

By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved July 2, 1926 (Bull. 8, W.D., 1926), a Soldier's Medal is awarded by the Commanding General, 93d Infantry Division, to the following named officer: STANIS S. MELENDEZ, 0-428160, first lieutenant, Midical Corps, United States Army. For heroism displayed at the scene of an accident in the Colorado River, near Earp, Cal fornia on Desember 1, 1942, when an assault boat containing ten enlisted man was awept by the swift current of the Colorado River into a footbridge, throwing four of the men into the river. Lieutenant MELENDEZ, upon seeing the accident, proceeded in a power-driven asparlt boat to a spot in the river where the men were last seen and, fully clothed, with utter disrigard for his own personal safety, dived into the water in an effort to save the lives of the four enlisted men. Despite the great risk involved due to many holes in the river bed, which created strong under-currents and whirlpools, and the heavy sand laden water, Lieutenant WELENDEZ divect again and again in repetted afforts to effect a rescue until he finally became as extausted that he had to be assisted from the water. #### AWARDS OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order, No. 9419; 4 February 1944 (Sec II, Bull 3, WD, 1944), a Bronze Star Medal is awarded by the Commanding General, 93d Infantry Division, to the following Officer and Enlisted Men:

CHARLES R COLLINS, (01030344), Second Lieutenant, Cavalry, United States Army for the performance of meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, on 17 May 1944, where he displayed aggressive leadership and devotion to duty. In his fourth fire fight within a period of two days, he wastehot in the leg, but continued on to accomplish his mission and was subsequently wounded three more times. In a severely wounded condition he continued to survive within enemy territory for a period of three days until returned to his unit. Nearest Relative: Mrs Deloise C Collins, (Wife), 4638 Indiana Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

WAITER J JEFFRES, (11131597). Technician Fifth Grade, Cavalry, United States Army for the performance of meritorious debyice in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands when he succeeded in silencing enemy fire long enough to recover his wounded comrade, Technician Fifth Grade Sanders V Williams. He then treated the wounds of Technician Fifth Grade Williams and cared for him for a period of two days and one night until contact was made with friendly troops. JAMES I. CWENS, (35069933), Sergeant, Corps of Engineers, United States Army, for the performance of meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, on 17 May 1944 when, with disregard for his own safety, he exposed himself to enemy observation and fire to deliver fire upon an enemy mortar squad that was seriously harrassing his patroll. Sergeant Owens killed three of the enemy and succeeded in silencing the mortar. Later surrounded by the enemy, Sergeant Owens remained concealed all night, returning to his unit the following morning and byinging with him valuable information of the enemy. CLAMENCE C REECE; (36256723), Technician Fifth Grade, Cavalry, United States Army for the performance of meritor ous service in connection with military operations, against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands on 17 May 1944, when he succeeded in silencing enemy fire long enough to recover his wounded comrade, Technician Fifth Grade Sanders V Williams. He then treated the wounds of Technician Fifth Grade Williams and cared for him for a period of two days and

### AWARDS (FOSTHUMOUS) OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By Hirection of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order No. 9419, A February 1944, (Section III, Bulletin No. 3, WD, 1944) a Bronze Star Medal is posthumously awarded by the Commanding General, 93d Infantry Division to the following named enlisted men:

MOSES 3. DAVIS (32567668), Technician 5th Grade, Cavalry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomom Islands, on 17 May 1944. While his unit was engaged in a fire fight with the enemy, Technician 5th Grade DAVIS, with disregard for his own safety, voluntarily exposed himself to heavy enemy fire in an effort to crawl to the aid of a wounded comrade, and in so doing, received wounds which resulted in his death. This example of heroism and devotion to duty reflects the highest credit on the military service. Next of kin: Mrs. Lula Davis, (Mother), Route 2, Macon, North Carolina.

DEGRAY RAY (3430)507), Private, Cavalry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomom Islands, on 17 May 1944. While on a patrol which was ambushed in enemy territory, Private RAY, without regard for his own personal safety, advanced without hesitation to give aid to a fallen comrade. On reaching his comrade he found that he was too late to give aid; and in trying to withdraw, was hit by a burst of enemy fire which resulted in his death. This example of heroism and devotion to duty reflects the highest credit on the military service. Next of kins Hr. Joseph F. Ray, (Fother), Route 2, St. Pall, North Carolina.

