STAFF SERGEANT WILLIAM V. CAUDLE, 35516298, Infantry, 330th Infantry, United States Army. For distinguishing himself by meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 4 July 1944 to 10 December 1944, in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, and Germany. Sergeant Caudle has performed his duties as a squad leader in a highly commendable and exemplary manner. Throughout the Normandy campaign, the campaign of Northern France, and Germany, Sergeant Caudle worked long hours under adverse and hazardous conditions to maintain a high standard of efficiency to keep his squad in operation against the enemy. As a squad leader his first thoughts have been for his men and missions assigned to him. Sergeant Caudle's willingness to work under such conditions in a cheerful and eager manner reflects great devotion to duty, and is in keeping with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Ohio. Residence, Rosedale.

PRIVATE FIRST CLASS ANTHONY A. DERAMO, 33307251, Infantry, 330th Infantry, United States Army. For distinguishing himself by meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 4 July 1944 to 4 December 1944, in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, and Germany. Private Deramo performed his duties as a Cannoneer in a highly commendable manner. He has shown undue energy and courage even though working under adverse conditions. Private Deramo's willingness to carry out his duties and his uncomplaining attitude has been an inspiration to his fellow comrades and bears the highest degree of credit to himself and to the military service. Entered military service from Pennsylvania. Residence, Pittick, Pennsylvania.

FIRST LIEUTENANT SAMUEL J. FRANDINO, 01301466, Infantry, 330th Infantry, United States Army. For distinguishing himself by meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 4 July 1944 to 7 August 1944, in France. Lieutenant Frandino performed his duties as platoon Leader in a highly commendable and exemplary manner. Throughout the different campaigns, Lieutenant Frandino worked long hours under adverse and hazardous conditions to maintain a high standard of efficiency within his platoon. Lieutenant Frandino's leadership, courage, initiative and sound judgment has been an inspiration to the entire organization and has won the confidence and admiration of all the men who have worked with him. His willingness to work, and his cheerful and eager manner reflects his great devotion to duty which will long be remembered by those who have had the pleasure of knowing him, and is in keeping with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from New York. Resi: Whitehall, New York.

TECHNICAL SERGEANT MYRON D. HAWORTH, 35665759, Infantry, 330th Infantry, United States Army. For distinguishing himself by heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 17 April 1945, in Germany. Sergeant Haworth performed duties with a high degree of efficiency as a forward observer and was constantly subjected to enemy small arms and artillery fire. He accurately adjusted cannon fire under very difficult conditions for which he received the highest praise. On April 17, while attempting to gain a dangerous vantage point in order to observe cannon fire, Sergeant Haworth was fatally wounded. The unwavering devotion to duty, courage and initiative reflects great credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Ohio. Resi: Greenville, Ohio.

PRIVATE BENNET H. LYNNAN, 16177429, Infantry, 329th Infantry, United States Army. For distinguishing himself by heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 25 December 1944 to 30 December 1944 near Rochefort, Belgium. While his company was isolated for ten days and nights, Private Lynnan's squad drove off a German counter-attack, including a German half-track and a Mark IV tank. Private Lynnan personally accounted for a German half-track with rifle grenades, and also eliminated an enemy patrol with his rifle. Surrounded on all sides and cut off from his company CP, Private Lynnan was inspirational in rallying his men to beat off repeated enemy counter-attacks under heavy enemy fire. He consolidated his

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position, and established contact with his company. Private Lyman's heroic efforts were instrumental in preventing the Germans from over-running the CP and possible elimination of the entire company. His actions merit the highest praise and are in keeping with the finest traditions of the United States Army. Entered military service from Michigan. Residence: Ontario, Canada.

TECHNICIAN FIFTH GRADE HOWARD R. VINCENT, 35739911, Infantry, 330th Infantry, United States Army. For distinguishing himself by meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 4 July 1944 to 10 April 1945, in France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Germany. Technician Fifth Grade Vincent performed his duties as a Truck Driver in a highly commendable and exemplary manner. Throughout the campaigns of Normandy, Northern France, the Ardennes and Germany, Technician Fifth Grade Vincent has shown undue energy and courage even though working under adverse and hazardous conditions. His courage, initiative and sound judgment as a truck driver won the confidence of the men in his squad and reflects the highest degree of credit to himself and to the military service. Entered military service from West Virginia. Residence: Homestead, West Virginia.

