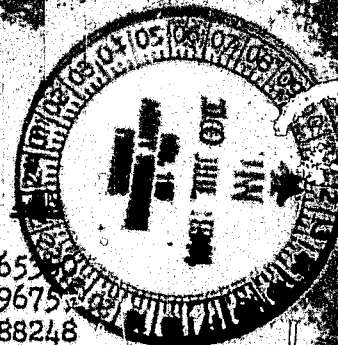

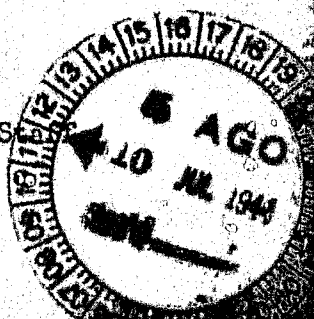

AWARD OF SILVER STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, a Silver Star Medal is awarded to:

Sergeant HORACE A. NANCE (Army Serial No. 34548307) 301st Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 11 September 1944 in Brittany, France. Sergeant NANCE while on outpost duty with five members of his squad was discovered by the enemy and subjected to fire during which he received severe leg wounds. On receiving orders to withdraw, Sergeant NANCE, unable to accompany his men due to the severity of his wounds, directed that they proceed while he covered their withdrawal. He again engaged the enemy, successfully defended the outpost, killed two and possibly three of the enemy and wounded several others. His bravery and coolness during the attack were an inspiration to all, aided in the prompt reoccupation of the outpost and exemplifies the finest traditions of the service.

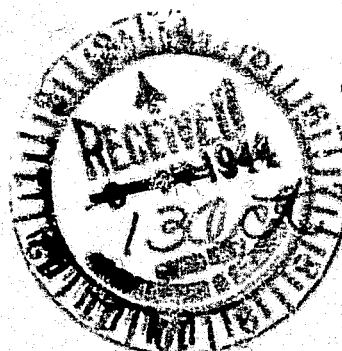

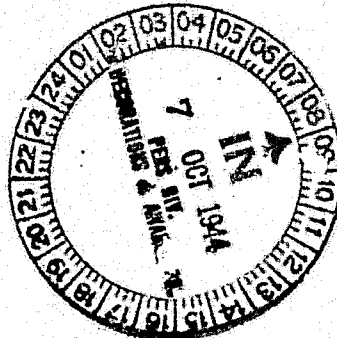

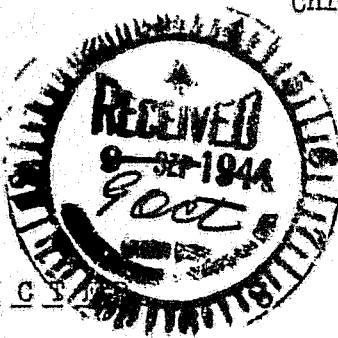

AWARDS OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum No. 34, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, 1944, as amended, a Bronze Star Medal was awarded by the Commanding General, 94th Infantry Division, United States Army, to the following-named enlisted men.

Technician Fifth Grade ANTHONY M. CALLADINO (Army Serial Number 36627441), Medical Detachment, 376th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 18 September 1944 in Brittany, France. With utter disregard for his own safety, amid enemy machine-gun fire and fully exposed by enemy flares, he gave first aid to a wounded comrade and then accompanied the wounded man to a rallying point where he treated other wounded as they arrived. His courage, calmness under fire, and skillful application of his technical knowledge are in keeping with the highest traditions of the Medical Corps. Entered the military service from Cicero, Illinois.

Private First Class PAUL V. HART (Army Serial Number 42000085), Company C, 376th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 20 September 1944 in Brittany, France. While a member of a combat patrol, Private First Class HART, disregarding enemy small arms fire, went to the aid of a wounded comrade, pulled him into a ditch and administered his wound. Still under fire, he assisted the wounded man to a position of cover until he could be removed. The prompt and heroic action of Private First Class HART reflects the highest credit on himself and the military service. Entered the military service from Rockway, New Jersey.

Private First Class GEORGE V. STONE (Army Serial Number 35643135), (then Private), Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 301st Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 13 September 1944 in Brittany, France. When his squad was pinned down by enemy artillery fire, Private First Class STONE'S (then Private) truck, carrying ammunition, was set afire by enemy action. Abandoning his foxhole and with complete disregard for his own safety, he raced to the truck and drove it to a position where the flames could be extinguished. His unhesitant and fearless action enabled the squad to withdraw to a new position and saved valuable materiel. Entered the military service from Bidwell, Ohio.

Private First Class ANTHONY D. STEFL (Army Serial Number 36285072), Company I, 301st Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 16 September 1944 in Brittany, France. During an intense artillery barrage by the enemy, a comrade was seriously wounded. With utter disregard for his own safety, Private First Class STEFL left his sheltered position, applied a tourniquet to the wound of his comrade and aided in evacuating him to a zone of relative safety. Private First Class STEFL'S courage and devotion to duty was an inspiration to all. Entered the military service from Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

While occupying a forward observation post which was under intense artillery fire and with one member of his squad already killed by the action and the officer in charge wounded, Sergeant THOMAS observed an enemy patrol advancing on his post. Without sufficient cover or protection, he called for aid adjusted a battery of field artillery which repelled and dispersed the enemy advance. His disregard for personal safety and quick action was an inspiration to all. Entered the military service from Saverton, Missouri.

First Sergeant WALTER F. BURNS (Army Serial Number 12077115), Company A, 301st Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action the night of 16-17 September 1944 in Brittany, France. While his position was under intense enemy artillery fire, with enemy shells exploding within 100 yards at intervals of approximately three to five minutes, First Sergeant BURNS, with complete disregard for his own safety, and in total darkness, went to each of the security outposts to check on his personnel. Finding one man wounded, First Sergeant BURNS guided him back to the Command Post and there found another casualty. Still under fire, First Sergeant BURNS directed the two wounded men to a covered emplacement, summoned a medical vehicle and assisted in their evacuation. First Sergeant BURNS' unselfish action and devotion to duty reflects the highest credit on himself and the military service. Entered the military service from West Orange, New Jersey.

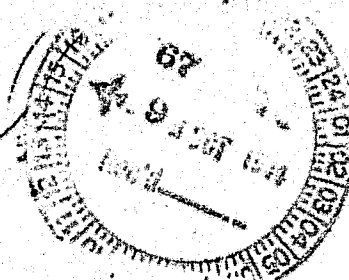

Private First Class SALVADOZA GARZA, (Army Serial Number 38425768), Company G, 302nd Infantry, United States Army. (Now missing in action). For gallantry in action on 19 September 1944 in Brittany, France. While on duty with a combat patrol, the enemy opened fire with machine guns and machine pistols pinning the unit down. Private First Class GARZA with utter disregard for his personal safety raised himself to a crouching position, fired his BAR at the enemy gun position, dropped to his knees, threw a hand grenade, changed his position and repeated this action. Again he stood to face the enemy who apparently sensed his next position and opened fire with deadly machine pistols wounding him before he could withdraw to a position of safety. In this encounter, he managed to throw his third and last grenade. His unhesitant action allowed the remainder of the patrol to withdraw to a position of safety, was an inspiration to all and exemplified the highest traditions of the service. Next of kin: Mrs. Conceptia Garza, (Mother), Route No. 6, Dallas, Texas.

Private ELWOOD E. VAN HORN, (Army Serial Number 33456886), Company K, 302nd Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action 1 October 1944 in Brittany, France. The platoon of which he was a member became engaged in combat with a numerically superior enemy force which had attacked from the rear. Private VAN HORN, then in the rear of the platoon, held down enemy fire by exchanging hand grenades over a hedgerow with a group of enemy soldiers, killing one at a range of three feet with his BAR. Moving to another position he killed three more of the enemy who were covering his platoon's only approach with heavy fire. Private VAN HORN, exposing himself, continued firing thereby reducing the enemy's fire power and made it possible for his platoon, including one wounded man, to withdraw safely. His cool action, quick thinking and utter disregard for personal safety upheld the highest traditions of the military service. Entered the military service from Sayre, Pennsylvania.

