When a patrol he was leading was subjected to intense enemy fire, Sergeant Herrera, disregarding his own safety, skillfully maneuvered his men in an approach upon the enemy positions. As they neared their objective, Sergeant Herrera, noticing an enemy soldier about to fire a rocket at two of the men in the patrol, boldly exposed himself to enemy observation and delivered automatic rifle fire upon the enemy soldier, causing the rocket to explode and resulting in the annihilation of several hostile soldiers. This quick action also enabled Sergeant Herrera and his patrol to take 14 prisoners. In a later action when his platoon was subjected to intense enemy fire, Staff Sergeant Ferrigno exposed himself to the hostile fire to direct mortar fire upon the enemy positions and force the German troops to withdraw. When a tank on which he and other members of his rifle squad were riding sustained a direct hit from enemy antitank gun fire, it was necessary for the rifleman to seek cover. Observing a wounded companion unable to move, Private First Class Lawrence, with utter disregard for his personal safety, exposed himself to the enemy fire to carry the stricken soldier to shelter, thereafter rendering first aid. Private First Class Lawrence lost his life in a subsequent action. The intrepidity, aggressive spirit and superior performance of duty displayed by Private First Class

Lawrence reflect high credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from Arkansas.

Major CHARLES R MURRAH 023874, Infantry, 106th Infantry Division (then assigned to 334th Infantry, 84th Infantry Division), United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 23 November 1944. Having assumed command of the remnants of a decidedly weakened, disorganized battalion which had suffered severe casualties in bitter fighting previously, Major Murrah, when his unit was ordered to assault an important enemy stronghold in the Siegfried Line, personally led an attack which gained 1000 yards in the direction of the objective. Overwhelming odds forced the unit to delay further offensive movements until reinforcements were obtained. The intrepidity, initiative and aggressive leadership displayed by Major Murrah reflect high credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from Georgia.

Captain FRANK R FRINK 01292684, Infantry, 333d Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 8 April 1945. Observing two busloads of German troops endeavoring to escape capture by his unit, Captain Frink, riding in an armored vehicle, delivered withering heavy machine gun and carbine fire on the enemy troops, killing or wounding all of the personnel in both vehicles. Later, he exposed himself to enemy artillery fire to reorganize a battalion column and lead it over unfamiliar terrain to prepare for an attack on an important German city the following day. The intrepid actions, initiative and aggressive fighting spirit displayed by Captain Frink reflect high credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Texas.

Private ALBERT J VELTEN 37182462, 335th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 16 April 1945. A liberated prisoner of war, Private Velten had knowledge of the whereabouts of five complete German companies in the Ruhr pocket east of the Rhine which he believed could be influenced to surrender. Contacting friendly troops, Private Velten daringly led an infantry regiment's S-2 officer deep into the enemy salient to contact the commanding German officers. Impressing upon the enemy officer the uselessness of continued resistance, Private Velten succeeded in negotiating the surrender of these five enemy units. The alert, intelligent action, initiative and superior performance of duty displayed by Private Velten reflect high credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Missouri.

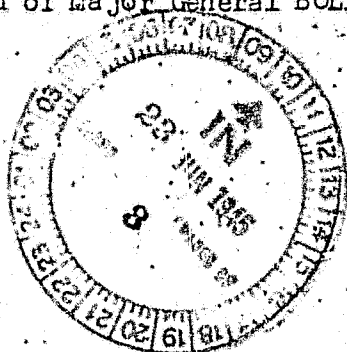

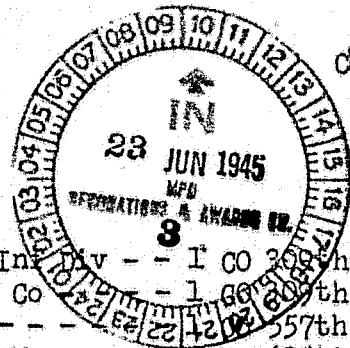

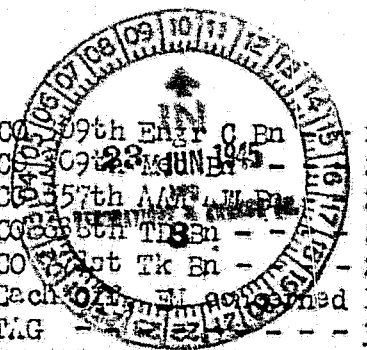

When renewed enemy fire again threatened the advance of his unit, Second Lieutenant Tarkington, using his own initiative, deployed his men in such a manner that the enemy soldiers were forced to take cover, thus neutralizing their fire and permitting the attack to continue. The cool courage, leadership and initiative displayed by Second Lieutenant Tarkington reflect the highest credit upon himself and the armed forces. Entered military service from Virginia.

