be occupied had been acquired through map reconnaissance only, Major **RUYFFELAERE** voluntarily guided the unit into position. Following this, he observed that supporting mortar elements were inactive and immediately rushed to their position. Disregarding the constant enemy artillery and mortar barrages, Major **RUYFFELAERE** aggressively re-employed the mortar sections and directed their fire upon the advancing enemy. Returning to the main line of resistance, he was informed of a serious ammunition shortage among elements in combat on the right flank. Climbing from the trench, he courageously initiated and supervised a supply line which rapidly relayed the critically-needed ammunition from a left flank supply point to the hard fighting defenders. Major **RUYFFELAERE** valiantly remained atop the parapet throughout this operation despite the intense enemy supporting fire. His inspirational leadership and ability to analyze critical situations accurately and rapidly were instrumental in the ensuing defeat of the enemy assault. Major **RUYFFELAERE'S** outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Massachusetts. "This award supersedes the award of the Bronze Star Medal with Letter "V" device to Major **RAYMOND F. RUYFFELAERE**, for heroic achievement from 14 June to 15 June 1953 as published in General Orders 324, this headquarters, dated 9 August 1953."

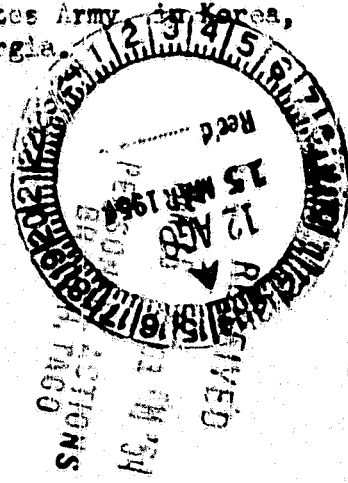

As a result of his exemplary actions, he was indispensable in aiding the wounded, saving the lives of friendly soldiers and alleviating much suffering. 

During the night of 9 June 1953, in the vicinity of Chat-Kol, Korea, a forward listening post detected an enemy force preparing for an attack and attempts were made to ignite illuminating flares but they failed to ignite. Aware of the necessity of maximum visibility to effectively halt the enemy move, Lieutenant KORCHEK immediately left the main line of resistance and moved through the incoming enemy mortar and artillery fire in search of the flares. Courageously advancing forward of the listening post, he reached the flares and rapidly ignited them. The accurate artillery, mortar and small arms fire United Nations defenders then directed upon the enemy force decisively repelled the attack. Lieutenant KORCHEK'S outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Virginia.

Master Sergeant THOMAS M. BLOUNT, RA37737779, Infantry, Heavy Mortar Company, 65th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the evening of 14 July 1953, in the vicinity of Kumhwa, Korea, Sergeant BLOUNT'S unit was firing in support of United Nations elements when the company emplacements were subjected to heavy barrages of enemy artillery fire. In the bombardment, three of Sergeant BLOUNT'S platoon members were wounded by the enemy fire and fell in the impact area. Observing the casualties, he immediately rushed across the terrain under fire to their position. Disregarding the incoming rounds, Sergeant BLOUNT courageously picked up the more seriously wounded man and, guiding the other two casualties, safely returned to his sheltered position. He then secured transportation and had the wounded platoon members evacuated to an aid station. Sergeant BLOUNT'S outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Kansas.

Sergeant First Class (then Sergeant) AUTRA J. BROCK, US54063600, Infantry, Company "F", 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the night of 14 June and early morning hours of 15 June 1953, in the vicinity of Ugo-Dong, Korea, the Company "F" main line of resistance positions were attacked by a numerically superior enemy force supported by intense mortar and artillery fire. Disregarding the heavy bombardment, Sergeant BROCK bravely moved through the trenches, checking his men. While he was in one bunker, an enemy round struck the fortification, wounding him and several other defenders. Sergeant BROCK ignored his wounds and courageously directed the treatment and evacuation of the casualties. Remaining in the damaged bunker, he permitted himself to be removed only after having been assured that his wounded comrades had been evacuated to safety. Sergeant BROCK'S outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Louisiana.