In the performance of this duty he was ambushed and machine gunned until fatally wounded. Major GARRETT J. DOBBINS, O358276, Cavalry, United States Army. For meritorious and heroic achievement between 3 August 1944 and 20 September 1944 in Brittany, France. At one time, while directing his squadron from a forward position, he was wounded by enemy sniper fire and refused to be evacuated. Returning to his squadron, he directed it in an outstanding manner, disregarding the injury that partially incapacitated him. His squadron travelled more than 500 combat miles during the Brittany Campaign taking part in the liberation of many cities and played an important part in the siege of Brest. During the advance on St. Malo, Major DOBBINS personally directed a tank attack to within 4 kilometers of the city which resulted in the capture of over 125 of the enemy. Major DOBBINS' leadership, courage, coolness and skill reflect the highest credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the military service from Kenosha, Wisconsin.

First Lieutenant JOSEPH D. GOLDMAN, O540802, Medical Corps, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 2 October 1944 in Brittany, France. While administering plasma to patients in a medical tent, the enemy opened fire and artillery shells were gradually reaching the area of the tent. With utter disregard for his own safety, Lieutenant GOLDMAN, while shrapnel penetrated the tent, continued administering plasma. His conduct and devotion to duty, under fire, upholds the finest traditions of the Medical Corps. Entered the military service from Indianapolis, Indiana.

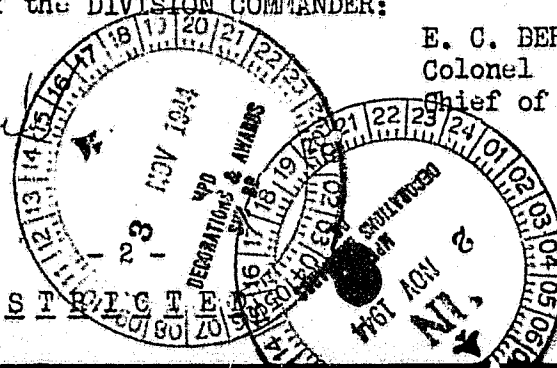

Private First Class WINOR E. LARSON, (Army Serial Number 36287408), Headquarters Company, 3rd Battalion, 376th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 25 September 1944 in Brittany, France. Having previously repaired a forward telephone wire while in danger from enemy machine gun and field artillery fire, Private First Class LARSON, upon learning of a second break and with full knowledge of the imminent danger, he ventured from his relatively safe wire head position and again repaired the line under enemy fire making it possible to maintain contact with the forward patrol Command Post. His utter disregard for his personal safety and complete devotion to duty was an inspiration to all. Entered the military service from Cable, Wisconsin.

Staff Sergeant ANTHONY S. ETASKO, (Army Serial Number 33457256), Company L, 302nd Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement between 15 September 1944 and 7 October 1944. Sergeant ETASKO constantly requested his platoon leader for patrol missions and has completed more patrols than any other member of his company. On his first mission he reconnoitered a road block established by the enemy in front of his platoon's position and finding it unoccupied set up an observation post which he manned all day. On subsequent missions he has drawn enemy machine gun and rifle fire to locate enemy guard posts and on others has led the advance of combat patrols. His boldness and tenacity have furnished valuable information regarding the enemy and has had a strong influence on the young and inexperienced soldiers in his squad who have profited from his example and direction. Entered the military service from Scranton, Pennsylvania.