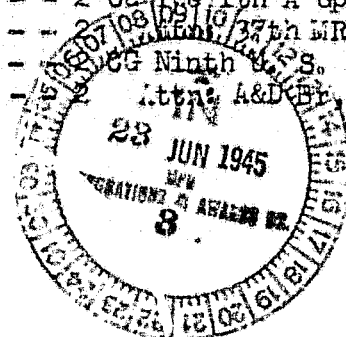

...the second wave of 23 February, the Third Battalion pushed through to launch an attack on a strategically important German town, which they captured in the evening and successfully defended by night against a bitter enemy armored counter-thrust. Two days later the battalion assaulted the next town and two smaller villages and, despite dogged hostile opposition, secured these objectives with a brilliant display of courage and coordination among the troops. When the enemy withdrawal turned into a rout thereafter, the battalion, joining a Task Force, carried their offensive 10 miles in a single day, overrunning several more German towns and villages and taking an enormous toll of the enemy as captured, killed or wounded. On 1 March the battalion attacked and gained control of the next objective, moving on in the motorized column with little additional resistance until two days later when considerable hostile resistance was encountered at night near a large German city. Despite the fact that the troops had obtained little rest during this period, they successfully neutralized the hostile positions and continued their aggressive action with the successful repulsion in bitter hand-to-hand combat of an enemy counterattack on 4 March. The following day elements of the battalion captured another large, strategically located city on the Rhine River, culminating a hazardous but brilliant advance in which the battalion completely smashed enemy forces, destroyed considerable equipment and secured a vast amount of invaluable ground.

The conspicuous bravery, dauntless determination and endurance displayed by the Third Battalion, 334th Infantry, against stubborn enemy resistance enabled them to accomplish a mission which made it possible for Allied forces to press on, deep into Germany, and exterminate the resisting enemy forces. By this exemplary action, the highest credit is reflected upon this unit and the military service of the United States.

In his regiment's first action in November, Major Harlan, as Battalion S-3, skillfully maneuvered troops of his unit and when reinforcements were needed to protect a flank, he courageously moved under intense fire to lead a reserve platoon to that sector and establish the men in carefully selected positions. Later, in the Ardennes, when the situation was critical and little knowledge of enemy positions was available, Major Harlan, disdainng the danger of ambush and sniper fire, personally conducted several reconnaissance missions contributing extensively to successes realized by his unit. The initiative, courage and outstanding performance of duty displayed by Major Harlan reflect high credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from New York.

Captain MICHAEL J NOONAN O1011285, Infantry (Armored), 771st Tank Battalion (Attached 84th Infantry Division), United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 14 April 1945. When a column of his unit was subjected to intense enemy artillery fire and a subsequent counterattack while preparing to move from a German town, Captain Noonan, exposing himself to enemy positions less than 200 yards away, organized a defense and committed his antitank gun platoon to sustain the enemy attack until a tank company in the area was notified and successfully repulsed the hostile thrust. The prompt action, intrepidity

Staff Sergeant GEORGE R FIECOAT 15076231, 638th Tank Destroyer Battalion (Attached 84th Infantry Division), United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 7 March 1945. When a reconnaissance platoon which he was leading in advance of an infantry attack upon a German town observed an enemy ambush of considerable strength, Staff Sergeant Fiecoat quickly deployed his men to protect the flanks of the approaching infantry elements. He then assisted in the deployment of the main force, personally directing two tank destroyers, supporting the infantry, into positions from which they delivered effective fire which contributed to the disorganization of the hostile resistance. The courage under fire, initiative and prompt, exemplary action displayed by Staff Sergeant Fiecoat reflect high credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from Ohio.

Only when this difficult operation was completed did Staff Sergeant Reed submit himself to medical treatment and evacuation. The intrepidity, leadership qualities and superior performance of duty displayed by Staff Sergeant Reed reflect high credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from California.

Private First Class EDWARD A SPECHT 33768154, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 5 April 1945. When six men were wounded by enemy artillery fire, Private First Class Specht, disregarding his safety under the heavy hostile fire, administered medical aid to the soldiers and removed them to the cellar of a nearby building. While attending to the wounded, two trucks loaded with demolitions were hit and set afire blocking the exit of the building. 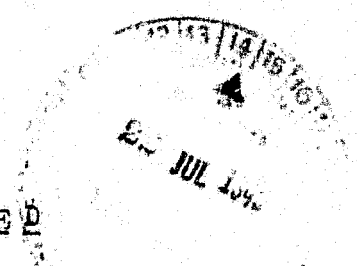
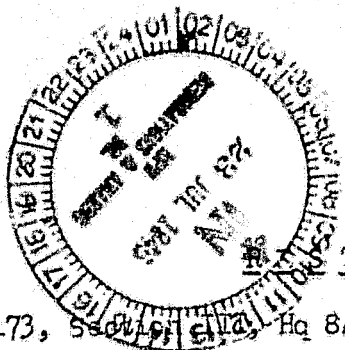

The aggressive action, intrepidity and determined fighting spirit displayed by Captain Bolling permitted his men to return safely to friendly lines and reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. I - AWARD OF SILVER STAR MEDAL (POSTHUMOUS): By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, and Circular 21, Headquarters Seventh Army, 17 June 1945, the Silver Star Medal is awarded posthumously to:

Technician Fifth Grade ROBERT R DURLING 39115177, 84th Reconnaissance Troop Mechanized, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 24 - 28 November 1944. When half tracks were needed to evacuate mounting casualties during a bitter phase of combat in the Siegfried line, Technician Fifth Grade Durling, with another soldier, drove one of the vehicles to the location, despite withering enemy fire of all types. He then voluntarily exposed himself to the enemy fire and, for four successive days with little rest, assisted in the evacuation of wounded personnel. Technician Fifth Grade Durling lost his life on the fourth day while continuing this intrepid, unselfish action, when he fell victim to a near direct hit by enemy artillery fire. The courage, commendable conduct and unswerving devotion to duty under perilous circumstances displayed by Technician Fifth Grade Durling reflect high credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from California.

II - AWARDS OF SILVER STAR MEDAL: By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, and Circular 21, Headquarters Seventh Army, 17 June 1945, the silver Star Medal is awarded to:
