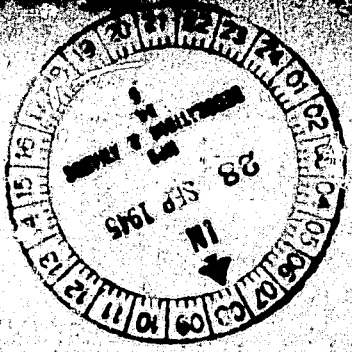

AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I, Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, as amended, the Soldier's Medal is awarded to:

HAROLD P. SCHUCH, 01056541, First Lieutenant, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroism on 6 July 1945 in the vicinity of Neustadt, Germany. While driving on a highway near the town, First Lieutenant Schuch noticed a trailer, attached to a truck and loaded with 600 hand grenades, on fire ahead of him. Fearing the conflagration that would result should shrapnel pierce the gas tank and spill gasoline about, he, disregarding the exploding grenades, quickly moved forward, mounted the cab of the truck and pulled the burning trailer into a nearby field. He then unhooked the trailer and drove the truck to a position of comparative safety. His heroism, which saved a vehicle and prevented possible damage to three other vehicles parked nearby, was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Wisconsin.

AWARD OF BRONZE STAR

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I, Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star is awarded to:

PAUL D. MARABLE, JR., OLI77896, First Lieutenant (then second lieutenant), Field Artillery, 3d Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 19 June 1944 in the vicinity of St. Le d'Curville, France. An infantry platoon, holding a commanding site, which had been selected as a suitable location for an observation post, was attacked by a hostile force of 200 infantrymen, and fired upon by an enemy tank. When, after a fierce fire fight, the platoon leader ordered his men to a more favorable position, First Lieutenant Marable, voluntarily and without regard for his personal safety, remained behind with an enlisted man and, with accurate machine gun, rifle, pistol and grenade fire, provided effective fire cover for the platoon. When the tank scored two direct hits on their foxhole killing the enlisted man, First Lieutenant Marable was knocked unconscious by the exploding shells, and was subsequently captured. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Texas.

AWARD OF SILVER STAR  
REVOCATION IN GENERAL ORDERS NUMBER 325

I—AWARD OF SILVER STAR—. Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I, Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, as amended, the Silver Star is awarded to:

**JAMES L. YATES**, 0507425, Captain (then first lieutenant), Infantry, Headquarters 90th Infantry Division, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 12 June 1944 in the vicinity of Amfreville, France. In the heavy action that ensued that day, the assault companies became temporarily disorganized because of terrific losses in personnel. Captain Yates, then Aide-de-camp to the Division Commander took due cognizance of the situation and, after returning to the Division Command Post with the Commanding General, left with proper authority to return and attempt correction of the critical situation then prevailing. As all key officers of the battalion staff were either killed, wounded, or separated, this officer with commendable foresight and sound tactical judgment reorganized the remainder of the battalion and moved the command post to a vantage point from which to better prosecute the attack. In addition to the withering fire then bringing severe casualties upon the battalion, he found that the communications system had been completely paralyzed by the fierce action of the enemy. Captain Yates braved the decimating fire to proceed forward and re-establish as much of the communications as was possible at the time. In addition to restoring control of the battalion, this officer personally gathered three aid men together and crawled forward into an area which was practically untenable to evacuate five (5) seriously wounded soldiers. It was possible to complete the evacuation of the wounded soldiers only by completely exposing himself to enemy fire. His great presence of mind and coolness under fire stabilized the situation and enabled the battalion to gain their objective. This officer's heroism and brilliant decisions made on the scene of action will always be remembered by those who witnessed his acts. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from Ohio.

II—REVOCATION IN GENERAL ORDERS NUMBER 325—. Section I, General Orders Number 325, this headquarters, 5 April 1945, awarding an Oak-Leaf Cluster to the Bronze Star to **JAMES L. YATES**, 0507425, First Lieutenant, Infantry, Headquarters 90th Infantry Division, United States Army, is revoked. This award is republished in Section I, of these General Orders.

I—AWARD, POSTHUMOUS, OF BRONZE STAR. Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I, Circular 5, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star is awarded, posthumously, to:

ROBERT J. CONNORS, 12 096 758, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 357th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 26 November 1944 in the vicinity of Otzwiller, France. With the mission of obtaining all possible information concerning the enemy, Staff Sergeant Connors, Squad Leader, led a patrol into the town. When a member of the patrol was injured while crossing an open area subjected to enemy small arms fire, Staff Sergeant Connors, without regard for his personal safety, immediately went to the aid of the casualty, but was mortally wounded while attempting to move him to safety. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from New York.

II—REVOCATION IN GENERAL ORDERS NUMBER 244---. So much of Section III, General Orders Number 244, this headquarters, 30 December 1944, as awards the Bronze Star, posthumously, to ROBERT J. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I, Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star is awarded to:

THEODOR M. DORSETT, JR., 01307523, First Lieutenant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in support of operations on 7 December 1944 in the vicinity of Dillingen, Germany. When it became impossible to maintain wire communications across the Saar River for the Battalion, First Lieutenant Dorsett, without regard for his personal safety, subjected himself to intense fire, dug an emplacement for a radio on an exposed hill, and manning the radio, relayed messages between the battalion and adjacent units. His courage and determination in maintaining communications enabled the battalion to provide invaluable information to friendly units concerning the strength and disposition of hostile troops, and also to call for artillery fire which helped to break up numerous counterattacks. His heroic service was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Mississippi.

DON MORRISON, 37156086, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in support of operations from 6 to 19 December 1944 in the vicinity of Dillingen, Germany. During the Saar River operation, friendly troops were in great need of supplies. Fully aware of the critical situation, Staff Sergeant Morrison, voluntarily and without regard for his personal safety, subjected himself to heavy fire of various calibers, organized and led a hand carrying party from a ferry site to a supply dump, and on the return trips, evacuated the wounded. When, on one occasion, machine gun fire emanating from an enemy pillbox pinned down his party, and seriously wounded one member, he crawled under the intense fire to the casualty and dragged him to a position of comparative safety. His heroic service was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Wyoming.

LLOYD A. KNITTLE, 33186951, Sergeant, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 30 April 1945 in the vicinity of Hazelbach, Germany. The advance of a company through a thickly wooded area was impeded by heavy fire emanating from a well concealed enemy machine gun nest. Sergeant Knittle, without regard for his personal safety, assaulted the hostile position under intense machine gun and small arms fire, killed the gunner, wounded his assistant and killed or routed enemy riflemen who were flanking the machine gun position. He then continued to participate in the battle until he was seriously wounded. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

LEO F. FELDMAN, 36432502, Private First Class, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in support of operations on 12 April 1945 in the vicinity of Grafenthal, Germany. When a motorized patrol, preceding a battalion, suddenly encountered heavy rocket, machine gun and small arms fire as it approached the town, Private First Class Feldman volunteered to return to the battalion in order to warn it of the danger. Moving quickly to his vehicle he mounted and drove it 800 yards over open terrain and under intense fire to the position of the battalion. He then gave the unit invaluable information concerning the strength, disposition and location of the hostile forces. His heroic service, which enabled the battalion to drive the enemy from the town, was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Illinois.

CLARENCE M. BERGUM, 37173134, Private First Class, Infantry, 358th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in support of operations on 12 June 1944 in the vicinity of Picauville, France. While attempting to gain positions beyond forward hedgerows, a company encountered intense artillery and small arms fire which inflicted heavy casualties upon the unit. Private First Class Bergum, voluntarily and without regard for his personal safety, advanced through the unrelenting fire to the position of a wounded soldier. As he was carrying the casualty to a position of comparative safety, he was wounded in the leg by a bursting mortar shell. Disregarding his painful wound, he carried the wounded man to a place of cover. His heroic service was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Minnesota.