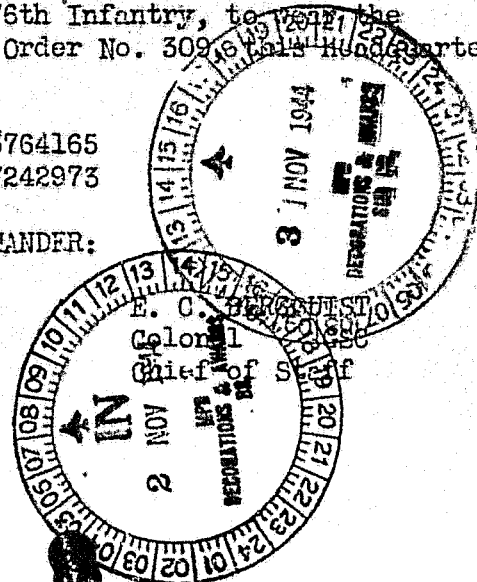





Technician Fifth Grade ALFRED J. KOSSMAN, (Army Serial Number 32559428), Medical Detachment, 15th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 9 September 1944 in Brittany, France. While Technician Fifth Grade KOSSMAN was serving as an aid man, the troop commander was seriously wounded and one platoon was pinned down by withering frontal and flanking fire by a superior force of enemy in entrenched positions. Technician Fifth Grade KOSSMAN, accompanied by another aid man, voluntarily went forward in an attempt to evacuate the troop commander. Before reaching a point where three other officers had just been wounded, he was told by the Executive Officer that it would be impossible to proceed beyond that point. Fully aware that the enemy in that sector previously had fired on aid men, and with utter disregard for his life, he continued forward until killed by enemy fire. Technician Fifth Grade KOSSMAN'S fearlessness and devotion to duty on this and numerous other occasions reflect the highest credit upon the Medical Corps. Next of kin: Mrs. Edna Kossman, (Mother), 30 Jefferson Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey.

II. SILVER STAR MEDAL.- By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, a Silver Star Medal was awarded by the Commanding General, 94th Infantry Division, United States Army, to:

Sergeant TILLMAN H. EVANS, (Army Serial Number 34518000), Company F, 302nd Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 18 September 1944 in Brittany, France. When his squad was pinned down by heavy machine gun and mortar fire, Sergeant EVANS observed that his BAR man had been wounded. With complete disregard for personal safety, and, while still under enemy fire, he crawled from his foxhole to the position of the wounded man and rapidly put the BAR into action. His quick thinking and daring action enabled his platoon to repulse a determined enemy attack although he received shrapnel wounds when the enemy concentrated heavy mortar and machine gun fire on his position. His conspicuous gallantry and intrepid leadership reflect the highest credit on himself and the military service. Entered the military service from Wimsboro, South Carolina.

A troop commander attached to infantry for dismounted action against the enemy, and while he and his command were not trained in infantry tactics, he led his unit with such aggressiveness and determination that his troop was at all times the most advanced unit of the entire line. His unit held when other units fell back; it made daring patrols in an attempt to infiltrate past a heavily fortified hill and turn the enemy right flank which was anchored there. The initiative of this officer in not only adapting himself and his command to the tactics of a different arm but also in excelling therein reflects great credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the military service from Hixson, Tennessee.

Captain JOHN G. WHELOCK, III, 025572, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 16 August 1944 in Brittany, France. The task force he commanded, consisting of one reconnaissance troop and two assault guns, had the mission of reducing enemy strongpoints. Encountering a strongly fortified island about 200 yards off shore, without hesitation, he attacked with all elements of his command. With disregard for personal safety, he exposed himself to full view of the enemy in order to get a better observation to direct fire of the assault. While in this exposed position, he was wounded by sniper fire but would not leave the scene of action until the enemy, which numbered about 300; displayed the white flag and surrendered. His unhesitant action, aggressiveness and leadership reflect the highest credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the military service from Monmouth, Illinois.

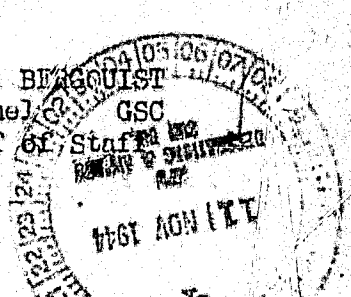
Captain ADRIAN ST. JOHN, 025583, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 9 September 1944 in Brittany, France. When the task force to which he was attached was pinned down by heavy fire from the enemy in entrenched positions and all officers except one of the leading troop were wounded, Captain ST. JOHN, with complete disregard for the heavy enemy artillery and mortar fire falling on his position, placed his assault guns into position and directed fire on the enemy entrenchments. He then went forward and personally directed the withdrawal and reorganization of the pinned down units. His coolness under fire and prompt action enabled the task force to withdraw and upholds the highest traditions of the military service. Entered the military service from Burlington, Vermont.