STAFF SERGEANT ~~JOHN C. APPERSON~~ 3503456, Infantry, 329th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 2 January 1945, in Belgium. Sergeant Cottle volunteered to reconnoiter a route of advance and locate the position of enemy tanks preparatory to a night attack by Company L. In the successful accomplishment of his mission he was killed while leading a bazooka team forward in an attempt to knock out the enemy tanks. His cool and courageous aggressiveness, with utter disregard for his own safety, inspired his men to continue the attack until the enemy was routed. Sergeant Cottle's conspicuous gallantry and personal bravery reflect the highest credit upon himself and exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Arkansas. Residence: Peach Orchard, Arkansas.

With outstanding courage Private Klunk volunteered to man his gun alone while the rest of his unit withdrew. In the artillery barrage that followed, he was killed while gallantly covering the withdrawal. His outstanding devotion to duty, courage and initiative reflect the highest credit on himself and exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.**

TECHNICAL SERGEANT ALBERT J. 

CAPTAIN PERRY E. BOVE, O-300266, Infantry, 330th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action against an enemy of the United States on 6 July 1944 in France. On 6 July 1944, Company "K" was subjected to intense enemy artillery and mortar fire after participating in a night attack on the town of Culot, France. At about 0100, Captain Bove, with disregard for his safety and in full view of the attacking enemy, stood in an open spot illuminated by a burning building and organized a new line of defense of men from his own company and from other companies and disorganized units. From there he ordered the setting up and firing of machine guns, placed riflemen in position, and with intense enemy fire around him, ordered and encouraged his men to take up designated positions and directed their fire. Due in great part to Captain Bove's bravery, the enemy's counter-attack was slowed down, which materially aided in the establishment of a stronger defensive line to resist further enemy effort. Captain Bove's outstanding gallantry and disregard for his own personal safety reflect the highest credit upon himself and exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Vermont.

AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL.....SECTION I

I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL--Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and Circular No 2, United States Forces in Austria, dated 26 August 1945, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Technical Sergeant Robert Zager (then Private First Class) 31470100, Infantry, 331st Infantry, United States Army, for distinguishing himself by heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 2 April 1945, at Hamm, Germany. Technical Sergeant Zager, then a gunner, took command of his machine gun squad and directed them to a position under direct enemy observation and heavy mortar and small arms fire to help the leading elements of "K" Company who at the time were pinned down by fire from an enemy machine gun. With complete disregard for personal safety, Technical Sergeant Zager put his gun into action and calmly directed fire on the enemy position. During the fire fight Technical Sergeant Zager was wounded, but remained at his gun putting effective fire on the enemy position again to give further support to the advance of "K" Company and thus enabled them to reach their objective. Only after the objective was taken and a defense set up in the railroad station would he allow himself to leave his gun and receive medical aid. His courage and leadership and devotion to duty merits the highest praise and upholds the finest traditions of the Military Service. Entered the military service from Massachusetts.

II. AWARD OF PURPLE HEART MEDAL--Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and Circular No 2, United States Forces in Austria, dated 26 August 1945, the Purple Heart Medal is awarded to:

Sergeant Leon Romaner, 42116499, Infantry, 329th Infantry, United States Army, for wounds received in action on 25 January 1945 in Belgium.

First Lieutenant Leonard Stein, O-1326433, Infantry, 330th Infantry, United States Army, for wounds received in action on 7 April 1945 in Germany.

Private First Class Louis Stellato, 42119400, Quartermaster, 3d Division Quartermaster Company, United States Army, (then 101st Infantry, 28th Infantry Division) for wounds received in action on 5 January 1945 in Germany.

For distinguishing himself by gallantry in action in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 16 January 1945, in Belgium. During a tank supported attack near Bovigny, the leading tank, accompanied by a squad of riflemen, received a direct hit from a concealed enemy tank. Six of the riflemen were so seriously wounded that they were unable to move back for treatment. Realizing that the proximity of the wounded men to the enemy position made rescue under cover of fire impossible, a Chaplain took the Red Cross flag from his jeep and indicated intention of going to the men. Private First Class Maheras and another medical aidman volunteered to accompany him in spite of the Chaplain's warning that the flag was no guarantee of safe conduct. Under direct observation of two German machine gun positions and the enemy tank, Private First Class Maheras and his comrades rendered first aid and then evacuated the six casualties. Two of whom were litter cases. The courage and disregard for personal safety displayed by this enlisted man reflect great credit upon him and are in keeping with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered the military service from Illinois.