Sergeant First Class (then Sergeant) THOMAS C. WHITE, RA23746235, Infantry, Company "F", 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the early morning hours of 15 June 1953, in the vicinity of Chat-Kol, Korea, the Company "F" main line of resistance positions were attacked by a large enemy force supported by intense mortar and artillery barrages. Sergeant WHITE immediately deployed his squad members in effective fighting positions on the company's right flank. Later, he was informed that the enemy had penetrated the adjacent sector. He rapidly guided his men to new positions to block the penetration and, despite the heavy enemy barrage, courageously directed their fire. Corporal HOWARD BEARD, JR., US55197372, Infantry, Company "B", 65th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the morning and afternoon of 17 July 1953, in the vicinity of Simmok-Tong, Korea, Corporal BEARD was a member of a company raiding force advancing on enemy-held Hill "433". He aggressively climbed the slope and charged the enemy, throwing hand grenades and firing his weapon. With complete disregard for his personal safety, Corporal BEARD repeatedly moved within a few yards of enemy bunkers and trenches to effectively fire upon the defenders. His courageous actions and constant encouragement inspired his men to fight still harder and to inflict extensive damage upon the foe. Observing heavy fire coming from a bunker, he valiantly rushed to an exposed position and fired upon the enemy troops in the fortification in an attempt to neutralize their fire. In this brave move to protect his comrades, Corporal BEARD was mortally wounded by a burst of enemy small arms fire. Corporal BEARD'S outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Illinois.

Private First Class RAMON DELGADO-GONZALEZ, US29145588, Infantry, Company "B", 65th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the morning and afternoon of 17 July 1953, in the vicinity of Simmok-Tong, Korea, Company "B" assaulted enemy-held Hill "433". In the action, many friendly casualties were sustained and volunteers were needed to retrieve and evacuate the wounded attackers. Although fully aware of the dangers involved, Private DELGADO-GONZALEZ bravely volunteered for the mission and soon began moving up the fire-swept slope toward a wounded United Nations soldier lying close to enemy fortifications. Despite the intense defensive fire, he courageously advanced toward the enemy and succeeded in reaching the casualty. Private DELGADO-GONZALEZ then valiantly moved back down the slope with the casualty but was mortally wounded by an exploding enemy mortar round before he could reach shelter. Private DELGADO-GONZALEZ' outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Puerto Rico.

Private VIRGIL B. ADKINS, US52188840, Infantry, Company "B", 65th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the morning and afternoon of 17 July 1953, in the vicinity of Simmok-Tong, Korea, Company "B" assaulted enemy-held Hill "433". In the action, many friendly casualties were sustained and Private ADKINS immediately began treating and evacuating them. Disregarding the heavy enemy fire, he repeatedly moved about the terrain under fire to aid wounded raiders. When the unit began to return toward the United Nations main line of resistance, Private ADKINS volunteered to remain behind and cover the retrograde movement. Courageously protecting his unit, he directed heavy fire upon the foe until mortally wounded by intense enemy automatic weapons fire. Private ADKINS' outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from West Virginia.

Private HENDRY'S outstanding heroism and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Michigan.

Sergeant First Class WILLIAM T. HENNESSEY, RA1220280, Infantry, Company "L", 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the evening of 25 September 1952, in the vicinity of Saeng, Korea, Sergeant HENNESSEY was a member of a raiding force advancing on enemy-held Hill "171". Sergeant HENNESSEY, serving as scout, was one of the first to engage the enemy and directed accurate carbine fire upon the defenders. He constantly exposed himself to enemy fire to more effectively operate his weapon. When the order to return was given, Sergeant HENNESSEY courageously volunteered to be the rear guard. Observing a number of enemy troops following the force, Sergeant HENNESSEY bravely fired upon them, mortally wounding one and wounding many others. His accurate carbine fire discouraged any other attempts to attack the patrol and was greatly responsible for the unit's safe movement back to the main line of resistance. Sergeant HENNESSEY'S outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from New Hampshire.

Sergeant JOHNNIE L. LANE, US52172823, Infantry, Company "E", 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the night of 14 June 1953, in the vicinity of Yugong-Ni, Korea, the Company "E" sector was subjected to a heavy enemy mortar and artillery bombardment. Due to the intensity of the concentration, Sergeant LANE'S squad was forced to move to positions offering more shelter from the incoming fire. Deploying his men in the new location, Sergeant LANE observed that two men were missing. He immediately rushed back across the terrain under fire in search of them. Locating the missing squad members, he saw they were seriously wounded and courageously evacuated them to safety, making two additional trips through the enemy barrage. Sergeant LANE then returned to his men and directed their fire in the defense of the sector. Although wounded in the ensuing action, Sergeant LANE contributed materially to the effective defense of the United Nations line. Sergeant LANE'S outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Ohio.

AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR. — By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 9 July 1918 (WD Bul 43, 1918), and pursuant to authority in AR 600-45, the Silver Star for gallantry in action is awarded to the following-named enlisted men:

Private First Class CHARLES F. BROWN, US52136472, Infantry, Company "H", 7th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the night of 14 June 1953, in the vicinity of Yugong-ni, Korea, Company "H" positions on the main line of resistance were attacked by a large enemy force. Private BROWN, a machine gunner in position on the line, directed heavy fire on the enemy troops moving toward the United Nations positions. When an enemy soldier charged his bunker, Private BROWN courageously ripped the automatic weapon from the foe and mortally wounded him. Private BROWN then returned to his machine gun and resumed firing upon the advancing enemy. Although wounded by the bombardment supporting the enemy attack, Private BROWN bravely refused medical attention and continued to inflict damage upon the attackers until the enemy was forced to withdraw. Private BROWN'S outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from West Virginia.

Private First Class DONALD A. THERKELSEN, US55238398, Infantry, Medical Company, 65th Infantry Regiment, 3d Infantry Division, United States Army. During the morning and afternoon of 17 July 1953, in the vicinity of Kumtwa, Korea, Company "B" assaulted enemy-held Hill "433" and, in the ensuing firefight, sustained many casualties. Observing the wounded attackers lying exposed to the enemy fire, Private THERKELSEN, an aidman, courageously moved from casualty to casualty, administering medical aid and removing them to sheltered positions. He repeatedly returned to aid the wounded men, despite the intense enemy fire, and was greatly responsible for saving the lives of several United Nations personnel. Private THERKELSEN was last seen valiantly advancing into an area under heavy enemy bombardment in an attempt to assist a wounded comrade. Private THERKELSEN'S outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the Federal Service from Illinois.

AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL

Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, the Soldier's Medal is awarded to the following officer:

First Lieutenant Orville F. McNatt, O1103317, CE, Company A, 4th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For heroism at Camp Gordon Johnston, Florida, on 26 November 1945. Engaged in a shore-to-shore landing operation along the Gulf of Mexico, the assault wave of the combat team to which Lieutenant McNatt was attached was proceeding to its rendezvous area under cover of darkness. Unanticipated and unpredicted high seas were encountered, buffeting severely the Landing Craft (LCV), aboard which were Lieutenant McNatt, twenty two (22) enlisted men, and five (5) enlisted crewmen. Sitting toward the stern of the craft, facing the stern, Lieutenant McNatt heard the coxswain shout a warning that water was coming over the bow. On turning, Lieutenant McNatt saw the bow disappear into a wave, resulting in the craft filling with water and sinking in about five seconds. Instantly shouting to the men "Keep together! Keep together!", he was plunged into the Gulf. His life already endangered, he further endangered it willingly, when on observing one of the men whose life jacket had become untied to be in difficulty and realizing the danger to the men and disregarding the risk to himself in detaching himself from the group, Lieutenant McNatt swam out to the man, retied the jacket, and then assured himself that the man became one of the group. In complete darkness and high sea, the group was kept together, largely through the efforts of Lieutenant McNatt, for about one hour. When the succeeding wave of craft approached the group, Lieutenant McNatt, having kept possession of his flashlight, proceeded to signal the approaching craft, directing others in the group to do likewise and to all were taken aboard, and no life was lost. The heroism, disregard for personal safety, and leadership of Lieutenant McNatt reflects great credit upon himself, the 4th Engineer Combat Battalion, and the 4th Infantry Div. Entered the military service from Colorado.

AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL

Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, the Soldier's Medal is awarded to the following enlisted men:

Staff Sergeant Arthur J. Horn, 32068234, Company B, 8th Infantry, United States Army. For heroism on 30 March 1944. A truck driven by a British civilian, carrying nine (9) British soldiers crashed into a bridge, and overturned into the river. Arriving on the scene immediately after the accident Staff Sergeant Horn, willingly and without hesitation did endanger his own life by entering the water and assisting in righting the overturned vehicle. Hindered by a swift current, caused by the rising tide, Staff Sergeant Horn repeatedly risked his life in the successful effort to release those pinned beneath the wreckage. Not until all the survivors were safe on shore and the bodies of the dead recovered did he cease his heroic and untiring efforts. The coolness and bravery of Staff Sergeant Horn, even when his own life was endangered, reflects great credit not only on himself but the 8th Infantry Regiment and the 4th Infantry Division. Entered the military service from New Jersey.

