CHRISTIAN H. CLARKE, JR., 018213, Colonel, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 9 November 1944 in the vicinity of Cattenom, France. During the crossing of the Moselle River, Colonel Clarke, Regimental Commander, overcame seemingly insurmountable obstacles to lead his Regiment across the raging current. On the far side of the river, he coordinated the Battalions for the continuation of the attack, and at risk of his life, personally led Company * * in a successful envelopment of Fort Koenigsmacher. His courageous and aggressive action aided his Regiment in seizing the Fort, killing 100 enemy and capturing 275 prisoners. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Georgia.

ROBERT B. SMITH, 01319672, First Lieutenant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 16 November 1944 in the vicinity of Distroff, France. During a counterattack by a strong enemy force, the forward Battalion Command Post was placed in an exposed position. First Lieutenant Smith, Anti-Tank Platoon Leader, armed with both rifle and carbine, directed defence. At risk of his life, he directed the action against the repeated attacks in such an expert and courageous manner that the enemy was finally repulsed. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Kansas.

II--Award, Posthumous, of Silver Star--Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Silver Star is posthumously awarded to:

JACK M. DEMING, 01283733, Captain, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 11 November 1944 in the vicinity of Koenigsmacher, France. A platoon of Company * *, 358th Infantry, suffered heavy casualties, including the Platoon Leader, Sergeant, and Guide. Captain Deming, Company Commander, regrouped the platoon, organized a demolition party and chose

Captain Deming's courageous leadership greatly bolstered the morale of the depleted platoon at a most critical time. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Michigan.

GERALD N. FAZE, 01322588, First Lieutenant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 13 November 1944 in the vicinity of Koenigsmacher, France. During an attack on the town, the advance of Company **, 358th Infantry, was executed so rapidly that confusion resulted and liaison between the units became impaired. First Lieutenant Faze, at risk of his life, proceeded from platoon to platoon through intense artillery fire and, while coordinating and organizing the scattered elements of the company, was mortally wounded by an enemy shell fragment. His courageous action, though at sacrifice of his life, greatly facilitated the accomplishment of his company's mission. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Ohio.

CARL E. POTTS, 39142690, Private First Class, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 10 November 1944 in the vicinity of Koenigsmacher, France. While Private First Class Potts was prosecuting a demolition assignment with an officer, the officer was wounded by a concealed enemy rifleman. Private First Class Potts, cognizant of the probability of fire from the same sniper, and at risk of his life, advanced through an open field to the wounded officer and, while evacuating him to a position of safety, was wounded by the enemy rifleman. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from California.

III--Award of Silver Star--Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Silver Star is awarded to:

EDWARD J. BLAKE, 01290188, Captain, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action 10 November 1944 in the vicinity of Fort Koenigsmacher, France. During the attack on the fort and despite intense enemy machine gun, bazooka and small arms fire, Captain Blake, Company Commander, with the aid of companions, neutralized an enemy shelter point by demolishing the steel door and stair case with explosives. His courageous and aggressive action deprived the enemy the use of the shelter point, forced them to withdraw further into the fort and hastened their subsequent rout and surrender. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Michigan.

WILLIAM T. RAFFERTY, 01293832, First Lieutenant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 9 November 1944 in the vicinity of Koenigsmacher, France. In an attack on the enemy, First Lieutenant Rafferty, Platoon Leader, directed his men so skilfully and aggressively that the platoon destroyed two enemy anti-tank guns, captured three pillboxes and one gun emplacement. Later, when the enemy attempted a counterattack, First Lieutenant

Rafferty personally led a successful repulsion of the attack. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Ohio.

HOWARD L. PEMBERTON, 37179710, Technical Sergeant, (then Staff Sergeant) Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 24 November 1944 in the vicinity of Butzdorf, Germany. Technical Sergeant Pemberton led a machine gun section 300 yards across an open area into the town while the enemy concentrated fire on the party. Upon arrival in the town, he quickly chose a house and deployed the men at various windows to fortify the building against enemy counterattacks. Technical Sergeant Pemberton personally repulsed several enemy attacks during the ensuing 24 hours. When the ammunition supply was critically low, he again subjected himself to enemy fire and procured a machine gun and ammunition abandoned by the enemy. Technical Sergeant Pemberton's courageous leadership greatly inspired the men to hold the tactically-important position until reinforcements arrived. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Missouri.