### WARD OF THE BRONZE STAR WEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order Number 9419, 4 February 1944 (Sec II, Bull 3, WD, 1944), a Bronze Star Medal is awarded by the Commanding General, 93d Infantry Division, to the following named Enlisted Man:

WADE FOCGIE, (34646418), Private First Class, Infantry, United States Army, for the performance of meritorous service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands on 4 April 1944; at which time his battalion was given the mission to encircle and destroy enemy forces. En route to accomplish said mission, the battalion encountered three (3) energy pill boxes whose fire stopped its advance. Private First Class FOCGIE was assigned the task of destroying the enemy pill boxes with rocket fire. While hostile snipers fired on and about him, he calmly crawled forward to a firing position in a shallow and expended foxhole. From that position he delivered accurate and effective fire on his target. Within a few minutes, the pill boxes and enemy therein had been destroyed; and his organization was able to proceed on its mission. COOKE, (32335838), Staff Sergeant, Cavalry, United States Army, for meritorous service in connection with military operations against the engey at Bougainville, Solomon Islands on 5 July 1944; at which time the platoon of which Staff Sergeant COCME was the Platoon Sergeant was advancing up an enemy ridgo, when brought under intense enemy fire. Hounded in the leg by the first volley, Staff Sergeant COOKE continued to fire his HAR with accurate and effective results, permitting the withdrawal of members of his plateon. His courage and devotion to duty, though wounded, reflects the highest credit on himself and the service. Nearest relative; Mr. Marcellus Cooke, (Father), Pea Pond Road, Mantagh, L.I., New York.

WIILIAM A. DYSON, (37368908), Private First Class, Cavalry, United States Army, for meritorous service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville on 5 July 1944. While on an approach to an enemy ridge, the platoon of which Private First Class DYSON was a member was . . brought under intense enemy first. Though wounded in the head by the first volley, Private First (Mass DYSON repeatedly exposed himself while firing his BAR, drawing fire to himself, knocking out at least one enemy machine gun; hence, permitting the men in front to withdraw while he covered the withdrawal. But for his action, courage and devotion to duty, the men in front of him would probably have been lost. Nearest relative: Mr. William Dyson, (Fither), General Delivery, Athen, Georgia.

#### SECTION I

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order Number 9419, 4 February 1944 (Sec II, Bull 3, WD, 1944), a Bronze Star Medal is awarded by the Commanding General, 93d Infantry Division, to the following named officers and enlisted man:

LINDEN A. C.RDING, (0-328141), First Lieutenant, Cavalry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomom Islands, on 29 July 1944. While leading an ambush patrol of men into Japanese territory, and when brought under enemy mortar fire, Lieutanent CARDING displayed exemplary leadership ability in keeping his men downshid in position. Although some of the men were under fire for the first time, they killed three (3) Japanese and wounded a fourth. When ordered to withdraw, while still under fire, he searched the bodies of the enemy dead, returning with valuable information. Lieutenant CARDING'S conduct reflects great credit upon himself and his organization. Nearest relative: Mrs. Linden A. Carding (Wife), 22 "C" Street., North East, Miami, Oklahoma.

EDGAR A. ROSEN, (0-454404), First Licutenant, Cavalry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomom Islands, from 30 July to 3 August 1944. Licutenant ROSEN led a patrol of men into Japaneso territory, cutting an enemy communication wire, and setting in an arbush. Although some of the men were under fire for the first time, three enemy attacks were repulsed, and the ambush kept intact for thirty-six (36) hours, preventing repair of communications. Lieutenant ROSEN'S exemplary Ladership and excellent judgment reflects great credit upon himself and him organization. Nearest relative: Reverend Louis Rosen (Father), 3813 Boarman Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland.

EDWARD J. SMITH, (34245326), Sorgeant, Cavalry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomom Islands on 16 August 1944. While on a patrol with his unit, Sergeant SMITH sensed an enemy ambush. Motioning the remainder of his

patrol to halt, he crawled forward across enemy fire lancs and discovered at least twelve (12) enemy with machine guns and rifles, formed as an ambush. Sergeant SMITH'S voluntarily going forward undoubtedly saved his patrol from being ambushed by the enemy and probable resultant in loss of life or wounding of members of his patrol. His courage and devotion to duty reflects the highest credit on himself and the service. Nearest relative: Mrs. Tomasina Sm. h (Wife), 1322 Lemon Street, Palatka, Florida.