Staff Sergeant Edward F. McGrath, 32022068, Headquarters Company, 2d Battalion, 8th Infantry, United States Army. For heroism on 30 March 1944. A truck driven by a British civilian, carrying nine (9) British soldiers crashed into a bridge, and overturned into the river. Staff Sergeant McGrath was among the first to reach site of the accident and realizing the plight of those in the vehicle disregarded his own personal safety to assist in the rescue of the victims. Staff Sergeant McGrath plunged into the river, the depth of which had been swelled to five (5) feet by the rapidly rising tide, made his way to the truck and at great risk to his own life did hasten the rescue of the five (5) survivors and the removal of the bodies of the five (5) who died in the accident. The heroism and gallant efforts with utter disregard for personal safety reflects great credit upon Staff Sergeant McGrath, the 8th Infantry Regiment and the 4th Infantry Division. Entered the military service from New York.

Private Louis Buscarone, 32022709, Company F, 8th Infantry, United States Army. For heroism on 30 March 1944. A truck driven by a British civilian, carrying nine (9) British soldiers crashed into a bridge, and overturned into the river. Private Buscarone was in the vicinity and on hearing the crash, rushed to the scene of the accident. At the risk of losing his own life, Private Buscarone dove into the swift waters of the river and went to the aid of the occupants of the wrecked truck. Private Buscarone narrowly escaped

AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL

Under the provisions of AR 600-45, dated 1 January 1943, and Circular 13, Headquarters First United States Army, dated 26 January 1944, as amended by Circular 16, Headquarters First United States Army, dated 2 February 1944, the Soldier's Medal is awarded the following enlisted men:

JACK R. GOODWIN, 35163106, Private, 4th Quartermaster Company. For heroism at sea on 28 April 1944. A convoy participating in an exercise, was attacked at about 0200 hours on 28 April 1944 by enemy surface craft. Some damage was effected causing several men to be adrift on rafts in the water. The ship, on which Private GOODWIN was a passenger, after losing contact with the enemy, returned to the scene to rescue survivors at 0400 hours. On his own initiative and with complete knowledge that it was at the risk of his own life, Private GOODWIN went over the side of the ship in darkness into frigid waters and onto the raft which was adrift. Working in the water, he placed ropes about the survivors who were clinging to the raft. He then boarded the raft, remaining there until the ship could come alongside, and assisted in hoisting the survivors to safety aboard ship. This act reflects great credit upon Private GOODWIN, the 4th Quartermaster Company, and the 4th Infantry Division. Entered the military service from Indiana.

JAMES E. GURLEY, 7001860, Private, 4th Quartermaster Company. For heroism at sea on 28 April 1944. A convoy participating in an exercise, was attacked at about 0200 hours on 28 April 1944 by enemy surface craft. Some damage was effected causing several men to be adrift on rafts in the water. The ship, on which Private GURLEY was a passenger, after losing contact with the enemy, returned to the scene to rescue survivors at 0400 hours. On his own initiative and with complete knowledge that it was at the risk of his own life, Private GURLEY went over the side of the ship in darkness into frigid waters and onto the raft which was adrift. Working in the water, he placed ropes about the survivors who were clinging to the raft. He then boarded the raft, remaining there until the ship could come alongside, and assisted in hoisting the survivors to safety aboard ship. This act reflects great credit upon Private GURLEY, the 4th Quartermaster Company, and the 4th Infantry Division. Entered the military service from South Carolina.

I --AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - Under the provisions of AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, and Circular 66, Headquarters First United States Army, dated 18 May 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following on-listed men:

GEORGE E. ZETT, 7024865, Corporal, Company A, 4th Medical Battalion. For heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 28 April 1944. A passenger on a ship which was torpedoed by enemy surface craft, Corporal ZETT, aware that a wounded man was trapped in the crew's quarters, proceeded aft to assist the injured sailor. His progress impeded by slippery, oil soaked decks and flying embers from a raging fire, he was compelled to climb over damaged ammunition magazines to reach the compartment. The quarters were completely dark, water rushing in, and choking fumes and smoke filled the air. Searching with his flashlight, Corporal ZETT found the injured, half conscious sailor on the floor, his head almost submerged. Corporal ZETT, by his own efforts, cleared sufficient debris to assist the man, moving him until help arrived to effect a complete rescue. Corporal ZETT'S initiative and heroic action are in keeping with the highest traditions of the service. Entered the military service from Pennsylvania.

