The 3d Battalion, 22d Infantry Regiment, is cited for outstanding performance of duty in action against the enemy on 6-9 June 1944 during the invasion of the Continent. The battalion landed in assault waves on the beach of the Cotentin Peninsula, France, 6 miles NW of the town of Carpiquet in the face of artillery, machine gun, mortar and small arms fire from organized positions. After making a successful landing, the battalion then advanced E of the beach and high ground between the beach and inundated area to the west. This area was isolated from the remainder of the attacking forces and contained barbed wire, mine obstacles and successive strong points of reinforced pill boxes and other fortifications, each of which were desperately defended, but by skillful, tactical employment of all organic and supporting weapons and with dogged bravery and utter disregard for personal safety they reduced the enemy positions to ruins and advanced the distance of 4 miles. The courage and devotion to duty shown by members of the 3d Battalion, 22d Infantry, in the face of overwhelming odds are worthy of emulation and reflect the highest traditions of the Army of the United States.