WALTER P. SHANK, 33412485, Technical Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 14 November 1944 in the vicinity of Distroff, France. During an enemy counterattack, when the Platoon Leader was mortally wounded, Technical Sergeant Shank, Platoon Sergeant, assumed command. At risk of his life, he subjected himself to continuous enemy fire, traversed enemy observed areas and exercised ingenious leadership. When the platoon was pinned down by enemy machine gun fire, Technical Sergeant Shank infiltrated 75 yards to silence it with a hand grenade. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

ROBERT L. WEATHERLY, 37440377, Technical Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 24 November 1944 in the vicinity of Butzdorf, Germany. A group of nine men were isolated in a building and subjected to repeated fierce attack by a numerically superior enemy. Technical Sergeant Weatherly, Platoon Leader, at risk of his life, rallied and encouraged the squad to repel the assaults and personally killed 3 of the attackers. As a result of his prolonged courageous leadership and despite seemingly insurmountable odds, the probability of death or capture of the men was averted. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Iowa.

EDWARD FLYNN, 31370043, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 24 November 1944 in the vicinity of Butzdorf, Germany. During the attack, Staff Sergeant Flynn (then Sergeant) sealed the embrasures of several enemy pillboxes which enabled his Platoon to eliminate them. Staff Sergeant Flynn, then, at risk of his life, subjected himself to continuous enemy machine gun and sniper fire, traversed an open area and administered first-aid to seven wounded men. He killed three enemy snipers who attacked him while he rendered first-aid to the casualties. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Massachusetts.

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(Sec III Award of Silver Star, GO 213 Hq 90th Inf Div 16 Dec 44 contd)

JAMES G. LIVINGSTON, 13013550, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 24 November 1944 in the vicinity of Tettingen, Germany. In an assault on enemy defensive positions, Staff Sergeant Livingston, Squad Leader, led his squad toward a nearby enemy communications trench, personally killing one of the enemy during the advance. With the aid of newly-arrived reinforcements, Staff Sergeant Livingston directed the advance in the trench, using enemy concussion grenades to weaken the opposition. As a direct result of this action, 99 of the enemy troops were killed, captured or wounded. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

WINIFRED RIGGS, 35933519, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 10 November 1944 in the vicinity of Basse Ham, France. When a squad of Company * *, 358th Infantry, discovered the enemy had made a night infiltration and established two machine gun positions in a nearby house. Staff Sergeant Riggs, Squad Leader, immediately deployed the squad in a defensive formation. He then crept to the enemy-occupied building and with hand grenades destroyed the two enemy guns and crew and captured twelve prisoners. His gallantry was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from West Virginia.

MAX J. SCHULTZ, 36889620, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 11 November 1944 in the vicinity of Koenigsmacher, France. During two successive counterattacks by a numerically superior enemy, Staff Sergeant Schultz, at risk of his life, remained at his position. By means of accurate grenade and rifle fire, succeeded in killing 14 enemy and repulsing the enemy attacks. The determination and courage displayed by Staff Sergeant Schultz was an inspiration to all who witnessed them. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Michigan.

JAMES M. WHITEMAN, 33320968, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 11 November 1944 in the vicinity of Koenigsmacher, France. During an attack on the town, the rapid advance of a platoon of Company * *, 358th Infantry, was temporarily impeded by machine gun fire from an enemy pillbox. Staff Sergeant Whiteman, Squad Leader, at risk of his life, proceeded to within range of the enemy and silenced the fire with a bazooka. His courageous action enabled the platoon to continue its advance and facilitated the accomplishment of its mission. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

HECTOR B. LEE, 34851978, Private First Class, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action 16 November 1944 in the vicinity of Distroff, France. During a heavy enemy counterattack, the personnel of * * * Company, 358th Infantry, were subjected to direct fire from enemy half-tracks. Private First Class Lee, Truck Driver, at risk of his life, subjected himself to heavy enemy fire of various calibers and disabled the enemy vehicles with accurate bazooka fire. His intrepid and aggressive action averted the probability of death or capture of 16 men and materially aided in the capture of 6 enemy soldiers. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from North Carolina.

