AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL TO PRIVATE WARREN J. ROGERS
ASN 36439108

1. Under the provisions of AR 600-45 a Soldier's Medal is awarded Private Warren J Rogers, ASN 36439108, Hq and Serv Co, 323rd Engr Bn, for having distinguished himself by heroism at Camp Breckinridge, Kentucky on 20 June 1943.

2. While serving in the capacity of truck driver transporting a detail of seven enlisted men and a box of dynamite for participation in a combat firing test, the truck was inadvertently driven into the impact area of small arms, automatic weapons, mortar and artillery fire. While bullets from small arms were passing around the truck, the non-commissioned officer in command of the detail ordered all personnel to dismount from the truck and take cover in a nearby suitable location. From this position Private Rogers volunteered and returned to the truck, drove it to a partially covered position some distance from the men and then removed the box of dynamite from the truck to a safe position to prevent possible injury to the personnel in case of explosion and also to prevent possible destruction of the vehicle. To move the truck and remove the dynamite Private Rogers knowingly and voluntarily exposed himself to rifle and artillery fire without regard for his own safety in order to protect other men in his detail.


3. Private Rogers' action reflects great credit upon himself and the military service.