X First Lieutenant MARION D. MERRITT, O1031739, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 9 September 1944 in Brittany, France. When the leading platoon was pinned down by enemy fire and the troop commander wounded, Lieutenant MERRITT, although warned of sniper fire on the position, with utter disregard for personal safety, continued forward in an attempt to extricate the pinned down elements. In the performance of this outstanding duty he was wounded but refused to leave the scene of action until he received a direct order from a superior officer to do so. His devotion to duty and coolness under fire was an inspiration to all. Entered the military service from Dayton, Ohio.

Y Second Lieutenant GLENN J. KERR, O1031890, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 9 September 1944 in Brittany, France. His platoon, which was the point of a task force attempting to penetrate the enemy positions, became pinned down by withering frontal and flanking fire from a superior number of the enemy in entrenched positions. He succeeded in extricating most of his platoon with the exception of three men and the troop commander who was wounded. After reporting the situation to the Executive Officer, Lieutenant KERR continued forward until he was seriously wounded refusing to leave the scene until ordered to do so by a superior officer. His conduct was an inspiration to his men and reflects the highest credit upon himself and the military service. Entered the military service from Sacramento, California.

X Captain JAMES D. WATSON, O365595, Cavalry, United States Army. (Now missing in action). For heroic achievement in action on 9 September 1944 in Brittany, France. While in command of a task force which had the mission of making a reconnaissance in force in an attempt to penetrate the enemy's positions, Captain WATSON placed himself with the leading elements of his command and advanced toward the enemy. When his supporting weapons were held up by a road block, he continued forward at the head of a dismounted party which became caught in withering frontal and flanking fire from a superior number of the enemy. In this engagement he was seriously wounded. When last seen Captain WATSON was at the head of his men. His aggressive nature, devotion to duty and disregard for his own life uphold the finest traditions of the military service. Next of kin: Mrs. M. D. Watson, (Mother), 511 Bloomfield Street, Athens, Ga.

After leading several patrols to reconnoiter enemy positions which gained valuable information in determining the exact position of the enemy line of resistance, Sergeant SCHIENI'S section was the point for a task force attempting to penetrate the enemy lines. He continued at the head of his men after a road block held up the supporting weapons and enemy artillery fire was falling on the position. His section was caught in a withering frontal and flanking fire and he has since been missing in action. His disregard for personal safety and his desire to be first in any action against the enemy were an inspiration to his comrades and in keeping with the highest traditions of the Army. Next of kin: Mr. George Schieni, (Father), IED #2, Salisbury, Missouri.

Staff Sergeant DEWEY H. LOSCH, (Army Serial Number 35100842), Company F, 302nd Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement on 18 September 1944 in Brittany, France. When his squad was pinned down by heavy enemy machine-gun and mortar fire, with the ammunition supply almost exhausted and the enemy only a few yards away, Staff Sergeant LOSCH, realized that his squad might be annihilated. With utter disregard for personal safety, rushed through a screen of enemy fire to report the situation to his company commander and returned immediately to his squad again risking his life to rescue his wounded assistant squad leader. The fearless action and devotion to duty were an inspiration to all. Entered the military service from Louisville, Kentucky.

Private First Class GILBERT FRANTZ, (Army Serial Number 36756219), Medical Detachment, 376th Infantry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 9 October 1944 in Brittany, France. When a member of the platoon to which he was attached was wounded by enemy action, Private First Class FRANTZ, with utter disregard for personal safety, advanced through heavy enemy mortar fire and managed to pull the wounded man into a trench. Still under enemy fire he administered first aid and later evacuated him to the area in the rear of the platoon. His devotion to duty and his gallant action are in keeping with the highest traditions of the Medical Corps. Entered the military service from Chicago, Illinois.