UNIT CITATION

Under the provisions of Section IV, Circular 333, War Department, 22 December 1943, and pursuant to the authority contained in 3rd Indorsement, Headquarters Third United States Army, File AG 200.6 (11 Jun 45) GNMCA-18, dated 20 September 1944, the following unit is cited)

The First Platoon, Company C, 712th Tank Battalion, is cited for extraordinary gallantry in the face of the enemy from 10 to 12 July 1944. During the Foret de Mont Caste operation, an infantry battalion was encircled and threatened with decimation by a numerically superior paratroop force. The First Platoon, Company C, 712th Tank Battalion, breached the hostile line to support the battalion and, in a brilliantly executed maneuver, destroyed two machine gun nests and killed many enemy. Then, despite overwhelming odds, the platoon members, well aware of the probable consequences, launched an assault upon the bulk of the paratroopers. When their four tanks were destroyed by devastating fire, the officers and men of this organization engaged the enemy in fierce hand-to-hand combat and fought valiantly until most of the gallant force were killed, wounded, or captured. The gallant and selfless action displayed by this unit contributed immeasurably to the success of the Foret de Mont Caste operation and was in accordance with the highest military tradition.

Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I, Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star is awarded to:

JAMES J. GABLE, O469710, Captain (then first lieutenant), Medical Corps, 343d Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 12 June 1944 in the vicinity of Amfreville, France. During an attack on the town, a soldier was seriously wounded and was lying helplessly in a heavily shelled area. Realizing that the wounded man was in need of immediate first aid and evacuation, Captain Gable, Assistant Battalion Surgeon, voluntarily and without regard for his personal safety, advanced under the continued shelling, reached the wounded man, rendered first aid to him and carried him to the safety of the aid station. The prompt and expert medical attention given by Captain Gable, undoubtedly saved the wounded man's life and was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from California.

HARTZELL, JR., O480235, Captain, Medical Corps, 315th Medical Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy in France, Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany during the period 9 June 1944 to 8 May 1945. I--AWARD OF BRONZE STAR--. Under the provisions of Army Regulation 600-45 and Section I, Circular 6, Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star is awarded to:

EDWARD BUSTRAAN, O1180138, First Lieutenant, Field Artillery, 343d Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 21 December 1944 in the vicinity of Dillingen, Germany. During the withdrawal of a task force across the Saar River, First Lieutenant Bustraan voluntarily and without regard for his personal safety, remained at an exposed position and provided covering fire for the withdrawing elements. Though subjected to intense hostile fire, First Lieutenant Bustraan carried his assembled radio over difficult terrain and accurately directed artillery fire which routed several enemy patrols and enabled the task force to accomplish its mission. His heroic achievement was in accordance with military tradition. Entered Military Service from Michigan.

RICHARD B. EISENBERG, O448700, Captain, Medical Corps, 315th Medical Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy in France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Germany during the period 7 June 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

JOHN F. GARRETY, O400052, Captain, Ordnance Department, 15th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy in France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Germany during the period 15 July 1944 to 22 April 1945. Entered Military Service from New Jersey.

SAMUEL M. Staff Sergeant Abdella, without regard for his personal safety, led two litter squads under intense fire to the position of the wounded men. After loading the casualties upon the litters, he had the choice of leading the litter squads through a two mile defilade sector or over a shorter but perilous route. Realizing if he chose the relatively safe defilade route that several of the wounded soldiers would succumb due to the long interval of time required to make a two mile litter carry, he, disregarding the danger involved, led the litter squads safely over the shorter route, which was constantly subjected to heavily observed artillery and machine gun fire, to an aid station. His gallantry was in accordance with high military tradition. Entered Military Service from New York.

During an attack near the town, friendly troops were pinned down by intense automatic and small arms fire emanating from well dug-in positions. Sensing the gravity of the situation, Staff Sergeant Dreyfuss, without regard for his personal safety, moved under the continued

hostile fire to a commanding but dangerously exposed position and, with devastating machine gun fire, killed or wounded many enemy troops and effected the surrender of an entire enemy company. HOWARD W. KLEMAN, 32999196, Private First Class, Infantry, 359th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 20 August 1944 in the vicinity of Chambois, France. During an enemy counterattack, Private First Class Klemann voluntarily and without regard for his personal safety, advanced 200 yards through an area subjected to intense hostile fire and secured bazooka ammunition. Upon returning to his unit with the critically needed ammunition, he immediately organized his squad and adroitly placed them in strategic positions. Despite intense fire concentrated upon him, Private First Class Klemann moved from man to man directing their fire. His courageous and aggressive actions materially aided in repelling the counterattack, killing or wounding many hostile troops and capturing 30. 