MARTIN L MOHRDIECK, jr., Corporal (Army Serial No. 39854042), Company A, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For heroism at Camp Howze, Texas, on 1 June 1943.

During the construction of a ponton bridge over North Lake, Camp Howze, Texas, by Company A, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, Private MERLE H HARTZELL, a member of the organization, dropped into the water to push a raft. A strong wind carried the raft away and Private HARTZELL became frightened and sank. Corporal MOHRDIECK, perceiving this situation from another raft some eighty yards distant, with complete disregard for his own safety dived into the water without removing his clothing, swam to the point at which the drowning man had disappeared, dived for him and brought him from the bottom of the lake to the surface. Private HARTZELL was placed in a lifeboat where Corporal MOHRDIECK performed artificial respiration to such good effect that Private HARTZELL commenced breathing by the time the lifeboat reached the shore. COMMENDATION

1. During the conduct of the battalion field exercise test on 17 July 1943 a charge of dynamite, which was to simulate artillery fire, failed to explode. Without knowledge of the existence of this unexploded charge the machine gun squad led by Corporal CHARLES H. COLLINS, 39614820, Company K, 334th Infantry, established its position in the vicinity of the dynamite which shortly thereafter, for an unexplained reason, exploded, knocking Corporal COLLINS to the ground with the loss of his helmet, and temporarily incapacitating the gunner and assistant gunner of the squad. Corporal COLLINS immediately picked himself up and set about determining the extent of the injuries sustained by his squad. When relieved of this duty by the arrival of company aid men, he reformed his squad, designating his ammunition carriers as gunner and assistant, himself carrying the ammunition boxes, and continued the attack. The assignment shortly thereafter of an additional man to his squad permitted him to resume with undivided attention his duties as squad leader.

2. The Division Commander takes pleasure in commending Corporal COLLINS for his display of the superior military virtues of determination, initiative, resourcefulness and devotion to duty under trying circumstances. Recommendation for the award of the Legion of Merit to Corporal COLLINS is being forwarded to the War Department.

Though wounded by shell fragments about the face, neck and arm, and bleeding profusely, he continued to lead his platoon in the face of enemy fire until he was certain the proper deployment of his men had been made, which resulted in the successful accomplishment of the platoon's mission. The high qualities of leadership, cool courage and faithful devotion to duty, without thought of his own safety, were a profound inspiration to his men and were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from Alabama.~~

Staff Sergeant LOUIS R YOUNANS 6927301, 333d Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 20 November 1944. When his battalion was stopped by the resistance offered by four enemy pillboxes, Staff Sergeant Youmans, displaying exceptional skill, high personal courage and a comprehensive knowledge of the tactics required, succeeded in capturing the four pillboxes and all the occupants, thus removing an obstacle from the path of the battalion's advance and allowing it to complete its mission. Entered military service from Georgia.

Private First Class CLAUDE R CUTLIP 15316065, 333d Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 21 November 1944. When heavy enemy mortar, machine gun and artillery fire had temporarily checked his company, Private First Class Cutlip, together with another soldier, voluntarily left his fox hole, ran an estimated 400 yards up a slope, under severe fire, to a pillbox, threw grenades in the openings and forced the remaining occupants to surrender. Despite wounds received, Private First Class Cutlip, displaying marked heroism, initiative and disregard for personal safety, captured the pillbox and eight prisoners and aided in clearing the way for the advance of his company. Entered military service from West Virginia.

Private OLIN W ROSE 15341364, 333d Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 21 November 1944. When heavy enemy mortar, machine gun and artillery fire had temporarily checked his company's advance, Private Rose, together with another soldier, voluntarily left his foxhole, ran an estimated 400 yards up a slope, under intense fire, to a pillbox, threw grenades in the openings and forced the remaining occupants to surrender. By the display of marked heroism, initiative and disregard for personal safety, Private Rose captured the pillbox and eight prisoners and aided in clearing the way for the advance of his company. Entered military service from Indiana.

Sergeant LEROY E WILKES 36299440, 334th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 19 November 1944. Sergeant Wilkes, with five of his men, held a corner of a town in Germany for 18 hours, inflicting losses on the enemy, killing many and capturing twelve prisoners. When the town was recaptured by American forces, Sergeant Wilkes brought all of his men back to the company uninjured. The initiative, courage, and devotion to duty of this enlisted man reflect the highest credit upon himself and upon the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from Wisconsin.