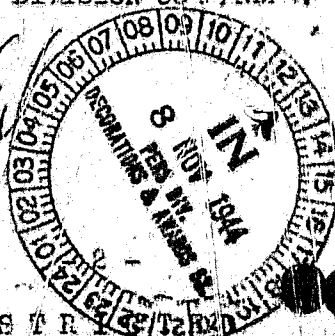

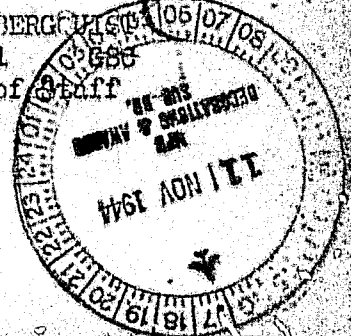

I. SILVER STAR MEDAL - POSTHUMOUS AWARD.- By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 300-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, a Silver Star Medal was posthumously awarded by the Commanding General, 94th Infantry Division, United States Army, to:

Private J. W. LUTTRELL, (Army Serial Number 18018604), Troop A, 15th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 22 August 1944 in Brittany, France. As a member of a dismounted patrol making a reconnaissance of a bridge, Private LUTTRELL voluntarily assumed the point. Due to excellent enemy observation the approach to his objective was extremely hazardous, but Private LUTTRELL accomplished this mission, returned, and directed the patrol to a position of cover within a few yards of the bridge. To determine if the bridge was mined, Private LUTTRELL again voluntarily left cover and moved to a position for better observation. It was here that an enemy sniper, concealed a few feet away, fatally wounded him. Private LUTTRELL'S fearless disregard for his own safety and continued desire to give more than was asked of him uphold the finest traditions of the military service. Next of kin: Mrs. Cora E. II. BRONZE STAR MEDAL.- By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, a Bronze Star Medal was awarded by the Commanding General, 94th Infantry Division, United States Army, to the following-named officer and enlisted man:

First Lieutenant ROBERT D. D'YAN, 026052, Cavalry, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 4 August 1944 in Brittany, France. First Lieutenant D'YAN was in command of a dismounted patrol making a reconnaissance in force against an enemy road block and strong point. Unable to attain his mission by flanking the enemy position, he lead his patrol so aggressively that despite the open terrain and the intense enemy machine gun and rifle fire he and several others were able to occupy a house behind the road block and in the middle of the enemy position. From this point he not only gained the desired information but also called for close supporting fire despite the proximity of the targets to his own position. This action enabled his party to withdraw with negligible losses. First Lieutenant D'YAN was the last to leave this forward position. The information gathered by this officer greatly influenced the course of operations in that area and saved many lives. In addition, after his return, First Lieutenant D'YAN without regard for personal safety, voluntarily returned to an observation point under heavy enemy artillery fire in order to point out enemy positions to junior officers of the tank destroyers and artillery. His aggressiveness, coolness under fire and disregard for personal safety were an inspiration to all. Entered the military service from Loredo, Texas.

Technician Fifth Grade GLEN SEIK, (Army Serial Number 33118943), Medical Detachment, 15th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, United States Army. For heroic achievement in action on 9 September 1944 in Brittany, France. While serving as an aid man, the troop commander was seriously wounded and one platoon was pinned down by a withering frontal and flanking fire from a superior force of the enemy in entrenched positions. Technician Fifth Grade SEIK, accompanied by another aid man, voluntarily went forward in an attempt to evacuate the troop commander. Before reaching the point where three other officers had just been wounded, he was told by the Executive Officer that it was impossible to go any further. The aid man accompanying him continued to advance and was fatally wounded. In spite of the fact that the troops were withdrawn and fully aware that the enemy had just wounded his comrade, Technician Fifth Grade SEIK, with complete disregard for personal safety, continued forward in an attempt to evacuate the wounded aid man only to find him fatally wounded. This soldier's fearlessness and devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the Medical Corps. Entered the military service from McDonald, Pennsylvania.