During an advance on enemy pill-boxes, Private First Class Lewis, Automatic Rifleman, killed fifteen of the enemy and cut off a vital enemy communication trench. Alone, at risk of his life, he advanced through heavy small arms fire to destroy an enemy fort, kill at least two more of the enemy and capture sixteen. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Tennessee.

A. L. McDONALD, 38327900, Private First Class, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 23 November 1944 in the vicinity of Borg, Germany. During the attack, enemy machine gun fire threatened the advance of Company * *, 358th Infantry. Private First Class McDonald, in the position of Lead Scout, immediately and at risk of his life, moved toward the enemy. He threw a hand grenade which put the enemy gun out of action, charged the enemy position, and in hand-to-hand combat, killed two of the enemy gun crew. By his cool, courageous actions, Private First Class McDonald removed a serious threat to the company which allowed them to proceed on their mission. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Oklahoma.

U. D. PERKINS, 34636003, Private First Class, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 26 November 1944 in the vicinity of Butzdorf, Germany. In the early action against a strong enemy position, Private First Class Perkins, Wireman, maintained wire communications so expertly that the mortar platoon, of which he was a member, was able to destroy two enemy machine gun nests and disable one armored vehicle. Later, at risk of his life, he obtained an automatic weapon, helped hold a flank by accurate fire and then made a valuable report of the situation to the Company Command Post. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Mississippi.

For heroic achievement in operations on 24 November 1944 in the vicinity of Butzdorf, Germany. During the enemy counterattack, Staff Sergeant McDermott, Machine Gun Sergeant, with the aid of a companion, carried a machine gun 800 yards uphill and placed it in a strategic position. From this commanding site, he disabled two enemy half-track vehicles and pinned down the enemy with accurate machine gun fire. This act enabled the company to seize and occupy three enemy-held buildings and to repel the enemy counterattacks. His heroic action was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Missouri.

After two unsuccessful attempts were made to carry ammunition and food supplies to the forward rifle echelons, Staff Sergeant McDermott (then Private First Class), Rifleman, without regard for his personal safety, voluntarily made his way through a heavily mined area and successfully fulfilled the mission. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Missouri.

ARMONDO L. PIETROSANTI, 32677924, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in operations on 10 November 1944 in the vicinity of Koenigsmacher, France. A soldier from the platoon of which Staff Sergeant Pietrosanti, Squad Leader, was a member, fell wounded in front of a strongly-fortified enemy pillbox. Staff Sergeant Pietrosanti left his place of cover to assist an Aid Man in evacuating the casualty. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. ROY W. HUGHES, 35681460, Technician Fourth Grade, Medical Department, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in operations on 14 June 1944 in the vicinity of Pont L'Abbe, France. Early in the battle, Technician Fourth Grade Hughes acting, as a Litter Bearer, was wounded. Despite his own wounds and without regard for his personal safety, he remained under heavy enemy mortar fire, continued to administer first aid and directed the evacuation of casualties. Private First Class Peterson, Aid Man, observed a member of his platoon wounded in front of a heavily-fortified enemy pillbox. He left his place of cover instantly to treat and aid in the evacuation of the casualty. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Iowa.

EDMOND C. MORRELL, 37152575, Private, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. (Now Missing in Action). 

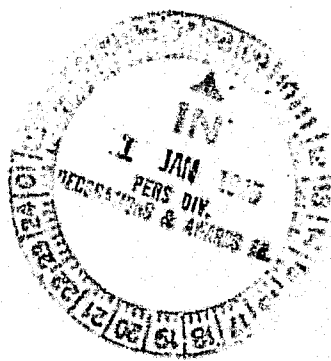



Technical Sergeant Asche, Platoon Sergeant, immediately assumed command and led the platoon into the town. During the ensuing battle, he, voluntarily and at risk of his life, advanced through intense enemy fire and set an enemy-occupied house ablaze with a flame thrower. He then moved in full view of the enemy and diverted their fire from the advancing platoon. His courageous action materially aided the success of the mission, and inspired those who witnessed it. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Nebraska.