Second Lieutenant ROBERT N MILFORD Jr 0510X5, Infantry, 335th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 13 November 1944. While in charge of a patrol whose mission was to reconnoiter enemy pillboxes, under cover of darkness and constantly harassed by enemy fire, Second Lieutenant Milford, by a display of superior qualities of leadership and courage, led the patrol to a successful accomplishment of its mission and secured information which was of material value to future operations, at the same time accounting for two of the enemy probably killed. His conduct was in accordance with the highest standards of the military service and served as an inspiration to the troops. Entered military service from Illinois.

Staff Sergeant BURTON MATTHEWS 38393324, 335th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany 12 November 1944. Staff Sergeant Matthews was leading a volunteer patrol behind enemy lines whose mission was the reconnaissance of a heavily fortified enemy position and a road vital to future operations. Encountering an enemy pillbox, Staff Sergeant Matthews, without regard for his personal safety, crawled close enough to kill the enemy sentry when challenged. He then aided in killing an estimated three additional Germans by throwing grenades and firing his sub-machine gun into the aperture of the pillbox. The patrol later came under heavy enemy fire and Staff Sergeant Matthews, stunned by a grenade, became separated from his patrol. He nevertheless returned to his lines without help under heavy mortar and machine gun fire. His calmness, courageous action and indifference to personal safety were decisive factors in the successful completion of the mission which was of material value to future operations. His conduct was in accordance with the highest standards of military service. Entered military service from Oklahama.

Sergeant JOHN O GROUSE Jr 37434070, 335th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany 12 November 1944. Sergeant Grouse was assistant leader of a volunteer patrol behind enemy lines whose mission was the reconnaissance of a heavily fortified enemy position and a road vital to future operations. Encountering an enemy pillbox, Sergeant Grouse aided in killing an estimated three Germans. Assuming command when the patrol leader became separated from the patrol during heavy enemy fire, Sergeant Grouse successfully led his men back to his lines and at the same time assisted in carrying a seriously injured patrol member to safety. His coolness, courageous action and disregard for personal safety were outstanding factors in the accomplishment of the patrol which contributed materially to future operations and reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from Iowa.

Sergeant CHARLES B KENDALL 6944375, 326th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany 24 November 1944. Charged with maintaining communications with the field artillery unit supporting an infantry battalion to which his liaison section was attached, Sergeant Kendall, although wounded by a shell fragment, skillfully directed his section in the maintenance of communications during an enemy artillery barrage. His bold, rapid action and initiative, with complete disregard for his own safety, undoubtedly contributed materially to the success of the action against the enemy. Entered military service from Maryland.

Technician Fourth Grade REED E HART 38325534, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 23 November 1944. Seeing a comrade who had been wounded by sniper fire and realizing that his assistance was badly needed, Technician Fourth Grade Hart, without regard for his own welfare, left his place of comparative safety and, under intense sniper fire, brought his wounded comrade to a place of safety. The initiative and courageous action displayed by Technician Fourth Grade Hart, without doubt, resulted in saving the life of a fellow soldier. Entered military service from Oklahoma.

Staff Sergeant JOHN B KENDREW 7025892, 309th Medical Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 23 November 1944. Although his duty was that of mess sergeant, he insisted that he be allowed to go to the front lines as a replacement for an exhausted litter bearer. As such he led in the evacuation of more than 20 casualties trapped in a pillbox for many hours, carrying the wounded on his back when other bearers were not available. He also led the walking wounded from a pillbox to the aid station under adverse conditions and in enemy territory. The unselish devotion to duty, fidelity and courageous action exhibited by Staff Sergeant Kendrew reflect immeasurable credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Private PAUL E PROUDFOOT 39614803, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry against the enemy in Germany, 23 November 1944. When his mine detector failed to operate while removing enemy mines in the advance of a long column of friendly tanks, Private Proudfoot, under heavy small arms fire, quickly resorted to the use of his bayonet as a probe, detonating numerous mines by rifle fire and removing plastic ones with scraps of wire. This bold, rapid action was a vital factor in the success of the tank attack which followed against enemy artillery and mortar positions. The initiative, ingenuity and courage displayed by this soldier reflect the highest credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from Montana.