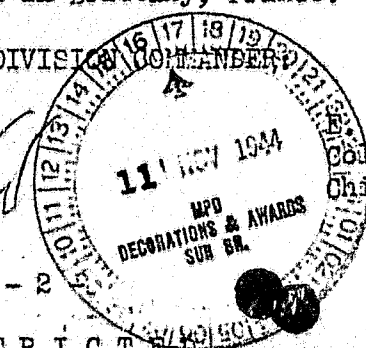

I. SILVER STAR MEDAL - POSTHUMOUS AWARD.- By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, a Silver Star Medal was posthumously awarded by the Commanding General, 94th Infantry Division, United States Army, to:

Corporal ARTHUR N. CAWLEY, (Army Serial Number 33134978), 15th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 15 August 1944 in Brittany, France. His troop was making an aggressive reconnaissance when the operation stalled due to an enemy road block defended by fire from high ground. As a member of a combat patrol sent out to gather information and details on the enemy position, this unit encircled the position but was pinned down by machine gun fire. Corporal CAWLEY, with utter disregard for personal safety, voluntarily worked his way into a grove of trees and put the enemy machine gun out of action with hand grenades. He was able to gather vital information and captured two prisoners. Returning to his patrol with the prisoners he was severely wounded by sniper fire. Corporal CAWLEY carried on despite his wounds and turned the prisoners over to other members of the patrol and gave them the information he had obtained, making possible the elimination of the road block and its defenders. His fearless action, devotion to duty and endurance in spite of his wounds to which he later succumbed, were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service. I. SILVER STAR MEDAL. - By direction of the President, under the provision of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, a Silver Star Medal was awarded to the following named officer and enlisted man:

Second Lieutenant NICOLAI C. PECKHAM, 0530057, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 28 October 1944 in Brittany, France. When his platoon was subjected to heavy enemy artillery fire which covered its entire position, Lieutenant PECKHAM with complete disregard for personal safety, dashed about 200 yards through intense fire to check the position of his left squad. Satisfied that the situation was under control, he then ran approximately 300 yards, still through intense concentrations of artillery, to his right squad. Discovering four men including the squad leader, had become casualties from the intense fire, he made immediate changes in the disposition of his men to get better protection, supervised the evacuation of the wounded and remained with that squad throughout the ensuing action during which approximately 400 rounds of enemy artillery fell on the position and an attack by approximately 200 enemy troops had been repulsed. His unhesitant action and devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered the military service from Taunton, Massachusetts.

Corporal LEO M. ROGERS, (Army Serial Number 39090613), Troop E, 15th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 5 August 1944 in Brittany, France. Corporal ROGERS was a member of an Assault Gun crew acting as support for an attacking infantry company. As the advancing line entered an orchard about 800 yards forward of the enemy position, it encountered heavy mortar, artillery, machine gun and small arms fire. When his tank was fired upon by an enemy machine gun forward, the crew to the floor and prevented the manning of the 75mm gun. Corporal ROGERS abandoned his normal position as gunner, climbed atop the tank ring mount, and, completely unprotected by armor, attempted to bring the machine gun to bear on the enemy. Suddenly Corporal ROGERS fell into the tank, which had stopped. A few seconds later he jumped from the tank carrying two grenades, and, in spite of artillery, small arms fire and the fact that this particular machine gun had been firing the entire time, charged at a dead run toward the source of fire. At a distance of 10 yards he threw his grenades silencing the gun. He returned to his tank and during the remainder of battle stayed unprotected on the .50 caliber machine gun, personally accounting for one enemy light machine gun, two machine pistols and possibly more. While not wounded, two bullets passed through his helmet between the liner and headstrap. Corporal ROGERS' fortitude, valor and actions reflect great credit upon himself and the armed forces. Entered the military service from San Francisco, California.

Quickly recovering from the shock he manned the machine gun and delivered continuing effective fire upon the enemy positions. When the order to advance was given Sergeant Stough, though obviously suffering from the effects of the enemy shell, continued to lead his squad and moved it forward aggressively crawling through water, mud, and continuous and inter-locking bands of heavy machine gun and anti-tank gun fire and achieved the objective. Not until other forces had taken over the position and his squad relieved would he submit to medical treatment.