ALBERT W. JUDD, 31351114, Private, Company C, 4th Medical Battalion. For heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 28 April 1944. Without regard for his personal safety, Private JUDD voluntarily assisted in extinguishing a fire caused by an enemy torpedo attack on the ship on which he was a passenger. The blaze raged while the ship was under enemy shell fire, and flames crept close to the ship's damaged ammunition magazine. When the fire was under control, Private JUDD joined in removing casualties from beneath accumulated debris in the seaman's quarters, remaining in the compartment about 45 minutes. He was a member of a party of 5 which searched the wreckage and carried about 20 men to the Medical Aid Station. Private JUDD'S initiative and heroic action are in keeping with the highest traditions of the service. Entered the military service from Maine.

ORESTO E. FORTINO, 7026233, Private, Company B, 4th Medical Battalion. For heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 28 April 1944. A passenger on a ship which had been attacked and left burning by the enemy, Private FORTINO three times entered a damaged compartment to assist the wounded. Hearing the moan of an injured man pinned beneath the wreckage, Private FORTINO cleared away sufficient debris to release the victim, then dragged him to a position where further assistance was available. Going below a second time he found another casualty under a mass of ammunition cases, bunks, clothing, and equipment. After removing this man, Private FORTINO again returned to the compartment, continuing the search for injured. Private FORTINO'S initiative and heroic action are in keeping with the highest traditions of the service. Entered the military service from Maryland.

SOI SCHWARTZ, 32656247, Private, Company B, 4th Medical Battalion. For her service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 28 April 1944. A passenger on a ship which was attacked by enemy surface craft, Private SCHWARTZ voluntarily joined a rescue party to assist injured men trapped below decks. Because of the damaged condition of the ship, Private SCHWARTZ was compelled to go topside to reach the crew's quarters, thus exposing himself to enemy shellfire. Reaching the stern he assisted in fighting a fire which menaced nearby ammunition stores. As the fire diminished, Private SCHWARTZ began to remove casualties from the accumulated debris. For a period of about 45 minutes he assisted in the search for injured within the seaman's quarters despite the hazards presented by the fire, and aided in carrying about 20 men to safety. Private SCHWARTZ'S initiative and heroic action are in keeping with the highest traditions of the service. Entered the military service from New York.

HARRY D. EVANS, JR., 33135188, Technician Fifth Grade, Company C, 4th Medical Battalion. For heroic service in connection with military operation against an enemy of the United States on 28 April 1944. Without regard for his personal safety, Tec 5 EVANS voluntarily assisted in extinguishing a fire dangerously near a ship's damaged ammunition magazine, caused by an enemy torpedo attack. With the fire under control he assisted in removing casualties from beneath debris in the seaman's quarters, remaining in the compartment about 45 minutes. He was one of a party of five which searched the wreckage and assisted in carrying 20 men to safety. Tec 5 EVANS' initiative and heroic action are in keeping with the highest traditions of the service. Entered the military service from Pennsylvania.

When the flight was taken over by Army and Navy Air Forces, Captain GREGORIE did not drop the search, but continued it nearer land. On 25 November 1943, he again risked his life to help effect the rescue of several landing craft which had been disabled by rough weather and stormy seas. The flight of his party led to the location of 3 overturned landing craft, and guided several other boats safely to shore after they had been blown off their course, thus saving many lives. Captain GREGORIE'S initiative and heroic actions are in keeping with the highest traditions of the service. Entered the military service from Florida.

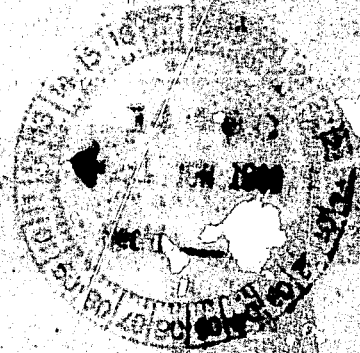