As platoon leader, Sergeant Klebofski, disregarding his own safety and exposed to enemy fire, advanced down an open road removing enemy mines in front of tanks at the same time affording the tanks rifle protection. During this courageous action, Sergeant Klebofski was killed by mortar fire. The fearless behavior, faithful devotion to

Technical Sergeant WILFRED CLEMENTI 32105485, 334th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany 18 November 1944. While leading his platoon against a strong enemy position, Technical Sergeant Clementi moved forward aggressively under heavy and intensive enemy fire and engaged personally in hand-to-hand combat with the enemy, killing at least two with his bayonet before he, himself, was killed. His example of courage and self-sacrifice so inspired those under his command that the action resulted in the complete rout of the enemy. Entered military service from New Jersey.

Technical Sergeant FRED FLUTY 32105485, 334th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 18 November 1944. While his platoon was in action against the enemy, it was subjected to heavy sniper and machine gun fire. Technical Sergeant Fluty set an outstanding individual example to all his men by being the first man forward in the assault on the enemy position. In the ensuing action he was fatally wounded. His exceptional display of individual heroism and aggressiveness undoubtedly resulted in encouraging his men in the attack. This courageous action of Technical Sergeant Fluty reflects great honor on the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from New York.

Technical Sergeant WILLIAM H KUNST 39117242, 335th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 24 November 1944. When a heavy artillery barrage was placed by the enemy on the area occupied by his platoon, Technical Sergeant Kunst repeatedly exposed himself to enemy fire checking the position of his men and reassuring them. He then moved his platoon to a safe position and while doing so was killed by an enemy shell. The courage, unwavering devotion to duty and initiative exhibited by Technical Sergeant Kunst without doubt saved the lives of several of his platoon and constituted an exemplary act for his fellow soldiers. 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

Staff Sergeant ROBERT J COONEY 39113559, 335th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 13 November 1944. As second in command of a patrol whose mission was to reconnoiter enemy pillboxes, Staff Sergeant Cooney displayed rare courage and initiative in assisting the patrol leader account for three of the enemy probably killed while making a detailed investigation of an enemy pillbox. Although constantly harassed by enemy fire, the patrol reached its objective, successfully completed its mission and obtained information which was of material value to future operations. Staff Sergeant Cooney's boldness and coolness served as an inspiration to all who participated in the mission. Entered military service from California.

First Lieutenant EUGENE E MORSE JR 01060218, Corps of Engineers, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 19 November 1944. While engaged with his platoon in clearing mine fields by hand, enemy machine gun fire was suddenly encountered. Realizing that most of his men were exposed to the fire with little or no protection, attracted enemy fire to himself and though wounded four times, afforded his men an opportunity to seek and maintain improved positions. Later the platoon destroyed the enemy machine gun position. The conspicuous courage and valor, the high devotion to duty and inspiring leadership exhibited by this officer, without doubt, resulted in saving the lives of many of his men and is in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from Minnesota.

He then moved his squad to a safe position and while doing so was killed by an enemy shell. The courage, unswerving devotion to duty and initiative exhibited by Staff Sergeant Russell, without doubt saved the lives of several of his squad and constituted an exemplary act for his fellow soldiers. 

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


During an attack, Captain Gieszl remained in front of his company during the entire advance, routing enemy snipers and when a strong enemy machine gun position threatened to halt the advance, he leaped to his feet, without regard for his personal safety, and crawled open terrain to flank the gun position. Though seriously wounded in this action and despite severe pain, he calmly continued to direct his company's advance until evacuated. The aggressiveness, heroic behavior and capable leadership displayed by Captain Gieszl were an inspiration to the troops and in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Private First Class JOHN PATTERSON 399046, 333d Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 24-25 November 1944. Following an engagement with the enemy, there were a number of casualties in two pillboxes requiring evacuation before daylight because of direct enemy machine gun fire on the position. There was a shortage of litters and litter bearers and to reach a medical aid station it was necessary to travel approximately one mile, about 400 yards of which required crawling through muddy trenches in bright moonlight under enemy observation and the remaining distance was subject to constant enemy fire. Private First Class Patterson negotiated this hazardous and difficult journey on two separate occasions, each time assisted by two different soldiers.

The personal courage, aggressive action and superior leadership of this officer reflect the highest credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from the District of Columbia.