### AWARDS OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order Number 9419, 4 February 1944, (Section II, Bulletin 3, WD, 1944), a Bronze Star Medal is awarded by the Commanding General, 93d Infantry Division, to the following named Warrant Officer and Enlisted Men:

LEON MOSBY, (W2114366), Chief Warrant Officer, United States Army. For meritorious service from 23 January to 1 September 1944. Nearest Relative: Mrs. Gussic Anderson, (Mother) 816 South Front Street, Hamilton, Ohio.

ARTHUR G. WILLIAMS, (98302468), Sergeant, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, on 5 July 1944. While Sergeant Wallams, then Corporal, was in command of the scout squad of a patrol approaching an enemy held ridge, the patrol was brought under intense enemy fire. Sergeant WILLIAMS, seeing that the lead scout was under concentrated fire, immediately crawled forward to the rear of the lead scout and covered the lead scout's withdrawal. At that time, three (3) enemy with machine guns suddenly charged the front of the group. Sergeant WILLIAMS, further exposing himself, took position and brought accurate fire to bear and dispersed the charging enemy. Nearest Relative: Mrs. Odessa Williams, (Mother), 307 Nolan Street, Marshall, Texas.

RUDOLPH S. ROBERSON, (14172887), Corporal, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, on 5 July 1944. While Corporal ROBERSON, then Private, was lead scout on an approach to an enemy held ridge, the patrol was brought under intense enemy fire. Corporal ROBERSON voluntarily crawled forward, repeatedly exposed himself, drawing fire, and gave the remainder of the patrol time to organize, return fire and successfully withdraw. The voluntary performance of this outstanding and hazardous act undoubtedly saved the lives of many men and permitted the recovery of those men who were wounded. Nearest Relative: Mr. Samuel J. Roberson, (Father), 1425 North Seventh Street, Atchison, Kansas.

JAMES L. VERNON, (15338018), Corporal, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Rougainville, Solomon Islands, on 5 July 1944. While on an approach to an enemy held ridge, Corporal VERNON'S patrol was brought under intense enemy fire. During the withdrawal of the patrol, the enemy succeeded in placing

accurate knee mortar fire on the front section. Corporal VERNON, upon observing the location of the mortar and crew, immediately crawled forward out of cover, and threw a grenade completely destroying the enemy mortar. The voluntary emposing of himself and crawling forward undoubtedly saved the lives of several members of the patrol. Nearest Relative: Mrs. Mattie Belle Preston, (Mother), General Delivery, Wilcoe, West Virginia.

Army. For heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, on 5 July 1944. While the patrol of which Private First Class VINSON, then Private, was a member was advancing up an enemy held ridge, it was brought under intense enemy fire from the front and flanks. Private First Class VINSON, though slightly wounded in the first volley; and though the enemy had discovered his position and were bringing heavy fire to bear on him, repeatedly exposed inself by raising to aim; and silenced the machine gun and crew on the flank, al dang his patrol to withdraw. His covering the flank, courage and devotion to duty, undoubtedly saved the lives of many of the men who might have been cut off. 

For meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, from 28 July to 30 July 1944. Nearest Relative: Mr. John B. CONWAY B. JONES, (Cl285597), First Lieutenant, Infantry, United States Army. While Commanding Officer of a company organized in a perimeter defense, Lieutenant JONES demonstrated outstanding abilities of leadership by the rapid and efficient direction of the efforts of his company in inflicting heavy casualties and the successful replusing of an enemy attack. JOHN S. WALKER, (0387037), First Lieutenant, Cavalry, United States Army. Claremont Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

FRANK LITTLE, (6267142), First Sergeant, In/antry, United States Army, For heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, on 17 April 1954. While in charge of a carrying party of approximately sixty (60) men/who were stacking ammunition within the company perimeter, Sergeant LITTLE domonstrated outstanding initiative and leadership by rapidly and calmay organizing the men and placing them in a position of defense when the enemy/attacked the company. CLIFFORD N. JOHNSON, (36164406), Technical Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy at Bougainville, Solomon Islands, on 17 April 1944. While acting plateon leader, Sergeant JOHNSON was given orders to move a reinforced squad to a flank position to prevent a possible enemy break-through. Under enemy fire, Sergeant JOHNSON demonstrated an outstanding ability of leadership in rapidly and courageously moving the squad into position. With disregard for his own safety, Sergeant JOHNSON crawled forward to see that two (2) wounded members of his squad were given first aid and placed in a position of cover from enemy fire, until they could be evacuated.
