AWARDS OF THE SOLDIERS' MEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of act of Congress, approved 2 July 1926 (Bulletin 8, WD, 1926), a Soldiers' Medal is awarded by the Commanding General, 93d Infantry Division, to the following named officers and enlisted men: *for service on 29 Jan. 1945. (Amount to include by 00453-4/4)*

First Lieutenant JOHN C. ROBINSON, (O-449468), Infantry, United States Army, for heroism at Los Negros Island, Admiralty Group. The crash and subsequent burning of an airplane into a bivouac area caused a number of casualties and endangered the lives of many troops then asleep in the area. Lieutenant ROBINSON, with complete disregard for his own safety, entered the conflagration of burning gasoline and exploding small arms ammunition and without hesitation began the evacuation of the injured and salvage of valuable property. Although duty would not require him to so expose himself, he, through his own courage and on his own initiative, at great risk to himself, succeeded in so inciting troops under him that lives and valuable property were saved wherein they would have perished. This action on the part of Lieutenant ROBINSON was in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Military Service. Home Address: Box 236, Atlanta University, Atlanta, Georgia.

First Lieutenant CLIFFORD R. WILSON, (O-1289525), Infantry, United States Army, for heroism at Los Negros Island, Admiralty Group. An Army airplane crashed into the bivouac area of an Airdrome Squadron and burst into flames. Lieutenant WILSON, with complete disregard for his own safety, went into the area of the burning plane and into the burning tents in order to remove injured personnel to safety. Lieutenant WILSON'S courageous action in the face of exploding gasoline and ammunition saved the lives of men who would otherwise have perished in the fire. This action, above and beyond the call of duty with its resulting saving of human life and valuable property, was in conformance with the high standards and traditions of the United States Military Service. Technician Fifth Grade LEE W. SLUSHER, (38320779), Infantry, United States Army, for heroism at Los Negros Island, Admiralty Group. An Army airplane crashed into the bivouac area of an Airdrome Squadron and burst into flames. Technician Fifth Grade SLUSHER, with complete disregard for his own safety, went into the area of the burning plane and into the burning tents in order to remove injured personnel to safety. Technician Fifth Grade SLUSHER'S courageous action in the face of exploding gasoline and ammunition saved the lives of men who would otherwise have perished in the fire. Such action in the face of danger and risk of his life displayed the courage and bravery so inherent in the American Soldier and was in conformance with the high standards and traditions of the United States Military Service. Technician Fifth Grade JAMES E. DAVIS, (73054268), Quartermaster Corps, United States Army, for heroism at Morotai, Netherlands East Indies. At approximately 0800 hours, 19 April 1945, the clothing of an enlisted man, working at an electrical light generator, suddenly caught fire from a gasoline explosion nearby. Technician Fifth Grade DAVIS, who was walking past the power plant at the time, was thrown to the ground by the force of the exploding gasoline. After regaining his composure, and with utter disregard for his own personal safety, Technician Fifth Grade DAVIS immediately ran to the aid of the badly burned enlisted man, threw him on the ground and smothered the flames with his bare hands, thus preventing serious burns and probable death to the injured. In a hurried effort to extinguish the ignited clothing of the enlisted man, Technician Fifth Grade DAVIS received burns on both hands. This action by Technician Fifth Grade DAVIS was in keeping with the high traditions and ideals of the United States Military Service. Home Address: Mrs. Annis W. 