During the initial assault to seize and establish the town as a road block, a concealed enemy machine gun temporarily halted the advance. After an unsuccessful attempt to locate the enemy gun, Staff Sergeant Williford, voluntarily and at risk of his life, bravely moved into direct view of the enemy in order to definitely locate the enemy position. During this action, Staff Sergeant Williford was mortally wounded. By his courageous self-sacrifice, the enemy gun was located, knocked out and the objective taken. At risk of his life and despite intense enemy shelling, he silenced the enemy fire with rifle grenades and enabled the Company to advance. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Kentucky.

✓ ROBERT R. MORRIS, 38125006, Technical Sergeant, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 3 and 4 October in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During the night, Technical Sergeant Morris, Platoon Leader, and two machine gun squads were isolated from the rest of the company by intense enemy fire of all calibers. At risk of his life, Technical Sergeant Morris reorganized his men into rifle squads, held off the enemy throughout the night, and personally led a counterattack the next morning that drove off the enemy in disorganized retreat. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Texas.

✓ CARL E. TRULSON, 37171209, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 3 and 4 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. On the night of 3 October 1944, Staff Sergeant Trulson, Platoon Sergeant, and his Machine Gun Squad were isolated from the rest of the company by intense enemy fire of all calibers. At risk of his life, although wounded, Staff Sergeant Trulson held off the enemy with hand grenades, carbine and machine gun fire. So effective was his individual performance and so exemplary his leadership that the next morning found the enemy driven back in disorder. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Minnesota.

✓ ROBERT G. BAIRD, 37256016, Sergeant, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 13 September 1944 in the vicinity of Uckange, France. During the attack on the town, installation of communication lines became mandatory between a forward battalion command post and the regiment. Sergeant Baird, Wire Section Chief, with aid of a companion, subjected himself to intermittent enemy fire, located the battalion command post and successfully laid the wire. He then established communications between rifle companies. His intrepid action and devotion to duty greatly facilitated the success of the Battalion's mission. Sergeant Baird's gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Nebraska.

✓ ROBERT T. HILL, 33503107, Sergeant, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 26 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. After unsuccessful attempts were made to blow a hole in a portion of a large enemy fortified position, Sergeant Hill, voluntarily and at risk of his life, made his way through intense direct enemy fire, placed a demolition charge against the strong point and ignited the charge. He gained an entrance and exploded booby-traps and land mines to clear a path for the assault troops.

During an attack on a strongly fortified enemy building, Private First Class Mills, Rifleman, in the absence of his squad leader, assumed command. By exemplary courage and intrepidity he led his squad into the enemy strongpoint. At risk of his life, he led numerous assaults on the inner rooms of the fortification and despite enemy fire of all calibers, succeeded in weakening the previously impregnable defenses. On a succeeding attack the following day, he voluntarily served as scout and again performed his duties courageously until a severe wound forced his evacuation. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered service from Ohio.

WILLIAM J. REED, 32027302, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 29 October 1944 in the vicinity of Maizieres les Metz, France. During an attack on the town, Private First Class Reed, Automatic Rifleman, was instrumental in helping the advance of his squad in its house-to-house movement. At risk of his life, he placed devastating and effective fire on the enemy positions. While so engaged, he was severely injured, but continued to perform his duties courageously until his Commanding Officer ordered his evacuation. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from New York.

OSCAR P. SCHUSSLER, 37404695, Private First Class, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 13 September 1944 in the vicinity of Uckange, France. During the attack on the town, installation of communication lines became mandatory between a Forward Battalion Command Post and the Regiment. Private First Class Schussler, Driver, with aid of a companion, subjected himself to intermittent enemy fire, located the Battalion Command Post and successfully laid the wire. He then established communications between rifle companies. His intrepid action and devotion to duty greatly facilitated the success of the Battalion's mission. For heroic achievement in operations on 20 August 1944 in the vicinity of Le Bourg St. Leonard, France. When direct enemy tank fire wounded the artillery officer at a Forward Observation Post, Private First Class Bavota, Telephone Operator, was ordered to withdraw to safety when he attempted to administer first aid to the officer. After an unsuccessful attempt to locate litter bearers, he, voluntarily and without regard for his personal safety, returned with a comrade. Upon discovery of the officer's death, he retrieved all equipment of military importance, which prevented its possible capture and use by the enemy. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Massachusetts.