Staff Sergeant CLARENCE E STEPHENS 14126141, 334th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 30 November 1944. When the advance of his company was temporarily checked by enemy machine gun and sniper fire, Staff Sergeant Stephens moved forward close to an enemy emplacement, threw two hand grenades and killed three Germans as they attempted to leave the position, thus enabling the company to continue its advance. The cool courage and commendable conduct displayed by Staff Sergeant Stephens exemplify those soldierly qualities which are in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from South Carolina.

Staff Sergeant JUNIOR L SHREVE 33405330, 335th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 29 November 1944. Later, together with another soldier, he successfully wiped out a counterattack which had developed in the rear of his squad. Entered military service from Massachusetts.

He also assisted in the removal of a deactivated explosive charge from an important river bridge and in the company of two officers and several enlisted men, he took part in the capture of one German officer and 47 enlisted men. The courage, initiative and commendable performance of duty displayed by Staff Sergeant Smith reflect high credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from California.

Technician Fifth Grade BERTRAM G BLEVENS 35693072, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 30 November 1944. 



Second Lieutenant BILLY B SLOAN 01322276 Infantry, 333d Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 22 November 1944. When his platoon was making an attack in open terrain under enemy observation, and it was temporarily checked by machine gun, artillery and mortar fire, Second Lieutenant Sloan, observing a point which afforded defilede from the machine gun fire and some cover from the artillery and mortar fire, led six of his men in an assault on the position which he discovered was occupied by enemy riflemen and a machine gun. Despite this obstacle, he and his small force succeeded in driving the enemy from the area, making it possible for his platoon, and later the entire company, to occupy the position. The cool courage, aggressive action and capable leadership of Second Lieutenant Sloan served as an inspiration to his men and was in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Although under direct enemy observation and machine gun fire, he succeeded in getting through and returning with the supplies and food. His courage and devotion to duty with complete disregard for his own safety reflect high credit on him and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Wisconsin.

Second Lieutenant THOMAS D HARRIS 01326159 Infantry, 334th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 18 November 1944. When a portion of his platoon had been cut off by the enemy, Second Lieutenant Harris, completely disregarding his own safety, made his way through an intense enemy artillery and mortar barrage to effect the rescue of his men. The devotion to duty, courage and aggressive leadership displayed by this officer reflect high credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from New York.



I. AWARDS OF SILVER STAR MEDAL: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, and Memorandum 3d, Headquarters, Ninth United States Army, 8 September 1944, as amended, the Silver Star Medal is awarded to:

First Lieutenant HOLLOWELL B BROOK 01171921, Field artillery, 909th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 29 November 1944. When information was received that seven Tiger tanks were being employed by the enemy during a counterattack, First Lieutenant Brook volunteered to establish an observation point from which fire could be directed on the enemy tanks. Although subjected to enemy machine gun and artillery fire, at times only fifty yards away, he succeeded in directing artillery fire which destroyed two tanks, definitely put another out of action, and resulted in the repulse of the enemy counterattack. The initiative, resourcefulness and cool courage displayed by this officer reflect high credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Mississippi.

Captain GEORGE R DOUGHTIE 0399283, Corps of Engineers, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 20 November 1944. While on reconnaissance for enemy mine fields with another officer, Captain Doughtie, although subjected to severe enemy small arms fire, without regard for his personal safety, assisted in clearing mines by hand in the path of tanks. He also assisted in detonating a charge wired to an important bridge which made it possible for friendly vehicles to proceed at once. Completing that mission, Captain Doughtie then assisted his fellow officer in the capture of 47 German soldiers. The boldness, initiative and courageous action on the part of Captain Doughtie reflect the highest credit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from Georgia.

Captain FRANK J KRUSE Jr 01106285, Corps of Engineers, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 30 November 1944. While on reconnaissance at night searching for one of his platoons which had been cut off and encircled by the enemy, Captain Kruse was seriously wounded by enemy machine gun fire. He, nevertheless, continued on, located the platoon, received first aid treatment and then directed the platoon to the company bivouac area. The bravery under fire, unswerving devotion to duty and leadership displayed by Captain Kruse exemplify those commendable qualities which are in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

Private JAMES D FOLSON 38591239, 309th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 29 November 1944 to 1 December 1944. Performing duty as a medical aid man, Private Folson, though under intense enemy mortar and machine gun fire, successfully removed wounded men to a place of safety and administered first aid. He then volunteered to remain in a village which was still under severe enemy sniper fire with three wounded men until they were evacuated two days later. Entered military service from Oklahoma.
